

CAMPBELL

OF POSSILL & COLGRAIN

COLIN CAMPBELL, was second son of John Campbell, 3rd of Kinloch, and resided at Acharn. He *m.* Beatrix Duff with whom he had a Wadset of the lands of Dalkillin, in Glenquaich, from John Campbell of Turrerich on 12 May, 1708,¹ and is then styled as brother to Mungo Campbell of Kinloch. He *d.* on 25 February, 1721, and was father of :

1. Mungo Campbell, resided in Killin and is mentioned with regard to the settlement of debts upon the lands of Kinloch in 1735. He had a Wadset for the mill-lands of Milnrogie from John Moray, Duke of Atholl, in 1745.
2. John Campbell, *m.* Margaret, eldest daughter of Alexander Menzies of Schian, (*c/m* at Auchnaclloch on 25 February, 1721), and on behalf of whom his uncle Mungo Campbell of Kinloch petitioned the Earl of Breadalbane for a Tack of the lands of Acharn on 14 March, 1721. He had issue :
 - 2a) Colin Campbell, *bap.* at Kenmore on 16 January, 1722.
3. Alexander Campbell, (*see below*).

ALEXANDER CAMPBELL, served as a Captain in the army and *m.* Helen Campbell, said to be of the Glenlyon family. He *d.* in around 1770 and had issue :

1. Colin Campbell of Park, entered the navy and had command of the Sloop *Prince of Wales* in 1772. He *d.* at Glasgow on 27 March, 1793,² and was father of :
 - 1a) Susanna Campbell, *m.* at Park on 1 July, 1788, Donald MacLachlan of that Ilk,³ (he *d.* in 1817), and had issue.
2. Mungo Campbell of Hundleshope, became a planter in Grenada and *m.* Elizabeth Nutter. He *d.* at his house in Edinburgh on 11 November, 1793,⁴ and was father of :

2a) Robert Nutter Campbell of Hundleshope, succeeded his father in his estate and *m.* at Edinburgh on 1 September, 1791, Margaret, daughter of James Montgomery, Baron of the Exchequer,¹ (she *d.* at Melville Street, Edinburgh, on 9 March 1852, aged 84 years²). He *d.* on 11 April, 1845.

3. John Campbell, (*see below*).

4. Susanna Campbell, *m.* on 17 February, 1766, Alexander Campbell, Comptroller of Customs in Glasgow, and had issue.

JOHN CAMPBELL, founded the company of John Campbell, Snr. & Co. in Glasgow, and *m.* at Greenock on 21 June, 1777, Marion, daughter of John Murdoch, Merchant in Glasgow, (she *d.* on 30 November, 1812). He was father of :

1. Alexander Campbell, 1st of Possil, *b.* on 28 November, 1778, attained the rank of Colonel and obtained the lands of Possil and Achnacroish. He *m.* at Castle Lachlan on 1 November, 1810, to Harriet, eldest daughter of Donald MacLachlan of Strathlachlan,³ (she *d.* at Torquay on 22 December 1868, aged 78 years⁴), and had issue :

1a) John Campbell, 2nd of Possill, *bap.* at Barony on 20 September, 1816, and succeeded his father. He *m.* firstly at Ballimore House on 20 September, 1848, to his cousin Elizabeth, daughter of Mungo Campbell of Ballimore,⁵ (she *d.* at Auchnacroish, Mull, on 14 September 1849⁶), and secondly at Tor Church, Torquay, on 15 January, 1851, to Helen, daughter of Colin Campbell, 1st of Colgrain,⁷ (she *d.* on 8 July, 1851). He *m.* thirdly at St. John's Episcopal Chapel, Edinburgh, on 20 June, 1854, to Elizabeth Williamson, youngest daughter of Donald Horne of Langwell,⁸ (she *d.* at Villa Como, Torquay, on 2 May 1884⁹), and *dsp* at Torquay on 30 August 1885.¹⁰

- 1a) Donald MacLachlan Campbell, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 21 October, 1830, and *dsp* on 6 January 1860.¹
- 1a) Ann Harriet Campbell, *b.* on 2 November, 1813.
- 1a) Susan Harriet Campbell, *b.* on 28 January, 1815, and *m.* at Calcutta on 12 January, 1841, to General George Campbell, Bengal Artillery, son of Duncan Campbell of Inverneil and Ross, (he *d.* in 1882). She *d.* at Brussels, Belgium, on 1 October 1855,² having had issue :
- 1b) George Campbell, *b.* at Meerut, India, on 19 February, 1847, entering the army, he was raised to Major in the 77th and 65th Regiments. *dsp* at Borough Villas, Weymouth, on 1 October 1890.³
- 1b) Susan Harriet Campbell, *b.* Cawnpore on 5 January, 1842, and *dsp.*
- 1b) Emily Georgina Campbell, 4th of Possil, *b.* at Cawnpore, India, on 6 February, 1843, succeeded her cousin, Celestine Norman Lamont-Campbell, in the lands of Possill and *m.* on 15 September, 1864, to Colonel Thomas Tupper Carter, (who assumed the surname of Campbell in 1893 and *d.* on 14 January, 1900). She *d.* on 15 January, 1906, and had issue.
- 1b) Alice Mary Campbell, *b.* at Ferozepore on 7 September, 1845.
- 1a) Marion Campbell, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 26 August, 1820, and *m.* at Abercromby Place, Edinburgh, on 21 April 1863, to Archibald Campbell, eldest son of Alexander Campbell of Halyards.⁴
- 1a) Harriet Campbell, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 20 September, 1823, and *m.* at Auchnacroish on 7 March 1844, to Archibald James Lamont of Lamont,⁵ (he was widow of Adelaide, daughter of James Massy Dawson, of Ballynacourte, whom he had *m.* on 1 September, 1839. He *d.* on 5 May, 1862). They had issue :
- 1b) John Henry Lamont of Lamont, *b.* on 10 March, 1854, and succeeded his father in these lands.
- 1b) Celestine Norman Lamont-Campbell, 3rd of Possil, *b.* on 14 May, 1858, and succeeded his maternal uncle in the lands of Possil. He *m.* at Campbeeltown on 19 April, 1882, to Margaret, daughter of Rev. John Curdie Russell, Moderator of the

COLIN CAMPBELL, 1ST OF COLGRAIN, *b.* on 8 January, 1782, acquired the lands of Colgrain, and *m.* at North Park on 24 October, 1814, to Janet Millar, eldest daughter of John Hamilton of North Park.⁷ He *d.* at Camis Eskan House on 22 January 1863,⁸ and was father of :

1. John Campbell, *b.* on 9 August, 1815, and served as a Captain in the Royal Scots Greys. He *dsp* at Brighton on 28 May 1846.¹

COLIN CAMPBELL, 2ND OF COLGRAIN, *b.* on 22 October, 1819, and succeeded his father on his death in 1863. He *m.* on 3 June, 1845, to Jessie, daughter of William Middleton,

(she *d.* at Ochertyre House, Crieff, on Sunday 11 July, 1897¹), *d.* at London on 20 February, 1886,² and was father of :

1. Colin John Campbell, *b.* on 28 May, 1848, and served as Lieutenant in the Royal Scots Greys. He *m.* at Colebrooke Church on 3 October, 1872, to Constance Henrietta, only daughter of Sir Arthur Brinsley Brooke, of Colebrooke, Co. Fermanagh,³ and *d. vita patris* at Camis Eskan House on 6 August, 1880.⁴ He was father of :

WILLIAM MIDDLETON CAMPBELL, 3RD OF COLGRAIN, *b.* on 15 August, 1849, and succeeded his father. He led a career in banking during which he was a long time director and Governor of the Bank of England. He *m.* at Knightsbridge, London, on 9 January, 1873, to Edith Agneta, daughter of R. *BAP.* L. Bevan, of Trent Park, *d.* at Fen Place, Turner's Hill, Essex, in May of 1919, and had issue :

1. Colin Alergnon Campbell, 4th of Colgrain, (*see below*).
2. Ronald George Campbell, *b.* on 4 September, 1878, and *m.* at St. John the Baptist Church, West Wickham, Kent, on Tuesday 25 June 1929, to Mary Grace Hallam, eldest daughter of Lieutenant-Colonel Sir Henry Lennard, of Wickham Court.¹
3. Norman Robert Campbell, *b.* on 7 March, 1880, and became a well-known Philosopher and Physicist. He *m.* at Leeds on 25 March 1912, to Edith Utley, eldest daughter of Rev. J. *BAP.* Sowerbutts,² and *d.* in 1949.
4. Evan Rolland Campbell, *b.* on 24 July, 1884, and *m.* at All Saints Church, Cairo, Egypt, on 9 January 1917, to Antoinette Priscilla Vulliamy, younger daughter of Robert L. Devonshire, of Heston.³
5. Agneta Elspeth Campbell, *b.* in 1877.

COLIN ALERGNON CAMPBELL, 4TH OF COLGRAIN, *b.* on 5 August, 1874, and succeeded his father. He *m.* on 20 April, 1911, to Mary Charlotte Gladys, daughter of John Beaty Barrington, and *d.* on 3 January, 1957, having had issue :

1. John Middleton Campbell, *m.* at St. John's Church, Hildenborough, on Saturday 8 January 1938, to Barbarat Noel, daughter of Leslie Roffey of Hayesden House, Haysden, Tonbridge.¹
