

# INGLIS

## OF ROTTENRAW & INGLISTON

**ALEXANDER INGLIS OF ROTTENRAW**, *m.* Elizabeth Craig with whom he is named in a charter dated 1622, and *d.* prior to 16 December 1635, when his son James was retoured his heir, and was father of :

**JAMES INGLIS OF EASTFIELD & INGLISTON**, who on 17 December 1631, had a charter under the Great Seal for the lands of Rottenraw, including that part called Eastfield, Westfield of Rottenraw and part of the lands of Audliston which the King then erected into the barony of Ingliston.<sup>1</sup> He was retoured heir general to his father on 16 December 1635,<sup>2</sup> *m.* Marion Somerville, and *d.* in 1640 being father of :

1. Sir Alexander Inglis of Ingliston, (*see below*).
2. James Inglis, served as a Major in the army and *m.* Janet, daughter of George Boswell, portioner of Kirkcaldy, (*c/m* 30 March 1654.<sup>3</sup> She was widow of David Beatson of Cardon, by whom she had issue). He was father of;
  - 2a} John Inglis,
  - 2a} Janet Inglis,
3. Thomas Inglis, *c.* at Edinburgh on 20 October 1629.
4. Patrick Inglis, *c.* at Edinburgh on 19 August 1633.
5. John Inglis, served as a Captain in the army and is styled as brother to Sir Alexander Inglis of Ingliston in Bond dated in 1664.
6. Marion Inglis, *c.* at Edinburgh on 18 November 1630.
7. Cecil Inglis, *c.* at Edinburgh on 18 November 1631.

**SIR ALEXANDER INGLIS OF INGLISTON**, was retoured heir general to his father on 3 November 1640,<sup>4</sup> and to Alexander Inglis of Rottenraw, his grandfather, in the lands of

Wester Coilzeam on the same day. He *m.* on 7 April 1630, to Euphame, daughter of James Skene, 1<sup>st</sup> Baronet of Curriehill, and accidentally shot and killed himself with a fowling piece.<sup>1</sup> He was buried in the Greyfriars, Edinburgh, on 8 October 1661,<sup>2</sup> and was father of :

1. James Inglis of Ingliston, (*see below*)
2. Archibald Inglis, styled as son to the deceased Sir Alexander Inglis of Ingliston in a Bond dated 10 June 1684.<sup>3</sup>
3. George Inglis, granted a Discharge on behalf of Euphemia Skene, relict of Alexander Inglis of Ingliston, on 7 July 1670.<sup>4</sup>
4. William Inglis,

**JAMES INGLIS OF INGLISTON**, succeeded his father and disposed the lands of Ingliston to Archibald Hope who thereafter had a charter of confirmation under the Great Seal on 7 December 1683. He *m.* Janet, daughter of Archibald Johnston of Hilton, (she was widow of Sir James Skene, 1<sup>st</sup> Baronet of Curriehill, who had *d.* in 1633, and by whom she had issue ; and also of Sir George Winram of Libberton), and was father of :

**JOHN INGLIS**, who was buried in the Greyfriars, Edinburgh, on 4 January 1689.<sup>5</sup>
