

GARDYNE

OF LEYS, LAWTON & MIDDLETON

WALTER GARDYNE OF CONNANSYTH, *d.* prior to November of 1482, and appears to have married twice, firstly, to Katherine Conan by whom he was father of :

1. Helen Gardyne, who on 28 November 1482, resigned her 1/3 part of the lands of Connansyth to her brother “on her father’s side” David Gardyne¹ and was cognised heir to her deceased mother in various parts of lands around Arbroath on 20 October 1483.²

And also to a woman whose name is unknown by whom he was father of :

2. David Gardyne of Connonsyth and Leys, (*see below*).

DAVID GARDYNE OF CONNONSYTH AND LEYS, had a charter from Thomas Stewart, Lord Innermeith, for the lands of Connansyth, Leys and Little Gardyne on 28 November 1512,³ with Sasine taken on 2 November 1513.⁴ He *m.* Janet, daughter and coheir of Walter of Tulloch of Bonnyton, *d.* prior to October of 1542, and was father of :

1. David Gardyne of Leys, (*see below*).
2. Walter Gardyne,

DAVID GARDYNE OF LEYS, had a charter from Thomas Stewart, Lord Innermeith, for the lands of Balnamoon and Bonnyton on 30 January 1508, and is therein styled as son of David Gardyne of Connonsyth and Janet Tulloch,⁵ and was infert in the half of thos of

Tulloch and Craichie as heir to his deceased father on 4 October 1542.¹ He *m.* Janet Bethune and was father of :

1. David Gardyne of Leys, (*see below*).
2. John Gardyne, had a Tack from John, Lord Glamis, for the lands of Drumgeith on 14 May 1567.²
3. George Gardyne,
4. Robert Gardyne,
5. Agnes Gardyne, *m.* Patrick Gardyne, younger of that ilk, (*c/m* 20 November 1549³).

DAVID GARDYNE OF LEYS, *m.* Isabel Gardyne whom, in implementation of their contract of marriage, he infeft in the liferent of the lands of Connansyth on 8 September 1574,⁴ and executed a charter reconfirming to himself and his heirs male whatsoever, the barony of Leys, Connansithe and Easter and Little Gardyne on 10 January 1587.⁵ He *d.* prior to October of 1598, and was father of :

1. David Gardyne of Leys, (*see below*).
2. Mr. John Gardyne, who, with his brother Alexander, were witnesses to a charter by their father for the lands of Gardyne dated 10 January 1587.
3. Alexander Gardyne,
4. James Gardyne, disponed his lands of Milnton of Tullos to David Gardyne of Lawton on 12 January 1615, and is then styled as son of the deceased David Gardyne of Leys.⁶
5. William Gardyne, who with his brothers Walter and Thomas disponed the lands of Connonsyth to William Rait, grandson of William Rait of Halgreen on 24 July 1609, and are then styled as sons of the deceased David Gardyne of Leys.⁷

DAVID GARDYNE OF LEYS, succeeded his father and disposed the lands of Leys under warrandice to John Auchterlony of Balmurmure on 31 October 1598, and which were afterwards apprised with Sir George Elphinstone of Blytheswood having a charter under the Great Seal for them on 24 November 1600. He *m.* Jean, daughter of John Stewart, 4th Lord Innermeath, and was father of :

1. David Gardyne, younger of Leys and 1st of Lawton, (*see below*).
2. John Gardyne of Middleton and Legatston, to whom and his brother David Gardyne, Thomas Gardyne of Legatston resigned his lands of Middleton of Gardyne on 11 December 1619. He is styled as brother to David Gardyne of Lawton in this David's Testament dated 27 June 1646, and *m.* Jean, daughter of David Carnegy of Balmachy, (*c/m* 23 October 1626¹).
3. Margaret Gardyne, *m.* George Mudie, eldest son of John Mudie of Bryantone, (*c/m* 29 November 1606).

DAVID GARDYNE, YOUNGER OF LEYS AND 1ST OF LAWTON, who, with his father David Gardyne of Leys, disposed the lands of Leys to John Auchterlony of Balmurmure on 31 October 1598. He *m.* firstly, by 7 September 1602, to Jean, daughter of Sir David Lindsay of Edzell, when they had a charter from George Gardyne, brother of Mr. David Gardyne, sometime of that Ilk, for the lands of Mains of Gardyne and Lawton. He *m.* secondly, to Isobel, daughter of Sir John Ogilvy of Invequharity, (*c/m* 21 December 1621.² She *m.* secondly by *c/m* 5 December 1649, to David Graham of Fintry³), *d* in 1645, and was father of :

JOHN GARDYNE, 2ND OF LAWTON, succeeded his father on his death and *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of James Arbuthnott, brother of Sir Robert Arbuthnott of that Ilk, Baronet, (*c/m* 7 February 1643⁴). He was father of :

1. Robert Gardyne, 3rd of Lawton, (*see below*).

2. Isobel Gardyne, *m.* Mr. Archibald Pearson of Westhall, second son of James Pearson of Balmadie, (*c/m* 12 & 13 November 1667¹).
3. Anna Gardyne, *m.* Mr. James Carnegie, Minister at Redgorton, (*c/m* 29 January 1673²).
4. Margaret Gardyne,
5. Magdalen Gardyne, *m.* John Arbuthnott, 2nd of Caterline, (*c/m* 26 February & 6 March 1684).
6. Catherine Gardyne, *m.* George Turnbull, second son of John Turnbull of Strathcathro, (*c/m* 23 & 26 November 1692³), and had issue.

ROBERT GARDYNE, 3RD OF LAWTON, succeeded his father and *m.* firstly, Grizel, daughter of Alexander Watson of Barry. He *m.* secondly, Margaret Dunmuir, (*c/m* 10 December 1685.⁴ She was widow of Henry Crawford of Easter Seaton), and was father of,

1. David Gardyne, 4th of Lawton, (*see below*).
2. John Gardyne, apprenticed to Thomas Brown, Merchant in Edinburgh, on 9 September 1698.⁵
3. Elizabeth Gardyne, *m.* firstly, James Scott of Ullishaven, (*c/m* 30 June 1698⁶), and secondly, Peter Barclay of Johnstone, (*c/m* 23 April 1705).
4. Grissel Gardyne, *b.* on 27 December 1679, and *m.* firstly, to Alexander Wedderburn of Easter Powrie, (*c/m* 31 December 1702.⁷ He *d.* on 15 December 1766). She *m.* secondly, on 1 June 1718, to David Graham, 6th of Duntrune, *d.* on 21 July 1748, and had issue.

DAVID GARDYNE, 4TH OF LAWTON, *bap.* on 22 May 1676, and was served heir to his father firstly on 1 November 1718, and again on 4 February 1724. He *m.* firstly Anna, eldest daughter of David Graham, younger of Fintry, (*c/m* 12 June 1706⁸). He *m.*

secondly, on 8 January 1729, Isobel, daughter of John Guthrie of Westhall, (*c/m* January of 1729.¹ She was widow of Mr Robert Norie, Minister at Dundee). He was father of :

1. David Gardyne, *dsvp* in 1749.

2. **JAMES GARDYNE OF MIDDLETON**, became a Merchant in Arbroath and *m.* Mary, daughter of Thomas Wallace, Merchant and Baillie of Arbroath, (*c/m* 27 June 1741²). He *d.* on 26 September 1790,³ and was father of,

2a) **DAVID GARDYNE OF MIDDLETON**, served as Major in the 66th Regiment of Foot and was served heir to his father in the lands of Middleton on 9 April 1791. He *m.* on 24 April 1784, Mary, daughter of Robert Taylor of Kirktonhill, (*c/m* 28 April 1784⁴), and *dsp* 25 January 1802.⁵

2a) **CHARLES GARDYNE OF MIDDLETON**, served heir to his brother David Gardyne of Middleton in the lands of Easter Gardyne, Middleton of Gardyne and Colton of Gardyne on 12 November 1802, and *d.* unmarried in June of 1813.

2a) **THOMAS GARDYNE OF MIDDLETON AND FINAVON**, was served heir to his brother, Charles Gardyne of Middleton, in the lands of Ravensby, Cruikhill and Milnhead of Barry on 16 September 1813, and *d.* unmarried in January of 1841.

2a) Agnes Gardyne, was served heir portioner to her brother Thomas Gardyne of Middleton on 27 April 1841, and again on 7 June of that same year. She *d.* unmarried at West Seaton, near Arbroath, on 3 June 1848, aged 88 years.⁶

2a) Elizabeth Gardyne, *d.* unmarried in 1831.

2a) Ann Gardyne, *m.* on 13 December 1777, to Major James Bruce,⁷ and had issue,

2b) **WILLIAM BRUCE GARDYNE OF MIDDLETON**, *bap.* at Arbroath on 4 October 1778, and was served heir portioner to his uncle Thomas Gardyne of Middleton firstly on 27 April 1841, and again on 7 June following. He *m.* Catherine, daughter of Lieutenant-Colonel Donald MacPherson, *d.* on 15 June 1846, and was father of :

2c) **THOMAS MACPHERSON BRUCE GARDYNE OF MIDDLETON**, *b.* on 23 February 1831, and succeeded his father on his death in 1846. He *d.* without

surviving issue at Middleton on 17 August 1888, being succeeded by his brother, James, and was father of :

2d) Thomas Bruce Gardyne, *d.* at Notting Hill on 20 February 1864, aged 5 years and 1 month.

2c) **JAMES WILLIAM BRUCE GARDYNE OF MIDDLETON**, *b.* on 17 April 1832, succeeded his brother Thomas on his death in 1888, and *m.* at Inschewan on 5 June 1860, to Elizabeth Grace, eldest daughter of John Ogilvy of Inschewan,¹ (she *d.* on 25 June 1913). He *d.* at Middleton on Friday 12 July 1901,² and was father of,

2d) William Herbert Gardyne, *b.* at St. Andrews on 4 April 1863, and *dsp.*

2d) **MARY MACPHERSON GARDYNE OF MIDDLETON**, succeeded her father on his death in 1901, and *d.* unmarried at Middleton on 24 July 1927.³

2c) Evan Bruce Gardyne, served as a Major in the 6th Royal Warwickshire Regiment and *m.* at Umballah, India, on 8 February 1869, to Alice Ann Howarth, daughter of Lieutenant-Colonel Roderick MacLeod, 21st Hussars,⁴ (she *d.* at Brighton on 17 March 1902), in her 53rd year). He *d.* at Dalhousie, India, on 9 September 1875.⁵

2c) David Greenhill Bruce Gardyne, *b.* on 4 August 1843, and *m.* at Holy Trinity Church, Folkestone, on 29 May 1883, to Azemia Helen, eldest daughter of Thomas Sellar of Hall Grove.⁶ He *d.* on 8 January 1920, and was father of :

2d) **EVAN BRUCE GARDYNE OF MIDDLETON**, *b.* on 21 April 1885, succeeded his cousin Mary Bruce Gardyne, in the Middleton estate on her death in 1927, and *m.* at St. Peter's, Cranley Gardens, South Kensington, on 10 February 1926, to Joan, daughter of Charles Edward McLaren, Barrister. He *d.* at Strathcathro Hospital, on Sunday 24 July 1939,⁷ and was father of :
