

# DRUMMOND

## OF GAIRDRUM

**ANDREW DRUMMOND**, was fifth son of George Drummond, 1<sup>st</sup> of Blair, and was mentioned in a bond of caution by Andrew Lundy of Conland in 1593.<sup>1</sup> He was appointed minister at Idvy in 1590, and was afterwards transferred to the Ministry at Panbride. He *m.* Margaret Allan with whom he granted a Bond to Mr James Syme, student, for 100 merks on 9 August 1591,<sup>2</sup> and *d.* in 1635. He was father of :

1. Henry Drummond, 1<sup>st</sup> of Gairdrum, (*see below*).
2. Sir Patrick Drummond, who went to France when a youth and entered the service of Duke of Bouillon and to who's children he was appointed governor. Following the death of his patron he entered the court of King Charles I. where he was appointed one of the Gentlemen Ushers. He was appointed Conservator of the Scot's Privileges at Camphyre, in Holland, on 18 January 1625, *m.* Margaret, daughter of John Porterfield, Merchant and Burgess of Edinburgh, (*c/m* 28 May 1632), and *dsp* at Amsterdam in October of 1661.<sup>3</sup>
3. James Drummond, became a minister in Durham and is said to have left issue.
4. Archibald Drummond, stated by Viscount Strathallan, to have resided in Angus and to have left issue.
5. Andrew Drummond,
6. Susanna Drummond, *m.* Henry Robertson, son of Thomas Robertson in Netherton of Tullois.

**HENRY DRUMMOND, 1<sup>ST</sup> OF GAIRDRUM**, who was involved in a brawl in 1625 during which he had his left hand severed.<sup>4</sup> He *m.* in 1630, his cousin Jean, daughter of John Drummond, 3<sup>rd</sup> of Blair, and was father of :

1. **GEORGE DRUMMOND, SOMETIME OF GAIRDRUM**, he succeeded his father and granted a Renunciation of all his rights to his estate to his brother Patrick Drummond.

2. **PATRICK DRUMMOND, 2<sup>ND</sup> OF GAIRDNUM**, succeeded and was retoured heir to his father in the lands of Gairdrum on 23 August, 1663.<sup>1</sup> He *m.* at Perth on 27 December, 1660, Helen, daughter of Mr. John Robertson, Minister of Perth East Church,<sup>2</sup> (*c/m* 15 December 1660<sup>3</sup>), and *dsp* in 1693.
3. James Drummond, 3<sup>rd</sup> of Gairdrum, (*see below*).

**JAMES DRUMMOND, 3<sup>RD</sup> OF GAIRDNUM**, succeeded and was served his heir to his brother Patrick Drummond of Gairdrum, on 13 August 1693.<sup>4</sup> He *m.* Liliias, daughter of John Anderson, Minister of Cargill, *d.* in about 1716 and was father of :

1. Patrick Drummond, 4<sup>th</sup> of Gairdrum, (*see below*).
2. Elspeth Drummond, a natural daughter who was *bap.* at Kinfauns on 15 December, 1673.

**PATRICK DRUMMOND, 4<sup>TH</sup> OF GAIRDNUM**, granted a Bond in favour of Mr. John Campbell, Minister at Monzievaird, on 16 December, 1703, and had a charter under the Great Seal for the lands of Buttergask on 12 February, 1719. He was created an Honorary Burgess of Perth on 14 February 1712, was served heir to his cousin William Ogilvy, son of Alexander Ogilvy in Errol on 3 March 1705, and to his uncle Robert Anderson, Minister at Perth, on the same day. He *m.* at Errol on 8 June 1705, Elizabeth, daughter of Adam Drummond, 8<sup>th</sup> of Lennoch and Megginch,<sup>5</sup> (she was *bap.* at Errol on 5 May 1682), and was father of :

1. **ROBERT DRUMMOND, 5<sup>TH</sup> OF GAIRDNUM**, *bap.* at Errol on 22 May, 1707, succeeded his father and *dsp* in 1731.
2. Adam Drummond, 6<sup>th</sup> of Gairdrum, (*see below*).
3. John Drummond, *d.* on 13 April 1749, aged 32 years.
4. James Drummond, apprenticed to William Tod, Merchant in Edinburgh, on 10 January 1733.<sup>6</sup>
5. Jannet Drummond, *bap.* at Errol on 12 April 1706.

6. Alison Drummond, *bap.* at Perth on 1 March 1713.

**DR. ADAM DRUMMOND, 6<sup>TH</sup> OF GAIRDNUM**, *b.* in around 1710, and practiced as a physician. He was entered as an Honorary Burgess of Perth on 29 January, 1736, and was served heir to his brother Robert Drummond of Gairdrum in the lands of Buttergask and Lidgethen on 2 February 1767. He *m.* at Perth on 12 July 1743, Jacobina Davidson,<sup>1</sup> *d.* at Bandirran on 4 November 1792,<sup>2</sup> and was father of :

1. Adam Drummond, younger of Gairdrum, served an Lieutenant in the army and *dsp* in around December 1777 from wounds received at the battle of Brandywine, in America, on 11 September previous.<sup>3</sup>
2. John Drummond, 7<sup>th</sup> of Gairdrum, (*see below*).
3. **JEAN DRUMMOND, 8<sup>TH</sup> OF GAIRDNUM**, *bap.* at Perth on 2 February, 1750, was retoured heir of tailzie to her brother, John, in the lands of Gairdrum on 6 January 1804, and in which she was infest on the 16th following. She *dsp* at Bandirran on 22 July 1829.<sup>4</sup>
4. **ELIZABETH DRUMMOND, 9<sup>TH</sup> OF GAIRDNUM**, *bap.* at Perth on 8 December, 1752, was served heir to her sister in the lands of Gairdrum on 19 March, 1830, and, with her sister Anna, granted a Disposition of the lands of Gairdrum in favour of their niece Jean Drummond. She *dsp* at Bandirran House on 17 January 1839, in her 87<sup>th</sup> year.<sup>5</sup>
5. Anna Drummond, who *dsp* on 16 July 1837.<sup>6</sup>

**JOHN DRUMMOND, 7<sup>TH</sup> OF GAIRDNUM**, had Sasine for the lands of Gairdrum following upon a resignation in his favour by his father on 24 April, 1784, and attained the rank of Major in the army. He *d.* at Hotwells, Bristol, on 2 November 1803,<sup>7</sup> having *m.* firstly, Margaret Drummond, (*c/m* 25 April 1790), by whom he had issue :

1. Jane Drummond, 10<sup>th</sup> of Gairdrum, (*see below*).

He *m.* secondly on 29 July, 1793, Margaret, daughter of James Paterson, 1<sup>st</sup> of Carpow,<sup>1</sup> (*c/m* 29 April 1793. She *d.* at Earn Bank on 6 October 1835<sup>2</sup>), by whom he had no issue.

**JANE DRUMMOND, 10<sup>TH</sup> OF GAIRDNUM**, *b.* in 1791, and was retoured heir to her aunts Elizabeth and Jean Drummond in the lands of Gairdrum on 25 June, 1846. She *m.* at Bandirran on 4 August, 1816, James Mellis Nairne of Dunsinane,<sup>3</sup> (he *d.* at Banderran House on 25 February 1848<sup>4</sup>), *d.* on 6 December, 1865,<sup>5</sup> and had issue :

1. William Nairne, *b.* on 25 July 1817, and *d.* at Bandirran on 29 June 1824.
2. **JANE DRUMMOND NAIRNE, 11<sup>TH</sup> OF GAIRDNUM**, *m.* firstly, at Bandirran House, on 8 October 1840, to Mortimer Percy Drummond, from whom she was divorced in June of 1857,<sup>6</sup> and secondly, to Thomas Charles Waddy who assumed the surname of Drummond, (he *d.* on 15 January 1870<sup>7</sup>). She was served heir to her mother in the lands of Gairdrum on 23 February, 1866, and sold the Bandirran estate to Colonel MacDonald in 1871.
3. Jessie Drummond Nairne, *m.* at Edinburgh on 19 June 1840, George Barrett Lennard of Belhouse,<sup>8</sup> and had issue.
4. Elizabeth Drummond Nairne, *b.* on 25 July 1822, and, with her sister Ann, were nominated as heirs to their maternal aunts Elizabeth and Ann Drummond of Gairdrum. She *m.* on 14 December 1845, Henry Thomas Smyth Coward Pigott, second son of John Hugh Smyth-Pigott of Brockley Hall,<sup>9</sup> (he *d.* in 1858), and had issue.
5. Jemima Drummond Nairne, *b.* on 3 November 1825, and *m.* at Edinburgh on 1 March 1849, Lieutenant Fitzroy Molyneux Somerset,<sup>10</sup> (he was *b.* on 29 December 1823, and *m.* secondly on 5 September 1882, Emily, daughter of Revd. George Biederman. He *d.* on 22 February 1901). She *d.* on 19 June 1874, and had issue.
