

CAMPBELL

OF LOCHNELL

JOHN CAMPBELL, 1ST OF LOCHNELL, was second son of Colin, 3rd Earl of Argyll, and had obtained the lands of Lochnell by 4 June 1536, when he was witness to a donation by Sir Archibald, Earl of Argyll, granting the ward and relief of the lands of Glenorchy to John Campbell, brother of Duncan Campbell of Glenorchy.¹ He *m.* Mary, daughter of Colin Campbell, 5th of Ardkinglass, was *k.* at the battle of Langside on 15 May 1568, and was father of :

1. Archibald Campbell, 2nd of Lochnell, (*see below*).
2. John Campbell of Cabrachan, *m.* Margaret, daughter of Campbell of Inverawe and acted as director in the assassination of John Campbell, of Cawdor in 1591. It was he who instructed the assassin, a MacEllar, to shoot Cawdor from the window of a house in Knepoch, Argyllshire for which he was apprehended and executed.
3. Donald Campbell, killed at the battle of Glenlivet in 1594 and had issue,
 - 3a) John Campbell, 1st of Bragleen, obtained these lands and had issue.
4. Colin Campbell of Lagganmore, *m.* a daughter of MacDougall, of Rary, and was *k.* at the battle of Glenlivet in 1594.
5. Katherine Campbell, *m.* first, John MacLean, of Kinlochaline, and secondly to John Stewart, of Appin, (*c/m* 6 April 1575), and had issue.
6. A daughter, said to have *m.* Hector MacLaine, of Lochbuy, and had issue.

ARCHIBALD CAMPBELL, 2ND OF LOCHNELL, succeeded his father in 1568 and banded with several noblemen including his kinsman John Campbell of Ardkinglass in an attempt to murder the young Earl of Argyll and his tutor John Campbell, of Cawdor, (whom they had murdered in 1591) in order to gain the honours of Argyll for himself and his followers. He managed to strike a deal with the Earl of Huntly promising to give outward support to his chief Argyll in the forthcoming advance by Argyll and the King to apprehend Huntly in the north and then, during battle, to change sides with his numerous

supporters and kill Argyll. During the conflict at Glenlivet in 1594, and immediately before he changed sides he was killed by Huntly's supporters unaware of the plot. He *m.* first, Janet, daughter of Duncan MacDougall of Dunnollie by whom he had issue :

1. Alexander Campbell, 3rd of Lochnell, (*see below*).
2. Colin Campbell of Kolmkill.

He *m.* secondly to Julia, daughter of Hector MacLean of Duart and had no issue ; and thirdly to Keir, daughter of Clavagh O'Donnell of Tyrconnell, by whom he was father of:

3. John Campbell, styled as brother to Alexander Campbell of Lochnell on 21 February 1635, when he rased an action against Coll MacDonald in Colonsay for the return of goods and livestock taken from his lands of Crossage.¹

He *m.* fourthly, Isabella, daughter of John Drummond, 5th of Colquhalzie, whom he infet in a liferent annualrent of £100 from his lands of Lochnell on 24 September 1578,² (she was widow of William Reidheugh, 2nd of Wester Aberlednock, who had *d.* on 27 February 1572, having had issue. She survived Lochnell and *m.* thirdly, by 14 July 1609, to Duncan MacDougall of Dunnolly³), and had issue :

4. James Campbell, of Cruachan, ancestor of Stonefield, (*see Campbell of Stonefield*).
5. Ann Campbell, *m.* in 1587 to Alexander Campbell, 7th of Dunstaffnage, and had issue.
6. Elizabeth Campbell, *m.* Duncan MacCorquadale, son and heir of Duncan MacCorquadale, of Phantelands, (*c/m* on 2 November 1589⁴), and had issue.
7. Janet Campbell, *m.* Archibald Campbell, of Barbreck, (*c/m* at Lochaweside 6 August 1599⁵), and had issue.
8. A daughter, *m.* Duncan Stewart, 5th of Appin, and had issue.

ALEXANDER CAMPBELL, 3RD OF LOCHNELL, succeeded his father and *m.* Isobel, daughter of Allan MacDougal of Raray, (*c/m* at Stirling and Aberlenock on 29 June & 1 July 1589, her Tocher being 2100 merks¹). He *d.* in 1635 and was father of :

1. John Campbell, 4th of Lochnell, (*see below*).
2. Colin Campbell, of Ardintallan, who *dsp.*
3. Duncan Campbell, styled as son of the deceased Alexander Campbell of Lochnell when he granted a discharge on behalf of his niece Isobel MacNeil on 12 January 1649.² On 27 June 1666, he entered into a wadset with Archibald, Earl of Argyll, for the lands of Largiebreck, Feoling, Knockbreck and various fishing rights, and also binding he and his heirs and assignees in the offices of bailie, chamberlain and forester of the Isle of Jura.³ He had issue, (*see Campbell of Jura*).
4. Alexander Campbell, said to have *d.* unmarried.
5. Mary Campbell, *m.* Hector MacNeil of Tavnish, and had issue.
6. Janet Campbell, *m.* John Campbell, fiar of Ardchattan, son and heir of Alexander Campbell, of Archattan, (*c/m* 18 November, 1626. He *m.* secondly Christine, daughter of Campbell of Auchnacree and widow of Colin Campbell of Ardintallen).
7. Isabel Campbell, *m.* her cousin John Campbell, 9th of Dunstaffnage, (*c/m* 9 December 1636. He *m.* secondly to Janet Campbell), and had issue.

JOHN CAMPBELL, 4TH OF LOCHNELL, succeeded his father and *m.* Anne, daughter of Sir Dugald Campbell, 1st Baronet of Auchinbreck, (*c/m* at Glasgow 31 October 1618). He was *k.* at the battle of Inverlochy on 2 February 1645, and was father of :

1. John Campbell, *d.* young
2. Colin Campbell, 5th of Lochnell, (*see below*).
3. Donald Campbell, 1st of Ardintallan, succeeded his uncle Colin Campbell of Ardintallan, in the lands of Ardintallan and with his nephew Alexander Campbell of Lochnell, he disposed any rights they had to the lands of Rannochmore to John Cameron of Glendessary on 29 October 1695. He *m.* Anne, daughter of Dougal Campbell, 6th of Inverawe, (*c/m* 8 November 1656), and had issue.

4. John Campbell of Barnacarry, styled suncle to the Laird of Lochnell when witness to a Bond by Alan MacDougal of Craganich to Hugh Campbell of Teychley for 25 merks on 31 March 1693. He *m.* Annabel, daughter of Colin Campbell, of Cleughnamachree, (*c/m* 14 December 1657).
5. Anne Campbell, *m.* to Colin Campbell, of Kinochtree, (*c/m* 22 April 1664,) and had issue.
6. Margaret Campbell, *m.* to Donald Stewart, 5th of Invernahyle, (*c/m* 18 June, 1657), and had issue.
7. Catherine Campbell, *m.* Hector Maclean, of Torloisk, (*c/m* 16 June 1666).
8. Mary Campbell, *m.* on 1 June, 1643, John MacLean of Kinlochaline

COLIN CAMPBELL, 5TH OF LOCHNELL, succeeded his father and *m.* by 12 January 1649, to Anne, daughter of Colin Campbell, of Ardkinglass, (she was widow of Hector MacNeil of Taynish by whom she had issue). He *d.* on 31 March 1671, and was father of:

1. Alexander Campbell, 6th of Lochnell, (*see below*).
2. John Campbell, of Toranturk and Gaolin, *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of Sir John Campbell, 4th Baronet of Glenurchy, (she *m.* secondly, Alexander Campbell of Stonefield, and thirdly, John Darroch, Minister of Craignish), and *d.* in May of 1689.¹ He was father of;
 - 2a) Archibald Campbell of Killiechronan, who was father of,
 - 2b) Archibald Campbell of Killiechronan, *m.* Mary, daughter of Hugh MacCalman, M.P., and was father of,
 - 2c) **ARCHIBALD CAMPBELL OF THE MOUNT & 11TH OF LOCHNELL**, *b.* in February of 1777. He succeeded to the representation of Lochnell family as heir male to his remote cousin Archibald Campbell of Lochnell and to whom he was served heir in the lands of Kilmachronag, Ardeich and others on 12 October 1846. He *m.* on 29 November 1803, to Louisa Ann, daughter of Duncan MacDougall of Ardentrive, (she *d.* on 14 May 1858), *d.* on 2 October 1855,² and was father of,
 - 2d) **DUNCAN CAMPBELL, 12TH OF LOCHNELL**, succeeded his father and *d.* unmarried on 11 May 1882.
 - 2d) Archibald Argyll Napier Campbell, *b.* on 20 January 1809, and *d.* of Cholera while at Dhooleah Candeish, Bombay, on 3 January 1838.³

2d) John Cameron Campbell, *b.* on 25 September 1810, entered the army on 25 October 1827, and served as Major in the 9th Lancers. He *m.* at Cawnpor, India, on 23 May 1844, Isabella Sophia, second daughter of Charles Smith, Northampton,¹ and *d.* at St. Petersburg Square, Bayswater, on 6 April 1871.²

2d) Hope MacDougall Campbell, *b.* on 2 December 1813, and *dsp.*

2d) Colin Campbell, *b.* on 23 April 1818, and was appointed Minister at St. George's, in Wolverhampton. He *m.* Henrietta Nathalina, daughter of Henry Hovy, *d.* at San Omer, Pais de Calais, on 27 April 1871,³ and was father of,

2e) **ARCHIBALD ARGYLL LOCHNELL CAMPBELL, 13TH OF LOCHNELL**, succeeded his uncle on his death in 1882. He *m.* at Richmond, Surrey, on 26 June 1877, to Anne Constance, daughter of John Francis Fitzgerald of Memsborough, Co. Waterford, (she was widow of Richard Carr McClement),⁴ and *d.* at Edinburgh on 23 October 1897, being buried in Oban.⁵ He was father of,

2f) **ARCHIBALD CAMPBELL, 14TH OF LOCHNELL**, *b.* on 14 October 1880, and succeeded on his father's death in 1897. He sold the lands of Bonawe in 1914, and then Lochnell, in 1918.

2f) Alexander Andrew Lochnell Campbell, *b.* on 14 October 1881, and *m.* Marjorie Irene, daughter of Alexander Campbell, St. Brannock's, Eastbourne.

2e) Colin Lorne Campbell, *k.* in Kaffirland on 2 August 1878.⁶

2e) Duncan MacDougall Lochnell Campbell, *bap.* at Wolverhampton on 4 June 1856.

- 2e} Neil Hovy Lochnell Campbell, *bap.* at Wolverhampton on 30 August 1857, and *d.* at St. George's Vicarage, Wolverhampton, on 1st September following, aged 14 days.¹
- 2e} Evah Charlotte Isabella Campbell, *m.* at Kimberley, South Africa, on 30 October 1875, to Baldwin K. Turner.²
- 2d} Alexander Campbell, *d.* at Alexandria, Egypt, on 25 August 1862.³
- 2d} Wellington Campbell,
- 2d} Louisa Ann Campbell, *d.* at the Manor House, Berkhamstead, on 4 March 1864.⁴
- 2d} Jean MacDougall Campbell, *b.* on 12 July 1807.
- 2d} Margaret MacNicol Campbell, *m.* James Robertson and *d.* at Trinity on 14 December 1853.
3. Archibald Campbell, of Achanduin and Barbreck, *m.* Veronica, daughter of Lachlan MacLachlan of Fassifern, and had issue. (*see Campbell of Auchanduin & Barbreck*).
4. Colin Campbell, who *d.* unmarried.
5. Mary Campbell, *m.* Alexander Campbell, 3rd of Barcaldine, (*c/m* 29 April 1676), and had issue.
6. Catherine Campbell, *m.* John Campbell, 2nd of Jura (*c/m* 29 April 1680. He *d.* on 18 July, 1736), and had issue.
7. Janet Campbell, *m.* Archibald MacLachlan of that Ilk, (*c/m* 22 April 1664), and had issue.
8. Isobel Campbell, *m.* John Campbell, younger of Airds (*c/m* 2 December 1667).
9. Margaret Campbell, *m.* Hector MacLaine of Lochbuie, (*c/m* 12 November 1669. He *d.* in 1706).
10. Anne Campbell, *m.* John Stewart, 3rd of Ardsheal, Tutor of Appin and had issue.

ALEXANDER CAMPBELL, 6TH OF LOCHNELL, succeeded his father and *m.* Margaret, only child of Duncan Stewart of Appin. He *d.* on 4 January 1714,⁵ and was father of :

1. Sir Duncan Campbell, 7th of Lochnell, (*see below*).
2. Archibald Campbell of Ballimore, obtained the lands of Ballimore and granted a Disposition to his second son John Campbell and the heirs male of his body, which failing, to Dugald Campbell Member of Parliament for Argyleshire, his eldest son, and to the heirs male of entail

succeeding to the estate of his brother Sir Duncan Campbell of Lochnell, for the five merk lands of Phantilands, dated 4 December 1758. He *m.* firstly to Ann, daughter of Dougal Campbell of Shirvan and had issue ; and secondly to Margaret Campbell, (*c/m* 6 December 1738), and had further issue. He was father of :

2a) Colin Campbell, younger of Ballimore, *m.* to Isabella, daughter and co-heiress of Hector MacLean of Coll, and was *k.* at the battle of Culloden on 16 April, 1746, leaving no male issue.

2a) Dugald Campbell of Ballimore, succeeded his father and served as Member of Parliament for Argyleshire. He *m.* Christine, daughter of Alexander Drummond, Consul at Aleppo, second son of John Drummond of Newton, (she was widow of David Campbell of Dunloskin), who had a pension of £200 from the government which, on 9 February 1765, she instructed her brother-in-law, Major John Campbell, to take half for the payment of her late husband's debts. He *d.* on 30 December 1764, and was father of :

2b) **DUNCAN CAMPBELL, 8TH OF LOCHNELL**, was served heir general to his father on 6 March, 1765, and to his granduncle in the lands of Lochnell on 15 October 1766, and succeeded his uncle John in his estate of Barbreck. He *m.* firstly on at Hatton, Stirlingshire, on 6 July, 1792, to Eleanor Fraser daughter of George, 5th Lord Saltoun,¹ (she was widow of Sir George Ramsay, 6th Baronet of Bamff, whom she had *m.* on 29 August 1786, and by whom she had issue ; and *d.* at Seafield on 21 February 1824²), from whom he was divorced in 1807,³ and secondly at Edinburgh on 14 May 1808, to Augusta, daughter of Sir William Murray of Ochtertyre, (she *d.* at Leamington on 12 March 1845⁴). He *dsp* at Edinburgh on 9 April, 1837.⁵

2b) Margaretta Campbell, *m.* Thomas Milles Riddell, son of Sir James Riddell of Ardnamurchan, (*c/m* 10 December 1784).

2a) John Campbell, of Barbreck, attained the rank of Major-General and commanded the Highland Brigade at Quebec in 1759. He was entrusted with various duties by members of his family relating to the management of their estates, and on 7 April 1764, Sir Duncan Campbell of Lochnell confirmed that, following his death, he wished the management of the estate of Lochnell to be undertaken by him during the minority of his nephew Duncan Campbell, the heir. He entailed his own estate firstly on his infant son and then on his

nephew Duncan Campbell, and *m.* Janet, daughter of Sir James Colquhoun, of Luss, Baronet, (she *d.* on 17 July 1806). He *d.* on 10 September 1794,¹ and was father of,

2b) Archibald James Campbell, *b.* at Edinburgh on 8 March 1787, and *d.* at Edinburgh, in infancy, on 3 February, 1791.²

2a) Janet Campbell, *m.* her cousin John Campbell, 2nd of Ardslnish, and had issue.

2a) Margaret Campbell, *m.* Donald Campbell, 2nd of Auchanduin, and had issue

2a) Mary Campbell, the only child in life of the second marriage to whom her father granted a provision on 2 June 1750.

3. Alexander Campbell of Ardslnish, *m.* Ann, daughter of John Campbell of Sannaig, (*c/m* 1-8 February 1711³), and *d.* in January of 1767.⁴ He was father of :

3a) John Campbell, of Ardslnish, served as Lieutenant in the Argyle Militia during the Jacobite uprising of 1745/6, and succeeded his father on his death in 1767. He *m.* Janet, daughter of Archibald Campbell of Balliemore, *d.* by July of 1787, and was father of :

3b) **ARCHIBALD CAMPBELL OF ARDSLIGNISH & 9TH OF LOCHNELL**, succeeded his cousin Duncan Campbell of Lochnell in the lands of Lochnell on his death in April of 1837. He *m.* firstly, Janet MacPhail., and had issue ; and secondly, to Liliias, daughter of Godfrey MacCalman, and *d.* at Lochnell House on 25 August 1837.⁵ He was father of :

3c) Archibald Campbell, of Ardslnish, *m.* to Margaret, daughter of Colin Campbell of Kilmartin and *d. vitae patris* on 19 October, 1820. He was father of :

3d) **ARCHIBALD CAMPBELL, 10TH OF LOCHNELL**, succeeded his grandfather and *m.* at Glasgow on 18 August 1837, to Emily, daughter of William Huey, Collector of Customs at Drogheda,⁶ (she *d.* at Lochnell House on 7 September 1838⁷). He *dsp* at Glenmore on 18 May 1846.⁸

- 3d} Mary Campbell, *m.* at Edinburgh on 30 March 1852, to James Montgomerie, M.D.¹
- 3c} Alexander Campbell, who *dsp.*
- 3c} John Campbell, was the only son by his father's second marriage. He drowned on board the Charles Grant East Indiaman on 15 June 1837.²
- 3c} Lillias Maria Campbell, *m.* at Holyrood Palace on 25 November 1856, to Robert William Davidson, son of William Davidson of Polmont.³ They had issue.
- 3b} Janet Campbell, *m.* Captain James Campbell, in Achnaba, and on 24 March 1790, she petitioned to have a deed returned to her and is then styled as daughter of the deceased John Campbell of Ardslnish.⁴
4. Colin Campbell, was witness to an agreement by his brother Sir Duncan Campbell of Lochnell anent the lands of Sunnart on 28 January 1715. He is said to have been a Catholic Priest and to have *dsp* of wounds received at the battle of Culloden on 16 April, 1746.
5. James Campbell, of Eriskay, was witness to a Bond by Alexander Campbell of Ardstignish to Patrick Campbell of Achnaba and others, as Tutors to the children of the deceased Duncan Campbell, Writer in Kirkcoun, for 3000 merks on 16 February 1739, and is then styled as brother to Campbell of Lochnell. He had a Provision from his brother Sir Duncan Campbell confirming to him and annuity of £40 sterling, dated 3 January 1763, and had *dsp* prior to 10 March 1765.
6. Isobel Campbell, *m.* John Cameron of Lochiel, and had issue.

SIR DUNCAN CAMPBELL, 7TH OF LOCHNELL, retoured heir to his father on 8 April 1749, and *m.* first, Isabel, daughter of Kenneth MacKenzie, 3rd Earl of Seaforth. He *m.* secondly, Margaret, daughter of Daniel Campbell of Shawfield, (*c/m* 10 October 1721), to whom he granted a Provision on 3 January 1763, and *dsp* on 10 March 1765.
