

DRUMMOND

OF HAWTHORNDEN

SIR JOHN DRUMMOND, 1ST OF HAWTHORNDEN, *b.* in 1553, and was included in the remainder of a charter for the lands of Carnock in a Charter by his father, Sir Robert Drummond of Carnock, in favour of his elder brother Patrick Drummond, dated 15 February 1569. He was appointed Gentleman Usher to King James VI. by whom he was Knighted in 1603, and purchased firstly the lands of Slipperfield followed by those of Hawthornden from James Douglas of Hawthornden, on 29 December 1597.¹ He *m.* Susanna, daughter of Sir William Fowler, Secretary to the Queen, *d.* in around 1610, and was father of :

1. Sir William Drummond, 2nd of Hawthornden, (*see below*).
2. James Drummond, styled as second son of the deceased Sir John Drummond of Hawthornden in a complaint raised by him against Sir George Touris of Innerleith in 1618.² He *m.* Margaret, daughter of Andrew Lumsden of Balnarn, and had issue, all of which are said to have *d.* young.
3. Alexander Drummond, styled as brother of William Drummond of Hawthornden in a list of those charged by the Privy Council in 1614 to apprehend members of the Clan Gregor in Upper Strathearn.³ He is said to have *dsp* aged about 50.
4. John Drummond, followed a military life and was killed at the siege of Brest, in France, in 1629.
5. Anna Drummond, had a gift under the Privy Seal of the ward of Robert Callander, son of the deceased John Callander of Manar, on 6 May, 1600, and *m.* Sir John Scott, 1st of Scotstarvet, Director of the Chancery, (he survived her and *m.* secondly by December of 1637, to Elizabeth, daughter of Sir James Melville of Hallhill, by whom he had issue. He *m.* thirdly by *c/m* 6 January, 1646,⁴ Euphemia, daughter of John Monypenny of Pitmilly, who was then widow of William Rigg of Athenrie, and *d.* in 1670 aged 84 years). They had issue.

6. Rebecca Drummond, who was offered in marriage to Robert Callendar of Manar by her sister Anna Drummond on 18 February, 1608.¹
7. Elizabeth Drummond, *m.* by 19 May, 1632, William Douglas of Bonjedward, when she is styled as his spouse in a Discharge by George Douglas of Bonjedward to William Douglas of Cavers.²
8. Jean Drummond, offered in marriage by her sister Anna Drummond to Robert Callander of Manar on 27 February, 1605, although this was not accepted. She *m.* Patrick Maxwell of Newhall.

SIR WILLIAM DRUMMOND, 2ND OF HAWTHORNDEN, *b.* on 13 December, 1585, and was served heir to his father in the lands of King's Field on 24 August, 1611.³ He is best known for being a renowned poet and scholar and *m.* in 1632, Elizabeth, sister to James Logan of Mountlothian. He *d.* on 4 December 1649,⁴ and was father of :

1. John Drummond, *c.* at Linlithgow on 12 November, 1633, and *d.* young.
2. William Drummond, 3rd of Hawthornden, (*see below*).
3. Robert Drummond, *m.* at Edinburgh on 18 December, 1673, Agnes, daughter of Edward Maxwell of Hills,⁵ (she was widow of John Logan of Burncastle, by whom she had issue,) and served in the Life Guards of King Charles II. He *d.* in 1691.⁶
4. Richard Drummond, *bap.* at Lasswade on 22 August, 1639, and *d.* in infancy.
5. James Drummond, *d.* in infancy.
6. Elizabeth Drummond, *bap.* at Linlithgow on 4 October, 1632, and *m.* at Edinburgh on 1 March, 1655, Dr. Henry Henderson of Elvinston, (*c/m* 26 January 1665⁷). They had issue.
7. Margaret Drummond, *bap.* at Linlithgow on 30 December 1634, and *d.* young.
8. Ann Drummond, *bap.* at Linlithgow on 7 March 1637, and *d.* young.
9. Jane Drummond, *d.* young.

WILLIAM DRUMMOND, 3RD OF HAWTHORNDEN, *bap.* at Linlithgow on 8 April 1636, succeeded his father on his death in 1649 and was served his heir on 29 December 1652.

He *d.* in 1713 having *m.* firstly, on 1 December 1657, Sophia, daughter of Sir John Auchmuthie of Gossford,¹ by whom he was father of :

1. Sophia Drummond, *m.* firstly, on 24 March, 1678, John Murray, 1st of Cringeltie,² from whom she was divorced on the grounds of his impotency. She *m.* secondly, Robert Preston of that Ilk, by whom she had no issue.
2. Elizabeth Drummond, *d.* unmarried on 14 December 1689.³
3. Margaret Drummond, *d.* in infancy.

He *m.* secondly at Edinburgh on 28 April, 1663, Barbara, daughter of Sir William Scott of Clerkington,⁴ (she was widow of John Stewart, younger of Blackhall, who had *d.* in 1658), and was father of :

4. William Drummond, 4th of Hawthornden, (*see below*).
5. Robert Drummond, *bap.* at Lasswade on 28 October, 1677, *m.* Jean, daughter of John Drummond of Fintullich, and became an Apothecary in Edinburgh. He *d.* in October of 1713⁵ and was father of :

5a) Barbara Drummond, styled in her father's Testament as his only child. She was placed under the care of her paternal uncle William Drummond of Hawthornden and against whom her cousin Barbara Mary Drummond, daughter and heiress of this William, had a ruling by the Court of Session in February of 1761 against her laying any claim to the Hawthornden estate as one of the collateral heirs of her deceased father.⁶ She *m.* at Leith on 15 September, 1730, William Halliday, Tidewaiter in Greenock,⁷ and had issue :

5b) Drummond Halliday, *bap.* at South Leith on 6 August, 1731.

5b) Adam Halliday, *bap.* at South Leith on 25 August, 1732.

5a) Margaret Drummond, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 8 October, 1710, and *d.* in infancy.

6. Barbara Drummond, *bap.* at Lasswade on 8 August, 1665, and *d.* at the age of 18 years.
7. Elizabeth Drummond, *m.* John Purves of Abbeyhill.

8. Anne Drummond, *bap.* at Lasswade on 7 January, 1672, *m.* John Corsar, Writer in Edinburgh, and *dsp*
9. Mary Drummond, *bap.* at Lasswade on 31 March, 1675, *m.* Sir Charles Milne of Barnton, (he *d.* at Hawthornden on 6 November 1730¹), and had issue.
10. Jacobina Drummond, *bap.* at Lasswade on 8 February, 1680, and *d.* young.

WILLIAM DRUMMOND, 4TH OF HAWTHORNDEN, *b.* in 1664 and *m.* Isobel, daughter of Sir John Ramsay of Whitehill. He *d.* in 1735 and was father of :

1. William Drummond, 5th of Hawthornden, (*see below*).
2. Isabel Drummond, *d.* unmarried at Edinburgh on 8 April 1776.²
3. Margaret Drummond, *m.* firstly at Edinburgh on 13 July, 1701, William Nairne, Bailie of Dalkeith,³ (*c/m* 17 July 1701⁴), and had issue ; and secondly at Edinburgh on 22 August, 1721, to Patrick Leith of Craighall, Advocate.⁵ By her first husband she had issue :
 - 3a) David Nairne, *bap.* at Dalkeith on 8 March, 1707, and *dsp.*
 - 3a) Ann Nairne, *bap.* at Dalkeith on 13 December, 1703, and *d.* in infancy.
 - 3a) Isabel Nairne, was retoured heir to her cousin William Drummond of Hawthornden, on 17 February 1790, and *dsp* prior to 7 September, 1791, when her cousin Francis Pinkerton was served her heir in the lands of Hawthornden.
 - 3a) Barbara Nairne, *bap.* at Dalkeith on 31 January, 1709, and *dsp.*
 - 3a) Anne Nairne, *bap.* at Dalkeith on 17 July, 1711, and *dsp.*
4. Barbara Drummond, *m.* first, at Edinburgh on 31 January, 1721, William Walker, Apothecary in Edinburgh,⁶ and surviving him, she secondly at Edinburgh on 27 October, 1727, Andrew Brown of Dolphington.⁷ She *dsp.*
5. Anne Drummond, *bap.* at Lasswade on 9 December, 1709, and *m.* on 9 August, 1748, Mr. John Pinkerton, Minister at Markinch, (son of James Pinkerton, schoolmaster at Lasswade, and was *b.* on 9 August, 1717. He *d.* suddenly at Balfour House on 17 June, 1784). She *d.* on 21 April, 1787, and had issue :

5a) Francis Pinkerton, *b.* on 27 July, 1749, and attained the rank of Captain in the 98th Regiment of Foot. He was granted Royal licence to assume the surname of Drummond on the basis that he was the only descendant and representative of William Drummond of Hawthornden¹ and was served heir to his cousin Isabel Nairne in the lands of Hawthornden on 7 September, 1791. He was father of :

5b) Sir John Francis Pinkerton Drummond, was served heir to his father on 29 September, 1823, and apparently *dsp.*

5a) Archibald Pinkerton, *b.* in 1752 and left no apparent issue.

6. Rosina Drummond, *bap.* at Lasswade on 12 June 1712.

7. Mary Drummond, *bap.* at Lasswade on 29 September 1714, and *d.* unmarried.

WILLIAM DRUMMOND, 5TH OF HAWTHORNDEN, succeeded his father and had an Instrument of Sasine for the lands of Hawthornden on 23 March, 1724.² He *m.* Jean, daughter of Sir Charles Milne of Barneton, (*c/m* 7 June 1722³), *d.* at Edinburgh on 18 May 1760,⁴ and was father of :

1. William Drummond, *bap.* at Lasswade on 22 December, 1723, qualified as a Doctor and *dsp* in Jamaica prior to 23rd March 1761.

2. Barbara Mary Drummond, succeeded her father and was served his heir in his entire estate on 23 March 1761.⁵ She *m.* firstly in 1751, Robert MacGregor alias Murray, of Glencarnock, (he was widow of Christian, daughter of John Campbell of Roro, and also of Robina, daughter of Major Donald Cameron, younger son of Sir Ewen Cameron of Locheil. He *d.* in Edinburgh in October of 1758 leaving issue by his second wife), whom she survived ; and secondly at Edinburgh on 26 October 1766, Dr. William Abernethy,⁶ second son of Alexander Abernethy of Corskie. She *d.* at Edinburgh on 11 September 1789, in her 68th year⁷ and had issue :

2a) Jean Abernethy, *b.* on 4 December 1763, and *d.* at Edinburgh on 11 February 1777.⁸
