

BARCLAY

OF BRECHIN

SIR DAVID DE BARCLAY OF CARNY, was second son of Hugh de Barclay of Towie and is said to have been *k.* at the battle of Bannockburn in June of 1314. He was father of :

1. Sir David Barclay of Carny and Brechin, (*see below*).
2. David de Barclay, ancestor of the Barclays of Collernie, (*see Barclay of Collernie*).
3. A daughter, *m.* Sir Alexander de Lindsay.

SIR DAVID BARCLAY OF CARNY AND BRECHIN, succeeded his father and *m.* Margaret, daughter and heiress of David, Lord Brechin, to whom he granted a charter for his lands of Carny Barclay, Carny Murcha, Ochtermozie, Thorr, Kindesleffs, Edalston and Hyndeford on 26 March, 1315.¹ He *d.* in 1350/1 and was father of :

1. Sir David de Barclay of Brechin, (*see below*).
2. Jean Barclay, *m.* Sir David Fleming of Biggar and Cumbernauld, and had issue.

SIR DAVID DE BARCLAY OF BRECHIN, succeeded his father and *m.* Janet, daughter of Sir Edward Keith of Sinton. He *d.* prior to 8 September, 1368, and was father of an only child :

MARGARET BARCLAY, *m.* Walter Stewart, Earl of Atholl and Caithness.
