

DRUMMOND

OF CULTMALUNDY

JAMES DRUMMOND, 1ST OF CULTMALUNDY, was second son of David Drummond, 1st of Innermay, younger son of John Drummond 3rd of Drummonderinloch. He had a grant of certain lands in the Barony of Innermay from his father on 2 July 1632, and obtained those of Cultmalundy from George and Laurence Bruce of Cultmalundy on 24 August 1661. He *m.* on 24 September 1656, Elizabeth, daughter of Henry Stewart of Balcaskie, brother of Sir Thomas Stuart of Grantully,¹ *d.* by 6 October 1676, and had issue :

1. James Drummond, *bap.* at Perth on 28 July 1663, and *d.* young.
2. David Drummond, 2nd of Cultmalundy, (*see below*).
3. John Drummond, styled as brother to David Drummond of Cultmalundy in a Bond by himself to James Skene of Newgrange for 1000 merks on 30 November 1693.²
4. Elizabeth Drummond, *bap.* at Perth on 10 August 1669.
5. Helen Drummond, *m.* Colonel James Ferguson of Balmakelly, (he *m.* secondly, Hester Elizabeth Hibelet, indweller in Bois-le-duc, and *d.* suddenly while commanding the garrison at Bois-le-duc in 1705),³ and had issue.
6. Jean Drummond, styled as daughter of James Drummond of Cultmalundy in a deed dated 1699.
7. Anna Drummond, *m.* firstly on 12 January 1688, James Skene, 1st of New Grange, (he *d.* in 1698), and secondly at Edinburgh on 28 February, 1702, Patrick Moncrieff, 5th of Readie.⁴ She *d.* at the Canongate, Edinburgh, in 1719,⁵ and had issue.

DAVID DRUMMOND, 2ND OF CULTMALUNDY, *bap.* at Perth on 12 October, 1666, and was served heir to his father in the lands and barony of Cultmalundy on 6 October, 1676.⁶ He was appointed a Commissioner of Assessment for Perthshire in 1690 and *m.* firstly, on 29

April, 1689, to Catherine, daughter of Walter Sandilands, 6th Lord Torphichen,¹ (*c/m* 29 April 1689). He *m.* secondly Anna, daughter of Sir Charles Halkett of Pitferran, (*c/m* 30 July and 5 August 1697.² She was *bap.* at Dunfermline on 4 November 1679, and surviving him, she *m.* secondly to Colonel James Cathcart of Corbieston), and apparently *dsp.*
