

DRUMMOND

OF INNERMAY

DAVID DRUMMOND, 1ST OF INNERMAY, was second son of John Drummond, 3rd of Drummonderinoch, and obtained the lands of Innermay on 7 November 1618. He served for a time as Chamberlain to successive Lord Drummonds and *d.* in around 1632, having *m.* firstly, Janet Tosheoch with whom he had Sasine for the lands of Lentibberts from Agnes Bethune, relict of Sir James Chisholm of Cromlix, on 18 July 1603, in which he is styled as brother to the deceased John Drummond of Drummonderinoch,¹ (she *d.* in October of 1607²). By her he was father of :

1. David Drummond, 2nd of Innermay, (*see below*).
2. Jean Drummond, *m.* firstly, to Mr. James Pearson, 1st of Kippenross and Minister of Dunblane, by 3 July 1631, when they had a Bond for 1000 merks Scots from John Drummond of Carnock,³ and had issue. She *m.* secondly at Dunblane on 17 March, 1660, Major John Home of Argaty,⁴ (he *dsp* on 30 June 1670⁵), and *d.* in September of 1691.⁶

He *m.* secondly, Elizabeth, daughter of John Abercromby of Kersie, (*c/m* 7 August & 6 September 1618⁷), and was father of :

3. James Drummond, 1st of Cultmalundy, (*see Drummond of Cultmalundy*).
4. Isabell Drummond, *m.* James Graham, 1st of Monzie, (he was *k.* at the battle of Philiphaugh, in 1646), and had issue.
5. Margaret Drummond, *b.* in 1621 and *m.* Sir George Muschet of Burnbank. She *d.* of the plague on 10 August 1647, with three of her young children. The inscription on her tombstone at

Burnbank House reads "Here lyes the Corpes of Margaret Drummond, Third daughter to the Laird of Innermay, and spouse to Sir George Muschet of Burnbank: Her Age 26: Departed this life in the Wisitation, with her three children at Burnbank, The 10 of August 1647."

6. Marjory Drummond, styled as youngest daughter of her father in a grant of an annualrent to be uplifted from the lands of Broomhill and Inverdunning for 320 merks.

DAVID DRUMMOND, 2ND OF INNERMAY, succeeded his father and had a charter for the lands and Barony of Innermay on 2 July 1632.¹ He had a charter for the lands of Kippen from John Graham of Balgowan on 23 January 1624, which lands were later incorporated into the Barony of Innermay by King Charles I. on 21 July 1632. He *m.* Helen, daughter of Sir James Chisholm, 5th of Cromlix, (*c/m* 23 January 1637²), and was father of :

1. David Drummond, 3rd of Innermay, (*see below*).
2. James Drummond, apprenticed to David Boyd, Merchant in Edinburgh, on 12 May 1669, and was admitted an Honorary Burgess of Perth on 21 October 1709, and is then styled as brother to the Laird of Innermay.³ He was father of :
 - 2a) A child, who died in infancy and was buried in Greyfriars, Edinburgh, on 4 August 1699.⁴
3. Elspeth Drummond, *m.* firstly, to James Drummond, 2nd of Comrie, (*c/m* 14 July 1654. He *d.* in November of 1679⁵), and secondly, Colin Campbell of Fornoct, and had issue.
4. Jean Drummond, *m.* firstly, William Oliphant, 5th of Culteucher, (*c/m* 12 May 1659. He *d.* by 11 August 1676), and had issue ; and secondly, to Thomas Stewart, 3rd of Ladywell, (he was widow of Elizabeth, daughter of John Graham, 2nd of Balgowan, whom he had *m.* in 1660 and by whom he had issue), and had issue.
5. Margaret Drummond, *m.* firstly, Paul Dog, 6th of Balingrew, (*c/m* 30 December 1679. He was widow of Jean, second daughter of Uchtred Knox, of Ranfurlie, and was *k.* when the party of soldiers he was with was ambushed in Argyle in 1685) and had issue. She survived him and *m.* secondly, Sir George Oliphant, 2nd Baronet of Newton, (*c/m* 13 July 1689), by whom she had no issue. She was buried in the High Church Yard, Glasgow, on 20 August, 1718.

DAVID DRUMMOND, 3RD OF INNERMAY, succeeded his father and had a Charter under the Great Seal for the lands of Innermay, and others, on 3 August 1681. He *m.* at Edinburgh on 27 February 1677, to Annabella, daughter of Sir John Rollo of Bannockburn, (*c/m* 27 February 1677.¹ She *d.* at Edinburgh on 2 February, 1693, and was buried in the King's Chapel of Holyroodhouse), *d.* in around 1707 and was father of :

DAVID DRUMMOND, 4TH OF INNERMAY, was the only apparent child and was *b.* in around 1679. He *m.* at Forgandenny on 1 June 1699, Janet, daughter of Patrick Meldrum of Leathers,² (she was widow of Laurence Oliphant, 4th of Condie, by whom she left issue, and surviving David Drummond, she *m.* for a thirdly, to Thomas Oliphant, second son of James Oliphant, 3rd of Gask, who *dsp* on 6 September 1740), and *d.* in December of 1718³ with his lands thereafter passing to David Oliphant of Culteucher, as heir, on 17 September 1719. He was father of :

DAVID DRUMMOND, YOUNGER OF INNERMAY, the only son who *dsp vita patris* at London in June of 1716.
