

LECKIE

OF LECKIE

MURDACH, of whom nothing of any certainty is known other than he and his son Duncan are styled as grandfather and father to Malcolm in a charter for the half lands of Leckie in 1354. He was father of :

DUNCAN, who was father of :

MALCOLM DE LECKY, had a charters from King David II., for the half of the lands of Lecky, in the sheriffdom of Stirling, on 31 March 1354, and 12 March 1358, resigned into the King's hands by Donald, Earl of Lennox, to be held in free barony for payment of one set of gilded spurs annually at Whitsunday.¹ He was father of :

1. Murdoch of Leckie of that ilk, (*see below*).
2. Thomas of Leckie, included in the remainder of his brother Murdoch's charter for the lands of Leckie in 1376.
3. Elizabeth of Leckie, named in the charter to her brother Murdoch in 1376.

MURDOCH OF LECKIE OF THAT ILK, had a charter from King Robert II. for the lands of Leckie in 1376, and is then styled as son of Malcolm ; and another from Robert Stewart, Duke of Albany, for the lands of Easter Leckie on 25 February 1407. He was father of :

MURDOCH OF LECKIE OF THAT ILK, was a member of the inquest at the retour of Sir John de Haldane, as heir to the deceased Sir Bernard de Haldane, his father, in the lands of Kepdowry on 2 October 1425,² and *m.* a woman named Margaret with whom he resigned the lands of East Leckie to John Murray of Kypmad on 7 March 1441. He was father of :

MALCOLM LECKIE OF THAT ILK, succeeded and appears to have been twice married as on 1 June 1477, he took Instruments declaring that he would never alienate any of his lands from his eldest son, begotten of his first spouse, except ten merks, and that would be with the consent of Malcolm Fleming, son and heir of Robert, Lord Fleming.¹ He was father of :

JAMES LECKIE OF THAT ILK, had succeedrd by 29 May 1487, when he was a member of the inquest at the retour of William de Stirling as heir to his father William de Stirling of Cadder, in the lands of Lettyr, on 24 May 1490,² and was a member of the inquest at the retour of James Haldane as heir to Duncan, Earl of Lennox, his great-great-grandfather, in one quarter of the Earldom of Lennox.³ He *d.* by 1515, and was father of :

RICHARD LECKIE OF THAT ILK, had Sasine for the half lands of Lecky and Boquhan on 8 November 1515,⁴ and was witness to a Precept of Clare Constat by Alexander Napier of Merchiston to infest Charles Denniston as heir to William Denniston, his brother, in the lands of Gartacharn on 9 February 1525.⁵ He was a member of the inquest at the retour of Elizabeth Galbraith as nearest heir to her brother, the deceased Thomas Galbraith of Ballindroich, on 7 October 1532,⁶ and was also present at the retour of George Stirling of Glorat as heir to his father William Stirling of Glorat in the lands of Easter and Wester Glorat on 15 January 1537.⁷ He was father of :

JOHN LECKIE OF THAT ILK, was a member of the assize at the retour of John Haldane, as heir to his father James Haldane of Gleneagles, in the Barony of Gleneagles on 29 March 1547,⁸ and *k.* at the battle of Pinkie in September of that same year.¹ He was father of :

1. Walter Leckie of that Ilk, (*see below*).
2. Robert Leckie of Kepdarroch, acted as Tutor to his great-nephew Alexander Leckie of that Ilk, during his minority and was father of :
 - 2a) Robert Leckie, younger of Kepdarroch, *m.* Beatrice Charteris.
 - 2a) John Leckie,
 - 2a) James Leckie,
3. James Leckie, the gift of whose escheat was granted to Robert, Earl of Lennox, on 6 July 1579, for not having appeared before the Privy Council to answer for certain charges² and for which he had a remission on 5 March 1580.³

WALTER LECKIE OF THAT ILK, succeeded his father and was retoured his heir in the middle-part of the Barony of Leckie on 26 March 1555,⁴ with Sasine taken on 19 April following.⁵ He *m.* first, by February of 1565, Agnes, sister of John Cunningham of Glengarnock,⁶ and was father of :

1. Alexander Leckie, younger of that Ilk, *m.* Eupham, sister to Patrick Maxwell of Newark, (she *m.* secondly, in 1606, to Adam Cunningham, son of the then deceased Adam Cunningham of Auchinhervie⁷ and had issue), and was murdered at the instance of Sir James Maxwell of Calderwood in September of 1601. He was father of,
 - 1a) Alexander Leckie of that Ilk, (*see below*).

He *m.* secondly, Mariote, sister of Alexander Livingston of Bantaskine, (*c/m* 13 October 1597⁸), by whom he had no apparent issue.

ALEXANDER LECKIE OF THAT ILK, succeeded his grandfather and *m.* Grisel, daughter of Sir John Murray of Touchadam, with whom, as his future spouse, they had a charter

under the Great Seal for the lands of and barony of Leckie, a third of Kepdarroch and Easter Leckie on 14 March 1617.¹ He *d.* in around 1643, and was father of :

1. John Leckie of that Ilk, (*see below*).
2. Eupham Leckie,
3. Margaret Leckie,

JOHN LECKIE OF THAT ILK, succeeded his father and was retoured his heir in the lands of West Leckie on 12 January 1648, which he subsequently disposed to David Moir by Disposition dated 12 March 1668.² He *m.* by 1 November 1661, to Jean, daughter of Sir George Buchanan of that Ilk, when he granted a Discharge to her brother John Buchanan of that Ilk for 10,000 merks as Tocher.³ He was father of :

1. John Leckie, *c.* at Gargunock on 27 November 1666.
2. Mary Leckie, *c.* at Gargunock on 12 July 1663.
