

DRUMMOND

OF KELTIE

JAMES DRUMMOND, IN CULT, was son of James Drummond, in Cult, brother of Gavin Drummond, 1st of Kildees. He *d.* in January of 1662¹ and was father of :

1. James Drummond, acted as executor to his father in 1662.
2. John Drummond, appointed Minister at Monzie and acted as executor to his brother George Drummond upon his death in 1680. He purchased the lands of Keltie in which he was infeft in August of 1697² and *dsp* prior to September of 1699 when his nephew John Drummond was retoured his heir.
3. George Drummond, resided in Strogeith and *m.* Isabella, daughter of Charles Murray of Glentarff, (she survived him and *m.* secondly, to James Drummond, second son of James Drummond, 3rd of Kildees, by whom she had further issue). He *d.* in April of 1680³ and was father of :
 - 3a} **JOHN DRUMMOND, 1ST OF KELTIE**, (*see below*).
 - 3a} Catherine Drummond, *m.* John Stewart, at the Mill of Pitcairns, (*c/m* 4 October 1702⁴).
 - 3a} Liliás Drummond,
 - 3a} Margaret Drummond, all of whom are named in their father's Testament in 1680.
4. Andrew Drummond, resided in Strogeith and was cautioner for his father's Testament in 1662.

JOHN DRUMMOND, 1ST OF KELTIE, who was under age at the time of his father's death in 1680 and was placed under the care of his uncle John Drummond, Minister of Monzie, to whom he was served heir in the lands and Barony of Keltie on 7 September, 1699.⁵ He

m. at Dunning on 5 January, 1701, Margaret, daughter of James Graham, 9th of Garvock,¹ (*c/m* 28 December 1700²), and was father of :

1. James Drummond, 2nd of Keltie, (*see below*).
2. David Drummond, *bap.* at Dunning on 14 May 1710, and became a Surgeon in the army.
3. John Drummond, *bap.* at Dunning on 2 December 1711, and was appointed Stampmaster at Auchterarder. He *m.* Anna, daughter of George Drummond of Calendar, *d.* in November of 1744³ and was father of :
 - 3a) Helen Drummond, *m.* Mr. William Erskine, Minister at Muthill, (he *d.* on 2 February, 1783, aged 73 years), and had issue.
4. Ann Drummond, *m.* at Dunning on 28 November 1731, William Hally of Kinneder,⁴ and had issue.
5. Katherine Drummond, *m.* at Dunning on 11 December 1737, to her brother-in-law James Hally, brother of William Hally of Kinneder.⁵
6. Isobel Drummond, *bap.* at Dunning on 26 April, 1709.
7. Æmelia Drummond, *m.* at Dunning on 16 November, 1740, James Patton⁶ and had issue.

He was also father of a natural son :

8. Duncan Drummond, is styled as son to John Drummond of Keltie when he appears as witness to a Bond by John Stewart of Dalguise in 1711.⁷ He became a Messenger in Perth, *m.* at Dunning on 13 January, 1717, Jean, daughter of Thomas Caw, Merchant in Crieff,⁸ (she was widow of Andrew Whittit, in Dunning,⁹), and was father of :

8a) John Drummond, *c.* at Dunning on 26 November, 1717, and became a Messenger in Perth by 23 January, 1753, when he granted a Discharge to Bailie John Stewart on behalf of Gilbert Stewart of Kinnaird, in which he is styled as son of the deceased Duncan Drummond, Messenger. He *d.* in January of 1771¹ and had issue,

8b) Janet Drummond, acted as executor to her father and *m.* Patrick Watt, Weaver in Perth.

8a) James Drummond, *bap.* at Dunning on 15 November 1719.

JAMES DRUMMOND, 2ND OF KELTIE, *b.* in 1701, succeeded his father in the lands of Keltie and acted as executor to his grandmother Isabella Murray. He *m.* at Dunning on 16 January, 1732, Christian, daughter of William Hally of Kinneder,² *d.* at Keltie on 8 April 1764, aged 63 years,³ and was father of :

1. John Drummond, 3rd of Keltie, (*see below*).
2. William Drummond, *bap.* at Dunning on 28 March 1735, and *m.* at Kenmore on 15 December, 1764, Margaret, daughter of Patrick Campbell,⁴ (she *d.* on 6 December 1802⁵). He was father of,
 - 2a) Christian Drummond, *bap.* at Muthill on 24 April 1766, and *dsp.*
3. James Drummond, *bap.* at Dunning on 10 November 1737, became Captain of a vessel in India and *dsp.*
4. Charles Drummond, *b.* on 27 December 1744, entered the army as a Lieutenant and *dsp.*
5. David Drummond, *bap.* at Dunning on 20 September 1747, and *d.* in the service of the East-India Company.
6. Gavin Drummond, *b.* on 11 March 1751, *m.* on 26 June 1794, Clementina, daughter of David Graham of Duntrune, and sister and heiress of Alexander Graham of Duntrune,⁶ (she was served heir to this brother who had *d.* on 27 October, 1804, on 6 April 1805), and *d.* on 19 June 1809.⁷ He was father of,

- 6a) **CLEMENTINA DRUMMOND, 7TH OF KELTIE**, *m.* at Edinburgh on 3 October, 1812, David Ogilvy, Earl of Airlie,¹ (he was *b.* at Auchterhouse on 4 December, 1751, and *m.* secondly on 15 November, 1838, Margaret, only child of William Bruce of Cowden. He *d.* on 20 August 1849). She was served heir to her cousin Mark Howard Drummond in the lands of Keltie on 8 May 1827, *d.* on 1 September 1835, and had issue.
7. Robert Drummond, *b.* on 1 July 1752, and *d.* young.
 8. Andrew Drummond, *b.* on 11 December 1754, and *d.* young.
 9. Christian Drummond, *bap.* at Dunning on 10 March 1737, *m.* at Dunning on 7 June, 1767, John Herdman,² and had issue.
 10. Barbara Drummond, *bap.* at Dunning on 18 August, 1740, and *d.* unmarried at Dunfermline on 6 August 1805.³
 11. Ann Drummond, *bap.* at Dunning on 22 May, 1742, and *d.* unmarried.
 12. Amelia Drummond, *bap.* at Dunning on 1 September, 1743, *m.* in 1780, George Millar, in Drummawhence, and had issue.
 13. Mary Drummond, *b.* on 16 January, 1746, and *m.* M. D. Mack. She *d.* at Dunning in February of 1806.⁴
 14. Katherine Drummond, *bap.* at Dunning on 9 August, 1749, *m.* Mark Howard, Jamaica, and *dsp* there in 1806.⁵

JOHN DRUMMOND, 3RD OF KELTIE, *b.* on 23 July, 1733, and was appointed Surgeon in the East-India Company. He *m.* on 15 February, 1767, Euphemia, daughter of John Aytoun of Inchdairnie,⁶ (she *d.* on 10 January 1817⁷), and *d.* at Keltie on 18 June 1801,⁸ being buried in Dunning Churchyard. He was father of,

1. James Drummond, *b.* on 10 September, 1767, and *dsp* *vita patris* .
2. Roger Drummond, *b.* and *bap.* at Dunning on 15 June, 1769, and *dsp* *vita patris*.

3. John Henry Drummond, *b.* on 10th and was *bap.* at Muthill on 15 September, 1773, and *dsp vita patris.*
4. Robert Drummond, 4th of Keltie, (*see below*).
5. Andrew Drummond, *b.* on 3 April and *bap.* at Dunning on 2 May, 1776, and *d.* young.
6. **WILLIAM DRUMMOND, 5TH OF KELTIE**, *b.* on 31 August, was *bap.* at Dunning on 7 September, 1778, and attained the rank of Major of the 60th Regiment of Foot with whom he led a distinguished military career. He was retoured heir to his brother Dr Robert Drummond in the Barony of Keltie on 22 August 1810, *m.* in 1806, Susanna Catherine Wohlfahrt, (she was widow of Mr. Boyle, Surinam, and *d.* at Paris on 4 April 1835¹), and *dsp* during the assault on Fort Erie during the American War in September of 1814.²
7. David Drummond, *b.* on 10 and *bap.* at Dunning on 19 December, 1781, and *d.* young.
8. **MARK HOWARD DRUMMOND, 6TH OF KELTIE**, *b.* on 3rd December, was *bap.* at Dunning on 4 December, 1786, and attained the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel of the 27th Regiment of Foot. He was retoured heir to his brother Major William Drummond in the Barony of Keltie on 24 December 1814, and *dsp* onboard the “Pomona” on 13 February 1826.³ He was succeeded the lands of Keltie by his cousin and heir Clementina Drummond.
9. Mary Christian Arrabella Drummond, *bap.* at Dunning on 2 July, 1771, and *d.* young.
10. Clementina Jean Marjory Easson Drummond, *c.* at Dunning on 15 October, 1788, and *dsp* in 1817.⁴
11. Isabella Drummond, *d.* young.

ROBERT DRUMMOND, 4TH OF KELTIE, *b.* on 27 March 1775, and was served heir to his father in the barony of Keltie on 15 April, 1803, in which he was infeft on 11 May 1804. He studied medicine at Edinburgh and became Surgeon to the Bombay Establishment in India. He *m.* at Culcabock on 17 August, 1800, Catherine, daughter of Arthur Robertson of Inches, (she *d.* at Broach, East Indies, in September 1804⁵), *d.* in India in March of 1809 and was father of :

1. Catherine Drummond, *b.* in around 1805 and *dsp.*
