OF SEGGIEDEN

PATRICK HAY OF SEGGIEDEN, was fourth son of James Hay, 3rd of Pitfour, and was *c.* at Saint Madoes on 13 June, 1681. He *m.* Barbara, daughter and coheirss of John Nairn of Seggieden, with whom he obtained the lands of Seggieden, and was father of :

1. John Hay of Seggieden, (*see below*).
2. Mary Hay, *m.* Thomas Blair of Newton, (*c/m* 11 October, 1735¹), and had issue.
3. Isobel Hay,
4. Elizabeth Hay,
5. Barbara Hay, all of which daughters had a Bond of Provision from their mother in 1737.

JOHN HAY OF SEGGIEDEN, succeeded to his mother's lands of Seggieden and *m.* on 3 October, 1736, Liliass, youngest daughter of John Hay, 4th of Pitfour.² He was father of :

1. James Hay of Seggieden, (*see below*).
2. John Hay, settled at Salem, Massachusetts, and *m.* in 1774, Katherine Farham..
3. Gordon Hay, *c.* at Kinfauns on 27 February, 1745.
4. Mary Hay, *c.* at Kinfauns on 29 September, 1737.
5. Anne Hay, *c.* at Kinfauns on 21 February, 1741.

JAMES HAY OF SEGGIEDEN, *b.* on 17 May, 1739, and was retoured heir to his grandmother Barbara Nairn on 18 November 1772. He *m.* on 15 August, 1770, Jean, daughter of Mr. James Donaldson, Minister of Glamis, *d.* on 23 March, 1781,³ and was father of :

JAMES HAY OF SEGGIEDEN, *b.* on 5 May, 1771, succeeded his father on his death in 1781, and was served his heir in the lands of Seggieden on 23 February 1782, with infetment being on 6 April following. He *d.* at Seggieden on 19 May 1838,¹ having *m.* firstly, on 10 August 1801, Margaret, daughter of John Richardson of Pitfour,² (she *d.* at Seggieden on 14 March 1819³), by whom he was father of :

1. James Richardson Richardson-Hay of Seggieden and Aberargie, (*see below*).
2. John Hay, *b.* on 23 March 1804, and entered the Royal Naval College in January 1817. He first enlisted on the frigate "Phaeton" in October 1819 and was raised to Lieutenant in 1829, retiring as Admiral in 1878. He *d.* at Edinburgh in January of 1899,⁴ having *m.* at Lude on 29 April 1849, to Elizabeth, second daughter of James MacInroy of Lude,⁵ and by whom he was father of:
 - 2a) Elizabeth Moore Hay, *b.* on 9 May 1850.
3. Patrick Hay, *b.* on 29 September, 1806, entered the service of the H.E.I.C.S and attained the rank of Colonel. He *dsp* at Edinburgh on 11 August, 1860.⁶
4. William Hay, *b.* on 2 August, 1811, and *dsp* at Seggieden on 8 January, 1837.⁷
5. Thomas Hay, trained as a Physician and *d.* at Peterborough, West Canada, on 9 March 1857.⁸
6. Barbara Hay, *b.* on 8 January, 1808, and *d.* unmarried at Pitlochry on 9 February, 1867.⁹
7. Jane Hay, *b.* on 28 September, 1809, and *d.* unmarried at Pitlochry on 2 October, 1890.¹⁰

He *m.* secondly, at Pitfour on 27 April, 1821, Christina Craigie, daughter of James Stewart of Urrard,¹¹ by whom he had no apparent issue.

JAMES RICHARDSON RICHARDSON-HAY OF SEGGIEDEN AND ABERARGIE, *b.* on 29 December, 1802, and succeeded his father, being served his heir on 2 August 1839. He *m.* on 7 February, 1833, Margaret Lothian Douglas, daughter of Lieutenant-Colonel Thomas Inglis, and *d.* at Rome 10 February, 1854.¹ He was father of :

CHARLOTTE ELIZABETH RICHARDSON-HAY OF SEGGIEDEN, succeeded her father and was retoured his heir and also her grandmother, Margaret Richardson's, on 22 January 1855. She *m.* at St. John's Episcopal Church, Perth, on 13 October 1859, to Colonel Henry Maurice Drummond, younger son of Sir Adam Drummond, 7th of Megginch,² (he was *b.* on 8 June 1816, and *d.* on 3 January 1896³), who assumed the surname of Hay and succeeded to the lands of Seggieden *jure uxoris*. She *d.* at Seggieden on 27 April 1914,⁴ leaving issue :

1. James Adam Gordon Drummond-Hay of Seggieden, (*see below*).
2. Henry Maurice Drummond-Hay, *b.* on 22 October, 1869, and *dsp* on 2 November, 1932.
3. Constance Margaret Drummond-Hay, *bap.* on 15 March, 1862, and *dsp* on 4 February, 1944.
4. Alice Charlotte Drummond-Hay, *bap.* at Kinfauns on 5 May, 1865, and *dsp* on 23 January, 1956.
5. Lucy Barbara Drummond-Hay, *bap.* at Kinfauns on 31 August, 1866, and *dsp* in 1954.
6. Edith Maud Drummond-Hay, *bap.* at Kinfauns on 28 February, 1872, and *dsp* on 20 February, 1960.

JAMES ADAM GORDON DRUMMOND-HAY OF SEGGIEDEN, *b.* on 5 August, 1863, and succeeded his mother on her death in 1914. He *m.* at St. John's Episcopal Church, Perth, on 29 January, 1903, Alice Evelyn Isabella, second daughter of Sir James Thomas Stewart-Richardson, Baronet, of Pitfour,⁵ and *d.* on 27 December, 1928, of injuries

sustained when he tripped over a wire in the garden at Seggieden on Christmas Eve.¹ He was father of :

1. James Drummond-Hay of Seggieden, (*see below*).
2. Peter Drummond-Hay, *b.* on 29 November, 1907, and *m.* on 21 August, 1951, Elizabeth Joan Daphne, daughter of Rev. Sir Montague Fowler. He had issue.
3. Andrew Drummond-Hay, *b.* on 14 January, 1910, and was *k.* in action at El Alamein on 13 August, 1942.
4. Mary Charlotte Drummond-Hay, *b.* on 3 December, 1903, *dsp* on 11 July, 1956.

JAMES DRUMMOND-HAY OF SEGGIEDEN, *b.* on 27 June, 1905, and *m.* at Salisbury Cathedral on 1 February, 1930, to Margaret, daughter of James Douglas-Hamilton, 13th Duke of Hamilton and Brandon.² He *d.* in 1983 and had issue :

1. Malcolm James Drummond-Hay, *b.* on 25 October, 1932.
2. Andrew Douglas Drummond-Hay of Seggieden, *b.* on 25 June, 1946, and succeeded his father on his death in 1983.
3. Jane Mairi Margaret Drummond-Hay, *b.* on 26 January, 1931, and *m.* on 29 April, 1955, Richard Timothy Whitely. They have issue.
4. Elizabeth Ann Drummond, *b.* on 4 August 1937.
5. Christine Liliias Drummond-Hay, *b.* on 17 February, 1943, and *m.* Neil Buchan-Watt, (*m.* dissolved by Divorce in 1998). They have issue.
6. Nina Benita Drummond-Hay, *b.* on 12 December, 1947, and *m.* on 4 January, 1986, Edward Bowry. They have issue.
