

DRUMMOND

OF RICCARTON

HENRY DRUMMOND, 1ST OF RICCARTON, was a son of Sir John Drummond, 1st of Innerpefferay, by his second wife, Elizabeth Douglas. He became a personal servant to King James V. who granted to him charters for the lands of Clathick and Wester Glassingall under the Great Seal on 4 March, 1536. He had a further charter from this Monarch for the lands of Blackford on 16 April, 1541, and had a charter from David, Lord Drummond, for the lands of Calliechat and Annat, in Menteith, on 21 August, 1550. He purchased from John Menteith, fiar of Carse, the quarter-part of the lands of Alva for which he had a charter of Confirmation on 14 July, 1558, and *m.* in around 1538, Janet, daughter and coheirress of Henry Crichton of Riccarton, with whom he obtained the lands of Riccarton and for which he granted a Charter in favour of his eldest son Henry Drummond on 6 June 1549.¹ He *d.* by 16 May 1561, and was father of :

1. Henry Drummond, had a charter from his parents for the lands of Riccarton, in the barony of Renfrew and Sheriffdom of Linlithgow, on 28 June, 1548. He *dsp* prior to 22 April 1574, when his brother Henry Drummond was retoured his heir in the lands of Riccarton and is then styled as eldest son and heir of the deceased Henry Drummond of Riccarton.
2. Henry Drummond, 2nd of Riccarton, (*see below*).
3. Sir William Drummond, 1st of Pitcairns, had a charter for the lands of Pitcairns from his father on 25 July, 1555,² and *m.* Jean Kerr. He *dsp* in 1614³ and was succeeded by his nephew Thomas Drummond.
4. Sir David Drummond, who traveled abroad with his Chisholm relations and was appointed Supreme Judge of the Bishop's Court at Vason in France. He was knighted by Pope Clement VIII. in 1598 and is said to have left issue.
5. Ninian Drummond, *b.* in around 1562 and was educated at the University of Glasgow where he graduated Master of Arts in 1582. He is styled as youngest son in an Assignment by James

Wedderspoon of Brighthouse for the teind sheaves of Little-Saltcoats in favour of Janet Crichton, widow of Henry Drummond of Riccarton, on 1 December, 1563,¹ and was appointed Minister at Kinnoull on 19 April, 1611. He was a provisional heir to his brother, Sir William's lands of Pitcairns on 11 June, 1611, and *m.* Margaret, daughter of Patrick Crichton of Lugton. He *d.* at Perth on 13 April, 1635, aged about 73, and was father of :

5a) James Drummond of Glassingall, obtained his grandfather's lands of Wester Glassingall, near Dunblane, and *m.* Anna, daughter of Robert Graham, of Cairney, (*c/m* 7 November, 1633,²). He *d.* prior to May of 1671 and was father of :

5b) Ninian Drummond of Glassingall, infeft in the lands of Wester Glassingall as heir to his deceased father in May of 1671³ and *m.* Helen, daughter of Duncan MacGregor *alias* Drummond, of Balhaldie and Culcrieff, (*c/m* 9 January, 1679,⁴).

5b) Jean Drummond, *m.* at Kilspondie on 1 October, 1675, Thomas Christie, Minister of Dunning, (he was widow of Janet Jack whom he had *m.* on 1 December, 1673, and *d.* in January of 1686), and had issue.

5b) Anne Drummond, *c.* at Perth on 11 December, 1634, and *m.* at Dunblane on 24 May, 1662, Thomas Graham, brother of John Graham of Bowton of Kilbride. They had issue.

5b) Helen Drummond, *m.* at Errol on 29 November, 1663, James Balfour, and had issue.

5b) Annabella Drummond, *m.* at Perth on 9 October, 1665, David Young, Minister at Lethendy, (he *d.* in January of 1687 aged about 48 years), and had issue.

5b) Grizell Drummond, was a mistress to William Drummond, 1st Viscount Strathallan, and by whom she had issue.

5a) Edward Drummond, educated at the University of St-Andrews from where he graduated Master of Arts on 21 July, 1621. He travelled and lived with his Chisholm relatives at Avignon and Rome and returned home to Scotland in 1628. He was appointed Minister of Callendar, from which he was deposed and *m.* Helen Morisson, (she was widow of William Fogo, the previous Minister of Callendar). He *d.* prior to 16 June, 1681 and was father of :

4b) Harold Drummond, acted as executor to his father.

- 5a) Jean Drummond, *m.* firstly, William Moncrieff, son of Hugh Moncrieff of Cottis, (*c/m* July of 1622), and secondly, John Freebairn, Minister of Madderty. She left issue by her second husband.
6. Edward Drummond, had an Instrument from William Douglas of Lochleven narrating that he was to have received 1100 merks from the lands of Keilour in April of 1562 in which he is styled as son to the deceased Henry Drummond of Riccarton and Janet Crichton.¹
7. Margaret Drummond, *m.* George Drummond, 4th of Balloch, and had issue.
8. Grizel Drummond, *m.* by 25 July, 1564, Andrew Wemyss of Logie, and had issue.
9. Elizabeth Drummond, *m.* John Polwarth of Cowston, from whom she had a liferent of the lands of Cowston on 16 June, 1561, in which she is styled as daughter of the deceased Henry Drummond of Riccarton.²
10. Helen Drummond, offered in marriage to Peter Scott, younger of Monzie, her mother's ward.

He was also father of at least two natural children :

10. Henry Drummond, had Letters of Legitimation under the Great Seal on 22 May, 1547.³
11. Margaret Drummond, legitimized with her brother Henry on 22 May, 1547.

HENRY DRUMMOND, 2ND OF RICCARTON, was served heir to his elder brother Henry Drummond in the lands of Riccarton on 22 April, 1574,⁴ and obtained the lands of Easter Hillhouse from Ninian Oliphant of Easter Hillhouse on 22 June, 1587.⁵ He *m.* Margaret, daughter of Sir James Sandilands of Slamanno Muir, (*c/m* 27 March, 1574), *d.* by August of 1606 and was father of :

1. Sir William Drummond, 3rd of Riccarton, (*see below*).
2. Thomas Drummond, 2nd of Pitcairns, was a provisional heir to his uncle William Drummond, 1st of Pitcairns, in the lands of Pitcairns on 11 June, 1611,⁶ and to whom he was served heir of entail on 10 November, 1615.⁷ He was put to the horn and pursued in 1620 for having murdered

Ninian Stewart, younger of Innerdunning, on 25th May of the same year¹ and *m.* Margaret, daughter of Thomas Drummond, son of John Drummond, 3rd of Drummonderinoch, (she was reserved a liferent of the lands of Pitcairns on 20 May, 1620). He was father of :

2a) Henry Drummond, 3rd of Pitcairns, had a charter for the lands of Pitcairns following upon a resignation in his favour by his father on 20 May, 1620,² and which he sold to Sir James and Sir John Rollo on 17 August, 1660. He served Major in the Scots army during the Royalist wars. He *m.* Anne, daughter of Sir Andrew Rollo, 1st Lord Rollo, (*c/m* 20 July, 1640.³ She was widow of William Mercer of Clevadge whom she had *m.* in 1633 and by whom she left issue), and was father of :

2b) Andrew Drummond, *bap.* at Perth on 3 March, 1642.

2b) Henry Drummond, was apprenticed to Walter Hamilton, Merchant in Edinburgh, on 4 August, 1658,⁴ and served in the Life Guards of King Charles II. from 1676 to 1678.

2b) William Drummond, was buried in Greyfriars, Edinburgh, on 15 February 1667.⁵

2b) Anna Drummond, *m.* in April of 1662, Mr. Alexander Ireland, Minister of Fossoway, (he was son of Alexander Ireland, Minister of Kinclaven, and *d.* in Ireland before 5 July, 1698), and had issue.

2a) James Drummond, is named as a provisional heir in the lands of Pitcairns on 20 May 1620, and is listed as one of the debtors of Patrick Ross, Sheriff-Clerk of Perthshire, in 1655.⁶

2a) Ninian Drummond, was a provisional heir to his brothers in the lands of Pitcairns in 1620.

3. Ninian Drummond, a provisional heir to the lands of Pitcairns on 11 June 1611.

4. Jean Drummond, *m.* Colin Campbell, 1st of Aberuchill, (he *d.* in March of 1618), and had issue.

5. Elizabeth Drummond, *m.* by 17 May, 1599, William Hamilton of Humbie, when she had Sasine from her spouse for victual from his lands of Humbie, and is then styled as daughter of Henry Drummond of Riccarton.⁷

SIR WILLIAM DRUMMOND, 3RD OF RICCARTON, succeeded his father and was served his heir on 14 August, 1606.¹ He *m.* Jean, daughter of Sir Archibald Stirling of Keir, *d.* on 23 February 1611,² and was father of :

1. William Drummond, 4th of Riccarton, (*see below*).
2. Jean Drummond, *m.* John Buchannan of Sheriffhall, and *dsp.*
3. Anna Drummond, *m.* Robert Napier, 1st of Culreuch, (he *d.* in July of 1652), and had issue.

WILLIAM DRUMMOND, 4TH OF RICCARTON, succeeded his father on his death and was served his heir in the lands of Riccarton and Easter and Wester Hillhouse, the middle-part of the lands of Pardovan and Lochhouse on 26 January 1626.³ He was one of the Commissioners of the Estates sent to London to attend Parliament in November of 1640. He *m.* on 1 September, 1626, to Magdalen, daughter of Thomas Dalziel of Binns,⁴ and was father of,

1. Thomas Drummond, 5th of Riccarton, (*see below*).
2. Alexander Drummond, *bap.* at Abercorn on 6 March, 1638, and *d.* young.
3. John Drummond, *bap.* at Abercorn on 28 December, 1633.
4. Anna Drummond, *d.* unmarried.
5. Margaret Drummond, who, with her sister Anna ‘dyed maids’ according to the Viscount Strathallan.
6. Catherine Drummond, *m.* on 22 December, 1672, Sir Thomas Dalzell, 1st Baronet of Binns,⁵ (he survived her and *m.* secondly at Edinburgh on 18 April, 1682, Agnes Murray, widow of John Eleis, Advocate⁶). They had issue.
7. Jean Drummond, *d.* unmarried in 1686, having appointed her niece Magdalen Drummond her executor.⁷

THOMAS DRUMMOND, 5TH OF RICCARTON, *bap.* at Abercorn on 13 January 1632, succeeded his father and *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of Sir Thomas Nicolson, 1st Baronet of Carnock. He *d.* in January of 1668¹ and was father of :

1. Thomas Drummond, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 30 November, 1656, and *d.* in infancy.
2. Thomas Drummond, 6th of Riccarton, (*see below*).
3. George Drummond, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 13 October, 1661, and was apprenticed to George Menteith, Merchant in Edinburgh, on 11 June, 1679.²
4. Isabella Drummond, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 12 November, 1654, and *dsp* in 1684.
5. Magdalen Drummond, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 27 March, 1659, *m.* on 11 May, 1685, Walter Cornwall of Bonhard, (*c/m* 16 May, 1685³), and was executor to her aunt Jean Drummond on 14 September, 1686. They had issue.
6. Anna Drummond, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 24 June, 1660.
7. Elizabeth Drummond, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 2 November, 1662.
8. Margaret Drummond, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 11 November, 1664.

THOMAS DRUMMOND, 6TH OF RICCARTON, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 3 January, 1658, and was retoured heir of his father and his grandfather in the lands of Riccarton, Hillhouse, Pardovan and Lochhouse on 2 May, 1668.⁴ He was appointed convener of Commissioners for the Supply in Linlithgowshire, was elected Member of Parliament for Linlithgow and *dsp* in 1690.⁵
