

# HALLIDAY

## OF TULLIEBOLE

**JOHN HALLIDAY, 1<sup>ST</sup> OF TULLIEBOLE**, was trained in the room of Mr Robert Crichton of Eliok, Advocate, and was admitted an Advocate. He acquired the lands of Tulliebole for which he had a charter under the Great Seal on 5 June, 1598, and *m.* firstly, Margaret, daughter of James Moncrieff of Easter Rhynd. He *m.* secondly, Elizabeth, daughter of Peter Hay of Megginch, (she survived him and *m.* secondly, Sir George Boswell of Balgonie, and *d.* on 2 December, 1615), *d.* on 19 September 1606, and was father of :

1. John Halliday of Tulliebole, (*see below*).
2. James Halliday, who, with his parents, was infeft in the lands of Strathkinness on 25 October, 1605.<sup>1</sup> He was admitted an Advocate and appointed Commissary of Dumfries. He *m.* on 1 October, 1607, Marion Henryson, and *d.* prior to May of 1624, when his brother William Halliday was retoured his heir.
3. William Halliday, named in the charter for the lands of Strathkinness in favour of his parents and brother James, in 1605. He was retoured heir to his brother James Halliday in the lands of Pitlochrie and Bannachtie on 24 May, 1624, which he disposed to his brother-in-law William Oliphant, eldest son of the deceased William Oliphant of Gask, on 27 September, 1625.<sup>2</sup> He *m.* on 11 March, 1621, Elizabeth Brown or Burne,<sup>3</sup> and was father of,
  - 3a) John Halliday, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 13 January, 1622.
  - 3a) James Halliday, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 30 January, 1625.
  - 3a) William Halliday, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 11 October, 1629, and *d.* young.
  - 3a) Steven Halliday, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 23 December, 1630.
  - 3a) John Halliday, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 28 March, 1632.
  - 3a) William Halliday, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 12 February, 1635.
  - 3a) Elspeth Halliday, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 2 July, 1626.
  - 3a) Bessie Halliday, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 9 September, 1633.
  - 3a) Margaret Halliday, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 26 August, 1637.

4. Catherine Halliday, *m.* on 6 July, 1617, to William Oliphant of Pitlochrie,<sup>1</sup> and had issue.
5. Grizel Halliday, *b.* 17 March, 1595.

**JOHN HALLIDAY OF TULLIEBOLE**, had a gift from King James VI. for a prebend from the Abbey lands of Lincluden for seven years for his support “at the schuillis” on 4 June, 1579.<sup>2</sup> He was admitted an Advocate, succeeded his father in the lands of Tullibole and *m.* Helen, daughter of Sir William Oliphant of Newton, (*c/m* 15 August, 1605. She survived him and *m.* secondly by 6 August 1631, to John Kinnaird of Newton of Fordie). He was buried on 8 March 1619, and was father of,

1. William Halliday of Tulliebole, (*see below*).
2. John Halliday, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 5 August, 1610.
3. Margaret Halliday, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 13 December, 1612.
4. Elizabeth Halliday, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 17 November, 1614.
5. Katherine Hailliday, *m.* Mr George Muschet, Minister of Dunning, (*c/m* 23 February 1637), and had issue.

**WILLIAM HALLIDAY OF TULLIEBOLE**, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 23 August, 1608, succeeded his father and *m.* firstly, Annabella, daughter of Robert Bruce of Clackmannan, (from whom he was separated on 26 January 1637<sup>3</sup>). He *m.* secondly, Isabell, sister of Robert, 2<sup>nd</sup> Lord Rollo, and *d.* in January of 1665.<sup>4</sup> He was father of :

1. John Halliday of Tulliebole, (*see below*).
2. Henry Halliday of Wester Pitgober, included with his brother, John Halliday of Tulliebole, and nephew, James Halliday, in a bond of caution subscribed in 1690.<sup>5</sup> He *m.* Sophia Drummond, (she was widow of Ralph Weir, Clerk at Bo’ness, and also of John Bellenden, Keeper of the Advocates’ Bar).

By his second wife, he was father of :

3. Margaret Halliday, *bap.* at Dunfermline on 5 February, 1654, and *m.* on 23 August, 1681, William Halkerston of Rathillet, by whom she had issue.
4. Isobel Halliday, *m.* John Jonking, son of John Jonking of Balglassie.

**JOHN HALLIDAY OF TULLIEBOLE**, succeeded his father and to whom he was retoured heir on 30 January, 1666. He *d.* on 22 November 1722, having *m.* firstly, to Elizabeth, daughter of Sir William Douglas of Kirkness, by whom he had issue :

1. James Halliday of Tulliebole, (*see below*).
2. **WILLIAM HALLIDAY OF TULLIEBOLE**, succeeded his nephew Robert Halliday of Tulliebole, on his death without issue and to whom he was served heir in the lands of Tulliebole on 5 May 1741, which he afterwards sold by public roup in 1749.
3. Margaret Halliday, *bap.* at Fossoway on 20 February, 1681.

He *m.* secondly at Kirkcaldy on 20 June, 1685, Barbara, daughter of Robert Ker of Graden,<sup>1</sup> and was father of :

4. Barbara Halliday, *bap.* at Fossoway on 6 December, 1685, and *m.* Robert Lindsay of Bowhill.
5. Jacobine Halliday, *b.* on 1 September, 1693, and *m.* on 2 February, 1724, to William Aitken, Merchant in Edinburgh.<sup>2</sup> They had issue.
6. Catherine Halliday, *m.* Mr. Archibald Moncrieff, Minister of Blackford, and had issue.

**JAMES HALLIDAY OF TULLIEBOLE**, subscribed a bond of caution with his father and his uncle Henry Halliday on 28 June, 1690. He was retoured heir to his mother Elizabeth, daughter of Sir William Douglas of Kirkness, on 9 January, 1696, and *m.* at Kinglassie on 11 November, 1693, Janet Ayton.<sup>3</sup> He *d.* on 9 May, 1723, and was father of :

1. Robert Halliday of Tulliebole, (*see below*).
2. Rachel Halliday, *bap.* at Kinglassie on 17 October, 1697.
3. Elizabeth Halliday, *bap.* at Kinglassie on 15 September, 1700.

4. Helen Halliday, *bap.* at Tulliebole on 18 February, 1702.
5. Margaret Halliday, *bap.* at Kinglassie on 18 February, 1704.
6. Isobel Halliday, *bap.* at Tulliebole 28 July, 1710.

**ROBERT HALLIDAY OF TULLIEBOLE**, *b.* on 16 September, 1694, was retoured heir to his father in the lands of Tulliebole on 27 September 1723, and *dsp* in November of 1737. He was succeeded in the lands of Tulliebole by his uncle Captain William Halliday.
