

WALKER ARNOTT OF ARLARY

1. **GEORGE ARNOT OF ARLARY**, *dsp* at Arlary on 10 February 1807,¹ and was succeeded by his brother Robert Arnot.
2. **ROBERT ARNOT OF ARLAY**, succeeded his brother George but *dsp* just over a month after doing so, dying at Arlay on Wednesday 18 March 1807.²
3. Mary Arnot, *m.* on 25 December 1768, to David Walker, (he *d.* in 1771), and was father of :
 - 3a) David Walker Arnot of Arlary, (*see below*).

DAVID WALKER ARNOTT OF EDENHEAD AND ARLARY, *b.* on 18 August 1769, succeeded his uncle, George Arnot of Arlary, and was served his heir in the lands of Arlary, in the parish of Orwell, on 29 October 1808. He *m.* on 27 August 1793, to Emilia, daughter of John Stewart of Stenton,³ (she *d.* at St. John's Street, Edinburgh, on 30 June 1843⁴), *d.* at Arlary on 20 January 1823,⁵ and was father of :

1. George Arnott Walker Arnot of Arlary, (*see below*).
2. John Alexander Walker Arnot, *b.* on 21 August 1806, and *d.* unmarried.
3. Jane Walker Arnot, *m.* at Edinburgh on 6 February 1829, to Rev. John Wilson, Minister of Walston.⁶
4. Mary Arnot, *m.* first at Arlary House on 29 July 1826, to Lieutenant Edward Bayley R.N.⁷ and secondly, at Edinburgh on 1 September 1846, to Rev. David Arnot, Minister of the High Church, Edinburgh, and *d.* at Gloucester Place, Edinburgh, on 29 July 1881, in her 82nd year.⁸

DR. GEORGE ARNOTT WALKER ARNOT OF ARLARY, *b.* at Edinburgh on 6 February 1799, succeeded his father on his death in 1823 and was served his heir in the lands of Arlary, Spittle, Cocklaw and others, on 10 October 1823. He was appointed Professor of Botany at the University of Glasgow, *m.* at Paris, Perthshire, on 1 August 1831, to Mary Hay, third daughter of Arthur Barclay, (she *d.* at Fettes Row, Edinburgh, on 11 May 1872⁹), *d.* at Victoria Terrace, Glasgow, on 17 June 1868,¹⁰ and was father of :

1. David Walker Arnot, (*see below*).

2. Arthur James Walker Arnot, *b.* on 30 April 1836, and became a provisions merchant.
3. George Walker Arnot, *b.* on 1 January 1845, and entered the Merchant Navy, being promoted Master on 5 June 1872. He *m.* on 22 May 1871, to Mary Ann, daughter of Charles Gill,¹ (she *d.* at Clarendon Gardens, Ilford, on 17 January 1940), *d.* in Essex Lunatic Assylum on 24 January 1885,² being buried on 31st of that month. He was father of :
- 3a) Arthur James Walker Arnott, *b.* on 1 March 1873, and became a Counting House Manager. He *m.* in 1932, to Charlotte Moulle, (she *d.* in March of 1963), and *d.* on 4 January 1957.³
- 3a) Charles Walker Arnott, *b.* on 25 March 1875, and *m.* at West Ham, in 1905, to Rosie Gertrude Robinson,⁴ (she *d.* at Chigwell, on 12 January 1966), He *d.* at Epping on 13 January 1972,⁵ and was father of :
- 3b) Charles Douglas Walker Arnott, *b.* on 17 June 1906, *m.* in 1934, to Kathleen Birttain, and *d.* at Chelmsford, on 20 May 1980.⁶
- 3b) Hugh Hansford Walker Arnott, *b.* on 22 June 1909, and *m.* in 1938, to Hermione Ann Newling. He *d.* at Bishop's Stortford, Herts, on 17 August 2009.⁷
- 3b) Alan David Walker Arnot, *b.* on 4 January 1911, and *m.* in 1942, to Mary E. Hart. He *d.* at Havering, Essex, in December 1996.⁸
- 3a) George Walker Arnott, *b.* in 1877, and *d.* at West Ham, London, in July 1888.⁹
- 3a) David Walker Arnott, *b.* in 1884, and *m.* at St. Michael, Cornhill, on 2 June 1916, to Marguerite Dewar, daughter of Albert Hooker.¹⁰ He *d.* at Eastbourne in June 1965,¹¹ and was father of :
- 3b) David Athelton Walker Arnott, *b.* at Epping on 24 February 1922, and *m.* in September 1947, to Melville Eryl Johnes. He *d.* in October 2002.¹²
- 3b) Mary Jeanette Walker Arnot, *b.* at Epping on 23 April 1919, and *m.* at Harrow in June 1950, to Leslie Williams.¹³ She *d.* at Eastbourne, in March 1990.¹⁴
- 3a) Helen Stewart Walker Arnott, *b.* on 4 July 1880, and *m.* at St. Stephen's, Walbrook, on 28 October 1912, to Charles Mathew Stedman, of Leytonstone,¹⁵ (he *d.* on 9 February 1954). She *d.* at Eastbourne on 2 October 1960.¹

- 3a) Mary Ann Walker Arnott, *b.* on 20 June 1882, and *m.* in 1907, to Thomas Edmund Dingwall. She *d.* Hutton, Essex, on 6 June 1966,² and had issue.
4. Jane Walker Arnot, *b.* on 1 June 1834, and was founder and superintendent of the Tabeetha Mission. She *d.* at Jaffa, Palestine, on Sunday 21 May 1911.³
5. Emilia Walker Arnot, *b.* on 19 October 1837, and *d.* unmarried in 1918
6. Mary Walker Arnot, *b.* on 25 March 1842, and *d.* unmarried in 1910.
7. Stewart Walker Arnot, *b.* on 23 December 1846, and *d.* of diphtheria at the American Mission at Aintab, Syria, on 2 December 1884.⁴
8. Fanny Burn Walker Arnot, *b.* on 31 August 1857, and *m.* at Jaffa, Syria, on 12 March 1887, to Timothy Bergheim, son of Melville P. Bergheim, Banker in Jerusalem.⁵

DAVID WALKER ARNOT, *b.* at Arlary on 5 October 1832, and following his father's death, he exposed Arlary for public sale in 1869. He *d.* at Melbourne, Australia, on 7 July 1880,⁶ and was father of :

1. George Frederick Arnot, *b.* at Fort William, Bengal, on 6 December 1874, and *d.* at St. Bernard's Crescent, Edinburgh, on 4 August 1888, aged 13 years.⁷
2. Esther Walker Arnot, *b.* at Secunderabad on 22 December 1869, and *m.* at St. Thomas's Church, Edinburgh, on 14 December 1897, to Lionel Cottingham Burrell, only son of Lionel Burrell, of Westley, Sidcup.⁸
