

# DUNDAS

## OF ARNISTON

**SIR JAMES DUNDAS, 1<sup>ST</sup> OF ARNISTON**, was a son by his father George Dundas of that Ilk's second marriage to Katherine, daughter of Lauremnce, 3<sup>rd</sup> Lord Oliphant. His father granted to him the right of redemption of the  $\frac{3}{4}$  of the lands of Arniston from Michael Borthwick of Glengelt on 225 May 1571, and he was included with his half-brother George Dundas and his brother Robert Dundas in the remainder of a charter by their father to their eldest brother Walter Dundas dated 9 July 1592.<sup>1</sup> He *d.* on 14 September 1628,<sup>2</sup> having *m.* firstly, by February 1598, to Katherine Douglas, by whom he was father of :

1. Anne Dundas, *m.* John Ker, son and apparent heir of Sir John Ker of Jedburgh, (*c/m* 10 January 1617<sup>3</sup>).
2. Elizabeth Dundas, *m.* Sir Patrick Murray of Langschaw, eldest son and apparent heir of Sir Gideon Murray of Elibank, (*c/m* 24 January 1617<sup>4</sup>).
3. Katherine Dundas, *m.* James Douglas, eldest son and heir of Mr. Thomas Douglas of Stainiepath, (*c/m* 17 May 1623<sup>5</sup>).

He *m.* secondly, Mary, youngest sister of Sir David Home of Wedderburn, (*c/m* 7 July 1619<sup>6</sup>), by whom he was father of :

5. Robert Dundas of Harvieston, styled as brother to Sir James Dundas of Arniston and son of Mary Home in in a charter in his favour for the lands of Godscroft and others in August of 1653.<sup>1</sup> He was father of :

- 5a) John Dundas of Harvieston, was served heir to John, Lord Borthwick, in the lands of Garvald and others, on 28 January 1676, and as heir general to his father on 23 February 1677. He had a charter under the Great Seal for the lands of Harvieston on 30 March 1692.

**SIR JAMES DUNDAS, 2<sup>ND</sup> OF ARNISTON**, was a son by his father's second marriage. He had a charter under the Great Seal for the lands of Newbyres on 31 July 1629, and in which he is styled as eldest son and heir of the deceased Sir James Dundas of Arniston.<sup>2</sup> He *m.* first, Marion, daughter of Robert, Lord Boyd, (*c/m* 12 November 1641<sup>3</sup>), secondly, to Janet, daughter of Sir Adam Hepburn of Humbie, (she was widow of John Cockburn of Ormiston), and thirdly, Helen, daughter of Sir James Skene, 1<sup>st</sup> Baronet of Curriehill, (*c/m* 13 April 1666. She was widow of Sir Charles Erskine, 1<sup>st</sup> of Alva). He *d.* in September of 1679<sup>4</sup> and was father of :

1. Robert Dundas, 3<sup>rd</sup> of Arniston, (*see below*).
2. Charles Dundas, apprenticed to William Johnston, Merchant in Edinburgh, on 26 January 1681.
3. Mary Dundas, *m.* John Home of Blackadder, (*c/m* 1 March 1660<sup>5</sup>).
4. Christian Dundas, *m.* Charles Erskine of Alva, (*c/m* 20 October 1664<sup>6</sup>).
5. Catherine Dundas, *m.* Mr. James Dalrymple, second son of Sir James Dalrymple of Stair, (*c/m* 2 January 1679<sup>7</sup>).

**ROBERT DUNDAS, 3<sup>RD</sup> OF ARNISTON**, succeeded his father and was admitted a Lord of Session as Lord Arniston. He *m.* on 4 January 1683, to Margaret, daughter of Sir Robert Sinclair of Stevenson, *d.* in 1727 and was father of :

1. James Dundas, admitted an Advocate and *m.* Mary, eldest daughter of Sir Alexander Hope of Kerse, (*c/m* 29 August 1712<sup>1</sup>). He *dsp.*
2. Robert Dundas, 4<sup>th</sup> of Arniston, (*see below*).
3. Alexander Dundas, *b.* at Edinburgh on 16 January 1693.
4. Charles Dundas, *b.* at Edinburgh on 23 June 1697, and was apprenticed to James Murray, Merchant in Edinburgh, on 5 March 1712.

**ROBERT DUNDAS, 4<sup>TH</sup> OF ARNISTON**, *b.* on 9 September 1685, and succeeded his father. He *d.* at Abbeyhill on 26 August 1753,<sup>7</sup> having *m.* firstly, at Edinburgh on 27 October 1712, Elizabeth, daughter of Robert Watson of Muirhouse, (*c/m* 14 October 1712), by whom he had issue :

**ROBERT DUNDAS, 5<sup>TH</sup> OF ARNISTON**, *b.* at Edinburgh on 18 July 1713, and was served heir to his father on 11 April 1754. He *d.* at Edinburgh on 13 December 1787,<sup>2</sup> having *m.* firstly, on 4 October 1741, Henrietta, sister and heir of Sir William Baillie of Lamington, (*c/m* 16 October 1741. She *d.* on 14 May 1755), by whom he had issue :

1. Robert Dundas, *b.* at Edinburgh on 19 June 1747, and *d.* young.
2. William Baillie of Lamington, succeeded to his mother's estates and was served her heir in those of Hyndford and Lamington on 9 October 1755.<sup>3</sup> He *dsp* on 16 June 1760,<sup>4</sup> being succeeded by his sister, Elizabeth.
3. Elizabeth Dundas Baillie of Lamington, succeeded her brother William in the lands and barony of Lamington on his death without issue in 1760, and was served his heir on 4 November 1760.

She was also served heir to her mother on 3 December 1760; to her grandmother, Margaret Baillie, widow of Sir James Carmichael, on 6 October 1761, and to her grandfather, Sir James Carmichael, on 3 October 1763.<sup>1</sup> She *m.* at London on 6 September 1762, to *m.* Sir John Lockhart-Ross of Balnagowan,<sup>2</sup> (he *d.* at Balnagowan on 19 July 1790<sup>3</sup>), and *d.* at Bonington House on 22 October 1817,<sup>4</sup> having had issue.

3. Henrietta Dundas, *b.* at Edinburgh on 22 January 1749, *m.* on 6 June 1777, Adam Duncan, 1<sup>st</sup> Viscount Camperdown, (he *d.* on 4 August 1804), and *d.* on 8 December 1832.

William Dundas, and held a number of senior appoints including: a Comissioner for India and Privy Councillor, 1804 ; Secretary of War in 1804-06 ; Lord Clerk Register ; Keeper of the Signet and Register of Sasines for Scotland. He *m.* at London on 1 June 1813, to Mary, daughter of James Archibald Stuart-Wortley-MacKenzie of Wortley<sup>6</sup> and *dsp* at Quarry House, St. Leonards-on-Sea on Friday 21 November 1845.<sup>7</sup>
9. Philip Dundas, *c.* at Borthwick on 7 May 1762, was appointed Governor of Prince of Wales' Island, and *m.* at Balindean on 5 May 1803, Margaret, sister of Sir David Wedderburn, Baronet.<sup>8</sup> He *d.* on board the *Belliqueux* man of war on 8 April 1807,<sup>9</sup> and was father of :

9a) Robert Adam Dundas Nisbet-Hamilton of Bloxholm Hall, served heir to his father in the lands of Whiterig, in the parish of Ayton, on 3 December 1810, and *m.* at Broomhall on 28 January 1828, Mary eldest, daughter of Thomas Bruce, 7<sup>th</sup> Earl of Elgin,<sup>1</sup> (she *d.* at Biel House on 21 December 1883). He *d.* at Chesham Place, London, on Saturday 9 June 1877, and was father of :

9b) Mary Georgina Constance Nisbet-Hamilton, succeeded to a considerable estate which included the Dirlton and Biel esatets and and upwards of 14,000 acres in Haddingtonshire and elsewhere. She *m.* in the private chapel at Biel on 11 September 1888, to Henry Thomas Ogilvy of Baldovan,<sup>2</sup> third son of Sir John Ogilvy, 9<sup>th</sup> Baronet of Inverquharity, (he *d.* on 5 December 1909), and *dsp* on 25 June 1920.

**ROBERT DUNDAS, 6<sup>TH</sup> OF ARNISTON**, *b.* 6 June 1758, and *m.* in 1787, his cousin Elizabeth, daughter of Henry Dundas, 1<sup>st</sup> Viscount Melville, (she *d.* on 18 March 1852). He *d.* on Wednesday 17 June 1819,<sup>6</sup> and was father of :

1. Robert Dundas, 7<sup>th</sup> of Arniston, (*see below*).

2. Henry Dundas, *b.* on 25 October 1799, entered the Royal Navy and was raised to Vice Admiral. He *m.* on 17 November 1836, Robina Mary, daughter of Robert Dundas of Dunira, and *dsp* on 11 September 1863.

**ROBERT DUNDAS, 7<sup>TH</sup> OF ARNISTON**, *b.* on 19 June 1797, succeeded his father and *m.* at Poulton House on Tuesday 9 April 1822, Lilius, only daughter and heiress of Sir Thomas Durham Calderwood of Polton and Largo.<sup>2</sup> He *d.* at Arniston on 8 June 1838,<sup>3</sup> and was father of :

1. Robert Dundas, 8<sup>th</sup> of Arniston, (*see below*).
2. Thomas Dundas, *b.* on 3 May 1825, entered the army and served as Major in the 12<sup>th</sup> Foot. He *m.* at Laverstoke House, Hants, on 3 September 1863, to Jane Eliza, youngest daughter of John Portal, of Freefolks Priors,<sup>4</sup> and *d.* at Wilton Street, London, on 20 July 1902.<sup>5</sup> He was father of,

3. William Dundas, *b.* on 21 August 1826, became a barrister and settled at The Elms, Faringdon, Berkshire. He *m.* at Adwell Church, Oxford, on 27 July 1858, to Ethelred Mary, daughter of Henry Champion Partridge, of Hockham Hall,<sup>6</sup> and *dsp* at Dover on 30 April 1903.<sup>7</sup>
4. James Durham Dundas, *b.* on 20 November 1835, entered the army and was raised to Major-General of the 60<sup>th</sup> Rifles. He *d.* at Albemarle Street, London, on Monday 6 September 1886.<sup>8</sup>

6. Ann Dundas, *b.* on 7 July 1834.

**SIR ROBERT DUNDAS, 8<sup>TH</sup> OF ARNISTON & 1<sup>ST</sup> BARONET**, *b.* on 23 March 1823, succeeded his father on his death in 1838, and to whom he was served heir on 22 April 1839. He was created a Baronet in 1898, with remainder to the heirs male of his own

He *m.* at St. Paul's Church, Knightsbridge, London, on Wednesday on 7 June 1933, to Isabel, daughter of Charles Goring, of Wiston Park, Sussex, *d.* on 2 December 1970, and was father of,

- 2a) Robert Charles Dundas, *b.* on 7 September 1912, entered the Royal Air Force, and was *k.* in action on 25 May 1940, having *m.* on 18 February 1939, to Marina Isabel Sherlock, daughter of Frank Rowland Eustace.
