

DRUMMOND

OF INNERPEFFRAY

JOHN DRUMMOND, 1ST OF INNERPEFFRAY, was a younger son of Sir John, 1st Lord Drummond. A precept for a charter of confirmation was issued under the Privy Seal for his infeftment in the lands of Candlochdow and Calzenagad, on 8 May, 1510, and in which he is styled as son of John, Lord Drummond,¹ and had a Charter for the extensive lands of Inchaffray and Innerpeffray with the office of Forester of Glenartney under the Great Seal on 2 April, 1532. He *m.* firstly, Isabella, daughter of James Drummond, 1st of Coldoch, by whom he had issue :

1. Sir John Drummond, 2nd of Innerpeffray, (*see below*).
2. Sybilla Drummond, she was one of the mistresses to King James V. She *m.* firstly, John Charteris of Cuthilgurdy whose relict she styled on 8 February, 1549,² and by whom she had no issue. She *m.* secondly, Alexander Graham by 8 February, 1549, when Elizabeth and Alison Charteris, heirs of their brother John Charteris of Cuthilgurdy had a decret arbal concerning her rights to the lands of Kinclaven,³ and thirdly by 2 August, 1565, James Herring of Drimmie. She *d.* on 23 June, 1571.⁴
3. Isabella Drummond, *m.* Alexander Gordon, 1st of Buckie, and had issue.

He *m.* secondly, Elizabeth Douglas, said to be of the family of Lochleven, and was father of :

4. Henry Drummond, 1st of Riccarton, (*see Drummond of Riccarton*).

He was also father of a natural son :

5. John Drummond, who had Letters of Legitimation under the Great Seal on 28 February, 1522.

SIR JOHN DRUMMOND, 2ND OF INNERPEFFRAY, succeeded his father and *m.* by 5 March, 1535, Margaret Stewart, natural daughter of King James IV. by Margaret, daughter of John, 1st Lord Drummond,¹ (she was widow of John, Lord Gordon, and Alexander Stewart, Commendator of Inchaffray). Having no son, he granted his lands of Innerpeffray to his daughter Jean Drummond and James Chisholm of Cromlix, her husband, on 10 February, 1558,² and had was father of,

1. Agnes Drummond, *m.* firstly, by 26 July, 1550, Sir Hugh Campbell, 8th of Loudoun, (he *d.* in 1561), and secondly, Hugh Montgomery, 3rd Earl of Eglinton, (*c/m* at Innerpeffray on 8 June, 1562.³ He had previously been *m.* to Jean, youngest daughter of James Hamilton, Earl of Arran, although a Papal Dispensation had not been obtained for this union and, being within the fourth degree of consanguinity, the marriage was dissolved in 1562. He *d.* on 3 June, 1585,) and had issue. She *m.* thirdly, Patrick, 3rd Lord Drummond, (*c/m* on 15 November, 1585.⁴ He was widow of Elizabeth, daughter David Lindsay, 9th Earl of Crawford, by whom he had issue), *d.* in 1589 and had issue.
2. Isabel Drummond, *m.* Sir Matthew Campbell, 9th of Loudoun, and had issue.
3. Margaret Drummond, *m.* Robert, 3rd Lord Elphinstone, (*c/m* at Stirling 3 September, 1546,) and had issue.
4. Jean Drummond, *m.* by 10 February, 1558, Sir James Chisholm, 3rd of Cromlix, when her father granted to them a charter for the lands of Innerpeffray. They had issue.
5. Elizabeth Drummond, *m.* Malcolm Drummond, 3rd of Bordland, (he *m.* secondly, Agnes, daughter of James Reidheugh, 2nd of Tulliechettill, and *d.* on 28 February, 1588,) and had issue.
