

CAMPBELL

OF LAGG

DUGALD CAMPBELL OF LAGG, had a charter for the lands of Lagg from Archibald, Earl of Argyll, dated 10 August 1542,¹ and *d.* by 28 July 1586. He was father of :

ALEXANDER CAMPBELL OF LAGG, succeeded his father by 28 July 1586, when he granted a charter to Archibald Campbell of Torrens² and on 31 July 1600, he was pursued by James Scrimgeour of Dudhope for production of the writs relating to the lands of Stroneskar and is then styled as son of the deceased Dugald Campbell of Lagg.³ He *m.* Fingewall Nighean Donald VicAllan, (*c/m* 17 March 1592. She *m.* secondly, by *c/m* 29 August 1602, to Donald Campbell of Stroneskar, second son of Duncan Campbell of Auchinbreck, and had issue), *d.* on 26 March 1602, and was father of,

EWER CAMPBELL OF LAGG, succeeded to the lands of Lagg and for which a precept was issued by Archibald, Earl of Argyll, dated 4 January 1608.⁴ On 16 June 1619, his mother raised an action for payment of £5 due to her from the lands of Garvalt by the terms of his father's Testament.⁵ He was father of :

DUGALD CAMPBELL OF LAGG, succeeded and *d.* in February of 1671, leaving issue :

BARBARA CAMPBELL, the only child who was under age at her father's death and to whom James Campbell of Ormsary was cognised nearest agnate on the father's side and appointed Tutor-at-law on 19 December 1674. She served heir to her father in the lands

of Rudmill, Auchnabreck and others, on 11 October 1700, *m.* Dugald Campbell of Kilberry, and had issue.
