

# GRAHAM

## OF FINTRY

**SIR ROBERT GRAHAM, 1<sup>ST</sup> OF FINTRY**, was a son of Sir William Graham by Mary Stewart and is so styled on 4 August 1420, when he had a charter from his father for the lands of Auld Montrose, Kinnaber and Charleston, all in the sheriffdom of Forfar, to be held by himself and his heirs male, whom failing, by his brothers, Patrick, William, Henry and Walter.<sup>1</sup> He obtained the lands of Mains of Earl's-Strathdighty from Archibald, Earl of Angus, by charter dated 27 January 1471,<sup>2</sup> and had a confirmation under the Great Seal for those of Wiltoun and Balhanan, in the barony of Fintry, and sheriffdom of Stirling, dated 10 October 1472.<sup>3</sup> He *m.* firstly, to Janet, daughter of Richard Lovell of Balumbie, with whom he is included in a mortification by Richard Barry, Burgess of Dundee, to the parish church of Dundee for the welfare of his own soul and those of his wife, Christine Galichtly, and of Robert and Janet, dated 2 June 1477,<sup>4</sup> and had issue by her. He *m.* secondly, Matilda, daughter of Sir James Scrimgeour of Dudhope, by whom he had further issue, and *d.* by January of 1492, being father of :

1. David Graham, was witness to a charter by his father to William Barry, Burgess of Dundee, for the lands of Horsewynd, in the city of Dundee, on 17 February, 1465, and is then styled as his eldest son and heir.<sup>5</sup> He *d. vita patris* prior to August of 1476 when his brother Robert is styled as son and apparent heir to Sir Robert Graham of Fintry, and was father of :

1a) Robert Graham, 2<sup>nd</sup> of Fintry, (*see below*).

1a) David Graham, who was a substitute groom to his brother Robert in the marriage contract entered into by their grandfather, Robert Graham of Fintry, and Archibald, Earl of Angus, for the marriage of their children on 7 August 1476.

- 1a) Elizabeth Graham, *m.* John Douglas, son of James, Earl of Morton, (*c/m* 30 June 1466<sup>1</sup>).
2. John Graham of Balargus, (*see Graham of Claverhouse*).
3. Marion Graham, *m.* John Erskine, 3<sup>rd</sup> of Dun, (he *d.* in 1508) and had issue.

**ROBERT GRAHAM, 2<sup>ND</sup> OF FINTRY**, who, as son of the deceased David Graham, and grandson of Robert Graham of Fintry, confirmed all grants made by his grandfather to John Graham of Ballargus, his uncle, by obligation dated 12 May 1487.<sup>2</sup> He succeeded his grandfather and granted a mortification to the parish church of Earl's Strathdichty on 7 January 1492, for the welfare of his and his wife, Elizabeth Douglas's, souls, and also those of Robert Graham and Janet Lovel, Patrick Graham, first Archbishop of St. Andrews and David Graham.<sup>3</sup> He *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of George Douglas, 4<sup>th</sup> Earl of Angus, (*c/m* 7 August 1476<sup>4</sup>), *d.* in 1495 and after 8 August of that year when he was infeft in the lands of Whitefield, and was father of :

1. David Graham, 3<sup>rd</sup> of Fintry, (*see below*).
2. Margaret Graham, *m.* Andrew Haliburton of Buttergask and Pitcur, (he was widow of Margaret, daughter of Robert Maule of Panmure, by whom he had issue, and was *k.* at the battle of Pinkie in September of 1547), and had issue.

**DAVID GRAHAM, 3<sup>RD</sup> OF FINTRY**, had Sasine of the lands of Fintry firstly in 1495<sup>5</sup> and then for Fintry and Buchlyvie-Graham in 1501,<sup>6</sup> and was infeft in the lands of Whitefield as his deceased father's heir on 25 August 1496.<sup>7</sup> He *m.* Jean, daughter of William Graham, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Montrose, and *d.* by November of 1513 when his son and heir, William Graham, had Sasine for the lands of Buchlyvie. He was father of :

**SIR WILLIAM GRAHAM, 4<sup>TH</sup> OF FINTRY**, succeeded his father and had Sasine for the lands of Buchlyvie-Graham on 7 November 1513.<sup>1</sup> He was respited by the King on 10 January 1529-30, for having remained from the seige of Tantallon and for all other treasonous acts, murders, fireraisings and slaughters he may also have committed.<sup>2</sup> He *m.* Katherine, daughter of John Bethune, 6<sup>th</sup> of Balfour, with whom he had a Precept for a charter of their joint-infefment for the lands of Strathichty-comitis, in the Regality of Kirriemuir, on 11 October, 1530,<sup>3</sup> *d.* prior to 30 September, 1546, and was father of :

1. Sir David Graham, 5<sup>th</sup> of Fintry, (*see below*).
2. Walter Graham, granted letters of reversion over an annualrent from the lands of Kingennie on 29 November 1582, and is then styled as brother to Sir David Graham of Fintry.<sup>4</sup>
3. James Graham, was presented to the Chaplainry of St. Marys by his brother Sir David Graham of Fintry, on 12 November, 1560.
4. Margaret Graham, *m.* Alexander Ogilvy, 4<sup>th</sup> of Clova, and had issue.
5. A daughter, *m.* David Tyrie of Drumkilbo, and had issue.

**SIR DAVID GRAHAM, 5<sup>TH</sup> OF FINTRY**, who, with his father, had a charter under the great Seal for the lands of Craigton-Easter otherwise called Fintry in the Sheriffdom of Stirling, and those of Mains of Stradichty-comitis in the Regality of Kirriemuir, which were personally resigned by the said William for re-infefment of the liferent in his favour and the fee in the favour of his son and heir David Graham on 13 July, 1541, which were then erected into a Barony by the King.<sup>5</sup> He and his father had a charter for the lands of Buchlyvie, in the Sheriffdom of Stirling, from David Ogilvy of that Ilk, on 10 August, 1541, and he had succeeded his father by 13 January 1549, when he had a charter of confirmation for the lands and barony of Fintry under the Great Seal. He *d.* in around 1586, having *m.* firstly, by 18 May, 1549, Margaret, daughter of James, 4<sup>th</sup> Lord Ogilvy of Airlie, when he granted a Discharge for her Tocher<sup>6</sup> and by whom he was father of :

1. David Graham, 6<sup>th</sup> of Fintry, (*see below*).
2. Sir William Graham of Baluny and Claypotts, served heir provisional to his nephew David Graham of Fintry in the lands of Fintry on 10 June, 1594, obtained the lands of Balueny and those of Claypotts, with the turret and manor thereof, from John Strachan of Claypotts on 31 May, 1601. He *m.* Isabella Maxwell and had issue :
  - 2a) David Graham, 2<sup>nd</sup> of Claypotts, had a charter for these lands from his father on 10 June, 1616, and *m.* by 30 January, 1612, Jean Galbraith when, with his father, they had a charter for the lands of Baldowie which they afterwards disposed to Francis Ogilvy of Newgrange on 22 June, 1619. He had issue.
  - 2a) James Graham, witness to a charter by his for the lands of Gotterston to Sir William Graham of Claverhouse on 13 August, 1619.
  - 2a) Margaret Graham, *m.* James Scrimgeour, eldest son and heir of James Scrimgeour of Fardill, (*c/m* 29 April, 1606<sup>1</sup>).
3. James Graham, who, with his brother William, was served heir provisional to his eldest brother David Graham in the lands of Fintry on 29 January, 1586, and was served heir provisional to his nephew David Graham of Fintry in the lands of Fintry on 10 June, 1594.
4. Alison Graham, *m.* John Crichton, eldest son and heir of Robert Crichton of Innernytie, (*c/m* at Dundee on 24 August 1576<sup>2</sup>), and had issue.
5. Helen Graham, *m.* Andrew Moncur of that ilk, and had issue.

He *m.* secondly by 29 January, 1586, Margaret Hunter when a liferent of a terce of her husband's lands were reserved to her, and by whom he had no issue.

**DAVID GRAHAM, 6<sup>TH</sup> OF FINTRY**, had a charter under the Great Seal following upon a resignation by his father in his favour for the lands of Fintry, in the Sheriffdom of Stirling, and those of Buchlyvie-Graham, in the Earldom of Menteith, on 28 January, 1586,<sup>3</sup> and *m.* Barbara, daughter of Sir James Scott of Balweary, (she *m.* secondly, soon after the execution of David Graham, to Thomas Fotheringham of Powrie, and had issue). He was executed on 15 February, 1593, for being part of a Catholic Plot and had issue :

1. Sir David Graham, 7<sup>th</sup> of Fintry, (*see below*).
2. James Graham, of Crago and Monorgan, *b.* in Stirling Castle in 1592 and was served heir provisional to his brother David Graham in the lands of Fintry on 10 June, 1594. He obtained the lands of Crago and afterwards those of Monorgan, one-third of the lands of Lumlathin and Easter Powrie, on 5 May, 1622, and is then styled as brother of David Graham of Fintry. He *m.* firstly, Grisell Hay and secondly, Margaret, daughter of James Gray of Baledgarno, (*c/m* 17 November 1652.<sup>1</sup> She *m.* secondly, Mungo Haldane, 16<sup>th</sup> of Gleneagles, who *d.* in May of 1685) and *d.* by April of 1664. He had issue,

2a) Agnes Graham, *c.* at Longforgan on 13 January, 1654, and *m.* David Lindsay, eldest son and heir of David Lindsay of Edzell, (*c/m* 29 & 30 April 1664<sup>2</sup>). They had issue.

**SIR DAVID GRAHAM, 7<sup>TH</sup> OF FINTRY**, *b.* in 1591 and, in his minority, had a charter for the lands of Fintry and all those that had pertained to his father under the Great Seal on 10 June 1594. He *m.* firstly, Jean, daughter of Sir James Haliburton of Pitcur, (*c/m* 16 November 1610<sup>3</sup>), and had issue ; and secondly, Isobel, daughter of Sir John Ogilvy of Inverquaritie, (*c/m* 5 December 1649.<sup>4</sup> She was widow of David Gardyne of Lawton, whom she had *m.* by *c/m* 21 December 1621). He was father of :

1. **JOHN GRAHAM, 8<sup>TH</sup> OF FINTRY**, succeeded his father and *m.* on 30 June, 1647, Jean, daughter of James Scrimgeour, 2<sup>nd</sup> Viscount of Dudhope. He was father of :
  - 1a) David Graham, *bap.* at Mains on 9 March, 1652, and *d.* young.
  - 1a) James Graham, *bap.* at Mains on 2 April, 1653, and *d.* young.
  - 1a) Robert Graham, *bap.* at Dundee on 1 March, 1660, and *d.* young.
  - 1a) Alexander Graham, *bap.* at Dundee on 22 May, 1662, and *d.* young.
  - 1a) Anna Graham, *bap.* at Mains on 4 November, 1649.
  - 1a) Jean Graham, *bap.* at Dundee on 28 January, 1651, and *d.* young
2. James Graham, 9<sup>th</sup> of Fintry, (*see below*).
3. Margaret Graham, *m.* William MacIntosh of Torcastle, (*c/m* 27 July 1638<sup>5</sup>).

4. Isabel Graham, *m.* firstly, on 26 May, 1642, Patrick Oliphant, fiar of Bachilton, (*c/m* 4 May 1642. He was *k.* at the battle of Tippermuir in September of 1644), and had issue ; and secondly by 17 June 1650, William Ord, Sheriff Clerk of Perthshire.<sup>1</sup>
5. Magdalen Graham, *m.* David Kinloch of Aberbothrie, (*c/m* 17 September 1634<sup>2</sup>), and had issue.

**JAMES GRAHAM, OF MONORGAN AND 9<sup>TH</sup> OF FINTRY**, succeeded to his uncle's lands of Monorgan and afterwards to his brother in the lands of Fintry. He *m.* firstly, Ann, daughter of Andrew Hay, 1<sup>st</sup> of Keilour, and secondly in 1684, Agnes Campbell, (she was widow of George Fletcher, Provost of Dundee),<sup>3</sup> and *d.* in around 1707 being father of :

1. David Graham, 10<sup>th</sup> of Fintry, (*see below*).
2. John Graham, *c.* at Mains on 8 December, 1663.
3. William Graham, *c.* at Mains on 8 January, 1666, became a Merchant in London and *m.* in 1681, Agnes, daughter of Sir William Foulis of Ingleby.
4. Thomas Graham, *c.* at Mains on 6 August, 1668, and was indentured as a Merchant in London on 13 September, 1684. He had settled in Rotterdam by 23 February 1694.
5. Isabella Graham, *c.* at Mains on 1 July, 1670, and *m.* Thomas Milne of Milnefield, (*c/m* 16 & 20 January, 1691,<sup>4</sup>).
6. Jean Graham, *c.* at Mains on 18 September, 1675, *m.* Robert Fletcher, eldest son and heir of Robert Fletcher of Ballinshoe, by whom she was infeft in an annualrent from the lands of Ballinshoe on 11 September, 1695. They had issue.
7. Margaret Graham, *m.* firstly, to Sir David Kinloch of Kinloch, (he was widow of Elizabeth, only child of David Bethune, second son of John Bethune of Balfour, by whom he had no apparent issue), and had issue ; and secondly, to Patrick Pgilvy of Balfour, by whom she had further issue.
8. Anna Graham, *c.* at Mains on 9 June, 1673.

**DAVID GRAHAM, 10<sup>TH</sup> OF FINTRY**, *c.* at Mains on 16 August, 1662, succeeded his father, and *m.* at Fowlis Wester on 10 June, 1686, Amelia, daughter of Sir Robert Moray, 11<sup>th</sup> of Abercairney. He *d.* in February of 1742, and was father of :

1. James Graham, *bap.* at Mains on 20 April, 1687, and *d.* young.
2. John Graham, *bap.* at Mains on 20 December, 1691, and *d.* young.
3. Robert Graham, 11<sup>th</sup> of Fintry, (*se below*).
4. William Graham, *bap.* at Mains on 5 September, 1703, and *d.* young.
5. Anne Graham, *bap.* at Mains on 6 May, 1688, *m.* David Gardyne of Lawton and Middleton, (*c/m* 12 June, 1706,<sup>1</sup>) and had issue.
6. Margaret Graham, *bap.* at Mains on 22 January, 1689, and *m.* Alexander Carnegy of Balnamoon, (*c/m* 28 July, 1711). They had issue.

11. Agnes Graham, *bap.* at Mains on 19 December, 1706, and *m.* on 14 November, 1735, Alexander Robertson, 2<sup>nd</sup> of Carnoustie. They had issue.
12. Grizel Graham, *bap.* at Mains on 2 March, 1702, and *m.* John Graham, Merchant in Dundee, (*c/m* 5 June, 1736<sup>2</sup>).
13. Mary Graham, *m.* at Dundee on 23 July, 1734, William Guthrie of Clepington.
14. Elizabeth Graham, *m.* at Dundee on 19 July, 1733, Alexander Stewart, Shipmaster in Dundee.
15. Liliash Graham, *m.* at Dundee on 29 July, 1764, Patrick Wallace.

**ROBERT GRAHAM, 11<sup>TH</sup> OF FINTRY**, *bap.* at Mains on 18 August, 1700, and was served heir male to his father on 5 February 1743. He *m.* on 20 February, 1735, Margaret, daughter of Sir William Murray, 10<sup>th</sup> of Ochertyre, *d.* at Linlathen on 20 October 1756, and was father of :

1. James Graham, *c.* at Fowlis Easter on 26 January 1747, and *d.* young
2. Robert Graham, 12<sup>th</sup> of Fintry, (*see below*).
3. David Graham, *c.* on 2 January 1753, and *d.* at Walton, near Liverpool, on 1 November 1824.<sup>1</sup>

4. James Graham, served as a Captain in the Atholl Highlanders and *d.* at Naples on 31 January 1779, in his twenty-third year.<sup>2</sup>
5. Elizabeth Graham, *c.* at Fowlis Easter on 15 March 1751.
6. Ann Graham, *m.* Robert Fletcher of Ballinsho and *d.* at Dundee on 3 September 1806.<sup>3</sup>

**ROBERT GRAHAM, 12<sup>TH</sup> OF FINTRY**, *c.* at Fowlis Easter on 7 February 1749, and was served heir to his father on 25 May 1757. He is said to have been of an “improvident nature” so much so, that he became compelled to sell his estate due to debts and afterwards resided at Balgowan where he *d.* on 10 January 1815. He *m.* Margaret, daughter of Thomas Mylne of Milnfield, and was father of :

1. Robert Graham, entered the service of the East India Company and was *dsp* at Benares in the East Indies, on 14 January 1799.<sup>4</sup>
2. John Graham, 13<sup>th</sup> of Fintry, (*see below*).
3. Thomas Graham, entered the Royal Navy and was raised to Captain. He *m.* at Bombay in December of 1809, to Maria, eldest daughter of George Dundas, Naval Commissioner at Bombay.<sup>5</sup>
4. Isabella Graham, *d.* at Snaigow on 2 October 1854.<sup>6</sup>
5. Margaret Graham, *d.* at Mylnefield on 20 January 1798.<sup>7</sup>
6. Anne Graham, *m.* at Lewisham on 5 September 1809, to Major-General John Brodick,<sup>8</sup> and *d.* at New Park, Clapham, on 3 May 1852.<sup>9</sup>
7. Elizabeth Graham, *m.* at St. Andrew’s on 31 October 1816, to James Keay, Advocate.<sup>10</sup>
8. Roberta Graham, *d.* at Halkerston Lodge on 28 April 1868.<sup>11</sup>

9. Jemima Agnes Graham, *m.* at Warfield Church, Berks, on 27 December 1813, to Captain William Bolster Dundas, R.A.<sup>1</sup>
10. Catherine Margaret Graham, *m.* at the Cape of Good Hope on 2 June 1840, to Captain James Briggs, Madras Native Infantry.<sup>2</sup>
11. Caroline Graham, *m.* at Strathtyrum on 12 July 1830, to Andrew Morton Carr, Solicitor of Excise,<sup>3</sup> and *d.* at Edinburgh on 26 May 1837.<sup>4</sup>
12. Emily Georgine Graham, *d.* unmarried at Inveresk on 19 January 1881.<sup>5</sup>

**JOHN GRAHAM, 13<sup>TH</sup> OF FINTRY**, *b.* on 24 April 1784, and led a military life, serving first in the 90<sup>th</sup> Regiment, then in the Austrian army. He was present at the battles of Adige and Villafranca, and was present at the taking of the Cape of Good Hope where he *d.* on 17 March 1821.<sup>6</sup> He *m.* on 24 July 1812, Johanna, daughter of Adolphus Cloete of Westerford, Cape of Good Hope,<sup>7</sup> and was father of :

**ROBERT GRAHAM, 14<sup>TH</sup> OF FINTRY**, the only son, was *b.* at Cape Town in 1816 and although educated in Scotland, he returned to the Cape and was employed in civil offices there for the duration of his life. He *m.* at Port MacQuarrie, Australia, on 27 May 1846, Elizabeth Anne, daughter of Lieutenant-Colonel Charles George Gray,<sup>8</sup> *d.* at Wynberg, Cape of Good Hope, on 28 September 1887, and was father of :

1. John James Graham, 15<sup>th</sup> of Fintry, (*see below*).
2. Sir Thomas Lyndedoch Graham, *b.* at Grahamstown, South Africa, in 1860, and was an Advocate in the Supreme Court of South Africa in 1898. He *m.* on 8 October 1891, to Annye Ismena Prior, daughter of Rev. J. F. A. Gavin,<sup>9</sup> and *d.* in 1940.
3. Jane Hay Graham, *m.* in 1882, to Sir Alexander Wilson, and *d.* in 1920.

4. Helen Lilius Graham, *m.* in 1889, to Colonel Andrew Aytoun, son of Robert Aytoun, W.S.
