OF LOCHNAW

ANDREW AGNEW OF LOCHNAW, to whom William Douglas of Leswalt granted a charter for the lands of Lochnaw and Garriecherrie and office of bailie of the barony of Leswalt on 10 November 1426.¹ He had grant of the office of Sheriff of Wigton from King James II. on 25 May 1451, to be held for the remainder of his life and then by Andrew Agnew, his son and apparent heir and his heirs male of his body, which failing, by Patrick Agnew, his natural son & *bap.*, which failing, by Gilbert Agnew, another natural son & etc.,² and appears to have *d.* by 29 July 1452, when his son Andrew was confirmed in this office. In 1458, his son and heir, Andrew Agnew, had a payment from the Exchequer in consideration of the destruction of his grain mill and also the death of his father in the King's service.³ He was father of :

1. Andrew Agnew of Lochnaw, (*see below*).

He was also father of two natural son :

2. Patrick Agnew, was a substitute heir to the lands of Lochnaw in 1426,⁴ and to the office of Sheriff of Wigton in 1451.
3. Gilbert Agnew, a substitute heir to the office of Sheriff of Wigton in 1451.

ANDREW AGNEW OF LOCHNAW, succeeded his father and had a charter under the Great Seal confirming him in the office of Sheriff of Wigton on 29 July 1452.⁵ He succeeded his father in the lands of Lochaw, Salchare and Garriecherrie for which a Precept was

issued for his infetment on 16 May 1455,¹ and in 1460 he had a payment from the Exchequer for the expenses he incurred going to Ireland against Regulum Onele.² He was father of :

1. Quentin Agnew of Lochnaw, (*see below*).

He is also said to have been father of :

2. William Agnew, 1st of Croach, who had Sasine for the lands of Croach in 1460.³ (*see Agnew of Croach*)
3. John Agnew,
4. Nevin Agnew,

QUENTIN AGNEW OF LOCHNAW, succeeded his father and was infet as his heir in the lands of Gargarrane and others, on 12 March 1484/5.⁴ He also succeeded his father in the office of Sheriff of Wigton and made a resignation of Salchary, Lochnaw, Creachmor and the officer of Sheriff of Wigton in favour of his son and heir Patrick Agnew, on 15 February 1487/8. He *m.* Marjory, daughter of Robert Vaus of Barnbarroch, to whom his father assigned the lands of Creachmore and in confirmation of which they had a confirmation under the Great Seal on 28 January 1469/70,⁵ and with whom he is named in a decree by the Lords Auditors for the return of livestock and goods stolen from them by Neil Neilson of Craigassie, Uchtred MacDowell of Mindork and others, in 1494.⁶ He was father of :

1. Patrick Agnew of Lochnaw, (*see below*).
2. Mr. Michael Agnew, who assumed the office of Sheriff of Wigton following his brother Patrick's death and is styled as such in a Sasine in favour of Finlay Campbell, son and heir of

the deceased Alexander Campbell of Corsewell dated 11 April 1514.¹ He *d.* prior to 9 March 1552.²

PATRICK AGNEW OF LOCHNAW, in whose favour his father resigned the lands of Salchary, Lochnaw and others, and the office of Sheriff of Wigton and in which he was infest on 26 April 1488.³ He *m.* Katherine, daughter of Robert Gordon of Lochinver, with whom, on his own resignation, he had a charter under the Great Seal for the lands of Creachmore dated 25 January 1506/7,⁴ and *d.* several weeks following the battle of Flodden on 9 September 1513, probably of wounds received, and was father of :

2. Mathew Agnew,
3. Mariotta Agnew, *m.* John Muirhead of Gulles
4. Katherine Agnew, *m.* Ninian Adair of Kinhilt.

ANDREW AGNEW OF LOCHNAW, was infest in the lands of Lochnaw, Salchary and Dunduine as heir to his father on 20 May 1514,⁵ and also in those of Dalyarran, Little Tong, Meikle Tong and Suchane for which he had Sasine on 30 May 1518.⁶ He *m.* Agnes Stewart with whom he is named in a Tack dated 14 February 1543/4,⁷ and was *k.* at the battle of Pinkie on 10 September 1547.⁸ He was father of :

3. Alexander Agnew of Ardoch, *m.* by 25 September 1592, to Barbara Gordon, (she was relict of Anthony Stewart of Clarie), when, as Sheriff depute, he was charged to infeft Alexander Stewart of Clarie as heir to his deceased father, the said Anthony Stewart, in the lands of Clarie, Grange and others.¹

4. Helen Agnew, *m.* John MacCulloch of Torhouse.

He was also father of a natural son :

5. Walter Agnew in Callochmon, who had letters of legitimization under the Great Seal on 24 September 1589.²

PATRICK AGNEW OF LOCHNAW, was infeft in the lands of Lochnaw, Salchay and others as heir to his father on 5 January 1547/8,³ and had his escheat gifted to his eldest son Andrew Agnew, younger of Lochnaw, on 3 March 1584/5. He *m.* Janet, daughter of James Gordon of Lochinver, to whom, in her virginity, he granted a charter for the liferent of the lands of Salchary on 17 August 1550, and in which she is styled sister german to John Gordon of Lochinver,⁴ and *d.* in around 1590. He was father of :

1. Sir Andrew Agnew of Lochnaw, (*see below*).

2. Patrick Agnew, to whom his father granted a Tack of the lands of Craighbirrach, in the barony of Glenluce, on 23 January 1575/6, and is then styled as second son.⁵

3. Quentin Agnew, to whom Sir Patrick Vaus of Barnbarroch renounced his rights to the lands of Culquhork, in the parish of Wigton, on 26 May 1586.⁶

4. Alexander Agnew, styled as brother to Andrew Agnew, Sheriff of Wigton, and a tenant on the lands of Killumquha in a dispute over the heirs to these lands on 6 January 1595/6.⁷

5. William Agnew, of Barmeal and Kirkton of Craggleton, acquired the lands of Kirkton of Craggleton from Alexander Cairns of Cults on 27 January 1607, and *m.* Agnes MacCulloch, Lady Monreith, with whom he had a Tack of the Teinds of the lands of Barmeal from Mr. Adam

Thomson, Vicar of Kirkmaiden, in June 1610.¹ He conveyed his lands to his nephew Thomas Agnew and *dsp.*

6. Thomas Agnew, styled as brother to the Sheriff of Wigton on 3 July 1594, and had settled at Greyabey, Ireland, by 27 July 1630. He *m.* Elizabeth Stewart and was father of,

6a) Patrick Agnew of Castlewigg, to whom his uncle William Agnew disposed the lands of Crugleton on 27 July 1630.² He was father of :

6b) Elizabeth Agnew, was the second daughter. She *m.* William Agnew, second son of Sir Andrew Agnew of Lochnaw, (*c/m* 3 April 1662³), and had issue.

7. Katherine Agnew, *m.* Patrick McKie of Larg, (*c/m* at Wigton on 3 August 1591⁴).

8. Helen Agnew, *m.* prior to 6 July 1575, to John MacDowall of Curghie.

SIR ANDREW AGNEW OF LOCHNAW, who was infest as his father's heir in the lands of Lochnaw, Salchary and others on 22 April 1590.⁵ He *m.* firstly, in 1577, to Agnes, daughter of Sir Alexander Stewart, 5th of Garlies, and had issue ; and secondly, to Agnes, sister of William Mure of Rowallan, to whom, on 26 September 1591, he granted a Bond in contemplation of their marriage contract.⁶ He *d.* prior to 14 January 1617, and was father of :

1. Sir Patrick Agnew of Lochnaw, (*see below*).

2. Andrew Agnew. He and his brothers Quentin and Alexander renounced their rights to the lands of Olbrek, Clennerie and Salchary in favour of their father on 15 November 1616.⁷

- 4a) Andrew Agnew, 2nd of Tong, succeeded his father and is styled as son of Alexander Agnew of Tong in a Sasine dated 4 May 1643.
5. Rosina Agnew, *m.* William MacLellan of Glenshinnoch, second son of Thomas MacLellan of Bombie, and had issue.
6. Jean Agnew, *m.* James Kennedy of Cruggleton.

SIR PATRICK AGNEW OF LOCHNAW, 1ST BARONET, succeeded his father and to whom he was retoured heir in the lands of Lochnaw and others, and the offices of Sheriff of Wigton and Constable of Lochnaw, on 14 January 1617,¹ in which he was infeft on 19 March following.² He was created a Baronet of Nova Scotia on 28 July 1629, *m.* Margaret, daughter of Sir Thomas Kennedy of Culzean, (*c/m* 1598³), *d.* by November of 1659, and was father of :

1. Sir Andrew Agnew of Lochnaw, (*see below*).
2. James Agnew, of Auchrocher, *m.* Marion, daughter of James Kennedy of Ardmillan,⁴ and *d.* prior to 17 February 1657 when Sir Andrew Agnew of Lochnaw, was styled as his brother and representative.⁵
3. Patrick Agnew of Sheuchan, to whom his father granted the lands of Tung with the mails on 17 August 1650.⁶ He *m.* Janet, daughter of William Gordon of Craighlaw, (*c/m* 17 August 1638), and was father of :

3a) Andrew Agnew of Sheuchan, succeeded his father by 1678, and to whom he was retoured heir on 21 October 1699.⁷ He was father of :

3b) Robert Agnew of Sheuchan, succeeded his father and to whom he was served heir firstly on 23 July 1748, and then as heir male on 19 January 1751. He *d.* at Sheuchan on Sunday 17 July 1774, aged 98 years⁸ and was father of :

3c) Margaret Agnew, *m.* John Vans of Barnbarroch, (*c/m* 29 December 1757), and upon whom her father entailed the lands of Sheuchan. They had issue.

SIR ANDREW AGNEW, OF LOCHNAW, 2ND BARONET, succeeded his father and to whom he was retoured heir in the lands of Lochnaw, and others, on 29 October 1661.³ He *m.* Agnes, daughter of Sir Alexander Stewart, 1st Earl of Galloway, (*c/m* circa 22 March 1625⁴), who had a Precept of Sasine for infeftment in the liferent of the lands of Craichmor and Achneill, in the parish of Leswalt on 26 June 1637,⁵ and *d.* by 2 October 1671. He was father of :

1. Sir Andrew Agnew of Lochnaw, (*see below*).
2. William Agnew, *m.* Elizabeth, second daughter of Patrick Agnew of Wig, (*c/m* 3 April 1662⁶), and had issue :
- 2a) William Agnew of Wig, succeeded his father and to whom he was retoured heir in the lands of Wig alias Castlewig on 19 November 1695.⁷ He *d.* unmarried and without legitimate issue on 19 February 1738, and to whom his great-nephew Hugh Hathorn, son of Hugh Hathorn, Merchant and Bailie of Edinburgh, was served heir in the lands of

SIR ANDREW AGNEW OF LOCHNAW, 3RD BARONET, was retoured heir to his father in the lands of Lochnaw and others, on 2 October 1671,¹ and in which he was infeft on 2 October 1671. He *m.* Jane, daughter of Thomas Hay of Park, (*c/m* 24 October 1656²), *d.* on 9 June 1702, and was father of :

1. Sir James Agnew of Lochnaw, (*see below*).

2. Thomas Agnew, booked as apprentice to Robert Blackwood, Merchant in Edinburgh, on 23 February 1687, but did not complete his training and instead he entered the army and *d.* at Inverness on 14 July 1690, while serving as a Cornet.³

3. Andrew Agnew, was buried in the Greyfriars, Edinburgh, on 16 December 1690.⁴

4. Grizel Agnew, *m.* Sir Charles Hay of Park, (*c/m* 3 August 1686), and had issue.

SIR JAMES AGNEW OF LOCHNAW, 4TH BARONET, *m.* on 15 September 1683, to Mary, daughter of Alexander Montgomery, 8th Earl of Eglinton,¹ (*c/m* 4 October 1683.² She *d.* at Edinburgh on 2 March 1742, aged about 90 years³), and was buried in the Abbey Church, Holyrood, on 13 March 1735.⁴ He was father of :

1. Sir Andrew Agnew of Lochnaw, (*see below*).

2. Patrick Agnew, *dsp* in 1740.

3. James Agnew, served as a Major in the 7th Regiment of Dragoons, being raised to Lieutenant-Colonel in March 1765, He *m.* at York on 9 October 1719, to Margaret, daughter and heir of Thomas Wilkinson of Kirkbrigg,⁵ (she *d.* at Bishop Auckland on Saturday 8th October 1768⁶), *d.* at his house in Bishop Auckland on Sunday 27 October 1770,⁷ and was father of :

3a) James Agnew of Howlish, served as Lieutenant-Colonel and then Brigadier-General of the 44th Regiment of Foot and was appointed an Aide de Camp to the King in October 1775. He served in the American Wars, landing in Boston in the latter part of 1775, and engaging in the battles of Long Island, in 1776, and Ridgefield. He was shot by a sniper during the battle of Germanton on 4 October 1777, and carried back to their headquarters where he *d.* of his wound shortly after.⁸ He *m.* on 27 September 1747, to Elizabeth Sanderson,⁹ (she *d.* at Bishop Auckland in July 1785¹⁰), and was father of :

3b) Robert Agnew of Howlish, *bap.* at Auckland Saint Andrew on 9 April 1749, and *m.* Catherine, daughter of Conway Blennerhasset of Castle Conway. He *d.* on 30 November 1792, and was father of :

3c) James Agnew of Howlish, *bap.* at Auckland Saint Andrew on 23 July 1783, and succeeded his father in the lands of Howlish which he sold in 1806. He entered the army, serving as a Lieutenant in the 65th Regiment, and was

appointed Colonial Secretary of Dominica in July 1844. He *m.* firstly, at Darlington to Mary Eleanor, daughter of Thomas Bowes, Darlington, and secondly, at Gravesend, on 10 August 1844, to Helen Caroline, daughter of Henry Brandon, Gravesend,¹ and *d.* without apparent issue during passage back to England “for the benefit of his health” in about September 1847.²

3c) Elizabeth Agnew, *bap.* at Auckland Saint Andrew on 13 November 1770, and *m.* on 20 May 1792, to Rev. Austin Martin, incumbent of Tarbert, County Kerry. She *d.* at Tarbert on 27 February 1830, and had issue.

3c) Margaret Agnew, *bap.* at Auckland Saint Andrew on 14 December 1771, and *m.* her cousin, Harman Blennerhasset, and had issue.

3c) Susanna Agnew, *bap.* at Auckland Saint Andrew on 10 May 1777, and *m.* at Auckland Saint Andrew on 23 January 1804, to Joseph Kilburn.

3b) James Agnew, *bap.* at Auckland Saint Andrew in May of 1752.

3a) Montgomery Agnew, *bap.* at Pontefract on 26 November 1729, entered the army and served as Captain in the 1st Dragoon Guards, being raised to Major in April 1778, then Colonel and finally to General. He was appointed Governor of Carlisle in September of 1892 in which office he continued up until his death, and *m.* on 7 May 1767, to Sarah, sister to John Bower,⁵ (she *d.* at Durham on 10 July 1805⁶). He *d.* without apparent issue at Durham on 14 July 1808.⁷

3a) Alexander Agnew, entered the Royal Navy and was Captain of the HMS Fury in action off Flamborough Head on 30 April 1780. Afterwards he and two other Captains were

court martialled for cowardice but were acquitted on that charge and dismissed from service for neglect of duty. He *m.* Bell Graves, *d.* on 23 February 1792, and was father of,

3b) Thomas Ramsden Agnew, entered the army and served as Major of the 82nd during the Peninsula campaign. He was present at the capture of Oporto, Talevera and was wounded in the thigh at Vittoria, causing him to have no less than three amputations.¹ He was afterwards appointed Barrack-Master of Tipner Fort, Portsmouth, and *d.* at Redland Park, Bristol, on 8 June 1874,² aged about 84 years. He *m.* at Saint Marys, Portsea, on 3 February 1815, to Anna, daughter of Richard Vere Drury, (she *d.* on 4 January 1875), and was father of :

3c) Thomas Richard Agnew, *bap.* at Portsea on 13 February 1816.

3c) Charles Montgomery Agnew, *bap.* at Portsea on 7 May 1822.

3c) James John Galton Agnew, *bap.* at Portsea on 17 September 1824.

3c) Edward Frederick Agnew, *bap.* at Portsea on 7 April 1826, and served as Adjutant in the Burkham Fusilier Militia. He *m.* at Christ Church, Marylebone, on 6 June 1855, to Julia Tyndale, third daughter of Rev. William H. Wilkinson, incumbent of All Saints,³ and *d.* without apparent issue on 28 May 1881.

3c) James Agnew, *bap.* at Portsea on 1 September 1828, served as Captain in the 39th Regiment and settled firstly at Jarsey House, Dollar, Clackmannanshire in about 1870, then in Blythswood, Glasgow.⁴ He *m.* at Belfast on 26 March 1852, to Lucinda, daughter of Noel Dalway, and was father of :

3d) James Pritchard Agnew, *b.* in 1856, and *m.* at St. John, Capetown, on 12 November 1879, Kathleen Mathilde, only daughter of Edmund John Johnstone, Deputy Assistant Commissary General.⁵

3d) Edward Frederick Agnew, *b.* at London on 31 May 1866.

3d) Alexander Percy Agnew, *b.* in 1870, and *m.* at Latchford, Cheshire, on 26 September 1895, to Florence, daughter of Joseph Taylor, Warrington.⁶ He *d.* in 1961 and was father of :
