

DRUMMOND

OF LENNOCH & MEGGINCH

JOHN “GYLOCH” DRUMMOND, 1ST OF LENNOCH, was younger son of Sir John Drummond, 2nd of Concraig, and Sasine for the lands of Dalchonzie and Gartherne from his nephew Maurice Drummond of Concraig on 11 September, 1450.¹ He was witness to a Notarial Instrument by this same nephew confirming that he had granted to his cousin Maurice Donaldson the lands of Kelauch, and others, on 17 May, 1453,² *d.* by 5 November, 1455, and was father of :

MAURICE DRUMMOND, 2ND OF LENNOCH, had Sasine for the lands of Dalchonzie as heir to his deceased father on 5 November, 1455,³ which he exchanged with John, Lord Drummond, for those of Struthill and Barnacles with the Chapel of St. Casloguy and the bell of the chapel of Cultichaldich on 15 June, 1474.⁴ He *d.* by 1502 and was father of :

WALTER DRUMMOND, 3RD OF LENNOCH, who was entered as tenant of the Crown lands of Lennoch in 1502⁵ and was a member of the inquest at the retour of William Murray, as heir to his late father William Murray of Castleton held at the Steward Court of Crieff on 9 May, 1516.⁶ He *d.* in around 1540 and was father of :

JOHN DRUMMOND, 4TH OF LENNOCH, succeeded to these lands in around 1540, and is mentioned in a charter of 2 July, 1560, regarding certain lands possessed by the Abbey of Inchaffray. He was cautioner to John Drummond of Colquhalzie when the latter was ordered to make account of his expenses during his time as tutor dative to Henry Reidheugh, eldest son and heir of William Reidheugh of Wester Aberlednock, on 2 April,

1576, and with many other Drummonds, subscribed to a bond of caution not to harm George Lundy of Gorthy in 1593. He *m.* Dorothy, daughter of William Drummond, 3rd of Balloch, with whom he had a charter for the lands of Farness-Easter from Margaret Balfour, widow of Henry Reidheugh of Aberlednock, and spouse to John Murray of Cowden on 23 May 1563,¹ and was father of :

1. William Drummond, fiar of Lennoch, (*see below*).
2. George Drummond, subscribed to a bond of caution with his father not to harm George Lundy of Gorthy in 1593.
3. John Drummond, became a Saddler in Edinburgh and is included in a bond of caution not to harm George Lundy of Gorthy in 1593.

WILLIAM DRUMMOND, FIAR OF LENNOCH, the eldest son who *m.* Janet, daughter of Duncan Nairne, 1st of Torbrecks, who, in her virginity and as his future spouse, was infeft in the liferent of the lands of Balloch, on his father's resignation, on 15 June 1577,² and with her he was infeft in the lands of Farness on 20 February, 1580.³ He *d. vita patris* on 16 January 1592,⁴ and was father of :

1. **JOHN DRUMMOND, 5TH OF LENNOCH**, had a charter for the fee of the lands of Lennoch as heir to his father on 14 January, 1598, and had *m.* by then to Barbara, daughter of Alexander Reidheugh, 4th of Tulliechettill.⁵ He *dsp* prior to 26 November, 1601, and was succeeded by his brother Patrick.
2. Patrick Drummond, 6th of Lennoch, (*see below*).

PATRICK DRUMMOND, 6TH OF LENNOCH, had a confirmation under the Great Seal for the lands of Easter and Wester Farness and Lennoch on 26 November, 1601,⁶ and is styled as a son of William Drummond of Lennoch in a Sasine dated 10 July, 1605. He *d.*

by December of 1653 having *m.* firstly, to Margaret, daughter of Adam Spittall of Blairlogie, by whom he was father of :

1. John Drummond, 7th of Lennoch, (*see below*).
2. David Drummond, styled as brother to John Drummond of Megginch in a Commission dated 22 August, 1677.

He *m.* secondly by 16 November, 1633, Mary, daughter and coheiress of John Erskine of Chapelland,¹ with whom he resigned what rights he may have to her deceased father's lands of Valleyfield and Byrefield in favour of George Bruce of Carnock on 7 December, 1638, and by whom he was father of :

3. George Drummond, retoured heir to his mother Mary Erskine on 22 December, 1653. He was retoured heir to his father in the lands of Muirton on the same day which he had sold to Gilbert Robertson, Merchant in Stirling, on 2 November, 1653.²
4. Mary Drummond, *m.* in 1656, John Reidheugh of Laggan, (he *d.* in March of 1672). She *d.* in May of 1693 aged 60 years, was buried in Kirkealdy and had issue.

JOHN DRUMMOND, 7TH OF LENNOCH & 1ST OF MEGGINCH, styled as son to Patrick Drummond of Lennoch in an Instrument of Sasine dated 25 November, 1633. He was apprenticed to John Mude, Writer to the Signet, for the space of three years on 11 January, 1630, and had a charter from his father for the lands of Farness and Lennoch on 16 November, 1633³. On 12 December, 1642, his father resigned all rights he had to his lands into the hands of the King for re-ineftment in favour of John and Jean Campbell his wife. He purchased the lands of Megginch from Sir Peter Hay of Megginch for which he had a Charter of Confirmation on 15 July, 1664, to be held by himself and Adam Drummond, his eldest lawful son and their heirs. He *d.* in May of 1679,⁴ having *m.* Jean, daughter of Colin Campbell, 1st of Aberuchill, with whom he had a resignation from his

father for the lands of Lennoch and Farness on 12 December, 1642.¹ By her he was father of :

1. Adam Drummond, 8th of Lennoch, & 2nd of Megginch, (*see below*).

2. Alexander Drummond, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 28 April 1650, and had a charter for the lands of Leuchat from his maternal kinsman Alexander Spittall of Leuchat on 12 October 1666, by the terms of which he became obliged to assume the surname and arms of Spittall of Leuchat. He *m.* at Errol on 23 July, 1671, Elizabeth, daughter of James Holburn of Menstrie, (*c/m* 17 July 1671²), *d.* prior to June of 1705 and was father of :

2a) James Spittall of Leuchat, *bap.* at Errol on 3 May, 1675, and was retoured heir general to his father on 21 June, 1705. He *m.* his cousin Janet, daughter of James Holburn of Menstrie, *d.* on 15 November 1770, and was father of :

2b) James Spittal, fiar of Leuchat, *m.* on 6 December, 1718, to Elizabeth, daughter of John Leslie of Quarter,³ (she had a Disposition for her deceased husbands subjects in Inverkeithing from her father-in-law James Spittall of Leuchat on 3 May, 1765), and *d. vita patris*. He was father of :

2c) James Spittal of Leuchat and Blairlogie, *bap.* at Blairlogie on 5 December, 1721, and succeeded his grandfather in the lands of Leuchat for which he had an Instrument of Sasine on 17 October, 1765.⁴ He attained the rank of Captain in the army, *m.* Frances Innes, (from whom he was separated in 1765⁵), and *d.* on 13 January 1796. He was father of :

2d) Elizabeth Spittall of Leuchat, *b.* at Edinburgh on 17 September, 1765, and was served heir to her father in the lands of Lipnoch on 17 March 1803. She *m.* at Edinburgh on 8 July, 1796, Robert Bruce Dundas of Blair,⁶ (he was *b.* on 6 August, 1754), and had issue, (*see Dundas of Blair*).

2c) John Spittall, *bap.* at Blairlogie on 13 May, 1723.

2c) Alexander Spittall, *bap.* at Burntisland on 23 May, 1724.

2c) Janet Spittall, *bap.* at Dalgety on 4 October, 1719.

2c) Alison Spittall, *bap.* at Blairlogie on 26 October, 1720, and *m.* at Edinburgh on 4 April, 1756, James Stewart, Merchant and Provost of Edinburgh, (he was widow of Elizabeth, daughter of Adam Drummond, Surgeon, by whom he had issue ; and *d.* on 10 June, 1777). She *d.* at Kirkbraehead on 9 October 1813.¹

2b) Alexander Spittal, *bap.* at Blairlogie on 6 August, 1695.

2a) Jean Spittall, styled as eldest grandchild to Jean Campbell, widow of John Drummond of Megginch, in a Disposition in her favour by the said Jean Campbell of her liferent of the lands of Lennoch on 24 June, 1684.² She *m.* James Holbourne of Menstrie, and had issue.

2a) Eupham Spittall, *bap.* at Inverkeithing on 23 October, 1677.

2a) Anna Spittall, *bap.* at Inverkeithing on 15 January, 1679.

2a) Jannet Spittall, *bap.* at Inverkeithing on 14 October, 1681.

2a) Margaret Spittall, *m.* at Edinburgh on 8 October, 1710, her cousin Dr. Adam Drummond,³ and had issue.

2a) Alison Spittall, *m.* John Leslie, 2nd of Quarter, (he *d.* on 29 July, 1706), and had issue.

3. William Drummond, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 30 October, 1659.

4. Jean Drummond, *m.* at Edinburgh on 15 August, 1682, John Riddoch of Laggan,⁴ (he *d.* in June of 1706), and *d.* in August of 1689 aged 40 years. She was buried in Kirkcaldy and had issue.

5. Anne Drummond, *b.* in around 1653 and *m.* firstly at Errol on 7 May, 1672, James Christie, fiar of Dalry.⁵ She survived him and *m.* secondly at Errol on 7 January, 1673, Alexander Duncan, 1st of Lundie,⁶ (he *d.* in April of 1696 aged 44 years). She *d.* in April of 1695, aged 42 years, and was buried in the Howff, Dundee. They had issue.

6. Isabella Drummond, *m.* Charles Murray of Glentarff, (he *d.* in 1689), and had issue.

ADAM DRUMMOND, 8TH OF LENNOCH AND 2ND OF MEGGINCH, *c.* at Edinburgh on 6 March, 1649, and was included in his father's charter for the lands of Megginch in 1664. He was appointed a Justice of the Peace in Perthshire following the succession of William and Mary in 1690 and was nominated one of the Commissioners to inquire into

the Massacre of Glen Coe in 1695. He *m.* on 27 September, 1673, Alison, eldest daughter of John Hay of Hayston,¹ (*c/m* 30 August 1673²), *d.* in March of 1709 and was father of :

1. John Drummond, 9th of Lennoch and 3rd Megginch, (*see below*).
2. Alexander Drummond, *bap.* at Errol on 22 June 1683.
3. Colin Drummond, *bap.* at Errol on 11 June 1684, and was appointed Professor of Philosophy at the College of Edinburgh. He *m.* firstly on 14 March 1708, Elizabeth, daughter of Andrew Straton of Kirkside,³ and secondly on 3 July, 1743, Mary, daughter of Thomas Weir, Surgeon,⁴ and *dsp* at Edinburgh on 25 August 1753.⁵
4. Adam Drummond, qualified as a Surgeon and is mentioned as such in his brother Colin's Testament in 1753. He *m.* on 8 October, 1710, his cousin Margaret, daughter of Alexander Spittall of Leuchat, and *d.* at Drumsheugh on Friday 22 December 1758.⁶ He was father of :
 - 4a) Adam Drummond, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 25 December, 1719.
 - 4a) John Drummond, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 7 February, 1722.
 - 4a) Elizabeth Drummond, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 29 March, 1714, and *m.* at Edinburgh on 17 April, 1737, James Stewart, Merchant and Provost of Edinburgh,⁷ (he survived her and *m.* secondly at Edinburgh on 4 April, 1756, to Alison, daughter of James Spittall, fiar of Leuchat,⁸ and *d.* on 10 June, 1777). She *d.* on 11 November 1752, and had issue.
 - 4a) Alison Drummond, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 26 April, 1716.
 - 4a) Jean Drummond, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 9 June, 1717.
 - 4a) Margaret Drummond, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 10 September, 1718.
5. Thomas Drummond, *bap.* at Errol on 7 January, 1687, and was apprenticed to Thomas Edgar, Apothecary in Edinburgh, on 23 July, 1701.⁹
6. Anna Drummond, *bap.* at Errol on 5 May, 1682, and *m.* at Megginch on 7 November, 1705, James Craigie, fiar of Dunbarney.¹⁰ They had issue.

7. Elizabeth Drummond, was a twin with Anna and was *bap.* at Errol on 5 May, 1682. She *m.* on 8 June, 1705, Patrick Drummond, 4th of Gairdrum,¹ and had issue.
8. Alison Drummond, *bap.* at Errol on 8 January, 1686, and *m.* at Pencaitland on 12 April, 1710, to Mr. Matthew Simpson, Minister of Pencaitland,² (he was widow of Katherine, daughter of Robert Wallwood, Merchant, whom he had *m.* at Pencaitland on 23 October, 1707, and by whom he had no issue. He *d.* on 20 May 1756). She *d.* on 24 February, 1736, and had issue.
9. Helen Drummond, *bap.* at Megginch Castle on 8 May, 1688, by Alexander Murray of Woodend, and was one of the “name mothers” of Helen Scrimgeour, daughter of John Scrimgeour of Kirkton, at her baptism on 17 January, 1713.
10. Isabell Drummond, *bap.* at the Meeting House in Errol on 28 June, 1689, by John Anderson, Minister at Perth.
11. Jean Drummond, *m.* at Errol on 22 April, 1718, Joseph Austin of Kilsplindie,³ (he was widow of Ann Waters by whom he had issue and *d.* in 1737), and had issue.

JOHN DRUMMOND, 9TH OF LENNOCH AND 3RD OF MEGGINCH, *b.* in around 1680 and *m.* at Edinburgh on 2 February, 1712, Bethia, daughter of James Murray of Deuchar.⁴ He *d.* in 1752 and was father of :

1. **ADAM DRUMMOND, 10TH OF LENNOCH AND 4TH OF MEGGINCH**, *b.* at Edinburgh at “five minutes before twelve of the clock, midday” and was *bap.* at Errol on 31 January 1713, and succeeded his father. He served in Lascelle’s Regiment of Foot (47th) during the Jacobite rising of 1745 and later in the American War and was admitted a member of the Faculty of Advocates. He *m.* at London in February of 1755, Catherine, daughter of Henry Powlett, Duke of Bolton,⁵ (she was widow of William Ashe and *d.* at Edinburgh on 8 October 1774), and *dsp.* on Saturday 24 June 1786.⁶
2. James Drummond, “second son to John Drummond of Megginch born on the second day of January at half one hour after one in the afternoon.” He was *bap.* at Errol on 5 January, 1714, and *dsp.*

3. John Drummond, *bap.* at Errol on 15 July, 1716, by Mr. Fleming, Minister at Lundie, with the witnesses being John Graham of Glendoik and Joseph Austin of Kilspindie, and *d.* young.
4. Gilbert Drummond, *bap.* at Errol on 18 October, 1717, and *dsp.*
5. Patrick Drummond, *bap.* at Errol on 19 June, 1720, and was apprenticed to William Hogg, Merchant in Edinburgh, on 16 April, 1736.¹ He *dsp.*
6. Colin Drummond, *bap.* at Errol on 30 July, 1722, served as paymaster to the forces in Canada and was appointed Collector of Taxes for Perthshire. He *m.* at Forgandenny on 31 December 1753, Catherine, daughter of Robert Oliphant of Rossie,² (she *d.* in 1810), *d.* onboard HMS Juno in May of 1776, and was father of :

6a) **JOHN DRUMMOND, 5TH OF MEGGINCH**, *bap.* at Errol on 18 October, 1754. He was served heir to his uncle Adam Drummond of Megginch on 17 June, 1786, and to his father on 17 October, 1786, and sold his lands in Strathearn to Graham-Stirling of Strowan. He conveyed the lands of Megginch to his younger brother Robert Drummond. He *m.* at London on 4 August, 1788, Susan, daughter of John Fane, 9th Earl of Westmorland, (she *d.* in 1793), *d.* in 1836 and was father of :

6b) John Drummond, *b.* on 5 October, 1793, attained the rank of Major-General in the army and *m.* on 5 May, 1821, Georgiana Augusta, sister of George Finch, of Burley-on-the-Hill. He *d.* at Boyce Court, Gloucestershire, on 15 April 1875,³ and was father of :

6c) Georgiana Matilda Drummond, *m.* at St. George's, Hanover Square, London, on Tuesday 6 July 1852, George Onslow Deane, 22nd Regiment,⁴ and had issue.

6b) Susan Drummond, *m.* at Snareston on Thursday 9 August 1810, to George Moore, younger of Appleby Hall, and *d.* at Snareston Lodge on 6 April 1813, having had issue.

6a) **ROBERT DRUMMOND, 6TH OF MEGGINCH**, *b.* in 1759 and to whom his brother disposed the lands of Megginch. He attained the rank of Captain in the Elliot East-Indiamen, *m.* on 21 June 1810, to Mary, eldest daughter of Revd. Joseph Phillimore, Rector of Orton on the Hill,⁵ (she *m.* secondly, in December of 1820, to Richard Geasley, of Stowe House,¹ and *d.* on 15 December 1841), and *dsp.* on 31 January 1815.²

6a) **SIR ADAM DRUMMOND, 7TH OF MEGGINCH**, *b.* in 1770, was served heir his brother Robert Drummond in the lands of Megginch on 10 April, 1815, and attained the rank of Admiral in the Royal Navy. He *m.* on 28 May 1801, Charlotte, daughter of John Murray, 4th Duke of Atholl, (she was widow of Sir John Menzies of Weem, whom she had *m.* at London on 4 March, 1797, and *d.* on 31 May 1832³). He *d.* at Norfolk Street, Park Lane, London, on 3 May 1849,⁴ and was father of :

6b) **JOHN DRUMMOND, 8TH OF MEGGINCH**, *b.* on 10 April, 1803, and succeeded his father on his death in 1849. He *m.* on 20 November, 1835, Frances Jemima, fourth daughter of General Sir John Oswald of Dunniker,⁵ (she *d.* at Hallingbury, Essex, in December of 1891), *d.* at Megginch on Wednesday 15 May 1889,⁶ and was father of :

6c) **MALCOLM DRUMMOND, 9TH OF MEGGINCH**, *b.* on 2 March, 1856, and succeeded his father upon his death in 1889. He *m.* at Westminster, on 30 April 1890, to Geraldine Margaret Tyssen, daughter of William Amherst Tyssen-Amherst, 1st Baron Amherst of Hackney,⁷ (she *d.* on 24 August 1956), and *d.* at Perth Royal Infirmary on 29 May 1924, of the effects of having fallen at Perth Railway Station on 16th May and broken his right leg.⁸ He had issue :

6d) **JOHN DRUMMOND, 10TH OF MEGGINCH**, *b.* on 6 May 1900, and *m.* at the Savoy Chapel, London, on 8 February 1928, Violet Margaret, only daughter of Sir Robert William Buchanan Jardine,⁹ (she *d.* on 16 October 1975). He *d.* on 13 April, 1982, and had issue :

6e) **JEAN DRUMMOND, 11TH OF MEGGINCH**, *b.* on 17 December 1928, and succeeded her father. She *m.* on 2 June 1952, Captain Humphrey ap Evens, who afterwards assumed the surname of Drummond, *d.* in March of 2005 and had issue.

- 6e} Heather Drummond, *b.* on 9 November 1931, and *m.* on 11 August 1954, Lieutenant-Commander Andrew Curry.
- 6e} Margaret April Drummond, *b.* on 3 April 1939, and *m.* on 14 December 1963, Sir Quentin Somerville Agnew Somerville.

- 6c} James Charles Drummond, *b.* in 1832 and *d.* in January of 1848 from having drowned after falling through ice on the pond at his uncle Rev. Robert's home.⁴
- 6c} Charlotte Annie Drummond, *m.* at Kurrachee on 6 November 1845, to Major Reginald Best Brett, Bombay Artillery,⁵ and *d.* on 25 June 1882.⁶
- 6c} Jane Catherine Drummond, *m.* at Kurrachee on 23 September 1845, to Henry Stanley, 5th Regiment.⁷
- 6c} Emily Sandelia Drummond, *m.* at Sukkur on 15 January 1848, to Lieutenant John Forbes, 3rd Regiment Bombay Light Cavalry.⁸
- 6b} James Charles Drummond, *b.* in October of 1807 and enlisted in the 19th Regiment of Bengal Native Infantry. He *d.* at Nusserabad, India, on 27 November 1827.⁹

- 6b) Henry Maurice Drummond, *b.* on 8 June 1816, and *m.* at Perth on 13 October, 1859, Charlotte Elizabeth, daughter and heiress of James Richardson Hay of Seggieden, (she *d.* on 27 April, 1914). He *d.* on 3 January, 1896, and had issue, (*see Hay of Seggieden*).

- 6b) William Russell Drummond, had the rank of Lieutenant in the Navy and *d.* onboard the *Satellite* on 31 January 1835, from wounds received at Callao.³
- 6b) Elizabeth Drummond, *bap.* at Brancepath on 12 April 1810, and *m.* on 18 August 1832, to Henry Howard, 2nd Earl of Effingham,⁴ (he *d.* on 5 February 1889).
- 6a) Elizabeth Drummond, *bap.* at Errol on 3 March, 1758.
- 6a) Jean Atholl Drummond, *bap.* at Errol on 11 January, 1764.
7. Francis Drummond, *bap.* at Errol on 16 September, 1723, and became Surgeon in Colonel Lascelle's Regiment of Foot, in which capacity he is styled when created an Honorary Burgess of Perth on 21 May 1744. He *d.* in 1747 from the effects of wounds received at the battle of Prestonpans in September of the previous year.
8. John Drummond, *b.* on 9 March 1736.
9. Ann Drummond, *bap.* at Errol on 30 January 1719.
10. Bethia Drummond, *bap.* at Errol on 13 May 1726.
11. Elizabeth Drummond, *m.* on 4 October 1779, to Captain John Augustus, Lord Harvey, (he was *b.* on 1 January, 1757, and *d.* on 10 January 1796), and *d.* on 4 September, 1818, leaving issue.
12. Jean Drummond, *bap.* at Errol on 31 March, 1725, and *m.* firstly at Edinburgh on 7 May, 1749, James Moray, 2nd Duke of Atholl, (he was widow of Jean, youngest daughter of Thomas Frederick, son and heir of Sir John Frederick, Alderman of London, whom he had *m.* in 1727.
