LORD GRAY

ANDREW GRAY OF BROXMOUTH, had a charter from King Robert I. for the lands of 20 merk lands Broxmouth being those which Thomas Randolph, Earl of Moray, had previously infeft Sir Alexander Fraser, undated by circa 1320.¹ He had a further charter under the Great Seal for these lands on the resignation of Thomas Randolph, dated a.r. 16 [1322].² He had a charter from Robert I. for the barony of Longforan, 1/3 part of Craigie, 1/3 part of Pittarrach, 1/3 part of Warriston and various lands in and around Dundee which had belonged to Edmund Hastings, dated circa 1325.³ He was father of :

SIR JOHN GRAY OF BROXMOUTH, who, as he succeeded to these lands, was no doubt the eldest son and heir to the previous possessor. He had a charter from William de Troup, son of the deceased John de Troup, for the lands of Craigie, in the sheriffdom of Kincardine, dated 8 September a.r. twenty-seven 1355-56.⁴ He appears to have *m.* Mariota Oliphant to whom, in her widowhood, his son and successor, Patrick Gray of Broxmouth, agrees to infeft in parts of his lands of Longforan on 6 January 1377,⁵ and was father of :

SIR PATRICK GRAY OF BROXMOUTH, had a charter under the Great Seal for the lands of Longforan to be held by he and Margaret, his wife, dated 11 February 1374.⁶ He was alive in 1421 and *d.* by 1422,⁷ being was father of :

1. Sir Andrew Gray of Foulis, (*see below*).
2. Alexander Gray, named with his brothers Patrick and George in a charter granted by their brother Sir Andrew Gray to Patrick Scott, Burgess of Dundee, for tenements in Dundee, dated 10 May 1424.¹
3. Patrick Gray,
4. George Gray,
5. Margaret Gray, *m.* Sir William Hay of Errol.
6. Elizabeth Gray, *m.* to Andrew Moncur of that Ilk.

SIR ANDREW GRAY OF FOULIS, styled as son and heir of the deceased Sir Patrick Gray in a Discharge dated 1422.² He was included in a safe conduct dated 3 February 1424, to meet King James I. at Durham³ and appears to have *d.* in 1442 when his son Andrew had Sasine for the lands of (1) third of Dundee (2) third of Craigie and (3) Foulis in 1443, and certainly prior to 17 July 1445.⁴ He *m.* firstly, to Janet, daughter of Sir Roger de Mortimar, with whom he had a charter of confirmation for the lands of Foulis, dated 20 June 1377, which had been resigned in their favour by her father, and by whom he was father of :

1. Andrew, 1st Lord Gray, (*see below*).
2. Thomas Gray, whose son Thomas had sasine in a tenement in Dundee 29 April 1445.
3. Janet Gray, *m.* Sir Alexander Ogilvy of Auchterhouse.
4. Elizabeth Gray, *m.* to Sir Thomas Maule of Panmure, (he was *k.* at the battle of Harlaw 1411).
5. a daughter, *m.* to John Ross of Kinfauns.
6. a daughter, *m.* to Herring of Glasclune.
7. a daughter, *m.* to William Auchterlony of Kelly.
8. a daughter, *m.* to David Annand of Melgum.
9. a daughter, *m.* to Maclellan of Bombie.
10. a daughter, *m.* to Parker and had issue.

He *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of Walter Buchannan of that Ilk, (she survived him and *m.* secondly, to Thomas Oliphant of Dron), to whom, as his relict, Andrew, Lord Gray, and Sir Patrick Gray of Kinneff, his eldest son, bound Sir John Scrimgeour to infeft her in an annualrent of five merks yearly from the third part of the lands of Dudhope on 6 October 1462.¹ was father of :

11. Andrew Gray, to whom his father granted a charter for part of the lands of Longforgan on 7 May 1439, to be held by he and his heirs male, which failing, by his brothers, Patrick, William and John.² He had issue, (*see Gray of Baledgarno*).
12. Patrick Gray.
13. William Gray.
14. John Gray,
15. Margaret Gray, *m.*, first, to William Murray of Tullibardine and secondly, to George Clephane of Carslogie.

SIR ANDREW GRAY OF FOULIS & 1ST LORD GRAY, was a hostage in England for King James I., and concerning which his father issued letters on 28 March 1424, confirming that he would remain there for payment of the ransom.³ He remained in England for several years until an order was issued by Henry VI. of England to commanding the Earl of Northumberland to exchange him for Malcolm Fleming, son to Malcolm Fleming of Cumbernauld, on 9 November 1427.⁴ He succeeded his father on his death in about 1442 and had Sasine for the third part of the lands of Dundee and third part of Craigie in 1442⁵ ; those of Foulis in 1443,⁶ and those of Broxmouth in 1445,⁷ and was raised to the peerage as Lord Gray by 1 July 1445.⁸ He *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of Sir John Wemyss of Rires, (*c/m* 31 August 1418), to whom a liferent was reserved on 6 July 1445, and *d.* in late 1469, being father of :

1. Patrick, Master of Gray, (*see below*).
2. Margaret Gray, *m.* by 1445, to Robert, 1st Lord Lyle.
3. Christian Gray, *m.* Sir James Crichton , 1st of Strathurd, (*c/m* 14 February 1463).

PATRICK GRAY, MASTER OF GRAY, gave his consent to a charter by his father granting the third part of the lands of Westfield of Dundee to David de Spalding on 26 April 1440.¹ He *m.* Annabella, daughter of Sir Alexander, Lord Forbes, with whom he had a charter from his father for the lands of Woodton, Dulaly and others, to be held by themselves and their heirs male, which failing, by his father's legitimate heirs, dated 6 July 1445.² He was witness with his father to a charter by Sir John de Wemyss granting the lands of Inchmartin to David de Ogilvy, son and heir of Sir Andrew de Ogilvy, dated 15 May 1461³ and *d.* prior to 5 November 1464. He was father of :

1. Andrew, 2nd Lord Gray, (*see below*).
2. Andrew Gray (secundus) styled as brother to Lord Gray in a decree by the Lords Auditors dated 17 October 1483, and on 22 June 1496, he was again complained of to the Lords Auditors by Thomas Drummond and Janet Abercrombie, his wife, for having withheld 40shillings yearly from the lands of Westfield of Dundee.⁴
3. Janet Gray, *m.*, first, to Alexander Blair of Balthayock,⁵ secondly, after 1502, to Thomas, 3rd Lord Fraser Lovat (he *d.* on 21 October 1524) and thirdly, and thirdly, to Sir David Lindsay of Edzell, 9th Earl of Crawford.
4. Elisabeth Gray, *m.* David Rollock of Bello, (he survived her and *m.* secondly, by 15 February 1492, to Marjory, daughter of Robert Barclay of Strowie) .
5. a daughter, *m.* to Andrew Monorgund of that ilk.
6. a daughter, *m.* to Collace of Balnamoon.

ANDREW, 2ND LORD GRAY, styled as eldest son of Patrick Gray, eldest son of Andrew, Lord Gray, when he gave consent to a charter by his grandfather granting the lands of

Calziebroachan and Dysert to John Stewart of Fothergill, dated 23 August 1462,¹ and was served heir to his father on 5 November 1464. He succeeded his grandfather in his lands and honours on his death in 1469, and *d.* in February 1513-14. He had been contracted on 31 May 1457, to marry Elizabeth, daughter of William Hay, Earl of Errol, although this does not seem to have been concluded.² He *m.* first, Janet, only daughter of Robert, Lord Keith, son of William, Earl Marischal, and had issue :

1. **SIR PATRICK, 3RD LORD GRAY**, who, as his father's heir, had charters under the Great Seal for the lands of Kalliebrochan, Dysart, Bonskeid and others in Atholl, dated 8 August 1511,³ and 12 February 1511-12,⁴ and succeeded his father on his death in February 1514, being served his heir in the lands of Balgillo and Broughty on 15 March 1515. He was contracted to marry Christian, daughter of David Ogilvy of Inchmartin, by indenture dated 25 April 1476, although this was not undertaken, and he *m.* instead, by 4 December 1494, to Janet, daughter of George Gordon, 2nd Earl of Huntly,⁵ (she was widow of Alexander Lindsay, Master of Crawford), with whom, on 3 February 1498-99, they resignation of her brother-in-law, John Earl of Crawford's resignation, for the lands of Alyth.⁶ He was divorced from her by March of 1508, when she had *m.* again, to Patrick Butter of Gormock. He *d.* at Castle Huntly in April of 1541 and was father of :

1a} Janet Gray, a natural daughter, who had a charter in liferent from Patrick Ogilvy of Inchmartine 6 April 1541. She *m.* firstly, to William Ogilvy of Inchmartine, and had issue ; and secondly, before 7 June 1566, to James Sandilands, 1st of St. Monance,⁷ (he was widow of Elizabeth Meldrum, and after the death of Janet Gray, he *m.* thirdly, in 1582, to Elizabeth, daughter of William Ramsay of Brackmont).

2. Isabel Gray, *m.* Alexander Stratoun of Lauristoun, and had issue.

3. Elizabeth Gray, *m.* first, in 1487, to John, 4th Lord Glamis, as appears from an obligation, of her father to John, third Lord Glamis, for 1000 for the marriage completed and solemnized between John, his son and apparent heir, and the said Elizabeth, dated 18 May 1487. He *d.* 1500. She *m.* secondly, in 1511, to Alexander, 3rd Earl of Huntly, (he *d.* at Perth 16 January 1523-24), and

thirdly, in 1525, to George, 4th Earl of Rothes, with whom she had a charter of the barony of Ballinbreich on 5 June 1525, and had *d.* by 4 October 1527.

He *m.* secondly, before 1483, Elizabeth, third daughter of John Stewart, 1st Earl of Atholl, by his first wife Margaret, daughter of Archibald, Earl of Douglas, and had issue ;

4. Robert Gray, witness with his brother Gilbert, to a charter by their father granting the lands of Woodtowns to John Wishart of Pitarow and Janet Lindsay, his wife, dated 13 June 1507, and are then styled as “*filii carnalibus.*”¹ He was witness to a charter by John Ogilvy of Laveroklaw granting the lands of Moys to Thomas, Lord Fraser of Lovat, on 14 June 1511.² He was *ksp* at the battle of Flodden in September of 1513.

5. Gilbert Gray of Buttergask, who, with his father, was appointed tutor to Elizabeth and Margaret, daughters and heirs to the deceased David Buttergask of that Ilk, on 18 November 1499,³ and had a charter from James Muschet of Tolgarth for the lands of Polkmiln dated 16 April 1504.⁴ He had a charter for the lands of Buttergask and Ligeartlaw dated 7 June 1507, which had been resigned in his favour by Margaret Buttergask of that Ilk.⁵ On 26 January 1516-17, he had the gift of the ward and nonentries of the lands of Baldowrie which had been in the King’s hands since the death of Christine Oliphant, widow of Alexander Blair of Bathayock, and on 17 May 1532, he had the gift of the marriage of William Gray, heir to the deceased Sir Edward Gray, parson of Lundy.⁶ He *m.* Egedia, daughter of Laurence Mercer of Meikleour, *d.* by 28 April 1542, and was father of :

5a) **PATRICK, 4TH LORD GRAY**, (*see below*).

5a) Robert Gray, was a provision heir to his brother Patrick in the lands and barony of Foulis on 28 April 1542.

5a) James Gray of Buttergask, who succeeded to the lands of Buttergask and *m.* Margaret Scott with whom, on his own resignation, that they had a charter under the Great Seal for he lands of Meikle Buttergask dated 21 June 1553.⁷ He was father of :

- 5b) Thomas Gray of Buttergask, *m.* Margaret Kinnaird, (*c/m* 20 and 24 June 1586), with whom he had a charter from Patrick, Master of Gray, for the lands of Meikle Buttergask on 24 June 1586.¹
- 5b) Robert Gray, styled as brother to Thomas Gray of Buttergask when bailie to a charter dated 15 August 1600.²
- 5a) Geilis Gray, *m.* firstly to Alexander Whitelaw of Newgrange ; and secondly, to Alexander Gardin in Drumgeich, and *d.* in October 1597.
6. John Gray, is included in letters of protection granted by the King to the friends and kin of Sir John Campbell of Lundy on 28 April 1529,³ and in similar letters granted in favour of Archibald Campbell, Earl of Argyll, dated 28 August 1536.⁴
7. Andrew Gray who *d.* prior to April of 1541, and was father of :
- 7a) Patrick Gray, had a charter from his uncle, Patrick, Lord Gray, for the lands of Balgillo dated 4 June 1540,⁵ and had a Precept for a charter of confirmation in favour for the lands of Milnton of Easter Cragy dated 14 April 1541, following on a resignation made in his favour by Patrick, Lord Gray.⁶
8. William Gray, who was included with his brother Patrick, Lord Gray, in a remssion for plundering the House of Kinnaird, dated 10 September 1488. He *m.* Marjory Fullarton and had issue, (*see Gray of Lour*).
9. Janet Gray, married, first, to John Charters of Cathelgurdie ; secondly, to (? Alexander) Keith, son of Sir William Keith of Inverugie, with issue; thirdly, to Sir David Wemyss of that Ilk, (he was killed at Flodden 1513) ; and fourthly, about 1530, to James Campbell of Lawers. She died in October 1539.
10. Isabel Gray (*secundus*), *m.* first, about 1495, to Sir James Scrimgeour of Dudhope, Constable of Dundee, who *d.* about 1503 ; secondly, before 1510, to Adam Crichton of Ruthven, who *d.* before 18 November 1516 ; and thirdly, before 1521, to Sir John Campbell of Lundy, with whom she had a charter of the lauds of Boquhan 27 April 1529.
11. Elizabeth Gray (*secundus*), was contracted to Walter, grandson of John, Lord Drummond, which contract was discharged in January 1501-2.

He *m.* thirdly, Margaret Houston, (she was widow of his nephew Robert, 2nd Lord Lyle), by whom he had no apparent issue.

He was also father of a natural son :

12. Patrick Gray, in whose favour a precept for letters of legitimation passed the Privy Seal on 30 May 1526.¹

PATRICK GRAY OF BUTTERGASK AND 4TH LORD GRAY, succeeded his father in his lands of Buttergask by 28 April 1542, when he had a gift of the non-entries of the lands and barony of Foulis,² and succeeded his cousin and namesake, Patrick, 3rd Lord Gray, on his death without male issue, following which he had a charter under the Great Seal for the lands and barony of Foulis and numerous others, on 28 April 1542, which had been resigned in his favour by Alexander Straiton of Laurieston, one of the heirs of line. He *m.* Mariota, daughter of James, 4th Lord Ogilvy of Airlie, (*c/m* 21 September 1537), *d.* in 1584 and was father of :

1. Patrick, 5th Lord Gray, (*see below*).
2. Gilbert Gray of Bandirran, had a respite on 15 August 1573, for having been part of the force to have held Edinburgh,³ and a charter of the lands of Ballumby from Mr. Thomas Lyon of Balduckie on 19 July 1583, and in which he is styled as son of Patrick, Lord Gray.⁴ He *m.* firstly, to Marion, daughter of John Carnegie of that Ilk, (she *d.* on 28 May 1585⁵), and secondly, to Elizabeth, daughter of Peter Hay of Megginch, (*c/m* 18 April 1587.⁶ She survived him and *m.* secondly, to William Rollo, 1st of Balbegie, by whom she had further issue ; and *d.* on 1 April 1600). He *d.* on 12 August 1592,⁷ and was father of :

2a} Agnes Gray, was the only apparent child by her father's first marriage.

- 2a) Eupham Gray, was retoured heir to her father in an annualrent of 300 merks to be uplifted from the lands of Inchconon on 23 December 1609.¹
- 2a) Marie Gray,
3. James Gray, witness with his brother Gilbert, to a charter by their father in favour of their mother for the domicile lands of Foulis dated 16 July 1569,² and to a charter by Captain James Fraser granting the lands and barony of Lugton to Patrick Crichton of Lugton, dated 14 July 1581.³ He had a gift of the escheat of George Barclay of Syde on 19 December 1583.⁴ He *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of John Bethune, 2nd of Creich, (she had been a mistress of King James V, by whom she had issue ; and was widow of John Stewart, 4th Lord Innermeath, who had *d.* in January of 1570), who divorced him on 10 June 1581, on account of his adultery.
4. Robert Gray, who had a gift of the liferent of the chaplaincy and parsonage of Baikie on 19 March 1566-67,⁵ and also that of the vicarage of Rossy on 29 March following.⁶ He and his brother Andrew were witnesses to their brother Gilbert's charter for the lands of Ballumbie, dated 19 July 1583.⁷ He was included in a remission for having invaded the palace of Falkland in June of 1592.⁸
5. Patrick Gray (secundus), *m.* Euphemia Murray, with whom he had a charter from Mr. Walter Lindsay of Hilton for the lands and barony of Balgavies dated 13 May 1585, and in which he is styled as brother germain to Patrick, Lord Gray.⁹ He had issue, (*see Gray of Invergowrie*).
6. Andrew Gray, had a gift of the escheat of John Lovell of Ballumbie on 22 September 1581,¹⁰ served in the army as a Captain and was witness to a charter by George Seton, fiar of Parbroath, granting the lands of Hayston of Scrogerfield, in favour of Patrick Gray of Invergowrie, his brother, dated 13 October 1601.¹¹
7. Mary Gray, contracted to William, Master of Ruthven, afterwards first Earl of Gowrie, but this did not take effect. She *m.* David Seton of Parbroath, (*c/m* 12 September 1568¹²), and had a

- precept for a charter confirming a grant in her favour, in her virginity, by David Seton of Parbroath for the liferent of the mill and mill lands of Parbroath, dated 16 September 1568.¹
8. Elizabeth Gray, *m.* Laurence Bruce, 4th of Cultmalundy, (*c/m* 16 April, 1568.² He was widow of Helen, daughter of Hugh Kennedy of Girvan Mains, by whom he had issue ; and *d.* in August of 1617), and had issue.
 9. Anne Gray, *m.* Patrick Douglas of Kilspindie, (*c/m* 16 January 1581-82), and had issue.
 7. Marion Gray, *m.* firstly, to Patrick, Master of Ruthven,, eldest son and heir of Patrick, 3rd Lord Ruthven, and had no issue ; and secondly, to Patrick Ogilvy of Inchmartine, (dispensation dated 12 April 1561. He survived her and *m.* secondly, to Elizabeth, daughter of John Butter of Gormock and thirdly, to Giles Seaton). She *d.* in June 1582.³
 9. Agnes Gray, *m.* first, before 14 September 1557, to Robert Logan of Restalrig, (he *d.* on or about 26 August 1561), and had issue ; secondly, after 1565, to Alexander, 5th Lord Home ; and, thirdly, after 1575, to Thomas Lyon of Balduckie.
 11. Helen Gray, *m.* Sir David Maxwell of Tealing, and had issue.
 12. Margaret Gray, *m.* James Ogilvy of Balfour, (*c/m* 1 April 1562)

PATRICK, 5TH LORD GRAY, succeeded his father on his death in 1584, and *m.* Barbara, daughter of William, 2nd Lord Ruthven, (*c/m* 14 January 1556⁴). He *d.* by 1608 and was father of :

1. Patrick, 6th Lord Gray, (*see below*).
2. William Gray of Bandirran, *m.* Elizabeth Gray, Lady Inchtute, and with whom he had a charter from his father for the lands of Bandirran on 20 November 1604.⁵
3. James Gray, who was included with his brother Patrick, Master of Gray, and Robert Gray, in a remission for their having invaded the palace of Falkland in June of 1592.⁶

4. Robert Gray, who was witness with his brother James and William to a charter by their brother Patrick, Master of Gray, granting a liferent of the lands and castle of Huntly to Mary Stewart, his spouse, dated 20 November 1591.¹
7. Barbara Gray, *m.* to Sir John Cranstoun of Morristoun.

PATRICK, 6TH LORD GRAY, succeeded his father and *d.* in 1612, having *m.* firstly, to Elizabeth, second daughter of John, 8th Lord Glamis, (*c/m* 18 May 1575. She *m.* secondly by *c/m* 14 February 1586-87, to William Ker or Kirkcaldy of Grange), who divorced him for adultery on 21 May 1585. He *m.* secondly Mary, eldest daughter of Robert Stewart, Earl of Orkney, (*c/m* 25 November 1585²), to whom, with his father's consent, he granted a charter for the liferent of the lands of Balgillo in October of 1586, and was father of :

1. Andrew, 7th Lord Gray, (*see below*).
2. Patrick Gray, entered Douay College 31 October 1620, being then fourteen years of age, and *d.* in Germany.
2. Agnes Gray, *m.* William Graham, Earl of Menteith, (*c/m* at Dundee on 30 January 1610³).
3. Helen Gray, *m.* Andrew Bruce, 7th of Earlsball, (*c/m* at Dundee on 11 September, 1622⁴), and had issue.
4. Isabel Gray, *m.* Sir Robert Carnegie of Dunnichen, (*c/m* 23 & 30 July 1623. He *dsp* in December of 1632), and had no apparent issue.
3. Jean Gray, *m.* to John, 1st Earl of Wemyss, (*c/m* 8 and 15 September 1609), and *d.* at Easter Wemyss 17 August 1639, leaving issue.
5. Mary Gray, *m.* James, 3rd Lord Lindores.
6. Elizabeth Gray, *m.* Sir John Leslie of Newton, (*c/m* 28 April 1616. He was *k.* at the storming of Dundee 1 September 1651), and *d.* at St. Andrews in 1650.⁵

ANDREW, 7TH LORD GRAY, succeeded his father and *m.* firstly Anne, daughter of Walter, Lord Deskford, sister of James, 1st Earl of Findlater, (*c/m* 3 December 1608. She was

widow of James Douglas, Earl of Buchan, who had *d.* on 26 August 1601, and by whom she had issue), by whom he was father of :

1. Patrick, Master of Gray, who was *ksp* at a siege in France in 1635.
2. Anne Gray, *m.* William Gray, eldest son of Sir William Gray of Pittendrum, and had issue.
3. Jean Gray, *m.* Sir John Wemyss of that Ilk.

He *m.* secondly, in 1627, Mary, said to be widow of Sir John Sydenham, Bart., of Brompton, and to be aged eighty. She had a charter from Sir John Gage of Firlie, Baronet, for an annualrent of £300 dated 18 December 1630, and in which she is styled as a widow and sometime spouse to Andrew, Lord Gray.¹ She *d.* before 1632 at St. Giles-in-the-Fields, the Letters of Administration of her estate being dated 4 and 16 January 1632.

He *m.* thirdly, before 1639, Catherine Caddell, and had further issue :

3. Frances Gray, buried in Holyrood Abbey, 22 April 1670, *m.* to Captain James Mackenzie of the Dragoons, son of Murdoch, Bishop of Moray and Orkney.

Succession then passed to the descendants of Sir William Gray of Pittendrum, whose son William, had married Anne, daughter and heir of Andrew, 7th Lord Gray. He was father of :

1. **WILLIAM, MASTER OF GRAY**, eldest son of Sir William Gray of Pittendrum, was *bap.* on 21 July 1621, and by the terms of the charter by his father-in-law, Andrew, Lord Gray, dated 8 January 1638, he became styled Master of Gray. He was *k.* near London, while fencing, by the Earl of Southesk, in the end of August 1660, during the lifetime of his father-in-law, and therefore never succeeded to the title. He *m.* firstly to Anne, daughter and heiress of Andrew, 7th Lord Gray, (*c/m* 30 November 1637), and had issue ; and secondly in April of 1654, to Margaret, daughter of Sir Alexander Gibson of Durie, (she was widow of Thomas Fotheringham of Powrie and also of Sir Thomas Blair of Balthayock), by whom he had no apparent issue. He was father of :

1a) **PATRICK, 8TH LORD GRAY**, succeeded his grandfather on his death 1663, and following the death of his only son, Patrick, and with consent of his only surviving brother Charles Gray, he made a resignation of the honours, dated December 1690, into the hands of Queen Anne on 20 February 1707, from whom he obtained a new patent of the same, with the former precedence, in favour of John Gray of Crichtie, husband of his deceased daughter Marjorie Gray, for life, and after his decease to John Gray, their eldest son and the heirs of his body ; whom failing, to the other eldest sons and heirs-male of the said marriage, and the heirs of their bodies; whom failing, to the eldest heir-female without division procreated betwixt the said John Gray of Crichtie and Marjorie Gray and the heirs of the body of such female, the eldest daughter succeeding without division; whom failing to the nearest heir-male of Patrick, Lord Gray, dated at St. James's on 27 February 1707. The patent was thereafter read in Parliament, and ordered to be recorded 11 March 1707. He *m.* Barbara, sister of David, 4th Viscount Stormont, (*c/m* 22 January 1664), *d.* in January 1711. and was father of :

1a) **PATRICK, MASTER OF GRAY**, was mentioned in a disposition by William Murray, fiar of Ochertyre, to his father and mother in liferent, and himself in fee, sasine on which is recorded 29 August 1671. He *dsp* before 30 July 1674, with his sister Marjorie being served his heir on 17 March 1677.

1a) Marjorie Gray, *m.* cousin John Gray of Crichtie, (*see below*).

1a) William Gray, who *d.* unmarried.

1a) Charles Gray, was admitted an Advocate on 21 December 1675, and *m.* on 18 October 1683, Barbara Douglas, (she *d.* on 3 July 1733). He *dsp* on 25 April 1722.

 - 5a) Robert Gray, a posthumous son who was *bap.* 12 June 1656.
6. David Gray, *bap.* 24 November 1640, and was *k.* at Tangier with the Earl of Teviot in May 1664.
7. Agnes Gray, *b.* on 5 December 1622, and *m.* firstly, to Sir John Dundas of Newliston, and secondly, to Sir Archibald Primrose, by whom she had issue. She was buried in Greyfriars, Edinburgh, on 15 December 1669
8. Janet Gray, *b.* on 28 September 1623, and *m.* Archibald Campbell, son of Sir Archibald Campbell, (*c/m* 4 September 1646)
9. Elspeth Gray, *bap.* on 20 December 1625, and *m.* on 30 April 1643 to James Bell, merchant burghess and Provost of Glasgow, (*c/m* 7 April 1643),
10. Margaret Gray, *bap.* on 29 October 1628, and *m.* to Sir William Blair of Balgillo.
11. Mary Gray, *bap.* on 2 April 1630, and *m.* on 10 June 1647, to John Clerk of Penicuik.
12. Barbara Gray, *bap.* on 29 May 1632, and *m.* on 10 June 1647, to Robert Douglas, merchant in Edinburgh. She was buried in the Greyfriars, Edinburgh, on 10 May 1662.
13. Jean Gray, *bap.* on 23 March 1635, and *d.* young.
14. Geils Gray, *bap.* on 27 May 1636, and *d.* unmarried

JOHN GRAY OF CRICHIE & 9TH LORD GRAY, who, in virtue of the resignation before narrated, became ninth Lord Gray during the lifetime of his father-in-law Patrick, 8th Lord, and took his seat in Parliament. He *m.* Marjorie, daughter of Patrick, 8th Lord Gray, *d.* on 10 January 1723, and was father of :

3. James Gray, *bap.* on 29 September 1685.

8. Elizabeth Gray, *m.* on 17 August 1717, to Peter Gordon of Abergeldie.³
9. Marjorie Gray, *bap.* on 14 May 1697.

JOHN, 10TH LORD GRAY, *bap.* on 15 January 1683, succeeded his father on his death in 1724 and was served heir on 16 August 1726. He *m.* on 12 July 1715, to Helen, third daughter of Alexander Stewart, 5th Lord Blantyre, *d.* at Gray 15 December 1738, and was father of :

1. John, 11th Lord Gray, (*see below*).
2. Charles Gray, *b.* on 14 November 1720.
3. Anne Gray, *b.* on 4 April 1717, *m.* to William Gray of Ballegarno, and *d.* at Edinburgh 17 February 1774.

JOHN, 11TH LORD GRAY, *b.* on 11 April 1716, succeeded his father in 1738, and was served his heir on 24 April 1741. He *d.* at Kinfauns on Wednesday 28 August 1782,⁴ having *m.* on 17 October 1741, to Margaret, daughter of heiress of Alexander Blair of Kinfauns, (she *d.* at Edinburgh 23 January 1790), by whom he was father of :

1. Andrew Gray, Master of Gray, *bap.* on 8 August 1742, and *dsp* at Donibristle on 23 May 1767.⁵

4. **WILLIAM JOHN, 13TH LORD GRAY**, *b.* in 1754 and was served heir to his brother Charles on 28 November 1787. He committed suicide at Kinfauns Castle on 12 December 1807, aged fifty four,² and was succeeded by his brother, Francis.
5. Francis Gray, 14th Lord Gray, (*see below*).
6. Jean Gray, *bap.* on 5 July 1743, and *m.* at Gray, on 28 June 1763, to Francis Stewart, 9th Earl of Moray, (he *d.* 28 August 1810). She *d.* 19 February 1786, and had issue :

FRANCIS, 14TH LORD GRAY, *b.* at Edinburgh 1 September 1765, and succeeded his brother, William, Lord Gray, on his death in 1807, and was served his heir on 15 January 1808. He *d.* at Edinburgh on Saturday 20 August 1842,¹ having *m.* on 17 February 1794, to Mary Ann, daughter of Major James Johnstone, 61st Foot,² (she *d.* 31 December 1858), by whom he was father of :

1. **JOHN, 15TH LORD GRAY**, *b.* at Aberdeen 12 May 1798, succeeded his father and *m.* on 23 May 1833, to Mary Anne, daughter of Charles Philip Ainslie, second son of Sir Philip Ainslie of Pilton, (she *d.* at Pau on 16 February 1882, aged seventy-two). He *dsp* at Paris on 31 January 1867, aged sixty-eight.³

2. **MADIELINA, BARONESS GRAY**, *b.* on 11 February 1799, succeeded her brother on his death in 1867 and *d.* unmarried at Gloucester Place, Edinburgh, on 20 February 1869,⁴ succeeded by her niece.

3. William Gray, *b.* on 10 April 1801, and *d.* in March 1802.
