

CAMPBELL

OF AUCHLYNE

DUNCAN CAMPBELL, 1ST OF AUCHLYNE, was eighth son of Sir Robert Campbell, 9th of Glenorchy, and was *b.* in 1631. He obtained the lands of Auchlyne, in Glen Dochart, from his father and *m.* at Kenmore on 4 May, 1656, Christian, daughter of Walter Dalgleish,¹ (she *d.* in 1698), in which entry he is styled as son to Sir Robert Campbell, of Glenorchy. He *d.* in 1703 and was father of :

1. Robert Campbell, 2nd of Auchlyne, (*see below*).
2. Duncan Campbell, was apprenticed to David Sommers, Pewtherer in Edinburgh, on 13 August, 1718.²
3. Alexander Campbell, resided in Edinchip and was infeft in the lands of Edravounich and Mill of Ledcharrie in return for a heritable bond to John, Earl of Breadalbane, on 28 November, 1696.³
4. Colin Campbell, who, with his brother Alexander, are styled as brothers of Robert Campbell, fiar of Auchlyne, in a Petition by Ensign William Campbell to the Earl of Breadalbane complaining against their behavior on 15 January, 1696.⁴
5. John Campbell, *m.* Margaret Whyte, (*c/m* 1 December, 1685.⁵ She was widow of Colin Campbell, brother of Alexander Campbell of Wester Ardeonaig).
6. Christian Campbell, *bap.* at Dunfermline on 10 May, 1663, *m.* Hugh Campbell, portioner of Ledcharrie, (*c/m* at Killin on 6 January, 1680), and had issue.
7. Catherine Campbell, *m.* John MacIntyre, eldest son of Donald MacIntyre, Wadsetter in Letterbaine, with whom she had an Instrument of Sasine following on an earlier contract of marriage for the lands of Lettermore, Letterbeg, and Innischonnan on 29 May, 1693.⁶
8. Susanna Campbell, *m.* at Linlithgow on 27 September, 1702, Alexander Dalgleish, Minister of Linlithgow,¹ (he was widow of Jean Marshall who had *d.* in 1701 and *d.* in 1726), and had issue.

9. Agnes Campbell, *m.* at Edinburgh on 2 December, 1714, Alexander Robertson, Merchant Burgess of Edinburgh.²

ROBERT CAMPBELL, 2ND OF AUCHLYNE, *bap.* at Dunfermline on 10 February, 1659, and was apprenticed to George Home, Merchant in Edinburgh, on 5 January, 1676.³ He entered into a contract of Wadset with John Campbell, Earl of Breadalbane, for the Mill of Auchlyne on 6 June, 1707, *m.* Agnes, daughter of James Goodlatt of Abbotshaugh, and was father of :

1. Duncan Campbell, 3rd of Auchlyne, (*see below*).
2. John Campbell, *bap.* at Killin on 24 December, 1696.
3. Robert Campbell, *bap.* at Killin on 29 July, 1710.
4. William Campbell, *bap.* at Killin on 28 October, 1712.
5. Alexander Campbell, became a Jeweler in Edinburgh and was admitted a Burgess there by right of his father on 9 August, 1738.⁴
6. Agnes Campbell, *m.* on 22 April, 1712, Colin Campbell, *fiar* of Glenfalloch, eldest son and heir of Robert Campbell, 2nd of Glenfalloch (he *d.* on 10 August, 1737), and had issue.
7. Jean Campbell, *b.* 1705, *m.* Robert Stewart, 1st of Dercluich, (*c/m* 24 April 1729. He *d.* on 22 May, 1767), and *d.* on 23 February 1788, having had issue.

DUNCAN CAMPBELL, 3RD OF AUCHLYNE, was included in his father's contract of Wadset of the Mill of Auchlyne on 6 June, 1707, and is styled as then being a minor. He succeeded his father, *m.* on 4 July, 1729, Louisa, daughter of John Campbell, 5th of Achalader, (she was *bap.* on 1 July, 1713, and *d.* in 1791), and was father of :

1. James Goodlatt Campbell, 4th of Auchlyne, (*see below*).
2. John Campbell, *bap.* at Killin on 23 January, 1737.
3. Catherine Campbell, *m.* on 28 February, 1758, Captain Lachlan MacPherson of Nuid.⁵

4. Agnes Campbell, *bap.* at Killin on 23 March, 1734, and *m.* on 12 December 1755, James Stewart of Dercluich, (he *m.* secondly in 1778, Margaret, daughter and heiress of Duncan Robertson of Edradynate, and had issue). She *d.* on 12 February 1778,
5. Jean Campbell, *bap.* at Killin on 17 October, 1735.
6. Louisa Campbell, *bap.* at Killin on 27 March, 1749, and *m.* Mr. Robert MacPherson, Chaplain to the 28th Regiment of Foot and Tacksman of Dalchully.
7. Persill Campbell, *bap.* at Killin on 17 November, 1750.
8. Arabella Campbell, *m.* on 20 February, 1778, Duncan Stewart, Minister of Balquhider, (he *d.* on 12 September, 1804), and *d.* on 12 July, 1805, leaving issue.
9. Margaret Campbell, to whom and her sisters Louisa and Arabella, their mother granted a Deed of Settlement on 28 May 1791. She *m.* by May of 1791, to Colin Campbell, Collector of Customs at Fort William.

JAMES GOODLATT CAMPBELL, 4TH OF AUCHLYNE, *bap.* at Killin on 20 March, 1731, succeeded his father and granted a Renunciation of the lands of Mill of Auchlyne on 22 June, 1770. He purchased the lands of Glenbeich, Carnlea, Dalveich and Auchraw from Alexander Campbell of Fonab on 6 August, 1765, *m.* at Edinburgh on 12 August, 1753, Janet, daughter and eventual heiress of Hugh Logan of that Ilk, (she was retoured heir of her brother Hugh Logan of that Ilk, in the lands of Logan in 1803, and *d.* on 3 May 1803), *d.* on 4 January 1785,¹ and was father of :

1. Duncan Campbell, *bap.* at Killin on 1 February, 1758, and *d. young*
2. Duncan Campbell, *bap.* at Killin on 9 May, 1764, and *dsp.*
3. **HUGH GOODLAT CAMPBELL OF LOGAN**, *bap.* at Killin on 26 November, 1766, became a Merchant in Glasgow and succeeded to his maternal lands of Logan. He was served heir to his father on 6 July, 1803, and *dsp* by 20 March, 1827, when his sisters were served his heir.
4. James Campbell, *bap.* at Killin on 28 March, 1769, and *dsp.*
5. John James Campbell, *bap.* at Killin in February of 1776, and was named in a disposition by his brother Hugh Goodlat Campbell dated 14 November 1803, by which he sold the lands of Auchyle to Patrick Campbell of Achalader.
6. Agnes Campbell, *d.* unmarried at Clober Hill on 28 January 1806.²
7. Katherine Campbell, living in 1803 and *m.* Alexander Black, Brewer in Glasgow.

8. Andrea Campbell, *bap.* at Killin on 6 April, 1761, *m.* firstly, Robert Bog, Merchant in Greenock, and secondly, on 25 February 1822, to Lewis Morris, Merchant in Bristol, and was served heir to her brother Hugh Goodlat Campbell, on 20 March 1827.
9. Willhelmina Campbell, *m.* Robert Stewart of Clochfoldich, and was served heir to her brother Hugh Goodlat Campbell of Logan on 20 March, 1827. She *d.* at Clochfoldich on 17 March 1847, and had issue.
10. Elizabeth Campbell, was served heir to her brother Hugh Campbell of Logan on 20 March, 1827, and *d.* unmarried at Portobello on 28 October 1848.¹
11. Janet Campbell, *m.* at Edinburgh on 28 April, 1789, Andrew MacKenzie, Writer in Edinburgh, second son of Kenneth MacKenzie, Professor of Law at Edinburgh University, second son of John MacKenzie, 1st of Delvine.
12. Louisa Campbell, *d.* unmarried on 9 July 1798.
