

LOCKHART

OF LEE AND CARNWATH

SIR SIMON DE LOCKHART, LORD OF LEE, made a donation to the Monks at Newbattle Abbey of annualrents from his lands of Kinnaird on 1 April 1339,¹ and was succeeded by:

ALEXANDER LOCKHART OF LEE, who was living on 8 January 1444, and had *d.* by February of 1467. He was father of :

SIR ALAN LOCKHART OF LEE, m. Mariote, daughter John Lockhart of Bar and was called in the remainder of a charter by his father-in-law for the lands of Bar dated 8 January 1444,² being then styled as son and heir of Alexander Lockhart of Lee. He had succeeded his father by 3 February 1467, when he renewed his ancestor's grant to the Monks of Newbattle as it had lapsed and remained uncollected for some years.³ He appears to have been father of :

1. **SIR MUNGO LOCKHART OF LEE**, was next to possess the lands of Lee and was in all probability the eldest son and heir of Sir Alan. He is named as tenant of the lands of Ardait in 1487, and *d.* by 1488 when these lands were assigned to Thomas Todd.⁴ He was father of :

1a) **ROBERT LOCKHART OF LEE**, who was *dsp* by 1502 and is then styled as son of the deceased Sir Mungo. He was succeeded by his uncle, James Lockhart.

2. James Lockhart of Lee, (*see below*).

SIR JAMES LOCKHART OF LEE, is styled as eme of the deceased Robert Lockhart, the son and heir of the deceased Sir Mungo Lockhart of Lee in 1502.⁵ He had the gift of the ward of the lands of Cleghorn following the deceased of Steven Lockhart of Cleghorn,

dated 14 May 1505,¹ and *d.* by 17 August 1507, when the ward of his son and lands were assigned to James Symonton, son and heir of John Symonton of that Ilk. He was father of:

JAMES LOCKHART OF LEE, who was under age at his father's death with his ward being gifted to James Symonton, fiar of that Ilk, on 17 August 1507.² He was of age on 4 February 1516, when he was included in a remission for the assault on James Douglas on the streets of Edinburgh,³ and had Sasine for the lands of Lee and Cartland on 6 May 1517, which had lapsed and been in the King's hands for the space of ten years.⁴ He *d.* by June of 1541 and was father of :

ALAN LOCKHART OF LEE, had succeeded by 14 June 1541, when he had a remission for the assault and murder of Rudolph Weir and David Weir.⁵ He *m.* Jean, daughter of Sir Hugh Carmichael of that Ilk, and apparently was *k.* at the battle of Pinkie in September of 1547. He was father of :

JAMES LOCKHART OF LEE, succeeded and had Sasine for the lands of Lee, Cartland East Memphlair and others on 8 November 1548, which had been in the King's hands since the term specified in the previous entry, that being September of 1547 due to death at the battle of Pinkie.⁶ He *m.* firstly, Janet, daughter of Robert Hamilton of Dalserf, and secondly, by 2 December 1593, to Mariote Cunningham, she was widow of Ninian Cunningham of Whitethrist,⁷ and was father of :

1. Sir James Lockhart of Lee, (*see below*).
2. Gaving Lockhart, became a Burgess of Lanark.⁸

SIR JAMES LOCKHART OF LEE, succeeded his father and exchanged his lands of Locherwater for those of Carstairs belonging to James Hamilton of Avendale by contract dated 23 November 1606,¹ and for which he had a charter of confirmation from the superior, John, Archbishop of Glasgow, on 12 March 1611. He *d.* in 1633 having *m.* firstly, to Agnes, daughter of Sir Robert Drummond of Carnock, whom, in her virginity, he infert in a liferent of his lands of Lockhart-miln on 10 November 1581,² and by whom he was father of :

1. Elspeth Lockhart, *m.* James Cunningham of Bonnetoun.

He *m.* secondly to Jane, daughter of James Weir of Stoneybires, (she *d.* by 3 September 1614), and by her he was father of :

2. Sir James Lockhart of Lee, (*see below*).

He *m.* thirdly, by 3 September 1614, to Jean, daughter of George Auchinleck, 2nd of Balmanno, when they had a charter under the Great Seal for the lands of Hewheads,³ and by her he was father of :

3. Sir William Lockhart, 1st of Carstairs, had a charter from his father for the lands of Threipholm dated 17 December 1614.⁴ He *m.* firstly, to Marion Hepburn with whom he had a charer from his father for the lands of Hoill of Mosplat and the remaining lands of the barony of Carstairs on 22 August 1627,⁵ and secondly, to Mary, daughter of James, 1st Lord Carmichael, (*c/m* 27 August 1640. She survived him and *m.* secondly by contract 31 January 1652, to Sir William Weir of Stonebyres), and was father of :

3a) James Lockhart, is styled as eldest son to Sir William Lockhart of Carstairs and Mary Carmichael when he had the fee of the lands of Stackfrank assigned to him on 2 June

1648.¹ He *d.* without apparent issue by July of 1664, being succeeded by his brother William.

3a) Sir William Lockhart, 2nd of Carstairs and 1st Baronet, succeeded his father and brother James and as his heir, he was infeft in the lands of Stackfrank on 4 August 1664.² He had issue, (*see Lockhart of Carstairs*).

4. John Lockhart, who was infeft in the fee of the lands of Malenie with his parents, Sir James Lockhart and Jean Auchinleck, in the liferent on 12 March 1617, to be held by himself and his heirs, which failing, by his brothers Samuel, George and William.³

5. Samuel Lockhart, had a charter from his father for the lands of Ravenstruther on 7 October 1614,⁴ and was apprenticed to Patrick Wood, Merchant in Edinburgh, on 15 February 1632.⁵ He granted a Disposition to Sir William Lockhart of Carstairs dated 25 December 1695, being then styled as son to the deceased Sir James Lockhart of Lee.⁶

6. George Lockhart,

7. Grisel Lockhart, *m.* James Bannatyne of Corehouse.

8. Christian Lockhart, *m.* James Douglas of Morton, (*c/m* 28 May 1624).

9. Mary Lockhart, *m.* Corneilius Lockhart of Jordanhill.

10. Elizabeth Lockhart, *m.* James Lockhart of Cleghorn.

11. Janet Lockhart, *m.* Carruthers of Holmains.

12. Jean Lockhart, *m.* Robert Chancellor of Sheilhill.

SIR JAMES LOCKHART OF LEE, was appointed a Clerk of the Judiciary and *m.* firstly, to Helen Fairlie with whom he had a charter from his father for the lands of Castlehill and Fullwood, dated 20 December 1617, to be held by themselves and their heirs male.⁷ He *m.* secondly, in 1619, to Martha, daughter of Sir George Douglas of Mordington, *d.* on 4 June 1674, and was father of :

1. **SIR WILLIAM LOCKHART OF LEE**, succeeded his father and was served his heir on 5 June 1674.¹ He *m.* firstly, to Margaret, daughter of Sir John Hamilton of Orbistoun, and secondly, at Westminster on 22 February 1654, to Robina Schuster,² neice of Oliver Cromwell, the Lord Protector, and in 1675, and by November of that year. He was father of :

1a) **CROMWELL LOCKHART OF LEE**, succeeded his father and was served his heir and his grandfather, Sir James Lockhart's on 9 November 1675.³ He *m.* firstly to a daughter of Sir David Harvie of Combe Nevill,⁴ and secondly, at Edinburgh on 1 September 1687, to Martha, daughter of Sir John Lockhart of Castlehill,⁵ and *dsp* being buried at Lanark on 8 March 1693,⁶ and succeeded in the lands of Lee by his brother Richard.

1a) **RICHARD LOCKHART OF LEE**, succeeded his brother and *m.* at Edinburgh on 5 April 1694, to Jean, daughter of Sir Patrick Houston of that Ilk,⁷ (she was widow of Walter Dundas, brother of Ralph Dundas of that Ilk, by whom she had no issue, and after Richard Lockhart's death she *m.* thirdly, to Ludovic Grant of Grant⁸). He *dsp* and was buried in the Greyfriars, Edinburgh, on 16 April 1696.⁹

1a) **JOHN LOCKHART OF LEE**, was served heir to his brother Cromwell Lockhart of Lee on 9 January 1697.¹⁰ He *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of Sir Thomas Scott of Scottshall, Kent,¹¹ *d.* on 16 September 1707, and was succeeded by his brother James.

1a) **JAMES LOCKHART OF LEE**, succeeded his brother John and was served his heir in the lands of Lee and others, on 13 April 1708. He *m.* Dorothy Luchan, *d.* on 26 October 1718, and was father of :

1b) James Lockhart, *b.* on 3 April 1702, and *d.* in infancy.

1b) William Lockhart, *b.* on 8 June 1703, and *dsp.*

1b) **JOHN LOCKHART OF LEE**, *b.* on 15 May 1705, was served heir to his father in the lands of Lee on 1 November 1733, and *m.* firstly, on 2 April 1732, to Jean,

daughter and heiress of Mr. Robert Alexander of Blackhouse.¹ He *m.* secondly, on 21 August 1750, to Mary, daughter of John Porterfield of Fullwood,² (she *d.* at Lee on 22 July 1797³), and *d.* on 24 May 1775, with his cousin, James Lockhart Wishart, being served his heir in the lands of Lee in 1777.

1b) James Lockhart, *b.* on 2 August 1706, and *dsp.*

1b) Anne Lockhart, *m.* John Pollock of Ballgray and *d.* at Ballgray House on 21 March 1769.⁴

1b) Dorothy Lockhart, *b.* on 15 August 1710, and *d.* unmarried at Lee at 20 February 1767.⁵

1b) Martha Lockhart, *b.* on 18 August 1716.

1a) Robina Lockhart, *m.* Archibald Douglas, Earl of Forfar,⁶ and *d.* at Bothwell Castle on Friday 20 March 1741, aged 79 years,⁷ having and had issue.

2. Sir George Lockhart of Carnwath, (*see below*).

3. Sir John Lockhart of Castlehill, was bred of the elaw and was appointed a Senator of the College of Justice. He *m.* on 6 June 1666, to Catherine Thomson, *d.* in 1694 and was father of :

3a) James Lockhart, 2nd of Castlehill, succeeded his father and was served his heir in the barony of Stonehouse on 4 May 1694.⁸ He *dsp.* and was buried in the Greyfriars, Edinburgh, on 27 July 1696,⁹ with his sister Martha being served his heir on 6 July 1696.

3a) Martha Lockhart, succeeded her brother James on his death without issue and was served his heir in the barony of Stonehouse on 6 July 1696.¹⁰ She *m.* firstly, at Edinburgh on 1 September 1687, to her cousin, Cromwell Lockhart of Lee, by whom she had no issue, and secondly, to John Sinclair, younger of Stevenston.

4. Anne Lockhart, *m.* Sir George Lockhart of Torbrax, and had issue.

SIR GEORGE LOCKHART, 1ST OF CARNWATH, *m.* Philadelphia, daughter of Philip, 4th Baron Wharton, (she survived him and *m.* secondly, to Captain John Ramsay, son of the Bishop of Ross ; and *d.* on Tuesday 10 July 1722¹), and was murdered in Edinburgh by John Cheisley of Dalry when returning from church on 31 March 1689. He was father of :

1. George Lockhart, 2nd of Carnwath, (*see below*).
2. Philip Lockhart, *b.* at Edinburgh on 9 January 1689.
3. Barbara Lockhart, *b.* on 16 December 1677, and *m.* firstly, to James Lockhart, younger of Castlehill. She *m.* secondly, to Daniel Carmichael of Maudsley, and had issue.
4. Philadelphia Lockart, *b.* at Edinburgh on 26 October 1686.

GEORGE LOCKHART, 2ND OF CARNWATH, succeeded his father and was served his heir in the lands and barony of Carnwath on 24 May 1690.² *m.* on 30 April 1697, to Euphemia, daughter of Alexander Montgomery, 9th Earl of Eglinton. He *d.* at Edinburgh on 17 December 1731,³ and was father of :

1. George Lockhart, 3rd of Carnwath, (*see below*).
2. Alexander Lockhart of Craighouse, was a proficient lawyer and was appointed a Lord of Session as Lord Covington. He *d.* at his house in Restalrig, Edinburgh, on 17 November 1782, in his 82nd year,⁴ and had issue :
 - 2a) William Lockhart, served in the Royal Navy being raised to Rear-Admiral. He was father of :
 - 2b) Alexander Lockhart, was served heir general to his father on 6 September 1813. He became a churchman and was appointed vicar of Stone, in Buckinghamshire. He *m.* on 13 April 1818, to Martha, eldest daughter of William Jacob of Chelsham Hall,⁵ *d.* on 13 Septembert 1831,⁶ and was father of :

- 2c) William Lockhart, *c.* at Warlingham, Surrey, on 15 September 1819, and became a churchman.
- 2b) William Lockhart, entered the army and served as Lieutenant in the 16th Light Dragoons. He *d.* at Olmodo, Spain, on 28 October 1812, of wounds received in action with the French.¹
- 2a) Rebecca Lockhart, *m.* on 15 September 1749, to James Boyd, Earl of Errol and *d.* in 1764, leaving issue.
- 2a) Anne Lockhart, *m.* Charles Boyd, and *d.* at Euston Place, New Road, London, on 11 April 1826.²
3. Margaret Lockhart, *b.* at Edinburgh on 12 July 1698.
4. Euphemia Lockhart, *m.* on 18 March 1721, to John Fleming, Earl of Wigton.
5. Grace Lockhart, *m.* 20 June 1724, to John Gordon, Earl of Aboyne, (he *d.* at Charlton-Aboyne on Tuesday 11 April 1732³), and had issue ; and secondly, in December of 1734, to James Stewart, 8th Earl of Moray.
6. Mary Lockhart, *m.* Dr. John Rattray, second son of Thomas Rattray of Craighall, (he was widow of Christian, daughter of George Main, whom he had *m.* on 3 February 1742, and who had *d.* “in childbed” on Sunday 19 November 1758⁴), and had no apparent issue.

GEORGE LOCKHART, 3RD OF CARNWATH, *b.* at Edinburgh on 18 June 1700, succeeded his father and was served his heir general on 14 March 1732. He *m.* on 25 January 1726, to Fergusia, daughter and heiress of Sir George Wishart of Cliftonhall,⁵ *d.* at Dryden on 30 October 1764,⁶ and was father of :

1. George Lockhart, *b.* on 4 December 1726, and *dsp* at Paris on 21 February 1761.⁷
2. James Lockhart, 4th of Carnwath and Lee, (*see below*).
3. Charles Lockhart of Muiravonside, *b.* on 27 February 1740, and *m.* on 16 August 1762, to Elizabeth, daughter and heiress of John MacDonald of Largie,¹ (she *d.* on 1 August 1787). He *d.* in 1796 and was father of :

- 3a) George Lockhart, *b.* on 10 December 1763.
- 3a) John MacDonald, served as a Lieutenant in the 42nd Regiment and *d.* at Bombay on 27 September 1783.²
- 3a) James MacDonald of Largie, *dsp* on 6 September 1793.
- 3a) **SIR ALEXANDER MACDONALD-LOCKHART, 1ST BARONET OF LEE AND CARNWATH**, succeeded his mother and was served her heir in the lands of Carnbeg, Carnmore and others in Argyleshire, on 5 January 1795. He was also served heir to his maternal grandfather, John MacDonald of Largie, on 1 June 1796, and succeeded his cousin Charles Lockhart of Lee in the lands and baronies of Lee and Carnwath on his death without issue in 1802, being served his heir on 7 March 1803. He *m.* Jane, daughter of Daniel MacNeill of Gallicholly, *d.* on 22 June 1816, and was father of :
- 3b) **SIR CHARLES MACDONALD LOCKHART, 2ND BARONET OF LEE AND CARNWATH**, succeeded his father and was served his heir in the lands and baronies of Lee and Carnwath on 6 November 1816. He *m.* on 27 February 1820, to Amelia Olivia, daughter of Sir Charles Ross of Balnagowan,³ (she *d.* on 24 June 1866), *d.* on 8 December 1832, and was father of :
- 3c) Mary Jane MacDonald Lockhart, *b.* on 23 April 1821, and was served coheir to her father on 6 February and 22 June 1835. She *m.* at St. George's, Hanover Square, London, on Tuesday 15 August 1837, to Augustus Henry MacDonald Moreton, son of the Earl of Ducie,⁴ and *d.* at Hyde Park, London, on 9 December 1851,⁵ having had issue which, at length, succeeded to the lands of Lee upon the failure of the senior male line in 1919.
- 3c) Emily Olivia MacDonald Lockhart, *b.* on 10 August 1828, and was served coheir with her sister, Mary, to her father on 6 February 1835.
- 3b) **SIR NORMAN MACDONALD-LOCKHART, 3RD BARONET OF LEE AND CARNWATH**, succeeded his brother Sir Charles as heir male and was served his heir in the lands and baronies of Lee, Carnwath and others, on 1 July 1833. He *m.* at Simonton Lodge, Lanarkshire, on 22 February 1836, to Margaret, daughter of John Maclean,

Campbelltown,¹ (she *d.* at Lee on 21 January 1895²), *d.* at Lee on 9 May 1849,³ and was father of :

3c) **SIR NORMAN MACDONALD LOCKHART, 4TH BARONET OF LEES AND CARNWATH**, *b.* on 28 November 1844, succeeded his father on his death and was served his heir on 16 September 1850. He *dsp* at Cavendish Square, London, on 20 May 1870, being succeeded by his brother Simon.⁴

3c) **SIR SIMON MACDONALD LOCKHART, 5TH BARONET OF LEES AND CARNWATH**, *b.* on 13 March 1849, and succeeded his brother. He *m.* at Bembridge, Isle of Wight, on Wednesday 14 December 1898, to Hilda Maud, second daughter of Lieutenant-Colonel MacDonald Moreton, Coldstream Guards.⁵ He *dsp* at Lee Castle on 25 March 1919.⁶

3c) Jane Margaret Matilda MacDonald Lockhart, *b.* on 17 April 1840, *m.* at the Episcopal Church, Lanark, on 23 September 1862, to Gerald Seymour Fitzgerald, eldest son of W. Seymour Fitzgerald of Holbrook.⁷

3c) Maria Theresa MacDonald Lockhart, *b.* on 29 October 1841.

3c) Cordelia Euphemia MacDonald Lockhart, *b.* on 1 July 1843, and *m.* at St. Peter's Church, Eaton Square, London, on 8 June 1867, to John Stanley Mott, only son of John Thomas Mott, of Barmingham Hall, Norfolk.⁸

3c) Esther Charlotte MacDonald Lockhart, *b.* on 5 July 1846, and *d.* unmarried at San Remo 23 February 1919.⁹

3c) Clementina MacDonald Lockhart, *b.* on 9 September 1847, and *m.* at St. James's Church, Picadilly, London, on 6 August 1873, to John Gregory MacKirdy, of Birkwood.¹⁰

3b) Alexander MacDonald Lockhart, *d.* at Galgorum Castle, county Antrim, on 27 October 1861.¹¹

- 3b) Daniel Alexander MacDonald Lockhart, *d.* at Edinburgh on 12 October 1805.¹
- 3b) Jane MacDonald Lockhart, *d.* at Largie on 27 October 1802.²
- 3b) Elizabeth Esther MacDonald Lockhart, *d.* at Madeira on 3 April 1817.³
- 3b) Matilda Jane MacDonald Lockhart, *d.* at Picardy Place, London, on 6 October 1816.⁴
- 3b) Esther Charlotte Sarah MacDonald Lockhart, *d.* at Upper Norwood on 30 January 1875.⁵

- 3b) Alexander MacDonald Lockhart, *b.* on 9 March 1814, and was served heir to his father in the lands of Tarbrax, and others, in Lanarkshire, on 2 April 1855. He settled in Western Canada, and *d.* there on 6 April 1870.⁸
- 3b) John Innes Crawford Lockhart, *b.* on 6 July 1815, and *d.* at California, USA, on 1 December 1850.⁹
- 3b) Norman Philip Lockhart, *b.* on 4 June 1818.
- 3b) Archibald MacMurdo Lockhart, *b.* on 1 July 1822, and *d.* at Paris while bathing in the Seine, on 16 May 1841.¹⁰
- 3b) Jane MacNeil Lockhart, *b.* on 9 June 1807.
- 3b) Elizabeth MacDonald Lockhart, *b.* on 27 January 1811, and *m.* at Douglas, Isle of Man, on 30 August 1838, to Eaglesfield Bradshaw Smith of Blackwood House.¹¹ She *d.* at Davos Platz, Switzerland, on 13 October 1888.¹

JAMES LOCKHART-WISHART, 4TH OF CARNWATH AND LEE, led a military life and served as an officer in the army of the Queen of Hungary, being raised to the rank of General. He was created a Count of the Holy Roman Empire ; Knight of the Order of Maria Theresa and a Lord of the Bed-Chamber and was served heir to his father on 21 January 1765 ; to his grandfather, Sir George Wishart of Cliftonhall, on 14 July 1777, and then to his cousin John Lockhart of Lee in the lands of Lee and others, on 31 July 1777. He *m.* firstly, at Edinburgh on 4 March 1763, to Mattie, second daughter of John Lockhart of Castlehill,⁹ and secondly, on 18 June 1770, to Marion, granddaughter and heir of David Murray of Balridding, and thirdly in France on 13 June 1785, to Annabella,

4. Matilda Lockhart, *b.* at Dryden on Saturday 15 October 1774, and *m.* at London on 19 February 1791, to Anthony Aufrere of Hoveton Hall, Norfolk.⁵
