JOHN HAMILTON, *m.* Marion, daughter of John Hamilton of Orbiston, (she was buried in the Greyfriars, Edinburgh, on 20 December 1667¹), and was father of :

JOHN HAMILTON OF BANGOUR, *m.* Margaret, daughter of James Hamilton of Westport, and was father of :

1. **JOHN HAMILTON OF BANGOUR**, succeeded his father and was served his heir on 17 October 1663.² He *m.* on 9 July 1648, to Elisabeth, daughter of George Dundas of that Ilk.³ He *dsp* and was succeeded by his brother James.
2. James Hamilton of Bangour, (*see below*).
3. Mr. Thomas Hamilton, who, on 8 July 1664, discharged various Bonds due by his late father.⁴
4. Sir William Hamilton of Whitelaw, was appointed Lord Justice General and *m.* at Edinburgh on 30 September 1700, to Anne Houston, (she was widow of Sir James Inglis of Cramond). He *dsp* with his nephew, John Hamilton of Bangour, being served his heir on 19 April 1707.

JAMES HAMILTON OF BANGOUR, became an Advocate, succeeded his brother John on his death and was retoured heir to his father on 4 January 1679.⁶ He *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of John Hamilton of Muirhouse, and was father of :

1. **JOHN HAMILTON OF BANGOUR**, succeeded his father and was served heir general firstly on 6 August 1706, then again on 25 November 1730 as his heir male. He *d.* unmarried at Ninewar on 8 May 1750, being succeeded by his only brother William.¹

WILLIAM HAMILTON OF BANGOUR, succeeded his brother John in the lands of Bangour and to whom he was served heir on 13 September 1750. He *m.* in 1743, to Katherine, sister to Sir John Hall of Dunglass,² *d.* on 25 March 1754, and was father of :

JAMES HAMILTON OF BANGOUR, *b.* on 13 September 1744, and *m.* in August of 1770 to Peggie, daughter of David Bruce of Kinnaird,³ (she *d.* at Lower Grosvenor Street, London, on 19 November 1818⁴). He *d.* at Bangour on 18 October 1814,⁵ and had issue :

1. William Hamilkton, younger of Balgour, (*see below*).
2. Elizabeth Bruce Hamilton, *m.* at St. James's, Westminster, London, on 1 July 1820, to Henry Warren of the Grove,⁶ and *d.* on 12 May 1835.⁷
3. Catherine Hamilton, *m.* Sir George Suttie of Balgone, (*c/m* 16 April 1792⁸).

WILLIAM HAMILTON, YOUNGER OF BANGOUR, *m.* Anne, daughter of Edward Lee, (she *d.* at Waterfoot, near Penrith, on 24 August 1852, aged 82 years⁹), *d. vita patris* at Chapel, East Lothian, on 23 December 1808,¹⁰ and was father of :

JAMES HAMILTON OF BANGOUR AND NINEWAR, was served heir to his grandfather, James Hamilton of Bangour, on 25 October 1815, and disposed the lands of Bangour, retaining those of Ninewar. He *m.* on 18 October 1824, to Mary, third daughter of William Maule of Panmure,¹ (she *d.* at Eaton Terrace, Edinburgh, on 1 September 1864²), and *dsp* on 2 March 1851.
