

# DRUMMOND

## OF LOGIEALMOND

**SIR JOHN DRUMMOND OF BUNRBANK AND 1<sup>ST</sup> OF LOGIEALMOND**, was fourth son of John Drummond, 2<sup>nd</sup> Earl of Perth, and acquired the lands of Burnbank, in Menteith, from David Muschet of Calliechat and others by resignation in his favour dated at Edinburgh on 30 July 1658, which was confirmed under the Great Seal on 25 July 1665.<sup>1</sup> He also acquired the lands of Logiealmond which had been resigned in his favour by James, Earl of Tulliebardine, on 7 June 1667, for which he had a confirmation under the Great Seal dated 12 July 1667,<sup>2</sup> and *m.* Grizel, daughter of Sir Thomas Stewart, of Grantully, (*c/m* 18 August, 1664,<sup>3</sup> with a Tocher of 20,000 merks). He *d.* prior to 22 July, 1678, and was father of :

1. **THOMAS DRUMMOND, 2<sup>ND</sup> OF LOGIEALMOND**, *b.* in 1673 and distinguished himself at the battle of Sheriffmuir in November of 1715 by the 'unseating' of a number of government dragoons. He was made prisoner during the battle, was taken to Carlisle Castle and received a Royal Pardon and Remission on 25 October 1716. He *m.* firstly Ann, daughter of Patrick, 2<sup>nd</sup> Lord Kinnaird, (*c/m* 3 December 1701<sup>4</sup>), by whom he had no issue. He *m.* secondly, in around 1722, Grizel, daughter of David Leslie, 2<sup>nd</sup> Lord Newark, (she *d.* at Logiealmond on Sunday 12 July 1761<sup>5</sup>), and *dsp* at Logiealmond on 18 December, 1757, in his 84<sup>th</sup> year,<sup>6</sup> being succeeded in the lands of Logiealmond by his nephew, John Drummond.
2. William Drummond, who, with his sister Grissell, had an annualrent to be uplifted from the lands of Logiealmond from their mother on 7 November, 1687. He obtained the lands of

Ballathie in which he was infert on 10 April, 1711,<sup>1</sup> and *m.* after 3 May, 1703, Elizabeth, daughter of George Oliphant, 2<sup>nd</sup> of Clashbeny. He *d.* in June of 1724<sup>2</sup> and was father of,

2a) **JOHN DRUMMOND, 3<sup>RD</sup> OF LOGIEALMOND**, (*see below*).

2a) Thomas Drummond, was ordained a Minister of the Episcopal Church in Scotland and *dsp* at Edinburgh on 23 November 1766.<sup>3</sup>

2a) Mary Drummond, who was living in 1744.

2a) Elizabeth Drummond, *m.* on 9 January 1743, to Anthony Murray of Balmanno and Merchant in Edinburgh,<sup>4</sup> (*c/m* in March of 1743. He *dsp* on 7 September 1746<sup>5</sup>), and *dsp.*

3. Grizel Drummond, she and her brother William Drummond had an annualrent from her mother on 7 November 1687, and is then styled as only daughter.<sup>6</sup>

**JOHN DRUMMOND, 3<sup>RD</sup> OF LOGIEALMOND**, was served heir to his father on 14 January, 1741, and to his uncle Thomas Drummond of Logiealmond in the lands of Logiealmond on 21 February, 1758. He entered the service of the King of Prussia, under Marischal Keith, and was appointed an aide-de-camp to Frederick the Great, in 1750. He *m.* at Perth on 8 January 1761, Katherine, daughter of William Murray, 3<sup>rd</sup> Earl of Dunmore,<sup>7</sup> (she *d.* in 1791) and *d.* at Logiealmond on Monday 9 September 1776.<sup>8</sup> He was father of :

1. **SIR WILLIAM JAMES CHARLES MARIA DRUMMOND, 4<sup>TH</sup> OF LOGIEALMOND**, *bap.* at Moneydie on 26 September, 1769, and succeeded on the death of his father in 1776. He was appointed a Privy Counselor in 1804 and afterwards Minister to the King at Sicily. He *m.* in December of 1794, Harriet, daughter of Charles Boon, (*c/m* 24 November 1794), and *dsp* at Rome on 29 March, 1827.<sup>9</sup>
2. Thomas George Drummond, *bap.* at Moneydie on 9 December, 1771, and *d.* at sea.
3. **CATHERINE DRUMMOND**, *bap.* on 11 February, 1762, and was served heir to her brother Sir William Drummond on 22 September 1828. She *m.* at Edinburgh on 16 April 1792, Sir George

Stewart, 17<sup>th</sup> of Grantully,<sup>1</sup> (he was *b.* at Ballechin on 17 October, 1750, and *d.* on 9 December 1827), and *d.* in March of 1833. They had issue which succeeded to the lands of Logiealmond.

4. Mary Drummond, *bap.* at Moneydie on 8 January, 1766, and *d.* unmarried.
5. Frances Maria Drummond, *bap.* at Moneydie on 27 September 1764, and purchased Braco Castle in 1843 where she *d.* unmarried in September of 1845.
6. Louisa Clementina Drummond, *bap.* at Moneydie on 25 February 1774, and *m.* firstly, at Murthly on 13 December 1797, to Lieutenant Walter Cecil, of the Windsor Forresters,<sup>2</sup> by whom she had issue. She *m.* secondly at Logiealmond House on 13 September 1805, to James Stewart of Alderston.<sup>3</sup>
7. Charlotte Anna Drummond, *bap.* at Moneydie on 5 February 1768, and *d.* young.
8. Elizabeth Drummond, *bap.* at Moneydie on 16 June 1763, and *dsp* at Logiealmond House on 5 July 1842.<sup>4</sup>
