OF CRAMOND

JAMES INGLIS, was a Skinner and Burgess of Edinburgh and was father of :

ARCHIBALD INGLIS, became a Merchant in Edinburgh and was admitted to Burgess there on 8 February 1581, by right of his father.¹ He *d.* by 31 December 1602, when his eldest son James Inglis granted letters of Reversion to George Bruce of Carnock for an annualrent of 500 merks from the lands of Wester Gelletis,² and was father of,

JAMES INGLIS, 1ST OF NETHER CRAMOND, was admitted Burgess of Edinburgh by right of his father on 12 November 1623,³ and obtained the lands of Nether Cramond from Alexander Douglas of Nether Cramond for which he had a charter from Alexander, Bishop of Dunkeld, the superior, on 7 April 1624, in which he is styled as son of the deceased Archibald Inglis, Merchant and Burgess of Edinburgh.⁴ He *m.* at Edinburgh on 12 October 1609, to Sarah, daughter of John Morison, and sister of Sir Alexander Morison of Prestongrange,⁵ *d.* prior to June of 1637 and was father of,

1. Archibald Inglis, *c.* at Edinburgh on 5 July 1610, and *d.* young.
2. John Inglis, 2nd of Nether Cramond, (*see below*).
3. Thomas Inglis, *c.* at Edinburgh on 6 December 1614.
4. James Inglis, *c.* at Edinburgh on 16 January 1616.
5. Sarah Inglis, *c.* at Edinburgh on 6 Seotember 1612.
6. Catherine Inglis, *c.* at Edinburgh on 28 October 1613.

JOHN INGLIS, 2ND OF NETHER CRAMOND, *b.* on 25 August 1611, and was retoured heir general to his father on 3 June 1637.¹ He *m.* Janet, daughter of James Eilis, Merchant Burgess of Edinburgh, (*c/m* 4 June 1632²), was buried in the Greyfriars, Edinburgh, on 1 April 1684,³ and was father of :

1. John Inglis, *d.* unmarried on 20 June 1664.
2. Sir James Inglis, 1st Baronet of Cramond, (*see below*).
3. Janet Inglis, *m.* on 22 September 1670, to James Holborn, 2nd of Menstrie, (*c/m* 31 August 1670⁴), and had issue.

SIR JAMES INGLIS, 1ST BARONET OF CRAMOND, had a Disposition from his father for the tenandry of Nether Cramond on 8 June 1676, in which he is styled as his only son, and for his entire estate of Cramond on 26 August 1686, and to whom he was retoured heir general on 3 June 1690.⁵ He was created a Baronet of Nova Scotia on 22 March 1687, with limitation to the heirs male of his own body, and *m.* at Cramond on 31 October 1682, Anne, daughter of Sir Patrick Houston, 1st Baronet of that Ilk,⁶ (she survived him and *m.* secondly, at Edinburgh on 30 September 1700, to Sir William Hamilton of Whitlaw,⁷ whom she also survived and *m.* thirdly, to Adam Cockburn of Ormiston. She *d.* on 18 January 1721), and was buried in the Greyfriars, Edinburgh, on 6 December 1688.⁸ He was father of :

1. Sir John Inglis, 2nd Baronet of Cramond, (*see below*).
2. Patrick Inglis, *c.* at Edinburgh on 22 December 1685.
3. Anne Inglis, *c.* at Cramond on 20 September 1684, and *m.* on 20 January 1704, Robert Lundin of Lundin, (*c/m* 31 December, 1703.⁹ He *d.* in December of 1716). They had issue.

4. Janet Inglis, *c.* at Edinburgh on 1 February 1687, and *m.* on 15 November 1709, Sir John Clerk, 2nd Baronet of Pennicuik, (he *d.* on 4 October 1755).
5. Margaret Inglis, *b.* on 19th and *c.* at Edinburgh on 22 March 1688.
6. Jacobina Inglis, *c.* at Edinburgh on 1 July 1689.

SIR JOHN INGLIS, 2ND BARONET OF CRAMOND, *b.* on 23 september 1683, succeeded his father and was appointed Postmaster-General for Scotland in May of 1742. He *m.* at Cramond on 24 June 1708, Anne, daughter of Adam Cockburn of Ormiston,¹ *d.* at Cramond on 26 February 1771,² and was father of :

1. **SIR ADAM INGLIS, 3RD BARONET OF CRAMOND**, *c.* at Cramond on 22 October 1714, succeeded his father and *m.* at Barnbogle on 24 November 1766, to Dorothea, daughter of James Primrose, 2nd Earl of Roseberry,³ (*c/m* 24 November 1766.⁴ She *d.* on 12 December 1783). He *dsp* at Cramond on 9 November 1772.⁵
2. **SIR JOHN INGLIS, 4TH BARONET OF CRAMOND**, *c.* at Cramond on 18 November 1718, succeeded his brother on his death in 1772, and to whom he was served heir on 11 December 1772. He *m.* at Edinburgh on 11 August 1754, Christian, daughter of Sir Robert Sinclair of Langformacus,⁶ (she *d.* at Cramond on Wednesday 28 July 1790⁷), *d.* at Cramond of 5 April 1799,⁸ and was father of :
 - 2a) Robert Inglis, *d.* at Cramond in January of 1777.⁹
 - 2a) Adam Inglis, *dsp vita patris* on 1 September 1794.
 - 2a) Anne Inglis, *m.* on 6 April 1795, James Sandilands, 9th Lord Torphichen, (he *dsp* on 7 June 1815), and was served heir of line to her father on 19 May 1799. She *dsp* in 1849, and to whom her cousin Charles Inglis Craigie Halket was served heir of tailzie on 18 June 1849.

3. **SIR PATRICK INGLIS, 5TH BARONET OF CRAMOND**, *c.* at Cramond on 13 Aril 1728, succeeded his brother Sir John Inglis on his death in 1799 and *dsp* at his house in George Square, Edinburgh, on 24 November 1817.¹
4. Charles Inglis, *c* at Cramond on 13 December 1730, entered the Royal Navy and was raised to Rear-Admiral. He *dsp* in October of 1791.
5. James Inglis, *c.* at Cramond on 15 July 1711.
6. Susanna Inglis, *b.* on 30 October 1709, *m.* at Cramond on 23 April 1730, to John Craigie of Dunbarney, and had issue which succeeded to the lands of Cramond.
7. Christian Inglis, *b.* on 12 February 1716, and *m.* on 20 September 1733, to James Wauchope of Edmonstone.²
8. Margaret Inglis, *m.* on Monday 3 March 1739, to John Erskine, younger of Dun, “An amiable young Pair,”³ and had issue.
9. Anne Inglis, *b.* on 20 September 1712, and *m.* at Cramond on 14 November 1742, to Hew Dalrymple of West Hall, (*c/m* 9 November 1742. He *d.* on 26 July 1746). They had no issue.
10. Janet Inglis, *c.* at Cramond on 28 April 1726, and *d.* unmarried at Edinburgh on 6 April 1812.⁴
