

AYTOUN

OF INCHDAIRNIE

ROBERT AYTOUN, 1ST OF INCHDAIRNIE, is styled as son of the deceased Andrew Aytoun when he and his mother, Isabel Kincragy, had a gift of the ward of the lands of Qwiltis, in the sheriffdom of Fife, being part of the ward his father had previously purchased from the King, dated 9 July 1516.¹ He had a tack of the lands of Inchdairney from the Commendator of Dunfermline in 1539,² *m.* Alison Lundy and was father of :

ROBERT AYTOUN, 2ND OF INCHDAIRNIE, had a charters for the lands of Ballinkirk from James Gib of Ballinkirk on 11 October, 1551, and for the lands of Pittconnochy from Patrick Halkett of Pitfirrane on 18 February, 1566. He *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of Pitcairn of Forthar, with whom he is mentioned in a premonition of redemption dated 11 April 1572,³ *d.* in 1595 and was father of :

1. George Aytoun, 3rd of Inchdairnie, (*see below*).
2. James Aytoun of Grange, was a servant for many years to the Master of Rothes, and is styled as brother to George Aytoun of Inchdairnie when witness, with this brother, to a charter Andrew, Earl of Rothes, on 24 January, 1589. He had a charter for the quarter-part of the lands of Overgrange on 20 May, 1600, from which he took his designation, and *m.* Barbara Hamilton. He was father of :
 - 2a) Alexander Aytoun, was infeft with his father, in the sixth-part of the north quarter of the lands of Auchtermuchty on 3 March, 1622.
 - 2a) James Aytoun, *bap.* at Dunfermline on 24 July, 1610.
 - 2a) Anne Aytoun, *m.* John Scott, second son of Sir John Scott of Scottstarvet, and to whom a charter for the middle-part of the lands of Gibleston was granted as his promised spouse on 11 July, 1635.⁴ She *d.* by 9 October 1649.

- 2a) Grizel Aytoun, *m.* John Hamilton, son of James Hamilton of Kilbrackmont, from whom she had a charter in her virginity for the liferent of the lands of Lingo, in the barony of Pittenweem, on 23 June, 1631.
- 2a) Elizabeth Aytoun, *m.* David Bethune, second son John Bethune of Balfour, and had issue.
- 2a) Barbara Aytoun, who, with her sisters Grizel and Elizabeth, was retoured heir to their sister Anne in portions of their father's lands of Grange on 9 October, 1649.
- 2a) Margaret Aytoun, *m.* Alexander Menzies, 1st of Rotmell, third son of Alexander Menzies of Weem, (he *m.* secondly, in 1647, Barbara, daughter of John Stewart of Arntully and Cardney), by whom she was infeft in the liferent of the lands of Rotmell on 27 August, 1634. They had issue.

- 2a) Jean Aytoun,
3. David Aytoun of Kinglassie, appointed Chamberlain of Dunfermline by 31 January, 1587, when he had a charter for the lands of Links of Balchristie from George, Earl of Huntlie, and was admitted an Advocate. He obtained the lands of Kinglassie on 26 July, 1605, *m.* firstly, at Edinburgh on 26 April, 1598, to Margaret Boyd,¹ by whom he had issue ; and secondly, to Julia Home. He was father of :
- 3a) Andrew Aytoun of Kinglassie, had a charters from his father for (1) the lands of Ballginal on 7 January 1618, in which he is styled as his eldest son and heir² (2) the lands of Kinglassie, and others, from his father and which were erected into the Barony of Kinglassie by King Charles I. on 6 February, 1630. He *m.* Janet, daughter of Captain Andrew Watson, and *dsp* soon after his marriage in 1635, and certainly by 9 July 1636, when his younger brother, Robert, was their father's heir male.
- 3a) Robert Aytoun of Finglassie, was retoured heir male to his father in the lands of Finglassie, in the Regality of Dunfermline, on 9 July, 1636,³ and *m.* Anna, daughter of Sir David Auchmouthie of that Ilk, (she *m.* secondly on 30 April, 1655, to David Kinnear of that Ilk.). He *dsp* prior to 22 April, 1643, when his brother James Aytoun was retoured his heir in the lands of Finglassie and part of Kinglassie.
- 3a) David Aytoun, styled as third son of Mr. David Aytoun in a charter by his father to his eldest brother Andrew Aytoun for the lands of Ballingall on 7 Janary 1618. He was a substitute heir to his brother Andrew in the lands of Kinglassie in 1630.

- 3a) James Aytoun of Kinglassie, was a substitute heir to his brother Andrew in the lands of Kinglassie in 1630 and for which he had a charter on 6 December, 1643. He was retoured heir to his brother Robert Aytoun of Finglassie, in the lands of Finglassie and Kinglassie on 22 April, 1643,¹ and *dsp* prior to 9 August, 1649.
- 3a) Rachel Aytoun, *m.* at Kinglassie on 24 October, 1646, Mr. Andrew Aytoun of Finglassie, brother of David Aytoun of Kinnaldie.²
- 3a) Janet Aytoun, *m.* James Alexander of Finglassie, and had issue.
- 3a) Margaret Aytoun, *m.* Martin Corstorphine, son of Martin Carstorphine of Balrymonth.
- 3a) Anna Aytoun, *m.* John Belsches of Tofts, (he *d.* in March of 1693), and had issue.
4. John Aytoun, who, or one of his brothers, was father of :
- 4a) Magnus Aytoun, was a Notary Public in Burntisland and is styled as “brother-son” and heir-male to Andrew Aytoun of Kinglassie on several occasions. He *m.* Isobel Michelson and was father of :
- 4b) Isobel Aytoun, *m.* Alexander Orrock of Cassindon, (*c/m* 10 February 1671³).
- 4b) Christine Aytoun, *m.* on 4 April, 1672, to Charles Wardlaw of Logie, (*c/m* 21 March 1672⁴), and had issue.
- 4b) Elizabeth Aytoun, *m.* John Dewar.
5. William Aytoun, styled as brother to George Aytoun of Inchdairnie when witness to a charter by John Inglis of Tarvit on 26 February, 1605.⁵
6. Robert Aytoun,
6. Agnes Aytoun, *m.* Walter Heriot, eldest son and heir of Walter Heriot of Ramorgny, from whom she had a charter in her virginity for the lands of Burnturk on 2 May, 1577.⁶

GEORGE AYTOUN, 3RD OF INCHDAIRNIE, succeeded his father and *m.* Christian, daughter of James Ramsay of Corstoun. He *d.* in 1606 and was father of :

1. Robert Aytoun, 4th of Inchdairnie, (*see below*).

2. David Aytoun, styled as son of the deceased George Aytoun of Inchdairnie, when witness to a charter by Duncan Menzies, fiar of Weem, to Jean Leslie, his spouse of certain lands in implementation of their contract of marriage on 30 July, 1622.¹
3. Robert Aytoun,
4. James Aytoun, retoured heir of tailzie to his uncle Mr James Aytoun of Grange, in the 1/8 part of the lands of Bondhalf of Auchtermuchtie on 26 March, 1631.²
5. George Aytoun, granted a Bond with his mother to Mr. William Cranston, Minister at Kettle, for 1,000 merks on 11 June, 1630.³

ROBERT AYTOUN, 4TH OF INCHDAIRNIE, succeeded his father and was retoured heir general to his grandfather, Robert Aytoun of Inchdairnie, on 17 March 1624.⁴ He *m.* Helen, daughter of James Hamilton of Kilbrackmonth, *d.* in October of 1650 and was father of :

1. John Aytoun, 5th of Inchdairnie, (*see below*).
2. James Aytoun, *bap.* at Kinglassie on 11 November, 1635.
3. David Aytoun, *bap.* at Kinglassie on 26 June, 1637.
4. Janet Aytoun, *m.* John Lindsay, 11th of Dowhill, (*c/m* 22 May, 1644⁵), and had issue.
5. Christine Aytoun, *m.* John Melville of Murdocairney, and had issue.
6. Eupham Aytoun, *bap.* at Kinglassie in June of 1633.

JOHN AYTOUN, 5TH OF INCHDAIRNIE, succeeded his father on his death in 1650 and *m.* Jean, daughter of James Stewart of Rosyth, (*c/m* 15 June, 1651). He *d.* in August of 1683⁶ and was father of :

1. Robert Aytoun, *bap.* at Kinglassie on 18 April, 1653.
2. John Aytoun, *b.* on 23 May, 1658.
3. Andrew Aytoun, *bap.* at Kinglassie on 18 September, 1660.

5. Archibald Aytoun, *b.* on 26 December, 1662.
6. Helen Aytoun, *bap.* at Kinglassie on 14 July, 1657, and *m.* Mr. David Scrimgeour, fiar of Cartmore, (*c/m* 19 June, 1682. He survived her and *m.* secondly, to Jean Moncrieff, relict of Dr. John MakGill, who, surviving him, *m.* after his death to John Murray of Bowhill).
7. Margaret Aytoun, *bap.* at Kinglassie on 4 June, 1659.

ALEXANDER AYTON, 6TH OF INCHDAIRNIE, *b.* 12 and *bap.* on 16 January 1662. He was apprenticed to William Blackwood, Merchant in Edinburgh, on 13 September 1676,¹ and was retoured heir to his father on 2 October 1684.² He *m.* at Edinburgh on 25 March 1686, to Margaret, sister of William Hog of Harcass,³ (*c/m* 20 March 1686⁴), and had issue :

1. Roger Ayton, 7th of Inchdairnie, (*see below*).
2. John Aytoun, *bap.* at Kinglassie on 13 April, 1689.
3. William Ayton, *bap.* at Kinglassie on 25 August, 1691, became a Goldsmith in Edinburgh and was entered a Burgess there by right of his father on 11 June, 1718.⁵ He *m.* at Edinburgh on 29 March, 1741, Thomasa, daughter of Mr. Thomas Wemyss, Advocate,⁶ and was father of :

6. David Aytoun, *bap.* at Kinglassie on 18 April, 1694, and was apprenticed to George Cunningham, Surgeon Apothecary in Edinburgh, on 1 March, 1714.⁹

8. Jean Aytoun, *bap.* at Kinglassie on 5 April, 1688.
9. Anna Aytoun, *bap.* at Kinglassie on 20 August, 1690.

ROGER AYTOUN, 7TH OF INCHDAIRNIE, *b.* at Edinburgh on 16 December 1686, and succeeded his father. He *d.* at Edinburgh on 19 March 1740, having been “seized here with an apoplectick fit, and expired in two minutes”¹ having *m.* firstly, Barbara, daughter of James Scott, Sheriff Clerk of Edinburgh, (*c/m* 26 & 31 March, 1716²), and secondly at Edinburgh on 21 April 1723, Euphemia, daughter of Sir John Ramsay of Whitehill.³ He was father of :

1. John Aytoun, 8th of Inchdairnie, (*see below*).
2. William Aytoun, apprenticed to James Graham W.S., and was admitted a Writer to the Signet on 16 December, 1760. He *m.* at Melrose on 3 June, 1766, to Isabella, daughter of Colonel Patrick Edmonstone, of the Marines,⁴ *d.* in May of 1780 and was father of :

2a) Roger Aytoun of Murieston, apprenticed to Samuel Mitchelson, W.S., and was admitted a Writer to the Signet on 8 July, 1790. He was retoured heir to his father in the lands of Gaitmilk, in the parish of Kinglassie, on 19 April 1785, *m.* on 9 March 1807, Joan, daughter of James Keir of Kinmonth, and *d.* on 16 March 1843, aged seventy-six years. He was father of :

2b) William Edmonstone Aytoun, *b.* on 21 June 1813. He was admitted an Advocate on 20 November, 1840, and was appointed to the post of Professor of Rhetoric and Belles-Lettres at the University of Edinburgh, in 1845. He *m.* firstly, on 11 April 1849, Jane Emily, youngest daughter of John Wilson, Professor of Moral Philosophy,⁵ (she *d.* at Edinburgh on 15 April 1859⁶), and secondly, at Edinburgh, on 24 December 1863, to Fearnie Jemima, second daughter of James Kinnear, W.S. He *d.* at Blackhills, near Elgin, on Friday 4 August 1865.⁷

- 2b) Margaret Keith Aytoun, *d.* unmarried at Edinburgh on Friday 15 April 1895.¹
- 2b) Isabella Aytoun, *d.* unmarried at Edinburgh on 20 June 1893.
- 2a) Andrew Aytoun, served as Lieutenant in the Royal Navy and *dsp* prior to October of 1800.
- 2a) James Edmonstone Aytoun, became a Manufacturer at Kinghorn and resided at Abbotshall. He *m.* on 24 November 1808, Mary, daughter of James Peter, Shipmaster in Dundee, (she was retoured heir to her father on 10 February 1825). He was father of :

- 2b) James Aytoun, *b.* 31 March 1816.

2a) Jane Ann Aytoun, was retoured an heir-portioner to her brother Lieutenant Andrew Aytoun on 8 October 1800. She *m.* on 1 September 1802, Robert Graham, 13th of Garvock, and had issue.

JOHN AYTOUN, 8TH OF INCHDAIRNIE, *b.* on 9 July 1728, succeeded his father and *m.* on 6 September, 1746, Isabel, daughter of Robert, 4th Lord Rollo, (she *d.* on 24 November 1751). He had issue :

1. Roger Aytoun, 9th of Inchdairnie, (*see below*).
2. Mary Aytoun, *bab.* on 25 July 1747, *m.* at Edinburgh on Wednesday 4 December 1765, to James, 7th Lord Rollo,¹ (*c/m* 4 June 1783. He *d.* on 14 April 1784), and *d.* on 24 April 1817. They had issue.
3. Euphemia Aytoun, *m.* at Dunning on 15 February, 1767, John Drummond, 3rd of Keltie,² (he *d.* on 18 June 1801), *d.* at Keltie Castle on 10 January 1817,³ and had issue.

ROGER AYTOUN, 9TH OF INCHDAIRNIE, *b.* on 30 March, 1749, *m.* firstly on 3 February 1769, Barbara Minshall, (she *d.* on 20 February 1783), and secondly at Kinglassie on 29 April, 1784, Jean, daughter and heiress of Sir John Sinclair of Balgownie,⁵ (she *d.* on 28 December 1836⁶). He *d.* at Inchdairnie on 23 October 1810,⁷ and was father of :

1. John Aytoun, 10th of Inchdairney, (*see below*).
2. Marriot Chadwick Walker Aytoun, *b.* on 18 March 1787, and served as a Captain in the Royal Artillery. He *m.* on 30 April 1823, Eliza Willimina Miller, (she *d.* at Biarritz, France, on 22 November 1881), *d.* at Coats Crescent, Edinburgh, on 16 February 1854,⁸ and was father of :

- 2a) Roger James Rutherford Aytoun of Ashintully, *b.* 29 May 1824, entered the army and was returned heir to his grand-aunt Janet Rutherford of Ashintully, Perthshire, on 17 December 1850. He *m.* at Aberdeen on 27 January 1852, to Catherine Georgina, second daughter of Patrick Bannerman, Advocate,¹ (she *d.* on 23 October 1856), *d.* at Ashintully Castle on 29 November 1871,² and was father of :
- 2b) Anna Maria Rutherford Aytoun, *b.* 5 August 1853, and *m.* at Perth on 4 October 1881, David Crawford Fullerton Lindsay Carnegie of Boysak.³ She *d.* on 9 September 1922.

- 2b) Isabella Mary Rutherford Aytoun of Ashintully, *b.* on 21 May 1858, and *d.* unmarried in April of 1937.⁴

JOHN AYTOUN, 10TH OF INCHDAIRNIE, *b.* on 5 May, 1785, and succeeded his father and was served heir-male of William Aytoun of Aytoun on 10 April 1829. He *m.* at Glasgow College on Tuesday 15 September 1818, to Margaret Ann, daughter of James Jeffrey, Glasgow University,⁴ (she *d.* on 2 March 1878), and *d.* at Campagne Videl St Marguerite, near Marseilles, France, on 11 November 1831.⁵ He was father of :
