

KINLOCH

OF ABERBOTHRIE & THAT ILK

DR. DAVID KINLOCH OF ABERBOTHRIE, was a man of keen medical skills and after training on the continent, he returned to Scotland and was appointed King's Physician. Under this designation he had a charter from King James VI. dated 13 June 1616, confirming to him the lands of Leitfie, Bardmony and Aberbothrie, all in the sheriffdom of Perth, following resignation in his favour by Andrew, Lord Gray, on 18 May previous¹ and *m.* Grizel, daughter of William Hay of Gourdie. He *d.* in 1617 and by 1 November of that year, when his son David was retoured his heir, and was father of :

1. David Kinloch of Aberbothrie, (*see below*).
2. John Kinloch, apprenticed to Steven Boyd, Merchant in Edinburgh, on 12 July 1620, and is then styled as second son of the deceased Mr. David Kinloch, doctor of Medicine.
3. James Kinloch, 1st of Gourdie, (*see Kinloch of Gourdie*).

MR. DAVID KINLOCH OF ABERBOTHRIE, retoured heir to his father in the lands of Leitfie, Bardmony and Aberbothrie on 1 November 1617. He *m.* Magdalen, daughter of Sir David Graham, 7th of Fintry, (*c/m* 17 September 1634²), *d.* by October of 1667, and was father of :

1. Sir David Kinloch, 1st Baronet, (*see below*).
2. James Kinloch, 1st of Kilry, (*see Kinloch of Kilry*).

SIR DAVID KINLOCH OF ABERBOTHRIE & 1ST BARONET, retoured heir to his father in the lands of Aberbothrie, Leitfie and others on 18 October 1667. He was created a baronet on 20 July 1685 and *d.* by July of 1699 having *m.* first, at Kemback on Sunday 13 June 1669, to Catherine, only apparent child of David Bethune of Pitkeirie, second son of John Bethune of Balfour, by whom he was father of :

1. Sir James Kinloch, 2nd Baronet of that Ilk, (*see below*).
2. Agnes Kinloch, *m.* Alexander Nairne, 1st of Drumkilbo, (he *d.* on 22 May 1741), and *d.* at Drumkilbo in August of 1752.¹

He *m.* secondly, to Margaret, daughter of James Graham of Fintry, (she survived him and *m.* secondly, to Patrick Ogilvy of Balfour, by whom she had issue), by whom he was father of :

3. William Kinloch, *bap.* at Dundee on 8 October 1687.

SIR JAMES KINLOCH, 2ND BARONET OF KINLOCH, succeeded his father and was served his heir general on 25 July 1699. He *m.* Elizabeth, sister and coheirress of David Nevay of that Ilk, (she *d.* at Kinloch on 6 April 1760, aged 77 years²), following which he assumed the additional surname of Nevay. He *d.* in 1744 and was father of :

1. Sir James Kinloch Nevay, 3rd Baronet of Kinloch, (*see below*).
2. David Kinloch, was apprenticed to David Aikenhead, Apothecary in Edinburgh, on 9 December 1720, and is then styled as second son.³
3. Alexander Kinloch, served throughout the rising of 1745/6 in the Ogilvy Regiment and was taken prisoner with his brother Charles and held at Southwark. A Bills of Indictment was read against them in August 1746, and a warrant for the execution of both delivered on 28 January 1747.⁴ This was commuted to transportation for life and both were released the following May. He *d.* at Kinloch on 26 December 1759.⁵
4. Charles Kinloch,
5. William Kinloch, was a Merchant in Lisbon.⁶
6. Margaret Kinloch, *m.* James Yeaman, 2nd of Murie, and had issue.
7. Jean Kinloch, *m.* James Rattray of Rannagulzion, and had issue.

8. Agnes Kinloch, *m.* on 13 April 1754, to James Smith of Camno, (he *d.* in January 1763), and *d.* at Affleck on 18 February 1795. They had issue.

SIR JAMES KINLOCH NEVAY, 3RD BARONET, engaged with his brothers Alexander and Charles as Jacobites in the rising of 1745/6 and served as an officer in the Ogilvy Regiment. He was attainted for high treason and although sentenced to execution, this was afterwards altered to a lifetime banishment to New Jersey. He *m.* Janet, daughter of William Duff, *d.* at Dundee on 5th February 1776,¹ and was father of,

1. James Kinloch, who *dsp* prior to 19 January 1759, when his brother William was served his heir in a provision.
2. **WILLIAM KINLOCH OF KINLOCH**, became a Chemist in London and was served heir to his brother James on 19 January 1759. He sold the lands of Kinloch to his cousin George Oliphant Kinloch.
3. Joseph York Kinloch, *d.* at Calcutta on 10 September 1796.²
4. Francis Peregrine Kinloch, *c.* at Barnstaple on 9 March 1751, and *d.* at Calcutta on 4 August 1806.³
5. Elizabeth Elinora Kinloch, *c.* at Barnstaple on 26 April 1749.
5. Henrietta Kinloch, *d.* on 28 December 1791.⁴
6. Mary Kinloch, *m.* at Dundee on 14 September 1767, to John Rankine of Dudhope.
7. Ann Kinloch, *d.* unmarried in 1793.
