

AUCHMOUTHIE

OF THAT ILK

ROTHERI DE ADMULTI, is the first for whom there is any evidence. He was present at an inquest held at Berwick on 25 August, 1292, which determined that Elena la Suche died infert in the third-part of the lands of Dysart and Strathor¹ and was father of :

FLORENTIUS DE AUCHMOUTHIE OF THAT ILK, who entered into an agreement with the Abbot of Dunfermline for the clearing of their marches in 1334.² From him descended :

THOMAS DE AUCHMOUTHIE OF THAT ILK, was a member of the inquest at the retour of David Ramsay as heir to his father William Ramsay of Brackmont on 26 May, 1438.³ He *d.* in around 1459 and was father of :

DAVID AUCHMUTHIE OF THAT ILK, succeeded his father and had Sasine for the lands of Auchmuthie in 1459.⁴ He entered into an agreement with the Abbot of Dunfermline for the clearing of their marches on 27 June 1466,⁵ and was a member of the inquest at the retour of Nicholas Scrimgeour as brother and heir to William Scrimgeour in the lands of Lillock, on 17 October, 1475.⁶ He was father of :

1. Alexander Auchmuthie of that Ilk, (*see below*).
2. Florence Auchmuthie of Easter Fernie, apparently a son of David Auchmuthie of that Ilk, (*see Auchmuthie of Easter Fernie & that Ilk*).

ALEXANDER AUCHMOUTHIE OF THAT ILK, succeeded his father and had Sasine for the lands of Auchmouthie in 1483.¹ He was a member of the inquest at the retour of Alexander Ramsay as son and heir of David Ramsay of Brackmont, on 16 April, 1493,² and was father of :

ALEXANDER AUCHMOUTHIE OF THAT ILK, succeeded his father and resigned his lands of Auchmouthie to his son and heir Henry Auchmouthie on 5 August, 1535. He had letters from the King exempting him from participating at the sheriff courts of Fife on 2 January 1537,³ *m.* Agnes Bruce and was father of :

1. Henry Auchmouthie of that Ilk, (*see below*).
2. Janet Auchmouthie, *m.* John Seton of Lathrisk, and had issue.

HENRY AUCHMOUHTIE OF THAT ILK, had a charter of confirmation for the lands of Auchmouthie following upon a resignation made in his favour by his father, dated 5 August, 1535,⁴ which he disposed under reversion to Walter Heriot of Burnturk on 1 January, 1556. He *m.* Grissel Heriot with whom he had a charter of joint-infetment for the lands of Auchmouthie on 9 January, 1548, and *d.* prior to 1567. He was father of :

1. George Auchmouthie of that Ilk, (*see below*).
2. Robert Auchmouthie, styled as brother to George Auchmouthie of that Ilk, in Letters of Slains dated 20 March 1587.
3. Alexander Auchmouthie, a natural son.

GEORGE AUCHMOUTHIE OF THAT ILK, succeeded his father and had his escheat gifted by the King to Andrew, Earl of Rothes, on 24 August 1583,⁵ for non-payment of taxes. On 6 August 1584, as the debt had been unpaid beyond one year and a day, the King

gifted his escheat and his liferent, mails, fermes, profits and duties of the lands of Auchmouthie to Thomas Leslie.¹
