OF GARGUNNOCK

ALEXANDER HEPBURN OF GARGUNNOCK, *m.* by 20 November 1465, to Mariote, daughter and heiress of John Normanville of Gargunock, and acquired these lands *jure uxoris*. He *d.* prior to 31 May 1480, when his relict, Mariote Normanville, conveyed the lands of Gargunock and others, to their only son Alexander, and was father of :

1. Alexander Hepburn of Gargunock, (*see below*).
2. Christian Hepburn, is styled as eldest sister to the deceased Alexander Hepburn of Gargunock, in the gift of her marriage to John de Kirkwood on 16 April 1499.¹ She *m.* to this John by 18 March 1511,² and with whom she disposed her share of the lands of Fordel, in the sheriffdom of Fife, to Mr. James Henryson, Burgess of Edinburgh, on 24 April 1511.³
3. Margaret Hepburn, the ward of whom was gifted to Alexander Elphinston on 23 April 1499. She *m.* by 19 June 1510, to William Sellar when she disposed her lands of Gargunock, Plean, Carnock and a portion of Fordel, to Alexander, Lord Elphinston.⁴
4. Mariote Hepburn. She and her two sisters all had Sasine of the lands of Gargunock in 1500.⁵

ALEXANDER HEPBURN OF GARGUNNOCK, succeeded his father and to whom his mother resigned the lands of Gargunock, Plean, Carnock, a portion of the lands of Fordel and those Merdane on 31 May 1480. His succession was disputed by other heirs and on 10 February 1490, he raised an action against David Graham in Gargunock for the destruction of the tower and place of Carnock and the removal of the iron gate therefrom. He *m.* by 16 March 1480, Marion, daughter of Robert Inglis of Lochend, who, on 20 April 1501, as his relict, had her terce confirmed to her.⁶ He *dsp* prior to 16 April 1499,
