

DALYELL

OF LINGO

JOHN DALYELL OF NEUK, is named as third natural son to General Thomas Dalyell of Binns, when included in the remainder of a charter for the lands of Binns dated 30 October 1669,¹ and was apprenticed to George Drummond, Merchant in Edinburgh, on 14 June, 1676.² He had a provision of 6000 merks Scots from his father on 3 August 1682,³ and served as a Lieutenant-Colonel in the army. He *m.* at Edinburgh on 12 March, 1686, to his sister-in-law Christian, daughter and one of the three coheirss of John Ellis, Advocate,⁴ and was *k.* at the battle of Malplaquet in 1704, being father of :

1. Thomas Dalyell of Craigfoodie and Lingo, (*see below*).
2. Agnes Dalyell, *m.* Alexander Crawford of Manuelmill, and with her brother Thomas Dalyell and her husband, translated a bond to Magdalen Dalyell of the Binns, on 29 April, 1723, in which they are styled as children of the late Lieutenant-Colonel John Dalyell.⁵
3. Johanna Dalyell, who *dsp* prior to 1 February 1722, when her brother Thomas Dalyell was served heir to her.

THOMAS DALYELL OF CRAIGFOODIE AND LINGO, styled as only son of his deceased father in a Discharge by James, Lord Torphicen, on 1 March, 1706.⁶ On 10 May, 1721, upon reaching the age of twenty-one years, he executed a raitification of a bond granted during his minority and on 28 December of that same year he was included in the remainder of a charter for the lands of Binns.⁷ He *m.* in 1745 to Margaret, daughter of

Andrew Lamont, Bishop of Edinburgh. He *d.* at Edinburgh on 7 September 1785,¹ and was father of :

1. John Dalzell, younger of Lingo, (*see below*).
2. Christian Dalzell,

JOHN DALZELL, YOUNGER OF LINGO, succeeded his father and *m.* at Edinburgh on 15 April, 1759, to Lindsay, daughter of Peter Hay of Leys,² (she *d.* at Balcomie on Sunday 8 November 1778³). He *d. vita patris* at Balcomie on 13 March 1780,⁴ and was father of :

1. Thomas Dalzell, *ksp* at Bangalore.
2. John Dalzell of Lingo, (*see below*).
3. David Dalzell, *b.* 20 September, 1776.
4. Margaret Dalzell, *m.* at Balcomie on 8 August, 1778, to Patrick Rigg of Downfield.⁵
5. Rebecca Dalzell, *b.* on 30 December, 1771, *m.* at Cupar on Tuesday 20 July 1790, to William Ann Douglas of Strathendry,⁶ and had issue.
6. Elizabeth Dalzell, *m.* at Edinburgh on 21 June, 1789, to John Cheape of Rossie,⁷ and had issue.
7. Lucy Dalzell, *b.* on 7 December, 1769, and *m.* a Captain Maxwell.
8. Christian Dalzell, *m.* at Edinburgh in October 1798, to Robert Kirk of Welham Lodge,⁸ and *d.* at Scraptoft on 1 June, 1816.
9. Mary Dalzell, *b.* on 16 March, 1773.
10. Henrietta Scott Dalzell, *b.* on 26 April, 1778, and *m.* at St. John's Chapel, on 14 August, 1822, to Robert Haymes of Great Glenn.⁹

JOHN MELVILLE DALYELL OF LINGO, succeeded his grandfather and *m.* at Edinburgh on 28 November, 1798, to Jane, daughter of John Melville of Murdocairney,¹ (she *d.* at Murdocairney on 24 March 1821). He *d.* at Dalyell Lodge on 30 November 1821,² and was father of :

1. John Dalyell of Lingo, (*see below*).
2. Melville Dalyell, *b.* on 28 January 1803, entered the army and after a full and active career in the Royal North Lancashire Regiments, was raised to General. He *d.* at Edinburgh 13 December 1887.³
3. Thomas Dalyell, *b.* on 2 February, 1806, and served as Lieutenant-Colonel of the 42nd Bengal Light Infantry. He was *ksp* at Narra-owlie, near Saugur, India, on 18 September 1857.⁴
4. James Rigg Dalyell, *b.* at Dalyell Lodge on 25 July, 1812, and *d.* at Wollombi, New South Wales, Australia, on 15 September 1863.⁵
5. Mary Lillias Dalyell, *b.* on 18 July, 1804.
6. Lindsay Rigg Dalyell, *bap.* at Cupar on 12 May, 1808, and *d.* unmarried at Merchiston Crescent, Edinburgh, on 7 July, 1884.⁶
7. Jane Dalyell, *b.* on 19 July, 1810.

JOHN DALYELL OF LINGO, *b.* at Lingo on 7 November, 1799, succeeded his father and to whom he was retoured heir on 9 April 1838. He *m.* at Heriot Row, Edinburgh, on 21 January, 1822, Jane, to daughter of Sir Robert Anstruther of Balcaskie,⁷ (she *d.* on 13 March 1865⁸), and *d.* at Balcaskie on 7 October 1843.⁹ He was father of :

1. Charles Dalyell, *d.* young.

2. **SIR ROBERT ANSTRUTHER DALYELL OF LINGO**, *b.* on 5 May, 1831, and was retoured heir to his father in the lands of Lingo on 17 December 1844. He attained the rank of General and was a member of the Council of the Secretary of State for India. He *dsp* on Saturday 18 January 1890, while at the New Club, Edinburgh, travelling back to Fife to attend a funeral.¹
3. Ralph Dalyell of Lingo, (*see below*).
4. Charlotte Lucy Hamilton Dalyell, *b.* on 2 January, 1823, and *m.* at Blintlesham, Suffolk, on 30 June 1853, to Rev. Maurice Ferdinand St. John.² She *d.* on 28 April 1902.
5. Jane Melville Dalyell, *b.* on 19 August, 1827, and *m.* at the Episcopal Church, Pitenweem, on 4 August, 1852, to Rev. William George Henderson, Dean of Carlisle.³ She *d.* in 1901.

RALPH DALYELL OF LINGO & TICKNEVIN, *b.* on 29 June 1834, served in the War Office for thirty-four years, and was sole executor to his brother Sir Robert on his death in 1890. He *m.* at Kensington, London, on 13 July 1870, to Annie Margaret Christina, daughter of Algernon William Bellingham Greville, of Granard,⁴ (she *d.* at Romsey on 25 August 1924), *d.* on 12 April 1915,⁵ and was father of:

1. Ruth Margaret Dalyell, *m.* at St. Paul's, Knightsbridge, London, on 18 January 1907, to Admiral Gerard Derriman,⁶ and had issue.
2. Jane Violet Dalyell, *m.* at St. Paul's Church, Knightsbridge, London, on 29 July 1899, to Horace Peel, second son of Sir Charles Lennox Peel.⁷
3. Lillias Dalyell, *m.* at St. Peter's, Cranley Gardens, Portsmouth, on 4 November 1908, to Lieutenant Bernard Ward.⁸
