

# HAY

## OF TULLIBODY

**SIR THOMAS DE HAY OF LOCHORWART**, *m.* Lora, daughter and heiress of William de Cunningsburgh, (she was widow of Richard Bickerton, sn of Sir John Bickerton by whom she had no issue), with whom he obtained the lands of Tullibody and concerning his rights to which an inquisition was held on 28 August 1307, which found that they had been given by William Cunningsburgh to his daughter, Lora, in frank marriage with Richard de Bickerton, son of Sir John de Bickerton, and were to be held by they and their heirs, which failing, by the said Sir John under reversion to Lora and her heirs but that Sir John had died about fifteen days or so prior to Pentecost last thereby Lora and her heirs were decerned the true heirs.<sup>1</sup> He *d.* in around 1335, and was father of :

1. Sir William de Hay of Lochorwarth, succeeded his father and had issue.
2. Sir John Hay of Tullibody, (*see below*).

**SIR JOHN HAY OF TULLIBODY**, to whom his father assigned the lands of Tullibody and is styled as brother to William de Hay of Lochorwath, in a charter by this William granting various lands to his kinsman John de Geddes 1395x99.<sup>2</sup> He *m.* Christian, daughter and coheir of Sir William Keith, and was father of :

1. Sir John Hay of Tullibody, (*see below*).
2. Margaret Hay, *m.* Alexander Stewart, 1<sup>st</sup> of Grantully, younger son of Sir John Stewart of Innermeath and Lorn, and to whom her brother John Hay of Tullibody granted the lands of Banchory, on 15 July 1416, in contemplation of their marriage.<sup>3</sup> They had issue.

**SIR JOHN HAY OF TULLIBODY**, *m.* by 1388 to Margaret, daughter of Sir John Stewart of Ralston, and neice of King Robert II., when he had a payment from the Royal Exchequer

in contemplation of the marriage.<sup>1</sup> He *d.* after 15 June 1416, and before June of 1418. He was father of,

**EGEDIA HAY**, *m.* Sir Alexander Seton, Lord Gordon, and on 8 January 1427, they had a charter on her resignation for her lands of Tullibody, the forest of Boyne and Enzie, the Barony of Kilsaurle, in Banff, and Kinmudie, in Aberdeenshire. The marriage though, was not a happy one and he procured a dissolution in order that he could marry Elizabeth, daughter of Sir William Crichton. Despite this, on 26 November 1438, she granted to him a charter confirming to him the lands contained in their jointure, and by 18 March 1439, he had married Elizabeth Crichton. Egedia *d.* in either 1440 or 1441, having had issue, a son Alexander Seton, who succeeded to her lands. (*see Seton of Tullibody and Touch*).
