

GRAHAM OF DRUNKIE

WALTER GRAHAM OF GLASSCHYLE, *m.* Jean, daughter of Walter Graham of Gallingad, (c/m 30 October, 1700.¹ She was widow of William Bontine of Mildoving, whom she had c/m 22 September, 1682²), and was father of :

1. John Graham of Drunkie, (*see below*).
2. Mary Graham, *m.* Robert Buchanan, Tacksman of Ardoch, (c/m 23 January 1734³).

JOHN GRAHAM OF DRUNKIE, who *d.* in 1755 and was father of :

1. Walter Graham, led a military life and for his services on board the Man of War, Lion, when in action against the French Elizabeth, he was rewarded by the King with a commission in Sir Richard Rich's Dragoons. He was served heir to his grandfather, Walter Graham of Glasschyles, in the lands of Drunkies and Drummond-Nories on 15 March 1754. He *d.* without apparent issue at London on Wednesday 31 May 1758,⁴ being succeeded by his brother John.
2. John Graham of Drunkie, (*see below*)
3. Peter Graham,

JOHN GRAHAM OF DRUNKIE, succeeded his brother Walter on his death and was served his heir in the lands of Drunkies on 18 August 1769. He *d.* on 4 April 1798, and was father of :

1. Walter Cairns Graham of Drunkie, (*see below*).
2. Thomas William Graham, who *d.* at Jamaica prior to December 1803.⁵
3. Jane Graham, *m.* at Stirling on 28 December 1807, to Mr. James Ogilvie Gardner.¹

WALTER CAIRNS GRAHAM OF DRUNKIE, succeeded his father on his death on was served his heir in the lands of Drunkie on 30 May 1800. He *d.* on 8 March 1806,² with the estate of Drunkie having been exposed for sale in 1804.
