

CRAWFORD

OF SEATON & MONORGUND

HENRY CRAWFORD OF EASTER SEATON, was a successful Merchant and Bailie in Dundee and acquired the lands of Easter Seaton from Sir Peter Young. He *m.* on 17 June 1652, to Margaret, daughter of John Dunmure,¹ (she survived him and *m.* secondly by *c/m* 10 December 1685, to Robert Gardyne, 3rd of Lawton), *d.* on 19 July 1684, aged 56 years,² and was father of :

1. John Crawford, *bap.* at Dundee on 2 January 1653, and *d.* young.

10. Rachel Crawford, *bap.* at Dundee on 1 November 1667.

HENRY CRAWFORD OF SEATON AND MONORGAN, *bap.* at Dundee on 9 May 1661, succeeded his father on his death in 1684, and was retoured his heir general on 18 March 1686,³ then afterwards in annualrents from the lands of Tealing and other lands on 7 February 1688.⁴ He *m.* on 8 July 1680, to Isobella, sister of David Nevay of that Ilk, and daughter of David Nevay of Nevay, Senator of the College of Justice,⁵ and secondly, on 9 April 1692, to Ann Hay, and had issue :

1. Henry Crawford of Monorgan, (*see below*).
2. David Crawford, *bap.* on 30 April 1686.
3. Margaret Crawford, *bap.* at Dundee on 13 October 1681.
4. Elizabeth Crawford, *bap.* at Dundee on Wednesday 16 January 1684.
5. Helen Crawford, *bap.* on 14 January 1688. She and her three sisters, Isobel, Anna and Jean, were infeft in the lands of Monorgan on 18 June 1711.¹
6. Isabel Crawford, *bap.* at Dundee on 29 October 1689.
7. Anna Crawford, *m.* James Coutts of Halgreen, and *d.* at Montrose on 9 October 1763.²
8. Jean Crawford,

HENRY CRAWFORD OF MONORGAN, *bap.* at Dundee on 15 December 1682, was retoured heir to his maternal uncle and grandfather in the half lands of Nevay on 8 March 1692, and heir-portioner to Margaret Nevay, wife of Thomas Miln of Milnfield, his maternal aunt, on the same day.³ He *m.* firstly, at Dundee on 30 March 1709, to Ann Hay by whom he was father of :

1. Henry Crawford, *bap.* at Dundee on 29 December 1711, and *d.* young.

He *m.* secondly, at Newtyle on 4 February 1719, to Elizabeth, daughter of Mr. James Paton of Scotston and Minister of Kettins,⁴ (*c/m* 3 March 1719), *d.* in March of 1731, and was father of :

2. Henry Crawford of Monorgund, (*see below*).
3. James Crawford, *bap.* at Dundee on 12 July 1723.
4. David Crawford, *bap.* at Dundee on 18 August 1724.
5. Isobel Crawford, *bap.* at Dundee on 6 January 1720, and *m.* at Dundee on 26 August 1736, to Mr. Alexander Duncan, Clerk in Dundee, and had issue.

HENRY CRAWFORD OF MONORGAN, *bap.* at Dundee on 29 January 1721, was retoured heir general to his father on 8 July 1731, and afterwards to his great-grandfather, Henry

Crawford of Seatone, in annualrents totalling £162 Scots from the lands of Bonnington, Idvies and others, on 20 April 1736. He was afterwards served heir to his father in the half of the barony of Nevay on 24 June 1755, and *d.* at Dundee of 17 January 1789,¹ having *m.* firstly, on 29 April 1745, to Elizabeth, daughter of Sir John Elphinstone of Logie, (she *d.* at Monorgund on 11 October 1762²). By whom he was father of :

1. Henry Crawford, *bap.* on 30 March 1746.
2. John Crawford of Monorgan, (*see below*).
3. Dr. Thomas Crawford, *d.* at Madagascar while returning home in about April of 1779.³
4. James Crawford, *bap.* on 20 November 1748.
5. Eliot Crawford, *bap.* on 2 April 1751.
6. Charles Crawford, *bap.* on 26 January 1761.
7. Mary Crawford, *bap.* on 5 June 1756, and *m.* on Friday 2 February 1781, to James Mayne of Powis-Logie.⁴ They had issue.
8. Marion Crawford, *m.* at Dundee on 1 December 1794, to David Jobson, Merchant in Dundee.⁵

He *m.* secondly, at Dundee on 21 October 1768, to Helen Murray, (she *d.* at Dundee on 12 August 1814, in her 88th year⁶).

JOHN CRAWFORD OF MONORGAN, *bap.* on 31 May 1747, became a Merchant in London and was served heir to his father 15 July 1802. He sold the lands of Monorgund and *d.* at his house in Montague Street, London, on 1 May 1818.⁷
