

HALDANE

OF LANRICK

PATRICK HALDANE, 1ST OF LANRICK, was second son of Sir John Haldane, 14th of Gleneagles, by his second wife, Margaret Fraser. He had a Charter of Confirmation for the lands of Lanrick, Rusky and others, on 11 December, 1668,¹ and *m.* firstly, Helen, daughter of John Dow of Arnhall, (*c/m* 3 January, 1672.² She *dsp* in January of 1673), by whom he had no apparent issue. He *m.* secondly at Edinburgh on 18 February 1675, to Agnes, daughter of George Haldane, Writer to the Signet, (she *m.* secondly, James Stewart of Crosswell, by whom she had issue and *d.* in 1724), *d.* in May of 1686³ and was father of :

1. John Haldane, 2nd of Lanrick, (*see below*).
2. James Haldane, *c.* at Kilmadock on 20 July, 1685, and *m.* Margaret, daughter of Alexander Stewart of Craigton. He was burned to death in his home after falling asleep reading by candlelight the Tuesday night prior to 19 January, 1727, and had issue :
 - 2a) Patrick Haldane,
3. George Haldane, *c.* at Kilmadock on 21 May, 1684, and was father of :
 - 3a) George Haldane, served in his uncle-in-law Charles Stewart's Regiment during the Jacobite rising of 1745 and was *ksp* at the battle of Culloden on 16 April, 1746.
4. Patrick Haldane, *c.* at Kilmadock on 22 August, 1686.
5. Janet Haldane, *b.* in August of 1682 and *d.* unmarried at Lanrick on Monday 17 December 1764.⁴
6. Margaret Haldane, *c.* at Kilmadock on 2 February 1678, and *d.* in 1764.
7. Isabell Haldane, *c.* at Kilmadock on 19 December 1675, *m.* in 1694, John Muschet of Craighead, and had issue.
8. Emelia Haldane, *c.* at Kilmadock on 28 January 1679.
9. Mary Haldane, *c.* at Kilmadock on 16 January 1680.

JOHN HALDANE, 2ND OF LANRICK, *c.* on 21 January, 1674, and *m.* Margaret, daughter of John Murray of Polmaise, (she *d.* at Lanrick on 29 December 1744¹). He had the rank of Major in William Boyd, 4th Earl of Kilmarnock's Cavalry, during the Jacobite rising in 1745 and after the battle of Culloden on 16 April 1746, made his escape. He *d.* at Lanrick on 2 January 1765,² and was father of :

1. Alexander Haldane, younger of Lanrick, *b.* in 1704 and served as a Captain under his father during the rising of 1745. He afterwards made his escape and had a Bill of Indictment raised against him on 13 October 1748. He *d.* unmarried and *vita patris* at Lanrick on 7 January 1764.³
2. Patrick Haldane, *b.* in 1712 and was apprenticed to George Murray, Chirurgeon Apothecary in Edinburgh, on 27 January, 1731. He afterwards entered the University of Leyden as a Medical Student, and *d.* unmarried at Murrayshall on Friday 23 January 1761.⁴
3. Ann Haldane, *b.* in 1706 and *m.* at Dunipace on 14 July 1736, to Thomas Forrester of Denovan, (he *d.* in 1771). She *d.* at Murrayshall on Tuesday 30 December 1783,⁵ and had issue.
4. Agnes Haldane, *b.* in 1707 and *m.* in 1748, to John Dundas of Manor, (he was *b.* on 16 October, 1701, was widow of Anne, daughter of John Murray of Touchadam, and *d.* in 1780). She *d.* at Glasgow on 21 December 1779,⁶ and had issue.
5. Liliias Haldane, *b.* in 1708 and *m.* at Edinburgh on 13 April 1729, to William Wilson, Writer in Murrayshall, (he *d.* in 1772), by whom she had issue.
6. Margaret Haldane, *c.* at Kilmadock on 6 September 1709, and *m.* on 6 April 1738, to William Bontine of Ardoch, (he *d.* in 1770). She *d.* on 23 April, 1781.
7. Isobel Haldane, *b.* on 28 March, 1713, and *m.* in 1732, Charles Stewart of Ardsheil, (he commanded the Appin Regiment during the Jacobite rising of 1745 and *d.* at Sens, in France, on 15 March, 1757). She *d.* at Northampton on Monday 8 April 1782, while on her way to Liverpool⁷ and had issue.

8. Janet Haldane, *b.* on 8 March 1717, and with her sister, was retoured heir-portioner to her father on 14 January 1767. She *m.* at Glasgow on 16 May 1758, to John Murray, Merchant in Glasgow, and *d.* at Glasgow on 13 June 1771.¹
