

# BAILIE

## OF PARBROATH

**ROBERT BAILIE OF BALMEDIESIDE**, was father of,

**ANDREW BAILIE OF LUTHRIE AND PARBROATH**, *hap.* on 10 July, 1668, and acquired the lands of Parbroath. He *m.* on 31 March, 1694, to Helen, eldest daughter of William Hamilton of Wishaw,<sup>1</sup> and was father of :

1. Robert Bailie of Parbroath, (*see below*).
2. John Bailie, served as a Physician in the army and *d.* at Flanders in late 1745/January 1746.<sup>2</sup>
3. Helen Bailie, *b.* on 23 January, 1695.
4. Grissell Bailie, *b.* on 4 March, 1697.
5. Mary Bailie, *b.* on 16 October, 1701.
6. Margaret Bailie, *b.* on 22 December, 1704.
7. Helen Bailie, *b.* on 28 August, 1708, and *m.* on 10 November, 1736, to Robert Hamilton, 1<sup>st</sup> of Stevenston, (he survived her and *m.* secondly, to Elizabeth, daughter of William Cunningham of Brownhill, and was buried on 28 November, 1769). She was buried on 22 April, 1758, and had issue.
8. Charlotte Bailie, *b.* on 14 August, 1712.

**ROBERT BAILIE OF PARBROATH**, *b.* on 7 June, 1703, and succeeded his father. He *m.* on 7 January, 1733, Barbara, daughter of Mr Alexander Maitland, son of Charles Maitland, 3<sup>rd</sup> Earl of Lauderdale,<sup>3</sup> (she was widow of Sir Edward Gibson, 2<sup>nd</sup> Baronet of Keirhill, who had *d.* in May of 1727, and by whom she had issue ; and *d.* on 19 June 1782), and had issue :

1. Andrew Bailie, *b.* on 14 November, 1734, and *dsp.*
2. Alexander Bailie of Parbroath, (*see below*).
3. Robert Bailie, *b.* on 9 June, 1740, resided in Carphin and *dsp* prior to 1 June 1807, when his brother Alexander was retoured his heir general.
4. Helen Bailie, *b.* on 3 April, 1737.

**ALEXANDER BAILIE OF PARBROATH & LUTHRIE**, *b.* on 14 October, 1738, and was retoured heir to his father on 20 June 1760. He served as a Colonel in the army, *m.* Euphemia, sister of Robert Hamilton, *de jure* 6<sup>th</sup> Lord Belhaven, and *dsp* at his house in Charlotte Square, Edinburgh, on 7 April, 1814.<sup>1</sup>
