

# HEPBURN

## OF WAUGHTON

**PATRICK HEPBURN, MASTER OF HAILES**, was the eldest son and heir apparent of Sir Patrick de Hepburn of Hailes. He *m.* secondly, to Christian, daughter and heiress of William de Gourlay of Waughton, and by her, he had at least two children :

1. **SIR PATRICK DE HEPBURN, 1<sup>ST</sup> OF WAUGHTON**, to whom the lands and barony of Waughton were conveyed and for which, at length, he had a charter of confirmation under the Great Seal dated 9 July 1452.<sup>1</sup> He had a charter from Walter Ogilvy of Bewfort, for the lands of Brotherton on 21 July 1446,<sup>2</sup> *dsp* by 23 March 1474, and was succeeded by his nephew David Hepburn.

2. Alexander de Hepburn, is styled as brother to Sir Patrick de Hepburn of Waughton when witness with his brother to an Instrument of Sasine in favour of Janet de Fenton, one of the coheirs of Walter de Fenton of Baikie, for infefting David Lindsay, eldest son of Sir John de Lindsay, Lord Lindsay of the Byres, in an annualrent from the Mains of Drem. Dated 30 May 1446.<sup>3</sup> He was father of :

2a) **DAVID HEPBURN, 2<sup>ND</sup> OF WAUGHTON**, (*see below*).

2a) Alexander Hepburn, who was father of :

2b) James Hepburn, a natural son who became a Chaplain and had a precept for letters of legitimation on 12 June 1541, in which he is styled as son of the deceased Alexander Hepburn, brother german to the deceased David Hepburn of Waughton.<sup>4</sup>

**DAVID HEPBURN OF WAUGHTON**, succeeded his uncle, Patrick Hepburn of Waughton, in the lands and barony of Waughton and to whom he was retoured heir on 23 March 1473/4,<sup>5</sup> with infeftment on 25<sup>th</sup> following. He had a remission for various crimes and misdemeanours on 20 June 1498,<sup>6</sup> and *m.* Christian, daughter of Sir James Sandilands of

Calder, (she survived him and *m.* secondly, to Andrew Anstruther of that ilk). He was father of :

**MUNGO HEPBURN OF LUFNESS**, *m.* Margaret, daughter of Sir Robert Lauder of the Bass, (she survived him and *m.* secondly, to Alexander Home, 2<sup>nd</sup> of Polwarth), and to whom his father David Hepburn of Waughton conveyed the lands of Waughton on 6 September 1498. He was living in November of 1510, and was father of :

1. Sir Patrick Hepburn of Waughton, (*see below*).
2. John Hepburn, of Kirklandhill, had a respite under the Privy Seal dated 1 July 1526, and is then styled as brother german to the Laird of Waughton.<sup>1</sup> He *m.* Sybilla Wallace who is styled as his relict in an Instrument relating to her liferent of the quarter part lands of Quitsum on 12 November 1560,<sup>2</sup> and was father of :

2a) Patrick Hepburn of Kirklandhill, succeeded his father by 18 February 1558, when he had a charter for the lands of Tynningham.<sup>3</sup> He *m.* by this date to Helen Hamilton, *d.* in November of 1581,<sup>4</sup> and was father of :

2b) Patrick Hepburn of Kirklandhill, succeeded his father and was served his heir in the lands part of the lands of Quhitsum on 28 March 1594. He and had issue :

2c) John Hepburn of Kirklandhill,

2c) George Hepburn, apprenticed to John Hepburn, Skinner in Edinburgh, on 26 June 1605.

2c) Adam Hepburn, apprenticed to Thomas Johnstone, Saddler in Edinburgh, on 20 July 1608.

2c) James Hepburn, apprenticed to William Carnegie, Skinner in Edinburgh, on 20 May 1612.

2b) John Hepburn, apprenticed to Patrick Brown, Skinner in Edinburgh, on 18 March 1584.

2b) Adam Hepburn, named in his father's Testament and was father of :

2b) Mr Adam Hepburn, 1<sup>st</sup> of Humbie, was served heir to his father Adam Hepburn, brother german of Patrick Hepburn of Kirklandhill, in an

annualrent of 100 merks from the lands of Overhartside, on 14 March 1623.<sup>1</sup>  
(*see Hepburn of Humbie*).

2b) Isobel Hepburn, named in her father's Testament.

2a) Robert Hepburn, styled as brother to Patrick Hepburn of Kirklandhill when witness to a charter by Patrick Hepburn of Waughton to Patrick Hepburn, his son, for the lands of Brotherton dated 7 April 1565.<sup>2</sup>

2a) John Hepburn, named with his mother on 12 November 1560.

**SIR PATRICK HEPBURN OF WAUGHTON**, *m.* at the parish church of Bolton on 3 November 1510, to Elena, daughter of Sir Adam Hepburn of Craigis,<sup>3</sup> with whom he was infert in the third part of the lands of Stevenson on 12 December 1531. He was convicted at Edinburgh on 24 January 1536, of certain crimes against James Sinclair, brother to Sinclair of Rosslin for which he was forfeited and his goods ordered to be seized by the King on 25 April following,<sup>4</sup> although he was rehabilitated by 8 May of that year when he had a gift from the King of the non-entries of the lands of Waughton and Lufness. He *d.* in 1549,<sup>5</sup> and was father of :

1. Patrick Hepburn of Waughton, (*see below*).
2. Adam Hepburn, 1<sup>st</sup> of Smeaton, to whom his father conveyed the half lands of Smeaton and all the lands of Smeaton-Cruks in 1538. He *m.* Isabella, daughter of John Preston of Craigmillar and had issue. (*see Hepburn of Smeaton*).
3. William Hepburn, styled as brother to Patrick Hepburn of Waughton in a charter by James, Earl of Bothwell, granting the lands to Gilbert Kerr on 29 November 1563.<sup>6</sup>
4. Helen Hepburn, *m.* Alexander Cockburn, eldest son and apparent heir of William Cockburn of that ilk, (*c/m* 12 February 1541/2<sup>7</sup>).

He was also father of a natural son :

5. Mr. George Hepburn, styled as natural son to Sir Patrick Hepburn of Waughton in a Notarial Instrument declaring that his father had passed to the presence of John, Bishop of Brechin, and presented him with letter of presentation from the Queen, dated 11 October 1548, in favour of George as Chancellor of Brechin. Dated 16 October 1548.<sup>1</sup>

**PATRICK HEPBURN OF WAUGHTON**, succeeded his father and to whom he was retoured heir in the lands and barony of Waughton, in the constabulary of Haddington, on 10 April 1549,<sup>2</sup> with Sasine on 20 April following.<sup>3</sup> He *m.* firstly, by 2 August 1538, to Elizabeth, daughter of Sir Robert Logan of Restalrig, when they had a precept for a charter of confirmation,<sup>4</sup> and secondly, to Margaret, daughter of Walter Lundy of that Ilk, and *d.* on 22 February 1584.<sup>5</sup> He was father of :

1. Sir Patrick Hepburn of Lufness, (*see below*).
2. Robert Hepburn, who with his brother John, were included in a list of rebels who were forfeited by the King on 20 December 1567. He had a precept for a charter confirming the gift to him by the King of the lands of Stevenson on 26 May 1571, following the forfeiture of William Maitland of Lethington.
3. John Hepburn,
4. Christine Hepburn, *m.* Patrick Cheyne of Essilmont, (*c/m* 11 April 1566<sup>6</sup>).
5. Isobel Hepburn, *m.* first, George Halket of Pitferran, (*c/m* 9 July 1575.<sup>7</sup> He *d.* in 1588), and had issue ; and secondly at Holyrood House on 7 June 1590, to William Stewart, Commendator of Pittenweem, (he was widow of Erica, widow of Count of Manderscheidt, by whom he had no apparent issue).
6. Margaret Hepburn, *m.* Patrick Congalton of that Ilk, and had issue.

**SIR PATRICK HEPBURN OF LUFNESS**, succeeded his father and was retoured heir in the barony of Waughton on 20 April 1585.<sup>1</sup> He *m.* Isabel, daughter of John Haldane of Gleneagles, (*c/m* 31 March 1565.<sup>2</sup> She *d.* on 17 August 1597), *d.* by April 1605 and was father of :

1. Sir Patrick Hepburn of Waughton, (*see below*).
2. Mr John Hepburn, a witness with his brother Sir Patrick Hepburn of Waughton on 28 June 1606.<sup>3</sup> He *d.* in 1651.<sup>4</sup>
3. Isobel Hepburn, *m.* Mr. George Lauder of Bass, (*c/m* circa 6 February 1588<sup>5</sup>).
4. Elizabeth Hepburn, *m.* Sir Alexander Drummond, 7<sup>th</sup> of Carnock, (*c/m* at Holyrood, Edinburgh and Waughton on 26 March 1601.<sup>6</sup> He *d.* in January of 1613<sup>7</sup>), and had issue.

**SIR PATRICK HEPBURN OF WAUGHTON**, succeeded his father and was retoured his heir in the barony of Waughton on 3 April 1605. He *m.* in 1607, to Jean, daughter of Sir John Moray, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Tulliebardine, disposed the lands and baronies of Waughton and Bass to his son and heir John Hepburn and his future spouse, Mary Ross, on 13 May 1646, *d.* by November 1649, and was father of :

1. John Hepburn of Waughton, (*see below*).
2. George Hepburn, to whom his father conveyed the lands of Fastcastle and for which he had a confirmation under the Great Seal dated 22 August 1642.<sup>8</sup>
3. Anna Hepburn, *m.* Sir James Hamilton of Priestfield, (*c/m* 18 September 1623), and had issue.

**JOHN HEPBURN OF WAUGHTON**, succeeded his father and was retoured his heir in the lands and barony of Waughton on 9 November 1649.<sup>9</sup> He *d.* in July of 1669,<sup>1</sup> having *m.*

firstly, to Mary, sister and heir portioner of Robert, Lord Ross, by whom he was father of  
:

1. **MARGARET HEPBURN**, to whom her father conveyed the half part of the lands of Preston on 5 June 1655, and is then styled as his only daughter.<sup>2</sup> She *m.* Sir Andrew Ramsay, (he *m.* secondly, in 1675, to Ann, daughter of Hugh Montgomery, 7<sup>th</sup> Earl of Eglinton, and had issue ; and *d.* in 1709), who succeeded in her right, to the lands and barony of Waughton. She *dsp* and was buried in the Greyfriars, Edinburgh, on 22 February 1672.

He *m.* secondly, by 21 February 1662, to Barbara, daughter of Sir Alexander Leslie, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Leven, (she was widow of Sir John Ruthven of Dunglass, by whom she had issue).
