

DALGLEISH

OF SCOTSCRAIG

JAMES DALGLEISH, was a merchant and bailie at Queensferry and *m.* on 16 July 1683, to Isabel, daughter of Alexander Stewart of Newhall.¹ He *d.* prior to October of 1719, and was father of :

1. Mr. William Dalgleish of Scotsraig, (*see below*).
2. Alexander Dalgleish, was a successful merchant in India and was *ksp* at Jedda in 1727 while returning home. He left his fortune to his mother who used it to purchase the lands of Scotsraig.
3. James Dalgleish, *bap.* at Queensferry on 8 April 1697, and *d.* young.
4. Robert Dalgleish, *bap.* at Queensferry on 26 September 1703.
5. James Dalgleish of Riddock, *bap.* at Queensferry on 15 July 1705, and was apprenticed to James Grant, Merchant in Edinburgh, on 14 November 1750.²
6. Marion Dalgleish, *bap.* at Queensferry on 1 June 1692, and *m.* firstly, to Samuel Wilson of Plewlands with issue. She *m.* secondly, on 18 March 1734, to David Monypenny of Pitmilley.³
7. Elizabeth Dalgleish, *bap.* at Queensferry on 11 February 1694.
8. Jean Dalgleish, *bap.* at Queensferry on 26 May 1695.
9. Isabel Dalgleish, *bap.* at Queensferry on 28 March 1699, and *m.* on 23 March 1728, to Archibald Stewart of Newhall.⁴ They had issue.
10. Anna Dalgleish, *bap.* at Queensferry on 4 February 1701.
11. Janet Dalgleish, *bap.* at Queensferry on 6 February 1709, and *m.* on 17 November 1732, to Robert Ramsay of Blackgrange.⁵

MR. WILLIAM DALGLEISH OF SCOTSCRAIG, *bap.* at Dalmeny on 8 July 1687, and was educated at the University of Glasgow where he graduated Master of Arts on 27 June 1707, afterwards continuing his studies at Leiden. He was admitted Minister at Ferry-Port-on-Craig on 11 October 1739. He was served heir general to his father on 3 October

1719, and acquired the lands of Scotsraig in which he and his mother, Isabel Stewart, relict of James Dalglish, his mother, were infeft on 26 July 1740. He *d.* on 6 August 1759, having *m.* firstly, on 15 June 1725, to Christian, daughter of Mr. Alexander Dalglish, Minister of Linlithgow,¹ by whom he was father of :

1. **JAMES DALGLEISH OF SCOTSCRAIG**, *b.* on 29 September 1726, was served heir to his mother on 13 July 1750, and succeeded his father to whom he was served heir in the lands of Scotsraig, Southferry and others in Fife, on 28 December 1761. He was admitted an Advocate and *d.* on 11 March 1780, with his brother Robert being served his heir. He *m.* a woman whose name has not been ascertained but who *dsp d.* at Cupar on 15 December 1800.²
2. Robert Dalglish of Scotsraig, (*see below*).

He *m.* secondly, on 31 December 1741, to Christian, daughter of James Nairn, shipmaster in Elie,³ and had further issue :

3. Alexander Dalglish,
4. William Dalglish, *d.* young.
5. William Dalglish,
6. Christian Dalglish.

REV. DR. ROBERT DALGLEISH OF SCOTSCRAIG, led a religious life and was admitted his father's successor as Minister at Ferry Port. He succeeded his brother James on his death, to whom he was served his heir in the lands of Scotsraig, Southferry and others on 8 May 1781, and *d.* on 19 April 1803, having *m.* firstly, on 16 May 1768, to Margaret, daughter of Mr. Robert Spears,⁴ (she *d.* in 1788), by whom he was father of,

He *m.* secondly, to Stewart, daughter of James Dalgleish of Riddock, (she *d.* at Queensferry on 26 January 1831¹), and had no apparent issue.

WILLIAM DALGLEISH OF SCOTSCRAIG, *b.* on 5 August 1770, succeeded and was served heir to his father and his uncle James Dalgleish of Scotsraig, on 5 August 1803. He *m.* on 11 September 1792, to Jean Isobel, daughter of Archibald Ogilvy of Inchmartin,² *d.* at Scotsraig House on 1 August 1824,³ and was father of :

1. Robert Dalgleish of Scotsraig, (*see below*).

2. Archibald Ogilvy Dalgleish of Roseville, *b.* on 8 April 1797, entered the army and served as Captain in the 18th Royal Irish Regiment. He *m.* at Carphin House on 7 December 1831, to Margaret Magdalene, daughter of John Rait of Carphin,⁴ (she *d.* at Allan Villa, St. Andrews, on 25 August 1874⁵), and *d.* at Tarvit House on Monday 21 February 1860, as a result of a head injury sustained when curling on Tarvit Pond.⁶ He was father of :

2a) Robert Dalgleish, *b.* on 14 December 1842.

2a) Margaret Mary Magdalene Dalgleish,

2a) Mary Dalgleish, *b.* in 1833.

2a) Jane Isabella Dalgleish, *b.* on 22 August 1834.

2a) Ellen Hay Dalgleish, *b.* on 15 May 1836.

2a) Caroline Adelaide Dalgleish, *b.* on 24 April 1838, and *m.* at Roseville, Cupar, on 14 August 1861, to Rev. Alexander Maxwell, Minister of the Free Church of Kettle and Cults.⁷ She *d.* at the Free Church Manse of Kettle and Cults on 18 June 1873,⁸ having had issue.

2a) Eliza Dalgleish, *b.* in 1846, and *m.* at St. James's, Cupar, on 18 July 1866, to Lieutenant James Lanlie Fagan.⁹ They had issue.

3. Stewart Dalgleish, *b.* on 18 May 1799, and *d.* at Scotsraig on 8 September 1809.¹

4. James Ogilvy Dalgleish of Woodburn and Baltilly, *b.* on 31 May 1800, and acquired the Woodburn estate in Fife in 1845. He *m.* on 2 April 1831, to Isabella Marshall, only child of David Martin, Merchant in Dundee,² *d.* at Mayfield on 29 November 1875, and was father of :
 - 4a) Sir William Ogilvy Dalgleish of Errol Park, *b.* on 7 June 1832, and led an active mercantile and political life. He was created a Baronet in 1896, and *m.* at Mayfield, near Dundee, on 25 April 1860, to Elizabeth Frances, only daughter of Francis Mollison of Mayfield.³ He *d.* on 21 December 1913.⁴
 - 4a) David Martin Dalgleish, *b.* on 30 October 1835.
 - 4a) A son, *b.* at Dalzell, Cupar, on 29 December 1843.
 - 4a) James Ogilvy Dalgleish, *b.* on 21 March 1846, and *m.* at Birnane on 29 April 1875, to Mary, eldest daughter of A. Carden, of Birnane, Co. Tipperary.⁵ He had issue.
 - 4a) Twin daughters, *b.* at Kilmarnock castle on 16 May 1833.
5. John Dalgleish, *b.* on 6 March 1803.
6. William Dalgleish, was a twin with John and was *b.* on 6 March 1803.
7. Charles Dalgleish, *b.* on 2 February 1806.
8. Eliza Dalgleish, *b.* on 24 July 1794, and *m.* at Scotsraig House on 13 November 1811, to John MakGill of Kemback,⁶ (he *d.* on 3 May 1817). She *d.* on 11 August 1860, having had issue.
9. Margaret Dalgleish, *b.* on 7 February 1796, and *m.* at Scotsraig House on 31 December 1813 to James Heriot of Ramornie.⁷
10. Jean Dalgleish, *b.* on 14 June 1798, and *m.* at Scotsraig House on 7 March 1820, to Captain Hugh Lyon Playfair.⁸
11. Mary Turner Dalgleish, *b.* on 4 April 1802.

ROBERT DALGLEISH OF SCOTSCRAIG AND DURA, *b.* on 16 July 1793, succeeded his father and was served his heir general on 13 September 1824. He *m.* at Dura House on 27
