

CAMPBELL

OF EASTER SCHIAN

PATRICK CAMPBELL, 1ST OF EASTER SCHIAN, was a son of John Campbell, 1st of Edramuckie, by his second marriage and resided initially in Mains of Balloch. He had a Heritable Bond and Tack from James Campbell of Lawers for the “officer’s croft” and the “Laird’s Meadow” for the space of seven years on 27 May, 1662,¹ and obtained the lands of Easter Schian. He *m.* Grissell Ramsay and was father of :

1. Colin Campbell, 2nd of Easter Schian, (*see below*).
2. Patrick Campbell, who, with his brother Colin Campbell, was included in the Tack of the officer’s croft to their father by James Campbell of Lawers in 1662.
3. John Campbell,
4. Duncan Campbell, who, with his brother John, were cautioners to their father in a Bond which was discharged on 18 February, 1668.
5. William Campbell, styled as son of Patrick Campbell of Easter Schian when he raised letters of homing on 12 December 1674, against James Campbell of Turrerich for payment of 200 merk contained in a Bond dated 11 December 1661.²
6. Alexander Campbell, became a Notary and by 12 June 1675, when he and his brother William are styled as sons of Patrick Campbell of Easter Schian.³ He resided in Kenknock and obtained the wadset of the lands of Tullich Wester from James Menzies of Culdares on 9 December 1692,⁴ and was father of :
 - 6a} Margaret Campbell, *m.* John Campbell of Garrows, and to whom her father assigned his wadset right of the lands of Tullich Wester on 28 November 1713. They had issue.

COLIN CAMPBELL, 2ND OF EASTER SCHIAN, succeeded his father and *m.* Mary, daughter of Patrick Campbell of Glentarken, (*c/m* at Monzie on 13 December 1676¹). He was father of :

1. Patrick Campbell, 3rd of Easter Schian, (*see below*).

2. John Campbell of Donchlage, *m.* Barbara, daughter of John Drummond, Minister of St. Madoes, and had issue;

2a) John Campbell of Annfield and Shergarton, *b.* in 1741 and *m.* firstly at Stirling on 18 July 1768, to Mary, daughter of Duncan Bachop,² and had issue. He *m.* secondly at Edinburgh on 12 August 1778, to Anna, eldest daughter of Robert Kinnear, Merchant,³ (she *d.* at Edinburgh on 8 April 1804⁴), with whom he was infeft in the lands of Shergarton on 18 February 1782, and was father of :

2b) John Campbell of Annfield and Carbrook, *b.* on 21 November, 1770, and *m.* at Edinburgh on 23 December, 1794, Frances, daughter of John Brown, Merchant in Glasgow,⁵ (she *d.* in 1847). He *d.* in 1855, and was father of :

2c) John Campbell, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 12 November, 1795, and *dsp.*

2c) William Hector Campbell, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 30 May, 1806, and *dsp.*

2c) **ALEXANDER JAMES CAMPBELL OF EASTER SCHIAN**, *b.* at Edinburgh on 3 April, 1815, and succeeded his distant kinsman as heir-male in the lands of Easter Schian. He was admitted the first Minister of the Free Church at Melrose from 1843-1859 until leaving their to take up a charge at Geelong, South Australia, where he was instrumental in founding the College there in 1861 and the Presbyterian Theological Hall. He *m.* at Melrose on 15 August 1844, to Mary Turner Wedderburn, daughter of James Maitland-Heriot of Ramornie,⁶ and *d.* at Herne Hill, Victoria, Australia, on 20 October 1909.⁷

He was father of :

- 2c} James Lewis Maitland Campbell, *b.* on 7 August 1888, and *m.* at Geelong on 10 November 1915, to Muriel Grace, daughter of A. H. Roadknight, Geelong. He *d.* on 2 January 1983, and was father of :
- 2d} James Lewis Alfred Campbell, *b.* on 30 September 1916, and *m.* on 27 April 1946, to Erica Mary Parkinson. He *d.* on 20 July 2009, and had issue.
- 2d} Frederick Alexander Campbell, *b.* at Melrose on 27 November 1849, and studied at Geelong College, afterwards enrolling at the University of Melbourne in 1875. He graduated from there with a certificate in Engineering in 1879, and was appointed assistant engineer to the railways of the New South Wales Department of Public Works. He *m.* at Brisbane, Australia, on 16 April 1884, to Mary Pitts, and *d.* on 13 February 1930.
- 2d} Archibald Henry Campbell, *b.* at Melrose on 10 June 1855, and *d.* at Albury, New South Wales, in 1939.
- 2d} Margaret Louisa Campbell, *b.* at Melrose on 25 January 1852, and *m.* in 1875, at Digger, Victoria, Australia, to Rev. William Stothert Rolland. She *d.* on 25 December 1922, and had issue.
- 2d} Frances Janet Campbell, a twin with Archibald. She *m.* in 1881, to Robert Andrew Agnew Balfour-Melville, and *d.* on 18 April 1947. They had issue.
- 2c} Archibald Hamilton Campbell, *b.* on 12 August, 1819, and *m.* at Hillingdon, Middlesex, on 3 April 1856, to Louisa, youngest daughter of Henry Fisher of Hillhead,¹ (she *d.* at Carbrook, Toronto, on 23 May 1916²). He emigrated to Toronto where he was a banker and *d.* there on 13 June 1909.³ He was father of :
- 2d} John Henry Mayne Campbell, *b.* on 12 December 1857, and was a barrister-at-law. He *m.* in 1914, to Louisa Edith, daughter of Colonel K. M. Morris, (she was widow of Harold Harrison), and *d.* at Bordighera, Italy, on 11 May 1933.

- 2d) Archibald Hamilton Campbell, *b.* in 1863, and *d.* in 1939.
- 2d) Amy Louisa Stuart Campbell, *m.* at Toronto on 10 July 1899, to Reginald Wolferston Thomas, Broker.²
- 2d) Muriel Drummond Campbell, *b.* at Toronto on 19 August 1877, and *m.* at Toronto on 2 June 1900, to Leighton MacCarthy, Barrister.³
- 2c) Jane Mayne Campbell, *b.* at Edinburgh on 6 September 1797, and *d.* unmarried at Edinburgh on 21 July 1804.⁴
- 2c) Mary Ann Campbell, *b.* at Edinburgh on 9 May 1802, and *m.* at Montreal on 1 June 1844, to Edward Thomas Renaud, Merchant.⁵
- 2c) Frances Campbell, *b.* in 1804 and *d.* at Torwood Lodge, Melrose, on 6 October 1880.⁶
- 2c) Helen Campbell, *d.* in infancy at Edinburgh on 4 April 1808.⁷
- 2c) Helen Campbell, *b.* at Edinburgh on 16 September 1813, and *d.* at Toronto on 8 May 1887.⁸
- 2b) Elizabeth Campbell, *bap.* at Stirling on 15 August, 1769.
- 2b) Barbara Campbell, *bap.* at Stirling on 23 March, 1772.
- 2a) Alexander Campbell, *bap.* at Crieff on 19 February, 1749.

PATRICK CAMPBELL, 3RD OF EASTER SCHIAN, succeeded his father and *m.* Catherine, daughter of William Stewart, 3RD of Drumcharry, (*c/m* 14 February 1700⁹). He *d.* in 1736 and was father of :

1. William Campbell, 4th of Easter Schian, (*see below*).
2. John Campbell, *bap.* at Kenmore on 27 February, 1704.

3. Beatrix Campbell, *bap.* at Kenmore on 13 March, 1702.
4. Jean Campbell, *m.* at Kenmore on 1 December, 1729, John Robertson, younger of Cultalony.¹

WILLIAM CAMPBELL, 4TH OF EASTER SCHIAN, succeeded his father and *m.* in 1743, Susanna, daughter of Mr. Alexander Campbell. He was father of :

1. Peter Campbell, 5th of Easter Schian, (*see below*).
2. William Campbell, *bap.* at Kenmore on 8 March, 1750.
3. John Campbell, *bap.* at Kenmore on 21 November, 1753.
4. Katherine Campbell, *bap.* at Kenmore on 29 March, 1744.
5. Margaret Campbell, *bap.* at Kenmore on 29 April, 1748.

He was also father of two natural children :

6. Thomas Campbell, was a son by Janet McCallan and was *bap.* at Kenmore on 17 August, 1735.
7. Mungo Campbell, was a son by Janet McPherson and was *bap.* at Kenmore on 9 May, 1737.

PETER CAMPBELL, 5TH OF EASTER SCHIAN, succeeded his father and *m.* at Dull on 26 October, 1782, Peggy, daughter of John Menzies and sister to Alexander Menzies of Chesthill.² He *d.* in 1831, and was father of :

1. Patrick Campbell, 6th of Schian, (*see below*).
2. Janet Campbell, *bap.* at Fortingall on 28 January, 1791.

PATRICK CAMPBELL, 6TH OF SCHIAN, succeeded his father and *m.* Janet Dow. He *d.* prior to 1841 and was father of :

1. Christian Campbell, *b.* in 1816, and *d.* unmarried.
2. Frances Campbell, *b.* in 1818, and *d.* unmarried in December of 1895.
3. Susan Campbell, *bap.* at Kenmore on 25 May 1819, and *d.* unmarried at Schian House on Wednesday 2 December 1896.³
