

# CAMPBELL

## OF JURA

**DUNCAN CAMPBELL OF SANNAIG AND BAILIE OF JURA**, is styled as son of the deceased Alexander Campbell of Lochnell when he granted a discharge on behalf of his niece Isobel MacNeil on 12 January 1649.<sup>1</sup> On 27 June 1666, he entered into a wadset with Archibald, Earl of Argyll, for the lands of Largiebreck, Feoling, Knockbreck and various fishing rights, and also binding he and his heirs and assignees in the offices of bailie, chamberlain and forester of the Isle of Jura.<sup>2</sup> He *d.* on 2 May 1695, in his 99<sup>th</sup> year<sup>3</sup> having *m.* firstly, Mary, daughter of Sir Donald Campbell of Ardnamurchan,<sup>4</sup> and secondly, to Mary, daughter of Hector MacLean of Torloisk, and was father of :

1. John Campbell, 2<sup>nd</sup> of Jura, (*see below*).
2. Archibald Campbell, to whom his father granted a Bond for 100 merks Scots on 29 July 1692. He *m.* Mary, daughter of Archibald Campbell, fiar of Ardchattan, (*c/m* 6 January 1685. She was widow of Alexander Campbell of Kilnanalen<sup>5</sup>).
3. Allan Campbell, became a Merchant and *m.* Catherine, daughter of Lachlan MacLaine of Lochbuie, (*c/m* 2 February 1703<sup>6</sup>), and *d.* prior to 7 June 1728.<sup>7</sup>
4. Duncan Campbell, was witness with his brother John to a Bond by their father to their brother Archibald for 100 merks Scots, dated 29 July 1692.<sup>8</sup>
5. Neil Campbell, who was father of,
  - 5a) Mary Campbell, *m.* Colin Agey, son of Robert Agey in Persobolss, (*c/m* 1 August 1721<sup>9</sup>).
6. Margaret Campbell, *m.* by 12 July 1687, to John Campbell of Inverliver.

7. Isabella Campbell, *m.* Dugald Campbell of Melfort, and had issue.

**JOHN CAMPBELL, OF SANNAIG AND BAILIE OF JURA**, succeeded his father and *m.* Catheirne, daughter of Colin Campbell of Lochnell, (*c/m* 29 April 1680. She *d.* on 17 March 1726, in her 68<sup>th</sup> year<sup>1</sup>). He *d.* on 18 July 1736, and was father of :

1. Archibald Campbell, 3<sup>rd</sup> of Jura, (*see below*).
2. Ann Campbell, *m.* Alexander Campbell of Ardslnish, younger son of Alexander Campbell of Lochnell, (*c/m* 7 March 1721<sup>2</sup>), and had issue.

**ARCHIBALD CAMPBELL, 3<sup>RD</sup> OF JURA**, the only son, succeeded his father and *d.* on 4 January 1764, aged 80 years.<sup>3</sup> He *m.* firstly, Barbara, eldest daughter of Archibald Campbell of Inverawe, (*c/m* 7 March 1721<sup>4</sup>) by whom he was father of :

1. Duncan Campbell, younger of Jura, the eldest son to whom his father granted a Disposition for his heritable estate at the time of his death on 7 August 1742, and who on 18 March 1755, granted a Disposition to his brother Archibald for a number of debts due to him,<sup>5</sup> He *dsp* by 24 May 1757, when his brother Archibald is styled as eldest son and heir to their father.
2. Archibald Campbell of Jura, (*see below*).
3. Catherine Campbell, *m.* George Campbell of Ellister, (*c/m* 6 November 1752<sup>6</sup>).

He *m.* secondly, Florence, daughter of Lachlan MacLachlan of Strathlachlan, (*c/m* 23 April 1762.<sup>7</sup> She *d.* on 31 January 1805, aged 82 years<sup>8</sup>), by whom he had no issue.

**ARCHIBALD CAMPBELL OF JURA, b.** at Inveraray on 28 October 1744,<sup>1</sup> succeeded his father and *m.* Sarah, daughter of James Campbell of Tofts, (*c/m* 7 February 1770.<sup>2</sup> She *d.*

on 20 October 1816). He *d.* at Jura House on 15 July 1835, in his 91<sup>st</sup> year,<sup>3</sup> and was father of :

1. Archibald Campbell, younger of Jura, entered the army and was raised to Lieutenant-Colonel of the 84<sup>th</sup> Regiment. He *d.* at Bangalore on 14 April 1817.<sup>4</sup>
2. **JAMES CAMPBELL OF JURA**, succeeded his father on his death in July of 1835, and *d.* unmarried at Jura House on 2 December 1838.<sup>5</sup>
3. John Kirkpatrick Campbell of Glenfeochan, was admitted a member of the Society of Writers to the Signet on 25 November 1796, and *m.* on 29 July 1817, to Mary, daughter of Alexander Campbell, Tobago,<sup>6</sup> (she *d.* at Portobello on 16 July 1836<sup>7</sup>). He *d.* on 28 April 1826,<sup>8</sup> and was father of :
  - 3a) Mary Kirkpatrick Aiskell Campbell, *b.* on 4 May 1824.
4. Colin Campbell of Jura, (*see below*).
5. Anna Penelope Campbell, *m.* at Levenside, on 1797, Robert Dennistoun, Merchant in Glasgow, (*c/m* 2 October 1797<sup>9</sup>).
6. Barbara Campbell, *m.* Alexander Campbell, Merchant in Glasgow, (*c/m* 16 August – 1 September 1800<sup>10</sup>).

**COLIN CAMPBELL OF JURA**, *b.* on 8 November 1772, and succeeded his brother James on his death in 1838. He *m.* on 6 August 1806, to Isabella Hamilton Dundas, daughter of Richard Dennistoun of Kelvin Grove, Glasgow, (she *d.* at West Coates House,

Edinburgh, on 15 January 1861<sup>1</sup>). He *d.* at Craignish Castle on 6 September 1848,<sup>2</sup> and was father of :

1. **ARCHIBALD CAMPBELL OF JURA**, *b.* on 9 December 1808, succeeded his father on his death in 1848, and *d.* unmarried at Edinburgh on 11 November 1851.<sup>3</sup>
2. **RICHARD DENNISTOUN CAMPBELL OF JURA**, *b.* on 16 May 1810, succeeded his brother Archibald on his death and *d.* unmarried at Jura House on 4 November 1878.<sup>4</sup>
3. Colin Campbell, served a Major in the 91<sup>st</sup> Regiment and *m.* at St. Helena on 6 April 1841, to Eleanor, eldest daughter of Robert Seale, Colonial Secretary of St. Helena, (she *d.* at Bordeaux, France, on 8 May 1855<sup>5</sup>).<sup>6</sup> He *d.* at Clifton on 15 June 1872,<sup>7</sup> and was father of an only child :
  - 3a) Isabella Eleanor Campbell, *m.* firstly, at St. John's Episcopal Church, Edinburgh, on 15 October 1863, to Smith Hill Child, 4<sup>th</sup> Dragoon Guards, eldest son of Smith Chil of Stallington Hall,<sup>8</sup> and secondly, at the British Embassy, Paris, on 21 May 1873, to Rev. James Royds of Woodlands.<sup>9</sup>
4. James Campbell of Jura, (*see below*).
5. John Campbell, *b.* at Glasgow on 13 August 1822, *m.* at Edinburgh on 3 January 1845, to Margaret Landles, eldest daughter of Alexander Hogg, Berwick-upon-Tweed,<sup>10</sup> and *d.* at Edinburgh on 18 February 1871.<sup>11</sup> He had issue :
  - 5a) John Campbell, *d.* at Edinburgh on 26 December 1849, aged three months.<sup>12</sup>
  - 5a) John Campbell, *b.* on 26 January 1852.
  - 5a) Richard Campbell, *d.* at London on 18 December 1876, aged 20.<sup>13</sup>
  - 5a) Jura Colina Augusta Campbell, *b.* at Edinburgh on 2 November 1845.
  - 5a) Isabella Hamilton Dennistoun Campbell, *b.* at Edinburgh on 6 December 1847.

- 5a) Margaret Alexandrina Campbell, *b.* on 8 May 1854, *m.* at Ayr on 22 April 1881, to John Shannon, California,<sup>1</sup> and *d.* at Tom Green, Texas, on 13 December 1931.<sup>2</sup>
6. Christiana Alston Campbell, *b.* on 22 May 1812, and *m.* at Albyn Place, Edinburgh, on 28 April 1831, to James Meiklam of Cairnbrae,<sup>3</sup> (*c/m* 27 April 1831<sup>4</sup>). They had issue.
7. Sarah Campbell, *b.* on 25 October 1813, and *m.* at Albyn Place, Edinburgh, on 13 June 1838, to William Francis Gordon,<sup>5</sup> eldest son of William Gordon of Milrig.
8. Isabella Hamilton Dundas Campbell, *b.* on 9 June 1815, and *m.* at Albyn Place, Edinburgh, on 15 February 1836, to Lachlan MacQuarrie of Jervisfield and Glenforsa,<sup>6</sup> (*c/m* 19 January 1836<sup>7</sup>). She *d.* at St. Leonard's-on-Sea on 27 October 1884.<sup>8</sup>
9. Ann Caroline Campbell, *b.* on 7 September 1819, and *d.* at Albyn Place, Edinburgh, on 26 April 1832.<sup>9</sup>
10. Mary Lyon Campbell, *b.* at Glasgow on 19 November 1820, and *m.* at West Coates House on 9 December 1852, to James Loftus Marsden, M.D.<sup>10</sup>
11. Barbara Campbell, *b.* on 8 March 1824, and *d.* at Leamington on 26 February 1855.<sup>11</sup>
12. Duncana Lochnell Augusta Campbell, *b.* on 14 September 1833.

**JAMES CAMPBELL OF JURA**, *b.* at Glasgow on 22 June 1818, and succeeded his brother Richard on his death in 1878. He *m.* at Treesbank on 9 March 1848, to Mary, second daughter of George James Campbell of Cessnock and Treesbank,<sup>12</sup> (she *d.* at Kensington on 8 January 1909<sup>13</sup>), *d.* at Cornwall Gardens, Kensington, London on 10 February 1901,<sup>14</sup> and was father of :

1. Colin Campbell of Jura, (*see below*).
2. George James Campbell, *b.* at Edinburgh on 28 August 1854, and *d.* at Victoria Bank, Ayr, on 24 February 1857.<sup>1</sup>
3. Isabella Hamilton Dennistoun Campbell, *b.* at Edinburgh on 8 April 1850, and *d.* unmarried at Ascog House on 19 April 1911.<sup>2</sup>
4. Christina Alston Campbell, *d.* at Edinburgh on 22 February 1947.<sup>3</sup>
5. Jessie Campbell, *m.* at St. Mary's Cathedral, Edinburgh, on 20 August 1885, to Allan Gordon Cameron of Letterwalton.<sup>4</sup>

**COLIN CAMPBELL OF JURA**, *b.* on 30 August 1851, and succeeded his father on his death in 1901. He *m.* at Chester Street, Edinburgh, on 7 June 1876, to Frances Monteath, second daughter of Charles Sidey,<sup>5</sup> (she *d.* at Jura House on 17 May 1925<sup>6</sup>), *d.* at Eastbourne on 2 August 1933,<sup>7</sup> and was father of :

1. James Archibald Lochnell Campbell, *b.* on 16 March 1879, and enlisted in the Argyle and Sutherland Highlanders in 1900, being raised to Lieutenant in 1902 and then Captain in 1910. He *m.* Holy Trinity Church, Sloane Street, London, on 23 April 1914, to Dorothy Rosalinda, eldest daughter of R. J. Black,<sup>8</sup> and was *ksp* in action in France in 1915.
2. Charles Graham Campbell of Jura, (*see below*).
3. Colin Richard Campbell, *b.* on 26 January 1885.
4. Ronald Walker Francis Campbell, *b.* on 18 June 1888, became a Barrister and *d.* at Manchester on 11 August 1916,<sup>9</sup> of wounds received in action in France.
5. Allison Campbell,
6. Mary Ruby Irene Campbell, *b.* on 18 August 1893, and *d.* at Lewes, Sussex, in August of 1986.
