

# CAMPBELL

## OF STONEFIELD

**JAMES CAMPBELL OF CRUACHAN**, was a younger son of Archibald Campbell, 2<sup>nd</sup> of Lochnell, by his fourth wife, Isabella, daughter of John Drummond of Colquhalzie. He *d.* by 15 September 1630, when his son Archibald was retoured his heir, and was father of :

**ARCHIBALD CAMPBELL OF CRUACHAN AND AUCHINCLOICH**, was retoured heir to his grandfather Archibald Campbell of Lochnell in the lands of Auchincloich with the islands on the lochs there, on 5 December 1628,<sup>1</sup> and to his father, James Campbell of Cruchan, in the lands of Frakkersyde, on the island of Lismore; Cruchan-Lochawe, Ardlong and the offices of bailie, serjeant and coroner of those lands, all of which were of antique extent, on 15 September 1630.<sup>2</sup> He *m.* by 12 April 1633, to Catherine, daughter and co-heiress of John Stewart of Lettershunna,<sup>3</sup> *d.* by 1 June 1687, when his son Mr. Archibald was retoured his heir in the lands of Auchincloich, and was father of :

**MR. ALEXANDER CAMPBELL OF AUCHINCLOICH**, was educated at the University of Glasgow from where he graduated Master of Arts in 1657. He was licensed by George, Bishop of Edinburgh, on 5 August 1665, and presented Minister of Kilmore by Archibald, Earl of Argyll, being admitted to that charge some time prior to 31 October 1666 but was subsequently deprived of office for not praying for William & Mary at the revolution of 1688. He was retoured heir to his father in the lands of Auchincloich on 1 June 1687,<sup>4</sup> and *d.* in 1698, having *m.* firstly, Margaret, daughter of John Campbell of Dunstaffnage, by whom he was father of :

1. **JAMES CAMPBELL OF STONEFIELD**, succeeded his father and *dsp* on 31 July 1729.<sup>5</sup>

He *m.* secondly, Elizabeth, daughter of Sir John Campbell of Glenorchy, (she was widow of John Campbell of Gaolin and Torranturk, and following Alexander's death in 1698, she *m.* thirdly to Mr. John Darroch, Minister of Craignish, by *c/m* dated 16 April 1701), and by her he was father of :

2. Archibald Campbell of Stonefield, (*see below*).

**ARCHIBALD CAMPBELL OF STONEFIELD**, *b.* in 1696/7, and was executor to his brother James on his death in 1729. He was appointed one of the Sheriff-deputes of Argyleshire by Commission dated 9 August 1729,<sup>1</sup> and in which position he continued for the next forty-seven years. He *d.* at Balmore on 19 August 1777, in his 81<sup>st</sup> year,<sup>2</sup> having *m.* Jane, daughter of Benjamin Freind of Ballyrechy, (*c/m* 14 October 1732. She was widow of Alexander Ogilvy of Forglan, and *d.* on 9 November 1771), and was father of :

1. John Campbell of Stonefield, (*see below*).

2. Elizabeth Campbell, *m.* Colin Campbell of Carwhin, (*c/m* 26 January–2 February 1758<sup>3</sup>).

3. Jane Campbell, *m.* John Campbell of Airds, (he *d.* at Airds on Thursday 22 May 1788<sup>4</sup>), and had issue.

**JOHN CAMPBELL OF STONEFIELD**, was appointed a Senator of the College of Justice under the title of Lord Stonefield, in April 1763, and *d.* at his house in George Square, Edinburgh, on 19 June 1801,<sup>5</sup> having *m.* firstly, Grace/Helen, daughter of James Stuart, 2<sup>nd</sup> Earl of Bute, (she *d.* at Levenside House, Dumbartonshire, on 5 June 1783<sup>6</sup>), by whom he was father of :

1. Archibald Campbell, who *dsp vitae patris* on 22 December 1774.

2. William Campbell, *b.* on 10 February 1762, was admitted an Advocate on 2 December 1783, and *dsp* on 16 January 1787.
3. John Campbell, served as a Colonel in the army and *dsp vita patris*.
4. Colin Campbell, younger of Stonefield, (*see below*).

He *m.* secondly, at Ruthin on 14 August 1791, to Phoenicia, daughter of Hugh Lloyd of Berth,<sup>1</sup> by whom he had no apparent issue.

**COLIN CAMPBELL**, served as Colonel in the Dumbartonshire Fencibles, and *m.* at Edinburgh on 23 February 1787, to Elizabeth, daughter of Sir Robert Anstruther of Balcaskie. He *d. vita patris* at Alphington Lodge, Devon, on 4 May 1799,<sup>2</sup> being father of :

1. Robert Campbell, who *dsp* when young.
2. John Campbell of Stonefield, (*see below*).
3. George Colin Campbell, *b.* on Saturday 15 September 1792,<sup>3</sup> entered the army and served with distinction as an officer in the 42<sup>nd</sup> Highlanders. He *m.* Arabella, daughter of Campbell of Kildallog, (she *d.* at Bath on 26 November 1841<sup>4</sup>), and *d.* in 1830, having had issue :
  - 3a} George Colin Campbell, *b.* on 1 September 1830, and was a clerk in Holy Orders. He *d.* unmarried.
  - 3a} Elizabeth Campbell, *b.* on 15 June 1820, and *d.* unmarried.
  - 3a} Anne Campbell, *b.* in 1825, and *d.* unmarried.
4. A son, *b.* at Levenside on 18 February 1795.<sup>5</sup> He apparently *d.* young.
5. Elizabeth Jane Campbell, *b.* at Edinburgh on 3 June 1790,<sup>6</sup> and *d.* young.

**JOHN CAMPBELL OF STONEFIELD**, *b.* at Edinburgh on 2 June 1788, succeeded his grandfather on his death in 1801, and *m.* at Rossdhu House on 15 July 1808, to

Wilhelmina, daughter of Sir James Colquhoun of Luss, (she *d.* at Pau on 22 December 1833<sup>1</sup>). He *d.* at Stonefield on 18 March 1857, in his 69<sup>th</sup> year,<sup>2</sup> and was father of :

1. Colin George Campbell of Stonefield, (*see below*).

2. James Colquhoun Campbell, *b.* at Stonefield on 27 December 1813,<sup>3</sup> entered the church and was appointed vicar of Roath, near Cardiff, and then Bishop of Bangor in 1859, which he held until resignation in 1890. He *m.* on 13 May 1840, to Blanche, second daughter of John Bruce Pryce, of Duffryn,<sup>4</sup> (she *d.* at the Palace, Bangor, on 17 March 1873<sup>5</sup>), *d.* at Hastings on Saturday 9 November 1895,<sup>6</sup> and was father of :

2a) John Archibald Campbell, *b.* on 2 February 1842, and *m.* on 14 October 1873, to Louisa Jane Hobgood, (she *d.* at West Kensington, London, on 20 February 1897, aged 48 years<sup>7</sup>). He *d.* at Hastings on 11 March 1877.<sup>8</sup>

2a) Arthur Bruce Knight Campbell, *b.* on 18 June 1851, followed his father in leading a religious life and was appointed curate of St. Mary, Beverley. He *d.* at the Palace, Bangor, on Monday 26 September 1881,<sup>9</sup> aged 30 years.

2a) Wilhelmina Mary Campbell, *d.* on 19 March 1912.

3. Elizabeth Janet Campbell, *b.* on 19 February 1810,<sup>10</sup> and *d.* in 1829.

4. Mary Louisa Campbell, *b.* at Stonefield on 8 December 1812,<sup>11</sup> and *d.* in infancy.

5. Mary Wilhelmina Campbell, *b.* at Stonefield on 1 November 1816,<sup>12</sup> and *m.* at Stonefield, on 11 July 1839, to Robert Robertson, younger of Montgreenan.<sup>13</sup>

6. Helen Catherine Campbell, *b.* at Stonefield on 10 January 1821,<sup>14</sup> and *d.* at Stonefield in 1859.

**COLIN GEORGE CAMPBELL OF STONEFIELD**, *b.* at Edinburgh on 22 May 1811,<sup>1</sup> and succeeded his father. He *m.* on 10 December 1839, to Elizabeth, daughter of Gibbon Fitzgibbon of Ballysreda, *d.* at Stonefield on 26 July 1887,<sup>2</sup> and was father of :

1. A son, *b.* at Rutland Street, Edinburgh, on 25 June 1843.<sup>3</sup>

2. John Campbell, *b.* at Edinburgh on 19 February 1845,<sup>4</sup> and *m.* at St. John's Episcopal Church, Cranston Hill, Glasgow, on 2 August 1871, Adela Harriet, second daughter of Charles Pelham-Clinton, brother of the Duke of Newcastle,<sup>5</sup> (she *d.* on 21 May 1915). He *d. vita patris* at Glenakill House, Tarbert, on 24 January 1885,<sup>6</sup> and was father of :

2a) **COLIN GEORGE CAMPBELL OF STONEFIELD**, (*see below*).

2a) Sir Nigel Leslie Campbell, *b.* in 1878, and *m.* at Grace Church, Canton, Syracuse, USA, on 29 August 1905, to Henriette, daughter of Justice Leslie W. Russell, New York,<sup>7</sup> (she *d.* at Portland Place, London, in July 1950). He *d.* at Torquay in March of 1948, and was father of :

2b) Lesley Campbell, *b.* in 1908, and *m.* at Brompton Oratory on Tuesday 30 April 1928, to Derrick Morley.<sup>8</sup> They had issue.

2b) Margaret Campbell, *b.* in 1911.

2b) Alison Campbell, *b.* in 1913.

2a) Sybil Adela Campbell, *b.* on 29 October 1874.

3. Colin George Campbell, *b.* on 26 May 1852, and held the office of Under Secretary of State for India. He *d.* on 27 May 1911.<sup>9</sup>

4. Henry Osborne Campbell, *b.* on 16 January 1854, and was a Merchant. He *m.* Marie, *d.* on 13 September 1920, and was father of :

4a) Jean Marjorie Campbell, the only child, *d.* at Eastbourne on 24 October 1904, when in her 14<sup>th</sup> year.<sup>10</sup>

5. Elizabeth Ida Campbell, *b.* on 19 February 1847, and *m.* on Wednesday 10 January 1877, William Thomas Trench of Cangort Park, Roscrea<sup>1</sup>. She *d.* on 21 November 1920.
6. Jane Arabella Campbell, *d.* unmarried on 4 November 1906.

**COLIN GEORGE CAMPBELL OF STONEFIELD**, *b.* on 31 May 1872, and succeeded his father. He *m.* at Clumber Park, on Wednesday 15 November 1893, Ileene Frances Cairns, second daughter of Francis Power Plantagenet Hastings, 13<sup>th</sup> Earl of Huntingdon,<sup>2</sup> *d.* on 8 February 1955, and was father of :

1. Colin Cairns Clinton Campbell of Stonefield, (*see below*).
2. Geordie Osmond Lorne Campbell, *b.* on 11 January 1896, and *m.* on 20 January 1921, to Jessie Mackie. He *d.* in 1956, and was father of :
  - 2a) Peter Lorne Mackie-Campbell, *b.* on 5 March 1925, and *m.* on 16 December 1954, to Ann Gillian Douglas, daughter of Ian Pountney Coats. He *d.* in 1992, and was father of :
    - 2b) George Logan Mackie-Campbell, *b.* in 1956.
    - 2b) Ileene Mackie-Campbell, *b.* in 1958.
  - 2a) Colena Ileene Mackie-Campbell, *b.* on 8 February 1922, and *m.* Iain Arthur Campbell. She *d.* on 28 July 1996, having had issue.
  - 2a) Patricia Isobel Mackie-Campbell, *b.* on 14 November 1923, and *d.* unmarried in 2007.

**COLIN CAIRNS CLINTON CAMPBELL, OF STONEFIELD**, *b.* on 3 December 1894, succeeded his father and was an artist and portrait painter. He *d.* without apparent issue in 1970.
