

BRUCE

OF KENNET & BURLEIGH

DAVID BRUCE, 1ST OF GREEN, was a younger son of Sir David Bruce of Clackmannan and had acquired the lands of Green by 30 January, 1536, when he was witness to a charter by John Brown granting to Alexander Schaw of Sauchie the lands of Balquharn. He *d.* by 12 June 1556, and was father of :

1. Patrick Bruce, 2nd of Green, succeeded his father in the lands of Green by May of 1556 when he acted as bailie in two Sasines by which Riobert Bruce was infeft in the lands of Wester Kennet and others as heir to his deceased father. He was father of :

1a) David Bruce, 3rd of Green, succeeded his father by 6 February 1581, when he was a member of the inquest at the retour of Robert Bruce, as heir to Margaret Bruce, his mother,¹ and *d.* in February of 1598. He was father of,

1b) Robert Bruce, acted as executor to his father following his death in 1598.

1b) Janet Bruce, mentioned in her father's Testament.

2. Archibald Bruce, (*see below*).

ARCHIBALD BRUCE OF WESTER KENNET, *m.* firstly, Margaret, only daughter and heiress of Robert Bruce of Wester Kennet, (*c/m* 16 June 1568.² She *d.* in September of 1579), with whom he obtained the lands of Kennet. He *d.* in 1609 and was father of :

1. Robert Bruce of Wester Kennet, (*see below*).

2. Agnes Bruce, *m.* at Clackmannan on 3 July 1604, Jasper Smith, in Clackmannan.

3. Marion Bruce, *m.* at Clackmannan in August of 1602, Patrick Blackadder of Millhill.

4. Archibald Bruce, was executor to his father following his death in 1609.

5. Norman Bruce, *bap.* at Clackmannan on 29 April 1599.

He was also father of a natural son :

6. John Bruce, became a Saddler in Edinburgh and is styled as natural brother to Robert Bruce, fiar of Wester Kennet, in his Testament in 1606.

ROBERT BRUCE, FIAR OF WESTER KENNET, returned heir to his mother, Margaret Bruce, in the lands of Kennet and others, on 6 February 1580/1,¹ and in which he was infeft on 2 April 1596.² He *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of Alexander Gaw of Maw, (*c/m* 30 July 1599³), *d. vitae patris* in 1606, and had issue :

1. Robert Bruce of Wester Kennet, (*see below*).

2. Andrew Bruce, 1st of Woodside, is said to have been a son of Robert Bruce of Wester Kennet. He obtained the lands of Woodside and *m.* Katherine Kay with whom he had Sasine for the lands of Schanbothy on 26 December, 1657. He *d.* by April of 1672 and had issue :

2a) Robert Bruce, 2nd of Woodside, *bap.* at Alloa on 5 December, 1642, succeeded his father and was infeft as his heir on the lands of Schanbothy on 22 April 1672.⁴ He served with the rank of Captain and was *k.* in Flander in 1677.⁵

2a) Harie Bruce, *bap.* at Alloa on 1 October, 1648.

2a) Charles Bruce, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 14 March, 1662.

2a) John Bruce, apprenticed to David Boyd, Merchant in Edinburgh, on 9 December, 1674.

2a) Catherine Bruce, *bap.* at Alloa on 26 January, 1651.

2a) Jean Bruce, *bap.* at Alloa on 29 September, 1664.

2a) Christian Bruce, had an Assignation for the lands of Schanbothy from her brother Robert Bruce of Woodside on 22 April, 1672, as security for her share of 4000 merks due from her parents and which she is styled as his youngest sister.⁶

4. Marjory Bruce, named with his sister Margaret daughters in their father's Will.

ROBERT BRUCE OF WESTER KENNET, was infeft in the lands of Wester Kennet as heir to his father on 11 March 1617,¹ and obtained the lands of Easter Kennet from Robert Bruce, fiar of Clackmannan, by Disposition dated 6 July 1642,² followed by those Schanbothy from James Stewart of Rosyth, on 11 August 1647, with infeftment on 7 September following.³ He *m.* at Dunfermline on 17 April, 1627, Agnes, daughter of Patrick Murray, 1st of Pardewis, (she *d.* in March of 1664⁴), *d.* after 9 November 1670, and before 13 July 1671, and was father of :

1. Robert Bruce, *bap.* at Clackmannan on 26 April 1628, and *d.* in infancy.

2. David Bruce of Kennet, (*see below*).

3. Alexander Bruce of Gartlet, *bap.* at Clackmannan on 13 June 1637, and had a Disposition from his father for the lands of Garlet on 11 June, 1668, with infeftment following on 9 November 1670⁵. He was educated at the University of Edinburgh from where he graduated Master of Arts on 26 July, 1657, and was ordained Minister of Stirling on 24 July, 1690. He afterwards settled in Ireland and was appointed Minister of Donaghadeem. He *m.* at Edinburgh on 17 April 1677, Margaret, daughter of James Clelland of Stoneypath, *d.* at Venecash, near Belfast, on 16 April 1704, and was father of :

3a) Alexander Bruce of Garlet, entered a Cherurgeon Apothecary Burgess of Edinburgh by right of his father on 18 December 1700. He *m.* firstly, at Edinburgh on 2 April 1700, to Grisel, daughter of Mr. James Lafreise of Barvennan, and secondly, on 16 September 1708, to Anna, daughter of John Stewart of Shawood, (she survived him and *m.* secondly at Edinburgh on 2 December 1716, to Mr. Archibald Campbell, Minister at Wemyss). He *d.* on 22 September 1715, and was father of :

3b) William Bruce, *b.* on 13 January, 1706, was retoured heir to his uncle David Bruce on 9 January 1728, and is then styled as son of Alexander Bruce, Surgeon in Edinburgh, with his uncle David being styled as son of Alexander Bruce of Gartlet. He is said to have *dsp.*

3b) Robert Bruce, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 22 November 1709.

3b) Alexander Bruce, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 1 March 1711.

3a) David Bruce, *bap.* at Burntisland on 4 May 1685, and *dsp* prior to January of 1728, when his nephew William Bruce was retoured his heir.

3a) James Bruce, was retoured heir to his sister Mary Bruce on 9 January 1728, and lived for most of his life in the Barbados where he was appointed a Judge of the Court of Common Pleas, and served as representative of the parish of St. Andrew in the Assembly. He *d.* at Fenchurch Street, London, on his way to Scotland on Tuesday 19 September 1749,¹ having *m.* Keturah, daughter of Joseph French, by whom he had issue :

3b) Joseph Osborne Bruce, *b.* in 1723, and served as one of the Judges at Barbadoes. He *m.* at Saint James, Barbadoes, on 27 August 1752, to Jane, daughter of General Samuel Barwick, Governor of Barbadoes, *d.* at Saint James, Barbadoes, on 24 March 1786,² and was father of :

3c) Barwick Bruce, became a Physician on the island of Barbadoes and *m.* at Saint Michael, Barbadoes, on 6 November 1777, to Amabel, daughter of Nathaniel Walrond, (she *d.* at Hartford, Connecticut, on 29 July 1841). He *d.* at Hartford, Connecticut, USA, on 13 May 1841, in his 85th year,³ and was father of :

3d) Alexander Bruce, *bap.* at Saint Michael, Barbadoes, on 18 April 1782.

3d) Samuel Barwick Bruce, *b.* at Saint Michael, Barbadoes, on 8 January 1786, and became a distinguished army surgeon, being present at various battles including that of Waterloo, in 1815, afterwards settling in Ripon, Yorkshire. He *m.* firstly, at Saint Peter, Barbadoes, on 19 February, 1807, to Susan Rollock, daughter of General Skinner, (she *d.* on 4 May 1808), by whom he had issue ; and secondly, at York on 2 December 1819, to Jane, daughter of William Downing, of Studley, and *d.* at Grosvenor Square, London, on Friday 24 December 1852.⁴ He was father of :

3a) Jacob Skinner Bruce, who entered the Civil Service and was drowned at Grenada on 12 December 1833.

3e) William Downing Bruce, became a Barrister-at-Law and was appointed Vice Consul for the Oriental Republic of Uruguay, in

1856. He *m.* at the British Embassy, Paris, on Tuesday 9 November 1847, to Louisa Emily, daughter of William Plomber, of Linbourn,¹ and was father of :

3f} William Alexander Beresford Barwick Bruce, *b.* on 31 August 1852, and *d.* on 5 December 1855.²

3f} James Alexander Beresford Barwick Bruce, *b.* on 23 February 1861, and became a Barrister. He *d.* unmarried.

3f} Edward Walrond De Wells Bruce, *b.* on 27 June 1863, entered the Royal Navy and *m.* in 1903, to Amy Cecilia Timms. He *d.* at Harrow on 5 January 1943.

3f} David *BAP.* S. Bruce, *b.* in 1865.

3f} Louisa K. Bruce, *b.* in 1855.

3f} Alice F. B. Bruce, *b.* in 1856.

3f} Margaret Cleland Bruce, *b.* on 14 December 1857, and *d.* unmarried at Bath on 15 July 1929.

3f} Rachel C B E Bruce, *b.* in 1870.

3e} Robert Cathcart Dalrymple Bruce, *b.* in 1827, and served as Captain in the 82nd Regiment. He *m.* at St. John's Episcopal Church, Edinburgh, on Thursday 30 April 1857, to Helen, only child of John Dunlop,³ *d.* at Chelsea on 9 November 1881,⁴ and had issue,

3e} Elizabeth Jane Bruce,

3e} Amabel Emma Bruce,

3d} Nathaniel French Bruce, *bap.* at Saint Michael, Barbadoes, on 11 December 1791, and settled at New York.

3d} Frances Larogue Bruce, *bap.* at Saint Michael, Barbadoes, on 7 January 1780, and *d.* in circa June of 1852.⁵

3d} Elizabeth Ann Bruce, *bap.* at Saint Michael, Barbadoes, on 26 May 1783, and *d.* in infancy.

- 3d) Elizabeth Keturah Bruce, *bap.* at Saint Michael, Barbadoes, on 21 November 1784, and *m.* James Beresford, Royal York Rangers. She *d.* on 3 March 1852, in her 68th year,¹ having had issue.
- 3d) Mabel Dalrymple Bruce, *bap.* at Saint Michael, Barbadoes, on 21 December 1799.
- 3b) Alexander Bruce, practiced as a Physician in Edinburgh and was father of :
- 3c) Keturah Shepherd Bruce, *m.* William Murray, of the Civil Service, and *d.* at Barbadoes on 31 March 1852, in her 84th year.²

- DAVID BRUCE OF KENNET**, *bap.* at Clackmannan on 15 May 1631, and succeeded his father. He *m.* Marjory, daughter of David Young of Kirkton, (*c/m* 12 & 25 June 1656), *d.* after 22 April 1672, and prior to 19 March 1673, and had issue :

1. **DAVID BRUCE OF KENNET**, who was a minor at his father's death and was retoured his heir in the barony of Schanbothie on 19 March 1673.¹ He *dsp* prior to 20 January 1704 and was succeeded by his brother James.

4. Charles Bruce, *bap.* at Clackmannan on 24 June, 1671.
5. George Bruce, *bap.* at Clackmannan on 16 July, 1672.

JAMES BRUCE OF KENNET, led a military career prior to succeeding his brother and attained the rank of Brigadier-General. He was retoured heir to Marjory Young, his mother, on 20 November 1714, *m.* in 1690, Mary, daughter of Sir Alexander Swinton, Lord Mersington, (she was widow of John Fletcher of Aberlady, whom she had *m.* on 22 April, 1686, and by whom she had issue), and *d.* in August of 1728. He was father of :

1. Alexander Bruce of Kennet, (*see below*).
2. John Bruce, was admitted Minister of Airth on 28 September 1728, and *m.* Jean, daughter of James Bruce of Powfoulis. He *d.* on 13 September 1741, and had issue :
 - 2a) Alexander Bruce, *bap.* at Airth on 4 June 1738, and *dsp.*
 - 2a) John Bruce, *bap.* at Airth on 20 January 1740, and was served heir to his father on 27 November 1771.
 - 2a) James Bruce, one of the heirs portioners to his father on 27 November 1771.
 - 2a) Ann Bruce, *m.* John Forbes of Newhall, and, with her sister Jean, was retoured heir to her father in 1771.
 - 2a) Jane Bruce, an heir portioner to her father on 27 November 1771.
3. William Henry Bruce, *bap.* on 10 July, 1695, attained the rank of Captain in the Royal Navy and *dsp.*
4. James Bruce, was admitted a Member of the Faculty of Advocates on 15 July 1715, and was appointed Master of the Mint in Scotland. He *m.* Mary Cross, (*c/m* 16 November 1730), *d.* on 28 May 1734, and had issue.

5. Alison Bruce, *m.* at Clackmannan on 6 December, 1718, George Dundas of Dundas, (he was *b.* on 15 July, 1690, and *d.* in May of 1762), and *d.* at Dundas House on 31 July 1754, in her 60th year.¹
6. Mary Bruce, *d.* unmarried.
7. Jean Bruce, clandestinely *m.* in June of 1720, to John Edgar, Advocate, (he *d.* on 9 September 1744), and *d.* at Queensferry on 6 April 1769.²

ALEXANDER BRUCE OF KENNET, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 19 June 1691, and attained the rank of Brigadier-General in the army. He *m.* in 1714, Mary, second daughter of Robert, 4th Lord Balfour of Burleigh, (she *d.* at Kerse on 7 November 1758), *d.* at Dundas House on 8 August 1747,³ and was father of :

1. James Bruce, *d.* young.
2. Robert Bruce of Kennet, (*see below*).
3. James Bruce, who *dsp.*
4. Margaret Bruce, *b.* at Edinburgh on 4 October 1716, and *m.* on 9 April 1738, Laurence Dundas of Kerse, second son of Thomas Dundas of Fingask, (*c/m* 7 April 1738⁴). She *d.* at Elderslie on 11 December 1802, and had issue.

ROBERT BRUCE OF KENNET, *b.* at Edinburgh on 28 December 1718, and was served heir to his father in the barony of Schanbothy on 13 July 1748. He was admitted an Advocate, and was appointed an Ordinary Lord of Session and a Senator of the College of Justice as Lord Kennet on 4 July 1764. He *m.* at Clackmannan on 6 June 1754, Helen, eldest daughter of George Abercromby, 2nd of Tulliebody, *d.* at Kennet on 8 April 1785,⁵ and was father of :

1. Alexander Bruce of Kennet, (*see below*).
2. Robert Bruce, *dsp* in 1769
3. George Bruce, *bap.* at Clackmannan on 28 May 1756, and *dsp.*

4. Balfour Bruce, *bap.* at Clackmannan on 29 May 1757, and *dsp.*
5. Laurence Dundas Bruce, *b.* on 26 March 1761, and *dsp.*
6. James Bruce, *bap.* at Clackmannan on 5 January 1763.
7. Thomas Bruce, *bap.* at Clackmannan on 29 January 1764, *m.* at Clackmannan on 15 April, 1798, Margaret, daughter of Robert Ramsay of Blackcraig, and *dsp.*
8. Ralph Bruce, *b.* on 8 February 1768, and served as a Lieutenant-Colonel in the 57th Regiment.
9. Burnet Bruce, *bap.* at Clackmannan on 13 January 1771, was admitted a Member of the Faculty of Advocates and *dsp* Edinburgh on 2 June 1813.¹
10. Mary Bruce, *bap.* at Clackmannan on 11 October, 1759, and *d.* unmarried at Edinburgh on 1 November 1841.²
11. Margaret Bruce, *bap.* at Clackmannan on 28 April, 1766, and *m.* at Edinburgh on 12 October 1792, Walter Watson, late of Jamaica.³

ALEXANDER BRUCE OF KENNET, *b.* on 17 July 1755, and *m.* on 15 February 1793, Hugh, daughter of Hugh Blackburn, Merchant in Glasgow, (she was *b.* on 13 August 1768, and *d.* at Edinburgh in December of 1851). He *d.* on 12 June 1808, and had issue :

1. Robert Bruce of Kennet, (*see below*).
2. George Abercromby Bruce, *b.* on 7 March 1799, and *dsp* at Jamaica on 14 November 1817.
3. Hugh Bruce, *b.* on 10 January and *bap.* at Clackmannan on 8 February 1800, and was admitted an Advocate on 2 June 1821. He *dsp* on 10 January 1874.
4. Laurence Dundas Bruce, *b.* on 16 November and *bap.* at Clackmannan on 12 December 1800. He was appointed Midshipman on the "Glasgow" and *dsp* at Deptford on 3 November 1817.⁴
5. Alexander Bruce, was a twin with Laurence and was *b.* on 16 November and *bap.* at Clackmannan on 12 December 1800. He *d.* in infancy.
6. Alexander Bruce, *bap.* at Clackmannan on 7 November 1804, and *d.* at Kennet on 27 March 1809.⁵
7. William Bruce, *b.* on 24th and *bap.* at Clackmannan on 30 March, 1806, and *m.* at Preston Hall on 20 May, 1834, Louisa, daughter of William Thomas Hall, of Marpool Hall, Devonshire,¹ (she *d.* in 1899). He *d.* at Moray Place, Edinburgh, on 29 May 1858,² and was father of :

- 7a) Robert Alexander Bruce, *b.* on 4 July 1835, and *d.* on 1 January 1837.
- 7a) William Thomas Bruce, *b.* on 1 September 1836, and *dsp* at Beechworth, Australia, on 12 April 1858.³
- 7a) Harriet Mary Bruce, *b.* on 18 November 1839, and *d.* at Deene House, Pultney Hill, London, on 4 August 1894.⁴
- 7a) Louisa Keith Bruce, *b.* on 19 September 1847, and *m.* at St. Jude's Church, Suth Kensington, London, on 26 1883, to Thomas Pelham, third son of Henry Thomas Pelham, Earl of Chichester,⁵ (he *d.* on 23 December 1916).
8. Helen Bruce, *bap.* at Clackmannan on 16 June 1803, *m.* at Moray Place, Edinburgh, on 22 March 1848, Robert Handyside, Advocate,⁶ (he *d.* on 17 April 1858), and *d.* on 13 December 1878.
9. Margaret Bruce, *bap.* at Clackmannan on 31 May 1807, and *d.* unmarried on 24 July 1881.

ROBERT BRUCE OF KENNET, *bap.* at Clackmannan on 8 December 1795, and served in the Grenadier Guards during the Peninsula Campaign and up to the battle of Waterloo on 18 June 1815. He put forward a claim to the dormant Lordship of Balfour of Burleigh but died before the case could be decided. He *m.* firstly on 10 April, 1825, Anne, daughter of William Murray of Touchadam, (she *d.* at Kennet on 19 May 1846⁷), by whom he had no issue ; and secondly, at Charlotte Square, Edinburgh, on 25 April, 1848, Jane Dalrymple Hamilton, daughter of Sir James Ferguson of Kilkerran.⁸ He *d.* at Kennet House on Saturday 13 August 1864,⁹ having had issue by his second wife :

1. Alexander Hugh Bruce of Kennet and 10th Lord Balfour of Burleigh, (*see below*).

2. Henrietta Anne Bruce, *b.* on 26 June and was *bap.* at Clackmannan on 28 July 1850. She *m.* at Kennet on Thursday 26 November 1874, Claud Hamilton of Preston Hall,¹ *d.* at Dunmore Park, near Falkirk, on 27 January 1911,² and had issue.

ALEXANDER HUGH BRUCE OF KENNET AND 10TH LORD BALFOUR OF BURLEIGH, *b.* on 13 January and *bap.* at Clackmannan on 18 February 1849. He continued his father's claim to the Balfour of Burleigh peerage and by act of parliament on 19 March 1869, he became 10th Lord. He *m.* on 21 November 1876, Catherine Eliza, daughter of George Gordon, 5th Earl of Aberdeen, (she *d.* on 27 January 1911), *d.* at Cadogan Square, London, on 6 July 1921,³ and had issue :

1. Robert Bruce, Master of Burleigh, *b.* at Edinburgh on 25 September 1880, and was commissioned into the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders on 18 April 1900, being gazetted Lieutenant in May 1903, and then Captain in 1910. He was *ksp* in trench action at Le Cateau on 26 August 1914, having been engaged to marry Cicely Blair, daughter of Blair of Blair.⁴
2. George John Gordon Bruce, 11th Lord Balfour of Burleigh, (*see below*).
3. Mary Bruce, *b.* on 24 August 1877, and *m.* on 26 April 1910, Sir John Augustus Hope, of Craighall. She *d.* on 18 February 1957, having had issue.
4. Jean Hamilton Bruce, *b.* on 18 March 1879, and *d.* unmarried at Egerton Crescent, London, on 15 January 1939.⁵
