

CAMPBELL

OF SOUTERHOUSES, KINOCHTREE, OTTER & ORMIDALE

JOHN CAMPBELL, OF SOUTERHOUSES, was a natural son of Donald Campbell, Abbot of Coupar Angus, and obtained the lands of Souterhouse from his father by charter dated 20 January 1558. He had *m.* by this date to Elizabeth Blalock,¹ *d.* by 18 June 1580, and was father of :

WILLIAM CAMPBELL OF SOUTERHOUSES, succeeded his father in the lands of Souterhouses by 18 June 1580, when he is included with Nicol Campbell of Keithock, Colin Campbell in Denhead and others, in a relaxation from a pointing at the instance of the parishioners of Coupar Angus against them² and was killed by James, Lord Ogilvy and James Ogilvy of Balfour on 16 August, 1591, for which they gave compensation to his son John Campbell of Souterhouses, on 6 February, 1595.³ He *m.* Janet, apparently daughter of Andrew Haliburton of Pitcur, with whom he included in an obligation to John Anderson, Maltman and Burgess of Perth, on 27 June 1584,⁴ and was father of :

1. John Campbell of Souterhouses, (*see below*).
2. Isabel Campbell, to whom her brother John granted a Bond for 500 merks Scots on 21 February 1602.⁵

JOHN CAMPBELL OF SOUTERHOUSES, to whom compensation for the murder of his father was paid by James, Lord Ogilvy and James Ogilvy of Balfour on 6 February, 1595. He disposed his lands of Souterhouses, obtained those of Calsayend and *m.* firstly, Isabel

Nevay with whom he had a charter from Colin Campbell, portioner of Balbrogie, for the 1/8 part of the lands of Ingliston on 29 December 1612.¹ He *m.* secondly, Marjory Robertson, thirdly, to Anne, daughter of Ronald Campbell of Craignish, and *d.* in around 1640. He was father of :

1. William Campbell, who, with his father, granted two crofts in the lands of Calsayend to his brother George Campbell, Sheriff Clerk of Argyleshire on 27 March, 1638, and is then styled as his eldest son.²
2. George Campbell of Kinochtree, (*see below*).
3. Mr John Campbell,

GEORGE CAMPBELL OF KINOCHTREE, was appointed Clerk of the Sheriffdom of Argyll by 27 June 1635, when he a charter under the Great Seal for the lands of Friarton and three-quarters of the lands of Kinochtree, which had previously been apprised by his father from John Fleming of Carwood, and in which he is styled as lawful son to John Campbell, formerly of Souterhouses.³ He *m.* Janet, daughter of Donald Murray, Provost of Inverary, to whom a liferent of the lands of Calsayend was reserved on 8 September 1662, *d.* in 1673 and was father of,

1. Archibald Campbell, younger of Kinochtree, to whom his father conveyed the lands of Kinochtree and Calsayend of Coupar, in which he was infeft on 8 September 1662, and is then styled as eldest son.⁴ He *dsp vita patris* prior to 24 April 1678, and to whom his nephew Mr. John Campbell of Otter was served heir on 10 August 1731.
2. Colin Campbell of Kinochtree and Otter, (*see below*).
3. George Campbell, styled as son to George Campbell, sheriff clerk of Argyleshire, in a Bond by Duncan Campbell of Inverliver for £2500, dated 7 June 1655.⁵ He was appointed Professor of Divinity at the University of Edinburgh and *m.* at Edinburgh on 4 February, 1697, Catherine, daughter of Mr. Robert Blair, Minister at St. Andrews.⁶ He had issue :

- 3a) Christian Campbell, *m.* at Edinburgh on 27 September, 1696, to Mr. George Chambers, Minister of Kilwinning.¹
4. Donald Campbell, 1st of Smiddiegreen, obtained these lands upon his marriage with Margaret, daughter and heiress of John Eadie of Smiddiegreen. He had issue, (*see Campbell of Smiddiegreen*).
5. Neil Campbell,
6. Elizabeth Campbell, *m.* on 12 April, 1668, Colin Campbell, 2nd of Soutarhouses, and had issue.
7. Mary Campbell, *m.* firstly, Thomas Davidson, Merchant in Glasgow, and secondly to John Fullarton of Sennick, (he was *k.* in Flanders in 1692), and *d.* on 17 April, 1714.
8. Christian Campbell, *m.* in 1658, Alexander Campbell, 3rd of Balgirsho, (he *d.* in 1705) and had issue.
9. Margaret Campbell, *m.* firstly on 7 July, 1660, Archibald Campbell of Kilmun, and had issue ; secondly prior to 7 March, 1667, Duncan Campbell of Kilbridemor, and thirdly, Alexander Henderson.

COLIN CAMPBELL OF KINNOCHTREE, PENNYLAND & OTTER, succeeded his father and had a Disposition for the lands of Pennyland from Archibald, Earl of Argyll, on 3 April, 1674. He was retoured heir to his father in the lands of (1) Coll, comprising the lands and barony, on 6 May 1674² (2) Duart, comprising the lands and barony, on the same day³ ; (3) those of Largy, also on the same day⁴ and (4) those of Friarton and the three-quarters and one-eighth part of those of Kinnochtree on 24 April 1678.⁵ Two days afterwards, he was retoured heir to his father and his brother Archibald in the lands of Calsayend and⁶ afterwards purchased the lands and barony of Otter, in Argyleshire, for which he had a charter under the Great Seal dated 26 March 1678.⁷ He *m.* Anne, daughter of John Campbell, 4th of Lochnell, (*c/m* 22 April 1664), *d.* at Penymore in December of 1678⁸ and was father of :

1. **ALEXANDER CAMPBELL OF OTTER**, named in his father's Testament dated 27 May 1681, and is then styled as the eldest son. He was *ksp* at the battle of Hochstadt on 7 August, 1704.
2. George Campbell, who *dsp* young.
3. John Campbell of Otter, (*see below*).

JOHN CAMPBELL OF KINNOCHTREE AND OTTER, succeeded his brother Alexander on his death without issue in 1704, and was retoured heir his heir on 21 October 1704, and afterwards to his uncle Archibald Campbell, eldest son of George Campbell, Sheriff Clerk of Argyll, on 10 August 1731.¹ He *m.* firstly on 16 April, 1701, Margaret, daughter of Sir Colin Campbell of Ardkinglass, secondly, Jane, daughter of John Stenhouse of Drumore, (she *d.* at Otter on 7 May 1782²), and *d.* at Otter House "at an advanced age" on 29 September 1763.³ He was father of :

1. George Campbell, younger of Otter, was a child by his father's first marriage and was witness with his father to the marriage contract between Patrick Campbell, only son of Donald Campbell, merchant in Kilmichael, and Violet, only lawful daughter of John Ferguson, miller at Otter, dated 19 April 1728. His father assigned the estate of Ardmannoch to him. He *m.* first, Janet, daughter of Mr. John Cunningham in Ardgartan, and had issue ; and secondly to Mary Fergusson. He was father of :
 - 1a} James Campbell, granted a factory in favour of his father on 26 October 1759.
 - 1a} Margaret Campbell, granted a disposition to her half goods falling due to her by the deceased of her mother, Janet Cunningham, and her father, her granddather, dated 13 December 1759.
 - 1a} Archibald Campbell of Ardmannoch, succeeded his father.
2. John Campbell of Otter, was a son by his father's second marriage and to whom the lands of Otter were assigned. He *dsp* at Otter in January of 1798, in his 81st year,⁴ with his lands being afterwards sold.
3. Alexander Campbell of Ormidale, (*see below*).
4. Jean Campbell, *m.* firstly, Adam Campbell of Danna, (*c/m* 3 November, 1747) and had issue ; and secondly, Archibald Campbell of Springfield.

5. Margaret Campbell, *m.* at Otter House on 4 June, 1752, Neil Campbell of Auchawhillan, and had issue.
6. Anne Campbell, *m.* on 19 March, 1769, Major Thomas Wood, of the Marines, and had issue.

ALEXANDER CAMPBELL OF ORMIDALE, was a child by his father's second marriage and to whom the lands of Ormidale were assigned. He was one of the executors qua creditors to his brother John on his death in 1798, and *m.* at Otter House on 4 June, 1752, Marion, daughter of John Campbell, third son of John Campbell of Strachur.¹ He *d.* at Ormidale in 1794, and was father of :

JOHN CAMPBELL OF ORMIDALE, *b.* in 1758, succeeded his father and *m.* on 16 July, 1785, Catherine, daughter of General John Campbell of Strachur, (she *d.* at Strouel Lodge, Roseneath, on 24 July 1843²). He *d.* at Ormidale House on 15 March 1842, aged 83 years³ and was father of :

1. Alexander Campbell, younger of Ormidale, *b.* in 1786, attained the rank of Captain in the Royal Navy and *dsp vita patris* at Strouel Lodge, Roseneath, on 29 May 1832.⁴
2. John Campbell, *bap.* at Lochgoilhead on 2 August, 1791, entered the army and was *ksp vita patris* on board the frigate *Nereide* when attacked by four French frigates in September 1811.⁵
3. **ROBERT NUTTER CAMPBELL OF ORMIDALE**, *bap.* at Lochgoilhead on 20 August, 1799, succeeded his father and *m.* in 1828, Margaret, daughter of Thomas Warrand of Lentram. He *d.* on 30 September, 1856, and was father of :

3a) John Thomas Morrison Campbell, *b.* on 6 December, 1834, and *d.* at Edinburgh on 23 April 1843.⁶

3a) Catherine Helen Campbell, returned heir portioner to her father and her uncle Alexander Campbell of Ormidale on 6 July, 1859, and *m.* at Ormidale on 25 October, 1854, William

Hunter of Lochton, Australia, second son of James Hunter of Hafton,¹ who thereafter assumed the surname of Campbell. She *d.* in September of 1892, and had issue.

- 3a) Elizabeth Campbell, *b.* on 1 June, 1830, and *d.* in infancy.
 - 3a) Emily Jessie Campbell, *b.* on 6 August, 1832, and was retoured heir portioner to her father on 6 July, 1859. She *m.* on 26 November, 1851, William Connal, Merchant in Glasgow.
 - 3a) Alexa Hugh Monro Campbell, *b.* on 9 August, 1838, and was retoured heir to her father and to her uncle Alexander Campbell of Ormidale on 6 July 1859. She *m.* at Edinburgh on 14 November, 1872, Robert Swinton.
- 4. Helen Campbell, *m.* Andrew Hunter of Bonnyton, and *d.* at South Kensington, London, on 24 February 1876.²
 - 5. Catherine Montour Campbell, *d.* at Strouel Lodge, Roseneath, on 20 November 1864, in her 69th year.³
 - 6. Eliza Campbell, *m.* at Madras on 7 August 1826, to Captain Francis Whinyates.⁴
