

# CAMPBELL

## OF LOUDOUN

**SIR DUNCAN CAMPBELL OF LOUDOUN**, who, with Susanna, his wife, had a Charter from Robert I. for the lands of Loudoun and Stevenston, in the Baliary of Cunningham, to be held by themselves and their heirs on 4 January 1318.<sup>1</sup> He was father of :

**SIR ANDREW CAMPELL OF LOUDOUN**, whose middle part of the lands of Redcastle, in the sheriffdom of Forfar, were granted by the King to Robert Stewart of Schanbothy, on 8 March 1367.<sup>2</sup> He disposed his lands of Arnele, in Ayrshire, in favour of William Hunter for which the latter had a charter under the Great Seal on 2 May 1375,<sup>3</sup> and was father of :

**GEORGE CAMPBELL OF LOUDOUN**, of whom nothing of any note is known other than he is styled as “abatavi” or great-great-great-grandfather of Sir Hugh Campbell of Loudoun, in 1499. He was father of :

1. Sir Hugh Campbell of Loudoun, (*see below*).

It is also generally accepted that he was also father of :

2. Sir John Campbell of Wester Loudoun, had a charter under the Great Seal confirming the lands of Chalchverk in the sheriffdom of Ayr, to him dated 14 August 1408.<sup>4</sup> He *m.* a lady by the name of Alica, who, on 2 January 1451, in her widowhood, made a donation for the maintenance of a chapel in Irvine.<sup>5</sup> He *d.* by January of 1451 and was father of :

2a) Sir John Campbell of Wester Loudoun, succeeded his father and *m.* Christian Ruthven, (she was widow of George Douglas of Lesswalt), who is styled as his spouse on 28 March 1476/77.<sup>1</sup> He was living on 23 February 1483, *d.* by June of 1498 when he had been succeeded in his lands by his son James, and was father of :

2b) James Campbell of Loudoun, styled as son of Sir John Campbell of Loudoun when witness to a charter by Robert Crawford of Auchinames granting the lands of Auchinames to his son James Crawford, dated 23 February 1483,<sup>2</sup> and had succeeded his father in the lands of Wester Loudoun by 4 June 1498, when he is named as a bailie in that part in a Precept. He *m.* firstly, to Margaret Maxwell from whom he separated and divorced ; and secondly, to Janet Cunningham, and *d.* by June of 1500 being father of :

2c) John Campbell of Wester Loudoun, succeeded his father and was infeft in the lands of Wester Loudoun as his heir on 4 June 1500.<sup>3</sup> He *m.* Elizabeth Douglas with whom he had a charter under the Great Seal for the lands of Dervale in the barony of Loudoun, on 26 September 1509,<sup>4</sup> and with whom he had a Precept for a charter of confirmation for the lands of Overmuir of Nether Loudoun on 16 September 1517.<sup>5</sup> He *dsp* by 13 March 1519.

2c) Marion Campbell, against whom and her sister Christian her cousin, John, Lord Cathcart, raised an action of bastardy following the death of their brother John. On 26 October 1526, a Decree was issued by Thomas Coutts, Official of Glasgow, declaring that she was a legitimate daughter although her sister Christian was not, the assertion for this being that neither had been born before the dissolution of their father's marriage to Margaret Maxwell and they were daughters of his second wife Janet Cunningham.<sup>6</sup> She *m.* first, William Campbell and had issue ; and secondly, by December of 1527, to Adam Hunter, and resigned her claim to the lands of Wester Loudoun and Stevenston to William Earl of Glencairn, who took instruments declaring this on 3 February 1527, although this was subsequently contested by Isabel

Wallace, Lady Loudoun, who had been infert in the liferent thereof. By her first husband she had issue :

2d) Finlay Campbell of Loudounhill, who is styled as heir and successor to John Campbell of Wester Loudoun, his mother's brother, when he raised an action against James Hamilton of Finnart regarding possession of the lands of Draffane, dated 9 May 1547.<sup>1</sup>

2c) Christan Campbell, who, while attempting to have herself served heir to her deceased brother John Campbell of Wester Loudoun, was challenged that she and her sister Marion and brother John were illegitimate on account of their parents having been within the forbidden degrees of consanguinity and had not procured a dispensation.<sup>2</sup>

2b) Elizabeth Campbell, *m.* Alan, Master of Cathcart, eldest son and heir of Sir Alan, 1<sup>st</sup> Lord Cathcart, by whom she was mother of John, Lord Cathcart, who raised an action of bastardy against his cousins Marian and Christian Campbell, in 1519.

**SIR HUGH CAMPBELL OF LOUDOUN**, succeeded to the lands of Loudoun by 10 December 1406, when he was witness to a charter by John de Keith of Galston,<sup>3</sup> and was witness to a charter by Sir Hugh Berklay, Lord of Kilbirnie, granting the lands of Ladylands and Kilbirnie, in the barony of Cunningham and Sheriffdom of Ayr, to Archibald Berklay, his son, dated prior to 25 May 1430, when it was confirmed under the Great Seal.<sup>4</sup> He *d.* by March of 1430, and was father of :

1. Sir George Campbell of Loudoun, (*see below*).
2. David Campbell, styled as brother to the Sheriff of Ayr when he was witness to a charter by John Maxwell of Calderwood, granting the lands of Auchinloch, and others, to Walter Graham of Wallaceon, dated 31 December 1450.<sup>5</sup> He is apparently identical to the David Campbell in Cumnock named as "foirgreatgranschir" to John Campbell of Little Cessnock in 1516, (*see Campell of Cessnock*).

3. Hugh or Hucheon Campbell, *m.* Katherine Blair and is styled as brother to Sir George Campbell of Loudoun in a renunciation for the lands of Brownside from John Stewart, Lord Darnley, dated 24 March 1452.<sup>1</sup>

**SIR GEORGE CAMPBELL, LORD OF LOUDOUN**, and Sheriff of Ayr, succeeded his father by 20 March 1429/30, when he disposed his lands of Lochgoil to Duncan Campbell of Lochawe,<sup>2</sup> and had resigned his office of Sheriff of the Sheriffdom of Ayr into the King's hands when at Perth and for which he had a reconfirmation under the Great Seal dated 16 May 1450.<sup>3</sup> He was present at the inquest whereby Malcolm Campbell was adjudged to be heir to Thomas Campbell, his father on 17 August 1459,<sup>4</sup> and was father of :

**SIR GEORGE CAMPBELL OF LOUDOUN**, present with his father at the inquest of Malcolm Campbell on 17 August 1459, and had a charter from Alexander Livingston of Duchray for the lands of Duchray in the lordship of Kingskyle, in the sheriffdom of Ayr, on 19 July 1465, and in which he is styled as son and heir apparent to Sir George Campbell of Loudoun.<sup>5</sup> He had a grant from the King for an annualrent of £3 from the lands of Shawfield and 33 shillings and 4 pence from those of Kers in December of 1467-68, and *m.* Elizabeth Stewart, (Dispensation dated 29 March 1466), *d.* by March 1491, and was father of :

1. George Campbell of Loudoun, (*see below*).
2. William Campbell, styled as uncle to Hugh Campbell of Loudoun when witness to an instrument of Sasine by which William Douglas, son of Archibald Earl of Angus, was infeft in the lands of Greenan, dated 21 September 1493.<sup>6</sup>
3. Elizabeth Campbell, *m.* about 1485, to Robert, 4<sup>th</sup> Lord Erskine, (he was *k.* at the battle of Flodden on 9 September 1513), and had issue.
4. Elena Campbell, *m.* Hugh, Lord Montgomery.

He was also father of several natural children :

5. John Campbell, styled as son of George Campbell, son of Sir George Campbell of Loudoun when witness to instruments in favour of Malcolm Campbell as heir to the deceased Thomas Campbell, his father, dated 17 August 1459, and to whom his father granted a charter for the lands of Duchray in the sheriffdom of Ayr, dated 17 August 1476, with remainder to himself and the heirs male of his body, which failing by his brothers Thomas and Robert.<sup>1</sup> He was witness with his father to a Sasine in favour of Hugh Montgomery, as great-grandson and heir of the deceased Alexander, Lord Montgomery, in the lands of Ardrossan, dated 5 June 1484.<sup>2</sup>
6. Thomas Campbell,
7. Robert Campbell,

**GEORGE CAMPBELL OF LOUDOUN**, in whose favour his father resigned the office of Sheriff of the Sheriffdom of Ayr and for which he had a confirmation under the Great Seal dated 4 July 1489.<sup>3</sup> He *d.* in about 1492, and is said to have *m.* firstly, to a daughter of Gilbert, Lord Kennedy, although there is no proof of this. There is evidence that he *m.* Marion Auchinleck who survived him and had remarried by 6 March 1504, to William Cunningham although she was not the mother of at least Sir Hugh Campbell, his son. He was father of :

1. Sir Hugh Campbell of Loudoun, (*see below*).
2. George Campbell. He and his brother Matthew were styled as brothers to Sir Hugh Campbell of Loudoun when all three were witness to a charter by William Crawford of Leffnoris granting an annualrent to his George Crawford, dated February of 1507.<sup>4</sup>
3. Matthew Campbell,
4. Margaret Campbell, *m.* Sir Alan Lockhart of Lee.

**SIR HUGH CAMPBELL OF LOUDOUN AND SHERIFF OF AYR**, succeeded his father by 4 October 1492, and *m.* Isobel Wallace with whom he had a charter under the Great Seal

for the lands of Burntwood dated 26 March 1505.<sup>1</sup> He was living in February of 1507, when he was a charter witness with his brothers George and Matthew, and *d.* prior 4 August 1508, when the ward of his lands and heir were gifted to Thomas Boswell of Auchinleck,<sup>2</sup> and was father of :

1. Sir Hugh Campbell of Loudoun, (*see below*).
2. Helen Campbell, *m.* Laurence Crawford of Kilbirnie.
3. Isobel Campbell, *m.* Mungo Muir of Rowallan.
4. Janet Campbell, *m.* John Campbell of Cessnock.
5. Margaret Campbell, *m.* by 23 July 1534, to Thomas Kennedy, eldest son and heir of Alexander Kennedy of Bargany, when she raised an action against her brother Hugh Campbell of Loudoun for his having taken 400 merks for a box belonging to her in the place of Greyfriars, and for which she had the key in possession.<sup>3</sup>
6. Annabella Campbell, *m.* firstly, by 8 May 1506, to Thomas Boswell of Auchinleck, (he was *k.* at the battle of Flodden on 9 September 1513), when he is styled as son son-in-law to Isobel Wallace, spouse of Hugh Campbell of Loudoun<sup>4</sup> ; and secondly, to John Cunningham of Caprington

**SIR HUGH CAMPBELL OF LOUDOUN**, succeeded his father on his death and as he was underage his ward was gifted by the King to Thomas Boswell of Auchinleck on 4 August 1508. On 1 September 1508, he had a renewal of a Tack from the King for the lands of Trabauch which had previously been held by his deceased father<sup>5</sup> and was appointed Master Usher to the King in 1526. He *d.* in February 1560/61, having *m.* first, Margaret, daughter of Matthew Stewart, 2<sup>nd</sup> Earl of Lennox. He *m.* secondly, by 26 July 1550, to Agnes, daughter of Sir John Drummond, 2<sup>nd</sup> of Innerpeffray, (she survived him and *m.* secondly, Hugh Montgomery, Earl of Eglinton, by *c/m* 8 June 1562,<sup>6</sup> and thirdly, to Patrick, 3<sup>rd</sup> Lord Drummond, by *c/m* 15 November 1585), and was father of :

1. Sir Matthew Campbell of Loudoun, (*see below*).
2. Thomas Campbell, was appointed Commendator of Holyrood.

He was also father of at least two natural children :

3. Alexander Campbell. He and his sister Margaret had letters of legitimation on 5 October 1522, and was shot and wounded by Edward Maxwell, Commendator of Dundrennan, for which Maxwell was foreited and his goods gifted by the King to James, Earl of Arran, on 5 August 1584.<sup>1</sup>
4. Margaret Campbell, *m.* Sir Alexander Nisbet of Bankhead.

**SIR MATTHEW CAMPBELL OF LOUDOUN**, succeeded his father on his death in 1561, and *m.* Isobel, daughter of Sir John Drummond, 2<sup>nd</sup> of Innerpeffray. He *d.* in April of 1594,<sup>2</sup> and was father of :

1. Sir Hugh Campbell of Loudoun, (*see below*).
2. George Campbell, had a gift of the third of the Priory of Whithorn in 1555, and is included in a Discharge by his father to John Lockhart of Bar for 600 merks, dated 6 November 1576.<sup>3</sup>
3. Margaret Campbell, *m.* or was at least contracted to marry Thomas, Master of Boyd, eldest son and heir of Robert, Lord Boyd, (*c/m* 16 August 1569<sup>4</sup>). She *m.* secondly, to Sir John Wallace of Craigie, and *d.* on 5 May 1597.<sup>5</sup>
4. Jean Campbell, *m.* first, Robert Montgomery of Giffin, (*c/m* April of 1589. He *d.* in August 1596) and had issue ; and secondly, in August 1598, to Ludovic Stewart, 2<sup>nd</sup> Duke of Lennox, (he was widow of Sophia, daughter of William Ruthven, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Gowrie)
5. Agnes Campbell, *m.* William Cunningham of Caprington.
6. Isobel Campbell, *m.* William Crawford of Leffnoris, and is styled as his spouse when her liferent of his lands was confirmed to her on 16 December 1511.<sup>6</sup>
7. Annabella Campbell, *m.* first, David Ker of Kersland, and secondly, David Dunbar of Enterkine.

**SIR HUGH CAMPBELL OF LOUDOUN & 1<sup>ST</sup> LORD LOUDOUN**, included with his father in a charter for the lands of Mauchlin, dated 20 January 1565,<sup>1</sup> He had a novodamus under the Great Seal confirming his lands and barony of Loudoun, to be held by himself and his heirs male procreate and to be procreate, which failing by George Campbell of Cessnock, and the heirs male of his body, which failing, by John Campbell of Shankston and his foresaids, which failing, by Charles Campbell, younger of Skeldon, and his foresaids, which failing, by Robert Campbell of Kingangeleuch, and his foresaids, which failing, George Campbell of Stevenson, and his foresaids, which failing, by Matthew Campbell of Barreochill, and his foresaids, which failing, by Mungo Campbell of Kowfieldschaw, and his foresaids, which failing, by Charles Campbell of Horsecleuch, and his foresaids, which failing, by Hugh Campbell of Boigcorroch, and his foresaids, which failing, by Charles Campbell of Glassnock, and his foresaids, which failing by his nearest legitimate heir-male of the surname of Campbell.<sup>2</sup> He *d.* on 15 December 1622,<sup>3</sup> having *m.* firstly, to Margaret, daughter of Sir John Gordon of Lochinver, (*c/m* 10 September 1572<sup>4</sup>), by whom he was father of :

1. George Campbell, Master of Loudoun, (*see below*).
2. Juliana Campbell, *m.* Colin Campbell, eldest son and heir of Sir Duncan Campbell of Glenorchy, (*c/m* 1594).
3. Isobel Campbell, *m.* Sir John Maxwell of Pollock.
4. Margaret Campbell, *m.* John Kennedy of Blairquhan.
5. Agnes Campbell, *m.* Robert MacLellan of Bomby, (*c/m* 18 and 26 October 1603).

He *m.* secondly, Elizabeth, daughter of William Ruthven, Earl of Gowrie, (she had previously been *m.* to Sir Robert Gordon of Lochinver, but had separated from and then divorced him on account of his abusive behaviour towards her. She *d.* in January of 1617<sup>5</sup>), by whom he was father of :

6. Jean Campbell, named with her sister Margaret in their mother's Testament.
7. Margaret Campbell, *m.* in 1636, to Sir William Cunningham of Caprington.

He *m.* thirdly, to Margaret, daughter of Sir David Hume of Wedderburn, (*c/m* 21 October 1617.<sup>1</sup> She survived him and *m.* secondly, Archibald Stewart of Ardgowan), by whom he had no apparent issue.

**GEORGE, MASTER OF LOUDOUN**, *d. vita patris* in March of 1612,<sup>2</sup> having *m.* Jean, daughter of John Fleming, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Wigton, and by whom he was father of :

1. Margaret Campbell, (*see below*).
2. Elizabeth Campbell, *m.* Sir Hugh Campbell of Cessnock.

**MARGARET CAMPBELL**, *m.* John Campbell, eldest son and heir of Sir James Campbell, 4<sup>th</sup> of Lawers, (*pre-nuptual c/m* at Edinburgh, Dalkeith, Donipace, Keir, Fordell, Inchaffray, Wemyss, Dunkeld, Perth, Fingask, Methven and Culross on 29 July, 2, 3, 4, 6, 7, 9, 11, 15, 19, 24, 25, 28, 30 and 31 August and 3 September, 1619.<sup>3</sup> He *d.* at Edinburgh on 15 March 1663), and whom, in her right, he acquired these lands by charter dated 26 July 1620, and was created Earl of Loudoun, Lord Tarrinyean and Mauchline on 12 May 1633. They had issue :

1. James Campbell, 2<sup>nd</sup> Earl of Loudoun, (*see below*).
2. George Campbell, styled as second lawful son to John, Earl of Loudoun, when witness to a Disposition by his father of annuities from the lands of Fodderance in favour of Alexander Haliburton of Fodderance on 25 February 1659.<sup>4</sup>
3. Jean Campbell, *m.* George Maule, 2<sup>nd</sup> Earl of Panmure, (*c/m* 7 March 1645.<sup>5</sup> He *d.* on 24 March 1671), and had issue.

4. Margaret Campbell, *m.* at the Abbey of Holyrood on Tuesday 30 October 1649, John Elphinstone, 3<sup>rd</sup> Lord Balmerino, (he was *b.* on 18 February 1623, and *d.* on 10 June 1704), *d.* in January of 1666 and had issue.

**JAMES CAMPBELL, 2<sup>ND</sup> EARL OF LOUDOUN**, succeeded his father and *m.* after 25 November 1666, Margaret, daughter of Hugh Montgomery, 7<sup>th</sup> Earl of Eglinton. He *d.* in 1684 and was father of,

1. **HUGH CAMPBELL, 3<sup>RD</sup> EARL OF LOUDOUN**, *bap.* at Loudoun on 14 January 1674. He was appointed Joint Secretary of State for Scotland in 1704, and held the office of Keeper of the Great Seal of Scotland 1708-1713. He *m.* on 6 April 1700, Margaret, daughter of John Dalrymple, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Stair, (she was *b.* on 4 February 1677, and *d.* at Sorn Castle on 3 April 1779<sup>1</sup>), *d.* 18 November 1731, and was father of,

- 1a) **JOHN CAMPBELL, 4<sup>TH</sup> EARL OF LOUDOUN**, *b.* on 5 May 1705, and served as one of the senior officers in the army of William, Duke of Cumberland, during the Jacobite uprising of 1745/46. He *dsp* at Loudoun Castle on 27 April 1782,<sup>2</sup> and was succeeded by his cousin James Campbell of Lawers.

- 1a) Elizabeth Campbell, *dsp* at Sorn Castle on 19 April 1771.

- 1a) Margaret Campbell, *m.* at Edinburgh on 30 August 1728, John Campbell, 2<sup>nd</sup> of Schawfield, (he was *b.* in 1696 and *m.* secondly at Edinburgh on 27 April 1735, Henrietta, daughter of William Cunningham, 12<sup>th</sup> Earl of Glencairn. He *d.* at Kilsyth on 22 July 1746).

2. John Campbell of Shankston, *bap.* at Loudoun on 8 March, 1675, obtained these lands and attained the rank of Colonel in the army. He *m.* on 22 June 1699, Janet, daughter of James Morton, and was father of,

- 1c) Hugh Campbell, *bap.* at Loudoun on 4 March 1705, and *dsp.*

- 1c) John Campbell, *bap.* at Loudoun on 7 July 1706, and *dsp.*

3. James Campbell, 9<sup>th</sup> of Lawers, succeeded his cousin in these lands and *m.* at Edinburgh on 27 February 1720, Jean, daughter of David Boyle, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Glasgow, by his second wife Jean, daughter and heiress of William Mure of Rowallan, (*c/m* 29 March 1720. She *d.* at Lawers on 19

December 1729). He had the command of the British Cavalry at the battle of Fontenoy during which he received wounds from which he *d.* on 30 April, 1745. He was father of,

3a) **JAMES CAMPBELL, 5<sup>TH</sup> EARL OF LOUDOUN**, (*see below*).

3a) Jean Campbell, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 28 June 1722.

3a) Margaret Campbell, *b.* on 17<sup>th</sup> and *bap.* at Edinburgh on 20 May 1727.

4. Jane Campbell, *m.* in 1705, Sir James Campbell, 4<sup>th</sup> of Aberuchill, (he was widow of Jean, daughter of Sir John Dempster of Pitliver, by whom he had issue. He *d.* on 10 May 1754), and had issue.
5. Margaret Campbell, *m.* Colin Lindsay, 3<sup>rd</sup> Earl of Balcarres, (he was widow of Mauritia, third daughter of Louis de Nassau by whom he had no issue, and of Jean, daughter of David Carnegie, 2<sup>nd</sup> Earl of Northesk, by whom he had issue. Also of Jean, daughter of William Ker, 2<sup>nd</sup> Earl of Roxburgh, by whom he had issue and *d.* in 1722 aged about 70 years), and had issue.
6. Christian Campbell, *m.* George Ross of Galstoun and had issue.

Eleanor Campbell, *m.* firstly, on 10 June 1697, James, 1<sup>st</sup> Viscount Primrose, (he *d.* on 13 June 1706), and had issue ; and secondly, John Dalrymple, 2<sup>nd</sup> Earl of Stair, (he *d.* at Queensberry House on 9 May 1747), by whom she had no issue. She *d.* at Edinburgh on 21 November 1759.

**JAMES CAMPBELL, 5<sup>TH</sup> EARL OF LOUDOUN**, *b.* at Edinburgh on 11 February, 1726. He was served heir to his mother Jean Boyle, on 9 May 1733, following which he assumed the name of Mure and succeeded to the estate of Rowallan. He *m.* at Redhall on 30 April 1777, Flora, daughter of John MacLeod of Raasay, (she *d.* at Hope Park 2 September 1780), and *d.* at Loudoun Castle on 28 April 1786. He was father of :

**FLORA CAMPBELL OF LOUDOUN**, *bap.* on 5 December 1780, succeeded her father and was served his heir in the lands of Rowallan on 30 July 1787. She *m.* on 12 July 1804, Francis Rawdon Hastings, 2<sup>nd</sup> Earl of Moira and 1<sup>st</sup> Marquis of Hastings, (he *d.* on 28 November 1826), *d.* on 8 January 1840, and had issue :

1. Francis George Augustus Campbell, *b.* at London on 13 February 1807, and *d.* the day after.
2. George Augustus Francis Campbell, 2<sup>nd</sup> Marquess of Hastings, *b.* at London on 4 February 1808, succeeded his father and had issue.
3. Flora Elizabeth Campbell, *b.* at Edinburgh on 11 February 1806, and *d.* unmarried on 5 July 1839.
4. Sophia Frederica Christina Campbell, *b.* on 1 February 1809.

5. Selina Constantinia Campbell, *b.* on 15 April 1810, and *m.* on 25 June 1838, Charles John Henry, son of John Joseph Henry of Straffan. She *d.* on 8 November 1867.
6. Adelaide Augustus Levinia Campbell, *m.* on 8 July 1854, Sir William Keith Murray, 7<sup>th</sup> Baronet of Ochertyre, and had issue.

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
