

# KINLOCH

## OF KILRY & LOGIE

**JAMES KINLOCH, 1<sup>ST</sup> OF KILRY**, was brother to Sir David Kinloch, 1<sup>st</sup> Baronet, and trained in the medical profession which he practiced with a good deal of success in Dundee to the extent that he was able to purchase the lands of Kilry. He *m.* Cecilia, daughter of David Fotheringham, 13<sup>th</sup> of Powrie, (she *m.* secondly, to John Ogilvy of Murthill<sup>1</sup>), had *d.* by 13 December 1693, and was father of :

1. David Kinloch, 2<sup>nd</sup> of Kilry, (*see below*).
2. James Kinloch, *c.* at Dundee on 18 March 1688.
3. John Kinloch, *c.* at Dundee on Thursday 5 January 1691, and trained as a Physician. He *m.* Jean, eldest daughter and coheirress of George Oliphant, 2<sup>nd</sup> of Clashbennie, (she *d.* in 1739), by whom, *jure uxoris*, he obtained the lands of Clashbennie, and had issue, (*see Kinloch of Clashbennie & Kinloch*).

**DAVID KINLOCH, 2<sup>ND</sup> OF KILRY**, *c.* at Dundee on 9 February 1687, succeeded his father in the lands of Kilry and to whom he was served heir firstly on 13 December 1693, then on 24 November 1737. He *d.* at Kilry on 19 December 1754, in his 67<sup>th</sup> year<sup>2</sup> having *m.* firstly, Isobel, second daughter and coheirress of George Oliphant, 2<sup>nd</sup> of Clashbennie, (*c/m* 2 March 1723.<sup>3</sup> She *d.* in 1737), by whom he was father of :

1. John Kinloch, 3<sup>rd</sup> of Kilry, (*see below*).
2. Cecilia Kinloch, *m.* at Kinblathmont House on 4 January 1772, to William MacDonald, younger of Rineton.<sup>4</sup>
3. Rachel Kinloch, *d.* at Edinburgh on 2 May 1807.<sup>5</sup>

He *m.* secondly, to Agnes, daughter of Andrew Leuchars in Bog of Puil, (*c/m* 10 November 1739), and by her he had further issue :

4. George Kinloch, contended with his brother John Kinloch regarding the terms of their father's first marriage for which a decret arbitral was issued on 11 February 1761, and in which he is styled as son by the second marriage.<sup>1</sup> He had entered the 70<sup>th</sup> Regiment Foot by 27 June 1761, and was then served as Lieutenant.

**JOHN KINLOCH, 3<sup>RD</sup> OF KILRY**, was served an heir portioner to his maternal grandfather George Oliphant of Clashbennie in the lands of Clashbennie on 6 May 1745, and as heir male general to his father firstly on 24 May 1755, then again on 13 November 1766, in the lands of Cairn and Sheriffbank. He *m.* Cecilia White, *d.* at his house in Dundee on Monday 16 January 1804,<sup>2</sup> and was father of :

**THOMAS KINLOCH, 4<sup>TH</sup> OF KILRY**, succeeded his father and to whom he was served heir general on 3 May 1811. He *m.* on 2 February 1807, to Ann Morley, (she *d.* at Boulogne on 27 February 1858<sup>3</sup>), *d.* at Kilry on 17 May 1824,<sup>4</sup> and was father of :

1. John Grant Kinloch, 5<sup>th</sup> of Kilry, (*see below*).
2. Thomas Kinloch, *b.* on 4 December 1814.
3. Ann Kinloch, *b.* at Logie on 14 March 1809, and *m.* on 20 June 1832, to James Balfour Ogilvy, fourth son of Sir William Ogilvy, 8<sup>th</sup> Baronet of Inverquhar, (he *d.* at Ceylon on 14 July 1848). She *d.* at Chittagong on 5 December 1841, and had issue.
4. Cecilia Kinloch, *c.* on 26 March 1810.
5. Agnes Kinloch, *d.* on 6 December 1848, aged 34 years.

**JOHN KINLOCH, 5<sup>TH</sup> OF KILRY**, *b.* on 8 November 1807, succeeded his father and to whom he was served heir firstly in the lands of Craigs, Quarrellhill and others on 19 December 1825, then as heir male on 2 March 1835. He *d.* at Logie House on 7 May

1894,<sup>1</sup> having *m.* firstly, at St. John's Chapel, Edinburgh, on 8 August 1837, to Agnes Garden, only daughter of Francis Garden Campbell of Troup and Glenlyon,<sup>2</sup> by whom he was father of :

1. Alexander Angus Airlie Kinloch, of Kilry and Logie, (*see below*).
2. John Andrew Kinloch, *b.* on 11 February 1841, and *d.* at Melbourne returning home from Tasmania in 1886.<sup>3</sup>
3. Francis Garden Kinloch, *b.* on 23 September 1852, and was commissioned Lieutenant in the 92<sup>nd</sup> Foot on 20 February 1874. He *k.* in the Koorum Valley during the Afghan war, in 1879.

He *m.* secondly, at St. John's Episcopal Church, Edinburgh, on 31 October 1872, to Marjory Alexandrina, eldest daughter and heiress of William MacDowall Grant of Arndilly, (she was widow of Ronald Steuart Menzies of Culdares whom she had *m.* on 17 April 1849, and who had *d.* on 22 October 1870, and by whom she had issue. She *d.* in 1894).

**ALEXANDER ANGUS AIRLIE KINLOCH, OF KILRY & LOGIE**, *b.* on 27 December 1838, and succeeded his father on his death on 1894. He entered the army, serving in the Afghan war and being raised to Major-General. He *m.* at Nynee, India, on 7 September 1868, to Constance Emma Mary, daughter of Frederic Long, *d.* at Bray Lodge, Berkshire, in 1919, and was father of :

1. Angus Murray Kinloch, (*see below*).
2. Hugh Kinloch, *b.* at Dinapore, Bengal, on 29 September 1869.
3. Ernest Kinloch, *b.* at Rawul Pindee, Bengal, on 2 March 1871.
4. Herbert Stewart Kinloch, *b.* at Rawul Pindee on 18 January 1872.
5. Ronald Kinloch, *b.* at Rawul Pindee on 6 March 1873.
6. Frank Kinloch, *b.* at Fort William, Bengal, on 1 February 1882.
7. John Alington Kinloch, *b.* at Darjeeling, Bengal, on 5 May 1886.
8. Victor Kinloch, *b.* at Abbottabad, Bengal, on 9 June 1887.
9. Violet Agnes Kinloch, *b.* at Murree, Bengal, on 25 May 1875, and *d.* on the same day.

**ANGUS MURRAY KINLOCH, OF LOGIE**, *b.* at Seetapoore, Bengal, on 5 June 1868, and *m.* Annie, youngest daughter of Major-General F. J. Wilson, Madras Staff Corps.<sup>1</sup> He *d.* at Kotagiri, Nilgiris India, on 3 May 1921, from being skewered by the wild boar he had shot and wounded while hunting,<sup>2</sup> and was father of,

1. Heather Edith Constance Kinloch, *b.* at Kotagiri, Bengal, on 13 March 1899.
2. Nancy Agnes Hilda Kinloch, *b.* at Kotagiri, Bengal, on 26 February 1901.
3. Dorothy Jean Kinloch, *b.* at Kotagiri, Bengal, on 29 December 1905, and *m.* at Kotagiri on 26 August 1932, to John Francis Murphy.
