

CAMPBELL

OF PERSIE

ARCHIBALD CAMPBELL, 1ST OF PERSIE, was a son of his father, Mr. David Campbell of Denhead's, second marriage with Grisel Maxwell, and had a charter with his father for the lands of Clavenns, in the bailiary of Kyle-Stewart, on 26 December, 1563, in which he is styled as his legitimate son.¹ He *m.* firstly, by 26 February 1579, to Agnes, daughter of John Drummond, 5th of Colquhalzie, when he entered into an agreement with his father-in-law on 26 February 1579, that the 500 merks outstanding in the name of Tocher between John Drummond, fiar of Colquhalzie, and Barbara Campbell, sister of Archibald, should be offset against the 500 merks due in terms of his own contract of marriage with Agnes, daughter of the said John Drummond of Colquhalzie. He *m.* secondly, by 27 May 1604, to Eupham Wishart when they granted a Bond to Alexander Menzies of that Ilk, and was father of :

1. Archibald Campbell, 2nd of Persie, (*see below*).
2. David Campbell, had the wadset of the lands of Hatton of Creuchies from John Reid of Hatton of Creuchies on 25 May 1627,² and was witness to the marriage contract between Elizabeth, daughter of Duncan Campbell of Glenlyon, and Robert Fleming, fiar of Moness, dated 24 July 1638.³

ARCHIBALD CAMPBELL, 2ND OF PERSIE, styled as heir apparent of his father when witness to a Charter by Colin Campbell, portioner of Balbrogie, for the lands of Kinnettles to John Campbell of Souterhouses and Isabel Nevay, his spouse, on 29 December, 1612, and succeeded to the lands of Persie. He *m.* Margaret, daughter of John Inglis of Tarvit, and was father of :

1. Colin Campbell, 3rd of Persie, (*see below*).

2. Eupham Campbell,
3. Margaret Campbell, *m.* David Spalding, in Corydone.

COLIN CAMPBELL, 3RD OF PERSIE, who *m.* Jean, daughter of Sir Lawrence Mercer, 10th of Meikleour, (*c/m* at Coupar Angus on 26 January, 1639), and had issue :

ARCHIBALD CAMPBELL, 4TH OF PERSIE, succeeded his father and *m.* on 3 December, 1665, Janet, daughter of James Durie of Craiginluscor, whom he infeft in a liferent of the lands of Persie on 10 August, 1665.¹ He *d.* prior to 17 July, 1707, and was father of :

1. Christian Campbell, who, with her sister Jean, are styled as daughters and heirs of the deceased Archibald Campbell of Persie in a decret against them by Sir James Ramsay of Bamff for not having entered as heirs to their father in the lands of Morganstoun on 17 July, 1707.² She *m.* at Coupar Angus on 23 October, 1691, Alexander Campbell, 4th of Balgirsho, and had issue.
