

# CARMICHAEL

## OF BALMEDIE

**JOHN CARMICHAEL OF BALMEDIE**, was second son of John Carmicahel, 1<sup>st</sup> of Meadowflat, and acquired the lands of Balmedie by 23 March 1473/4, as part of the marriage settlement with Isobel Sibbald, when he was present at the retour of David Hepburn as heir of the deceased Patrick Hepburn of Waughton, his uncle.<sup>1</sup> He *m.* as above, prior to 23 March 1473/4, to Isobel, daughter of Sir John Sibbald of Balgonie, (she was widow of George Douglas, 4<sup>th</sup> Earl of Angus. She survived him and *m.* thirdly by 20 July 1498, to Sir Robert Douglas of Lochleven), *d.* by 20 July 1498, and was father of :

1. James Carmichael of Balmedie and Folkarton, (*see below*).
2. Peter Carmichael of Dron, who had charters from George, Earl of Angus, for the lands of Kirkdroyne alias East Dron in 1509<sup>2</sup> and others, and had a Tack for the lands of Pitbla on 26 January 1511-12.<sup>3</sup> He also acquired the heritable bailiery of the regality of Abernethy 11 July 1528. He *m.* prior to 1509 Euphame Wemyss, and *dsp* before 30 May 1545, being succeeded by his grandnephew, David Carmichael of Balmedie.
3. Elizabeth Carmichael, *m.* at Edinburgh on 3 July 1489, to Sir John Somerville of Cambusnethan.

**JAMES CARMICHAEL OF BALMEDIE AND WHELPHILL AND FOLKARTON**, is styled as brother to Archibald Douglas, Earl of Angus, on 19 May 1491, in an action raised against him and David, John and William Carmichael, by Sir William Lindsay for the spoilation of the lands of Biggar, Shiels and Muirhouse.<sup>4</sup> He had succeeded his father in the lands of Balmedie by 20 July 1498, when he was witness to a charter by Archibald, Earl of Angus, granting the lands and barony of Braidwood, and others, to Janet Kennedy.<sup>5</sup> He

*m.* Elizabeth, daughter and heiress of Folkart of Folkarton, to whom the lands of Folkarton were confirmed by Robert, Abbot of Kelso, on 20 October 1495, and was father of ;

**JAMES CARMICHAEL OF BALMEDIE AND WHELPHILL**, succeeded his father and *m.* Margaret, daughter of David Kincairgie of that ilk. He *d.* after 31 August 1536,<sup>1</sup> and before 5 July 1542, and was father of :

1. **PETER CARMICHAEL OF BALMEDIE**, had a charter on 5 July 1542 of the lands of Whelphill, Lanarkshire, which had belonged to his father.<sup>2</sup> He claimed to be heir to his cousin Peter Carmichael of Dron, and as such he protested on 30 May 1545, at the redemption payment made by William Leslie to Euphame Wemyss, Peter's relict, for the lands of Pitbla.<sup>3</sup> He was forfeited for complicity in the murder of Cardinal Bethune, afterwards serving in the galleys with John Knox, and was imprisoned on Mont St. Michel with the Master of Rothes, Kirkcaldy of Grange, and others, but escaped with Grange disguised as a professional mendicant. He returned to Scotland and *d.* without issue before 13 October 1553.
2. David Carmichael of Balmedie, (*see below*).
3. Robert Carmichael, portioner of Ethybetoun, acquired the sunny half of the lands of Wester Gourdie from Walter Mylne, son and heir of the deceased John Mylne, portioner of Wester Gourdie, by charter dated 10 June 1574, which, with the consent of Elizabeth Lovell, his wife, he disposed to Alexander Wedderburn, Clerk of Dundee, on 6 June 1591.<sup>4</sup>

**DAVID CARMICHAEL OF BALMEDIE**, who, on his brother Peter's death, became heir to their great-uncle Peter Carmichael of Dron, and as such he assigned his right to the tack of the lands of Newton of Forgandenny to William Oliphant on 13 October 1553.<sup>5</sup> He *m.* Isabel, daughter of David Barclay of Collairnie, *d.* in July 1580, and was father of :

1. James Carmichael of Balmedie, (*see below*).

2. John Carmichael, was admitted Minister of Kilconquhar and was a cautioner to his niece, Euphame Carmichael, on her marriage to David Tullie in 1610, being then styled as uncle to her brother David Carmichael of Balmedie.<sup>1</sup> He was father of :

2a) Frederick Carmichael,

3. Margaret Carmichael,

4. Euphame Carmichael, *m.* firstly, prior to 16 February 1555, to Peter Balmanno of that Ilk,<sup>2</sup> and, secondly, by 26 December 1567, to John Ramsay of Corstoun.<sup>3</sup>

He was also father of a natural son :

5. William Carmichael.

**JAMES CARMICHAEL OF BALMEDIE, CRAIGPOTTIE, AND KIRKDRUM**, was served heir to Peter Carmichael of Craigpottie, his great-grandfather's brother on 22 March 1588. He *m.* Jean, eldest daughter of Sir David Carnegie of Colluthie, (*c/m* 25 April 1590. She survived him and married, secondly, to Archibald Dundas of Fingask by whom she had further issue), *d.* on 7 May 1594, and was father of :

1. David Carmichael of Balmedie, (*see below*).

2. James Carmichael, had a charter of Kildowny and Chingillis 20 October 1632, and is then styled as brother german to David Carmichael of Balmedie.<sup>4</sup>

3. Euphame Carmichael, *m.* David Tullie, (*c/m* 28, 29 & 31 December 1610<sup>5</sup>).

**DAVID CARMICHAEL OF BALMEDIE**, succeeded his father on his death in May of 1594 and *d.* before 14 November 1646, having *m.* firstly, to Jean, second daughter of Sir William Oliphant of Newton, King's Advocate, (she *d.* in September of 1621<sup>6</sup>), by whom he was father of :

1. William Carmichael, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 28 July 1612, and *d.* young.
2. Jean Carmichael,
3. Catherine Carmichael, all of whom are named in their mother Jean Oliphant's Testament in 1621.

He *m.* secondly, by 29 January 1628, to Margaret, daughter of William Myrton of Cambo,<sup>1</sup> when they had a charter from William Halyburton of Pitcur for the lands of Eglismagirdle in the sheriffdom of Perth,<sup>2</sup> and by her he had further issue :

4. Sir David Carmichael of Balmedie, (*see below*).
5. James Carmichael of Balmblae, styled as brother to Sir David Carmichael of Balmedie when witness to a charter by David, Earl of Stormonth, dated 18 July 1663, confirming an earlier charter by Colonel Ludovic Leslie granting his lands of Mugdrum to William Arnot, brother of James Arnot of Woodmiln.<sup>3</sup> He *m.* Euphan, daughter of Sir Thomas Myrton of Cambo, (she was widow of Robert, 1<sup>st</sup> Lord Colvill of Ochiltree, who had *d.* on 25 August 1662 ; and *d.* on 8 November 1708), *d.* on 20 October 1704, and was father of :

3a) Robert Carmichael, of Balmblae, *bap.* on 27 May 1671, and *m.* Jean, daughter of Dr. James Murray, younger son of Andrew Murray, 1<sup>st</sup> Lord Balvaird, (*c/m* 30 September 1697. She *d.* on 8 November 1708). He *d.* on 5 March 1722,<sup>4</sup> and was father of :

3b) James Carmichael of Balmblae, *bap.* at Falkland on 9 December 1708, was served heir to his father in the barony of Balmblae on 9 November 1727, and *dsp.* being succeeded by his brother Robert.

3b) Robert Carmichael of Balmblae, succeeded his brother and *m.* at Markinch on 17 October 1779, to Catherine, daughter of George Lindsay of Kirkforthar, (she *m.* secondly on 10 August 1797, to Christopher Seton of Carriston, by whom she had issue). He *d.* at Balmblae on 15 January 1786,<sup>5</sup> and was father of,

3c) Magdalene Carmichael, *bap.* at Falkland on 21 October 1781, and *dsp.* prior to 1801, when her uncle Stewart Carmichael was served her heir.

3b) David Carmichael, *bap.* at Falkland on 9 October 1710.

3b) Stewart Carmichael, *bap.* on 24 June 1712, and took up residence in Jamaica. He was served heir of his brother Robert on 28 July 1800, and his niece Magdalene and 9 March 1801.

**SIR DAVID CARMICHAEL OF BALMEADIE**, succeeded his father to whom he was served heir in the lands of Ecclesmagirdle with the mill, in the regality of Lindores, and Nether Aberargie, in the regality of Abernethy, on 14 November 1646,<sup>1</sup> then in those of Balmedie and Craigpottie on 15 March 1648.<sup>2</sup> He *d.* by May of 1698, having *m.* firstly, in 1647, to Anne, daughter of Sir James, 1<sup>st</sup> Lord Carmichael, by whom he was father of ;

1. Euphame Carmichael, *m.* on 17 August 1698, to William Dick,

2. Anne Carmichael, *m.* to Dundas of Duddingston.

He *m.* secondly, at Kinfauns on 25 May 1652, Cecilia, second daughter of Thomas Fotheringham of Pourie,<sup>3</sup> (*c/m* 5 May 1652<sup>4</sup>). He was father of ;

3. **DAVID CARMICHAEL, YOUNGER OF BALMEDIE**, *m.* Euphemia, daughter of James Dempster of Balbougie, (*c/m* 27 January 1675), and *d. vita patris* in 1676, he was father of,

3a) David Carmichael of Balmedie, who succeeded to his grandfather. (*see below*).

**DAVID CARMICHAEL OF BALMEDIE**, *b.* on 7 February 1675, and to whom his grandfather, Sir David Carmichael, was appointed Tutor on 24 August 1676.<sup>5</sup> He was

served heir to his father in the lands of Ecclesmagirdle on 5 May 1698,<sup>1</sup> and to his mother, Euphame Dempster, in the 3/16 part of those of Luthrie on the same date.<sup>2</sup> He was served heir general of his great-grandfather David Carmichael of Balmedie on 12 November 1740. He *m.* on 29 December 1698, to Anna, daughter of Thomas Graham of Balgowan, *d.* at Craigpottie on 7 November 1761, aged 86 years,<sup>3</sup> and was father of :

1. **DAVID CARMICHAEL, YOUNGER OF BALMEDIÉ**, who, becoming involved in the rising in support of Prince Charles Edward, was heavily fined and obliged to alienate his estates in Scotland. He *m.* Janet, daughter of Peter Coutts, merchant in Edinburgh, (*c/m* 15 October 1725.<sup>4</sup> She *d.* at Peattie on Friday 9 March 1744<sup>5</sup>), *d.* “about the end of”<sup>6</sup> 1757, and was father of :

1a) **DAVID CARMICHAEL OF ECCLESMAGIRDLE**, *b.* on 19 May 1731, and was served heir to his father in the lands of Egglismagirdill on 9 November 1764.<sup>7</sup> He *m.* at Wiston, Suffolk, on 27 April 1758, to Mary, daughter of the Rev. William Tatham of Wormingford, and *d.* at Pitcullen on 29 September 1783.<sup>8</sup>

1a) Ann Carmichael, *b.* on 10 June 1729.

2. Thomas Carmichael, (*see below*).

3. William Carmichael,

4. John Carmichael, *b.* on 31 July 1705, and was apprenticed to William Edmonstone, Deacon of the Wrights in Edinburgh, on 15 August 1722.

6. Anne Carmichael, *m.* on 11 February 1721, to Sir James Stewart, Baronet of Burray, and *d.* at Edinburgh 19 January 1779.

**THOMAS CARMICHAEL**, *b.* on 8 September 1702, and was educated at the University of Leyden from where he graduated M.D. He *m.* in 1740, Margaret, eldest daughter and heir of Dr. James Smyth of Aithernie, son of Mr. William Smith, younger son of Patrick Smythe, 3<sup>rd</sup> of Braco, *d.* in 1746 and was father of,

1. James Carmichael, (*see below*).
2. Anne Carmichael,
3. Elizabeth Carmichael,

**JAMES CARMICHAEL OF AITHERNIE**, *b.* on 23 February 1742, inherited Aithernie and in compliance with the will of his grandfather he assumed the surname of Smyth in addition to that of Carmichael. He settled in England, was twice censor of the Royal College of Physicians, London ; was appointed Physician Extraordinary to George III., and twice received the thanks of Parliament for valuable public services. He *d.* on 18 June 1821,<sup>1</sup> having *m.* at Greta Green, on 9 November 1775, to Mary, daughter of Thomas Holyland of Bromley, (she *d.* on 24 May 1806), and was father of :

1. James Carmichael, 1<sup>st</sup> Baronet, (*see below*).
2. Henry William Carmichael, served as a Major in the Bengal Engineers and was the original of his step-son, William Makepeace Thackeray's "Major Newcombe." He *m.* on 13 March 1817, to Anne, second daughter of John Harman Beecher, (she was widow of Richmond Makepeace Thackeray, and *d.* at Onslow Gardens, London, on 18 December 1864,<sup>2</sup> having had issue), and *dsp* at Ayr on 9 September 1861.<sup>3</sup>
3. William Henry Carmichael, Bengal Civil Service, afterwards Paymaster of Exchequer Bills. He *dsp* at Paris, France, on 5 May 1846.
4. Charles Montauban Carmichael, *b.* on 21 December 1790, and led a military life, entering the Bengal Cavalry as a Cadet in 1807 and being raised to General and Colonel of the 20<sup>th</sup> Hussars. He discontinued to use the name of Smyth by royal licence dated 17 August 1842, and *m.* at the British Embassy, Naples, on 4 March 1841, to Mary Eliot, only daughter of Captain Allan

Graham, Bengal Artillery, (she *d.* on 29 April 1871). He *d.* at the Hotel du Louvre, Boulogne-sur-Mer, France, on 21 November 1870,<sup>1</sup> and was father of :

4a) Charles Henry Edward Carmichael, *b.* on 9 January 1842, and *m.* on 17 April 1890, to Harriet, daughter of William Morley. He *dsp* 2 March 1895.

4a) Rose Gordon Carmichael, *b.* in 1850, and *m.* at St. Gabriel's. Warwick Square, London, on 15 April 1874, to Lieutenant Oswald B. Niven, R.N.<sup>2</sup> She *d.* in 1925, having had issue.

4a) Florence Graham Carmichael, *b.* in 1858, and *d.* on 6 April 1873.<sup>3</sup>

5. David Scott Carmichael Smyth, *b.* on 15 August 1798, and was appointed one of the Judges of the Sudder Dewanny and Nizamut Adawult. He *m.* firstly, in 1819, to Anne, daughter and co-heiress of Major-General J. D. Sherwood, Bengal Artillery, (she *d.* in 1834), by whom he had issue ; and secondly, in 1839, to Isabella Francis, daughter of W. H. Oakes, (she survived him and *m.* secondly, at Brighton, on 30 August 1849, to Daniel Bayley, 7<sup>th</sup> Regiment Bengal Light Cavalry<sup>4</sup>), by whom he had further issue. He *d.* at Calcutta on 2 September 1841,<sup>5</sup> and was father of :

5a) James Dodington Carmichael, *b.* on 14 August 1820 , and reassumed in common with his brothers and sister the family name of Carinichael in lieu of Carmichael-Smyth, by royal licence. He *m.* firstly, in 1860, Barre Georgina, daughter of Major Latter, and had issue ; and, secondly, in 1869, to Teresa Ann, daughter of Thomas Morris of Crome Hall, Gloucester, (she was widow of Captain Scott, 32nd Regiment, and *d.* on 7 November 1875). He *d.* on 13 May 1893,<sup>6</sup> and was father of :

5b) James Bane Hood Carmichael, *b.* on 12 July 1860, and was *bap.* at Croadall, Hampshire, on 23 November following. He served as Second Lieutenant of the 33<sup>rd</sup> Regiment, and was *ksp* in a landslip at Nynce Tal 18 September 1880.<sup>7</sup>

5b) **CLAUDE DUNDAS JAMES CARMICHAEL**, son of Colonel James Dodington Carmichael, was *b.* at Jullundur, Bengal, on 21 October 1862, and served as Deputy-Inspector of the Madras Police Force. On the death of his cousin, Sir James Morse Carmichael, in 1902, as heir-male, he claimed the titles of Earl of Hyndford, Viscount Inglisberry and Nemphlar, Lord Carmichael of Carmichael,

Lord Carmichael and the Baronetcy of Nova Scotia, created in 1627. He *m.* on 5 July 1888, to Mary Glencairn, second daughter of James Shaw, *d.* in India, on 8 September 1915, and was father of :

5c) Barre Grace Carmichael, *b.* on 30 April 1889

5a) Charles Paget Carmichael, *b.* on 8 November 1829, and was appointed to the Bengal Civil Service, being promoted to Magistrate and Collector in 1856 and then member of the Board of Revenue which he held until his retirement in 1884. He *m.* firstly, on 8 November 1853, to Georgina Rebecca, daughter of Canon Judge, (she *d.* at Bareilly, Bengal, on 23 March 1884<sup>1</sup>), and secondly, at St. Mary Abbot's, Kensington, on 27 July 1887, to Annabella Violet, daughter of John Crofton, Lincoln's Inn,<sup>2</sup> (she *d.* on 15 September 1890). He *d.* at Sackville Gardens, Hove, Brighton, on 29 January 1900,<sup>3</sup> and was father of :

5b) Charles Edward Dodington Carmichael, *b.* at Agra Bengal, on 3 November 1854, and *d.* at Nynee Tal, Bengal, on 4 September 1856.

5b) David Carmichael, *b.* on 3 January 1861, and *d.* young.

5b) David Lyndoch Camrichael, *b.* at Dorking on 2 January 1866, and *d.* at Nynee Tal, Bengal, on 19 June 1867.

5b) Sir James Forrest Halkett Carmichael, *b.* at Bareilly, Bengal, on 8 July 1868, and *m.* in 1908, to Winifred Mary, daughter of Rev. J. M. Webster Row. He *dsp* on 12 August 1834.

5b) George Gawler Irving Carmichael, *b.* at Landour, Bengal, on 23 June 1870, and served as a lieutenant in the Gloucestershire Regiment and India Staff Corps. He *d.* unmarried on 23 June 1905.

5b) Constance Barre Carmichael, *b.* 10 September 1856, and *m.* on 8 October 1878, to Rev. E. Jermyn, and has issue.

5b) Annie Louisa Carmichael, born 30 September 1858, died 3 March 1859.

5b) Gertrude Wilson Carmichael, *b.* at Bareilly, Bengal, on 14 December 1861.

5b) Mary Adelaide Carmichael, *b.* at Bengal, on 8 December 1863, and *d.* unmarried on 22 January 1943.

5a) David Fremantle Carmichael, *b.* on 15 October 1836, and was appointed to Madras Civil Service. He *m.* firstly, at Cheadle, Cheshire, on 4 March 1856, to Jane Theophila, eldest daughter of Robert Gee, of Holy Wood, near Stockport,<sup>1</sup> (she *d.* at Government House, Madras, on 14 June 1860<sup>2</sup>) ; secondly, on 27 September 1876, Sarah Margaret, daughter of the Ven. George Truelock, Archdeacon of Killala. She died 23 April 1900. He *d.* at Richmond, Surrey, on 30 September 1903,<sup>3</sup> and was father of :

5b) Anne Theophila Carmichael, *b.* at Madras on 27 January 1857, and *m.* at Ootacamund, Madras, on 11 August 1880, to John Wellonghby Francis Dumergue.<sup>4</sup>

5b) Katherine Georgiana Carmichael, *b.* at Madras on 15 July 1858, and *m.* at Madras, on 29 December 1881, to Lieutenant-Colonel Sir William Hutt Curzon Wylie,<sup>5</sup> (he was assassinated by an Indian Nationalist at Jehangir Hall in July of 1909).

5b) Jane Trevelyan Carmichael, *b.* at Madras, on 14 June 1860, and *m.* at Madras on 29 December 1881, to Harry George Wedderburn, Barrister-at-law.<sup>6</sup>

5a) George Lynedoch Carmichael, *b.* on 8 December 1831, and *m.* on 7 July 1870, Eva Maria, daughter of Andrew Saunders, The Downes, Eliug, Hants, (she *d.* on 10 April 1871). He *d.* on 29 January 1903, and was father of :

5b) **EVELYN GEORGE MASSEY CARMICHAEL**, *b.* on 3 April 1871, and became a Barrister-at-law. He became heir-male of the family on the death without male issue of Claude Carmichael in 1915, and unsuccessfully claimed the Hyndford Peerage. He *m.* at St. Paul's, Knightsbridge, London, on 29 February 1908, to Dorothea Helen, younger daughter of Sir James Colquhoun of Colquhoun, *d.* on 14 July 1959, and was father of :

**JAMES CARMICHAEL, 1<sup>ST</sup> BARONET**, *b.* on 22 February 1780, and entered the Royal Engineers. He served with distinction under Sir David Baird at the Cape of Good Hope and Corunna, afterwards commanding the corps of Royal Engineers attached to the army in the Low Countries under Lord Lynedoch, when he planned the memorable attack on Bergen-op-Zoom. He was commanding Engineer with the allied army in 1815, and served on the personal staff of the Duke of Wellington at Quatre Bras and Waterloo. At the close of the war he was created a Baronet by George IV. for distinguished military services. Sir James Carmichael-Smyth was subsequently appointed Governor of the Bahamas, in 1829, and thence removed in 1836, to the more important colony of British Guiana, where, after carrying into effect the emancipation of the slaves, and administering the government with eminent success, he *d.* at Camp House, Georgetown, on 4 March 1838.<sup>3</sup> He *m.* on 28 May 1816, to Harriet, only surviving child of General Robert Morse, Royal Engineers, (she *d.* at Sussex Place, Regent's Park, London, on 23 September 1870<sup>4</sup>), and was father of :
