

DICK OF GRANGE

WILLIAM DICK, was a younger son of Sir William Dick of Braid, and became a Merchant in Edinburgh and admitted Burgess of that city by right of his father on 28 August 1639.¹ He *m.* Janet McMath, (she was buried in the Greyfriars, Edinburgh, on 7 July 1676²), with whom he had a charter under the Great Seal for the lands of and barony of Butterdaine on 6 December 1643,³ and whom he appointed his executrix in his Testament which was dated 25 January 1647. He was father of :

1. William Dick of Grange, (*see below*).
2. Janet Dick, *m.* circa 1661 to James Leslie of Lumquhat, and had issue.

WILLIAM DICK OF GRANGE, succeeded his father on his death in 1647, and was served heir to his mother, Janet McMath, in the lands of Over Saint Gillie-Grange, with the manor, on 9 April 1679.⁴ He was buried in the Greyfriars, Edinburgh, on 3 March 1694,⁵ having *m.* firstly, Elizabeth, sister of John Leslie of Newton, (*c/m* 26 January & 1 February, 1672.⁶ She was buried in the Greyfirars, Edinburgh, on 24 November 1674⁷), by whom he was father of :

1. Anna Dick, *m.* at Edinburgh on 26 February 1698, to Patrick Leith of Craighall.⁸
2. Janet Dick, both of whom were served heir to their uncle, John Leslie of Newton, son of Sir John Leslie of Newton, in the lands of Corbie, Corbiehill, Birkhill, the lands and barony of

Newton and various other around Balmerino, in the sheriffdom of Fife, on 12 July 1697.¹ She *m.* firstly, Mungo Carnegie, Advocate, by whom she had issue ; and secondly, in 1709, to Alexander Alison, W.S., (he survived her and *m.* secondly, to Mary, daughter of James Gray of Baledgarno by whom he had issue ; and *d.* in September of 1728).

He *m.* secondly, to Charles, daughter of Robert Leslie of Kinclevean, and had further issue :

3. William Dick of Grange, (*see below*).
4. James Dick or Leslie, is named with his mother in an Indenture relating to the settling of debts due by the deceased Sir James Leslie, dated 17 February 1703.² He *dsp* by 25 August 1704, when his brother, William, was retoured his heir.³
5. Thomas Dick, was included in a heritable Bond by his brother William Dick of Grange dated 19 May 1697.⁴
6. Charles Dick, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 18 January 1680.
7. Andrew Dick, apprenticed to Uchtred MacDowell, Merchant in Edinburgh, on 16 June 1708,⁵ and was admitted a Burgess of Edinburgh, on 11 February 1718.
8. Catherine Dick, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 17 June 1677, and *m.* at Edinburgh on 15 September 1698, to James Christie of Newhall.⁶ She was served heir to her uncle Colonel Sir James Leslie on 31 August 1704, and had issue.
9. Elizabeth Dick, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 10 June 1682.
10. Margaret Dick, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 24 May 1683.

WILLIAM DICK OF GRANGE, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 1 June 1678, succeeded his father on his death and was served his heir general on 29 May 1694.⁷ He *m.* at Edinburgh on 24 February 1707, to Ann, daughter of Sir Alexander Seton, 1st Baronet of Pitmeddan,⁸ and was father of :

1. Alexander Dick, *b.* on 17 July 1718, and *dsp.*
2. Charlotte Dick, *b.* on 12 February 1714, and *dsp.*
3. **ISABELLA DICK**, *b.* on 2 November 1716, and *m.* Sir Andrew Lauder, 5th Baronet of Fountainhall, (he *d.* on 5 March 1769), and had issue which succeeded to the lands of Grange and assumed the additional surname of Dick.
4. Jane Dick, *b.* on 31 August 1721.
