

# CARNEGIE

## OF CRAIGO

**DAVID CARNEGIE, 1<sup>ST</sup> OF CRAIGO**, was appointed Dean of Brechin, and purchased the lands of Craigo. He *m.* Helen, daughter of David Lindsay, Bishop of Brechin, (she *d.* on 18 July 1656), *d.* in 1672 and was father of :

1. David Carnegie, fiar of Craigo, *m.* Helen, daughter of Henry Stewart, Lord Balcaskie, and *dsp* prior to July of 1673.
2. Mr. James Carnegie of Craigo, (*see below*).
3. Mr. Robert Carnegie, became a Minister and *d.* unmarried,
4. Agnes Carnegie, *m.* Robert Paterson, Principal of Marischal College, and had issue.

**MR. JAMES CARNEGIE OF CRAIGO**, was appointed minister, first of Redgorton and afterwards of Barrie, and was retoured heir general to his father on 12 July 1673.<sup>1</sup> He *m.* Anne Gardyne, (she *d.* on 30 December 1739), *d.* on 6 December 1701,<sup>2</sup> and was father of :

1. David Carnegie of Craigo, (*see below*).
2. Elizabeth Carnegie, *m.* firstly, to Robert Arbuthnott, and secondly, to Sir James Nicolson of Lasswade and that ilk.
3. Helen Carnegie, *d.* unmarried.
4. Magdalen Carnegie, *m.* John Mudie of Ardbeikie, and had issue.
5. Agnes Carnegie, *m.* Thomas Ogilvy of Kinnaldy.
6. Catherine Carnegie, *m.* Pearson.
7. Anne Carnegie, *m.* Dickson of Stonefield.

**DAVID CARNEGIE OF CRAIGO**, succeeded his father on his death and was served heir to him in the lands of Ardoch and Craigo on 23 February 1703.<sup>1</sup> He *m.* on 26 October 1704, to Margaret Dempster of Logie, *d.* in March of 1761,<sup>2</sup> and was father of,

1. Robert Carnegie, *b.* on 17 June 1705, and *d.* the following morning.
2. James Carnegie, *b.* on 6 April 1707, and *d.* on 10 January 1732.
3. Alexander Carnegie, *b.* on 29 July 1709, and *d.* on 2 July 1747.
4. Carnegie, *b.* in 1714, and *d.* on 7 January 1715.
5. John Carnegie, *b.* on 18 July 1716, and *d.* on 4 August following.
6. David Carnegie, *b.* on 5 August 1719, and *d.* on 29 May 1724.
7. Thomas Carnegie of Craigo, (*see below*).
8. David Carnegie, *b.* on 11 November 1730, and *d.* at Muriefauld on 15 September 1731.
9. Margaret Carnegie, *b.* on 25 April 1706.
10. Anne Carnegie, *b.* on 9 April 1708, and *d.* on 19<sup>th</sup> following.
11. Anne Carnegie, *b.* on 24 April 1711, and *d.* on 7<sup>th</sup> July following.
12. Agnes Carnegie, *b.* on 22 September 1712, and *d.* on 20 August 1713.
13. Elizabeth Carnegie, *b.* on 21 February 1718.
14. Anne Carnegie, *b.* on 25 February 1721, and *d.* unmarried at Montrose on 26 November 1799.<sup>3</sup>
15. Jane Carnegie, *b.* on 27 October 1722, and *d.* on 2 July 1769.
16. Mary Carnegie, *b.* on 16 March 1724.
17. Clementina Carnegie, *b.* on 31 October 1725.
18. Helen Carnegie, *b.* on 23 May 1727. She *d.* unmarried and to whom her nephew, David Carnegie of Craigo, was served heir general on 31 December 1818.<sup>4</sup>
19. Mary Carnegie, *b.* in March of 1732 and *d.* on 5 February 1736.

**THOMAS CARNEGIE OF CRAIGO**, *b.* on 11 February 1729, succeeded his father on his death and was served his heir general on 25 January 1762.<sup>5</sup> He was served heir of taillie and provision to Elizabeth Arbuthnott of Balwyllie on 28 June 1782,<sup>6</sup> and *m.* on 19 April

1775, to Mary, daughter of James Gardyne of Middleton,<sup>1</sup> (c/m 12 April 1775<sup>2</sup>). He *d.* at Craigo on Sunday 9 September 1793,<sup>3</sup> was father of :

1. David Carnegie of Craigo, (*see below*).
2. James Carnegie Gardyne of Finhaven, *b.* on 3 November 1785, was admitted a member of the Societh of Writers to the Signet, and succeeded to the lands of Finhaven upon which he assumed the additional surname of Gardyne. He *d.* unmarried at Scarborough on 6 June 1864.<sup>4</sup>
3. Mary Carnegie, *b.* on 21 December 1777, *m.* on 26 August 1803, to Sir George MacPherson Grant, 1<sup>st</sup> Baronet, (he *d.* at Ballindalloch Castle on 24 November 1846), and had issue.
4. A daughter, who *d.* unmarried at Montrose on 2 April 1804.<sup>5</sup>
5. Elizabeth Carnegie, *b.* on 27 April 1779, and *m.* at Montrose on 21 December 1801, to Adam Gillies, Advocate.<sup>6</sup> She *dsp* on 18 June 1862.
6. Margaret Dempster Carnegie, *b.* on 24 December 1780, and *m.* at Montrose on 10 September 1805, to Malcolm Laing of Stryngzie.<sup>7</sup> She *dsp* on 2 November 1864.
7. Anne Carnegie, *b.* on 20 September 1782, and *d.* unmarried in October of 1835.
8. Clementina Carnegie, *b.* on 21 March 1784, and *m.* at Edinburgh on 20 May 1825, to William Gillies, London.<sup>8</sup> She *dsp* in 1834.
9. Helen Hay Carnegie, *d.* unmarried at Laverockbank House, Edinburgh, on 27 November 1866.<sup>9</sup>

**DAVID CARNEGIE OF CRAIGO**, *b.* on 9 March 1776, succeeded his father on his death in 1793, and was served heir to his aunt, Helen Carnegie in Montrose, on 31 December 1818,<sup>10</sup> then afterwards to his uncle, Thomas Gardyne of Middletown, in the Eastertown of Gardyne called Legatstoun on 10 January 1842.<sup>11</sup> He *m.* on 1 March 1803, to Isabella

Agnes, daughter of George MacPherson of Invereshie,<sup>1</sup> (she *d.* at Craigo on 24 September 1856<sup>2</sup>), *d.* on 10 November 1845, from injuries sustained by a fall his horse the previous week,<sup>3</sup> and was father of,

1. Thomas Carnegie of Craigo, (*see below*).
2. Charles Hay Carnegie of Pitforthie, *b.* on 5 February 1808, and served as a surgeon in the army. He *d.* unmarried at Brussels, on 12 August 1850.<sup>4</sup>
3. John Carnegie, *b.* on 28 July 1809, and served as an officer in the H.E.I.C.S. He *d.* unmarried at sea on 23 November 1824.<sup>5</sup>
4. Isabella Carnegie, *bap.* on 17 April 1806, and *d.* unmarried at Edinburgh on 20 February 1876.<sup>6</sup>
5. Mary Carnegie, *b.* on 4 May 1811, and *d.* unmarried at Craigo on 23 February 1847.<sup>7</sup>
6. Anne Grace Carnegie, *b.* on 23 October 1812, and *d.* unmarried on 1 March 1885.<sup>8</sup>
7. Agnes Madeline Carnegie, *b.* on 14 June 1814, and *d.* unmarried at Laverock Bank House, Edinburgh, on 28 January 1890.<sup>9</sup>
8. Agnes Carnegie, *b.* on 17 December 1816, and *m.* at Edinburgh on 10 June 1846, to Mr. John Bain, Minister of the Free Church of Logie Pert.<sup>10</sup> She and her sisters, Agnes Madeline, Anne Grace, Elizabeth and Margaret, were served heirs portioners to their father in the lands of Over and Little Dysart and Balstool, in the sheriffdom of Forfar, on 29 October 1858.<sup>11</sup> She *d.* at Edinburgh on Sunday 6 May 1883.<sup>12</sup>
9. Elizabeth Carnegie, *b.* on 4 January 1819, and *d.* unmarried at Laverock Bank House, Edinburgh, on 8 July 1902.<sup>13</sup>

10. Margaret Carnegie, *b.* on 11 July 1822, and *d.* unmarried at Laverock Bank House, Edinburgh, on 17 February 1875.<sup>1</sup>

**THOMAS CARNEGIE OF CRAIGO**, *b.* on 9 March 1804, succeeded his father and was served his heir firstly, in parts of the lands of Craigo on 28 February 1848, and then in those of Bryanstown, Craigshaugh, Farchfield, and others, on 5 June 1850.<sup>2</sup> He *dsp* at Craigo on Thursday 12 June 1856,<sup>3</sup> having conveyed his estate to his nephew, Thomas MacPherson Grant, although on his death without issue in 1883, the lands reverted to Thomas Carnegie's sisters.
